

What was that up in the sky?

RUSSELL SPRINGS, Ky. (AP) — Eyewitnesses to a bright, white light that swept across the clear, night sky during the weekend can only agree on one thing.

It happened Saturday night.

Some say it was the size of a car headlight and some say it could have filled two football fields. Some say a loud, crashing noise accompanied it and some say there was silence.

"It looked like a large falling star," said Daniel Wilson, 22, who works for the Russell County ambulance service.

Wilson said he noticed the lights at about 11:50 p.m. CST while driving in Russell Springs.

Terry Tuck, dispatcher for the Macon Co. sheriff's department in northern Tennessee near the Kentucky border, said descriptions he received were a bit different.

Tuck said two of the department's officers saw the lights, describing them as the size of two football fields.

No one seems to know what caused the mysterious lights, including officials at the North American Air Defense Command in Denver, Colo.
