

Family horrified as aliens reduce son to size of a thimble!

Boy shrunk and kidnapped by tiny UFO

A basketball-size UFO shrunk a 10-year-old boy to the size of a thimble, beamed him aboard ship and vanished into the night, China's *Xinhua News Agency* has reported.

The apparent abduction of Sun Chung-tse was reported with surprising candor by *Xinhua*, which is run by the state.

According to the report, Sun was taken aboard the glowing white UFO on the evening of March 20. Twenty minutes later passengers on two commuter flights claim to have seen a similar UFO in the sky over Xinjiang province, the boy's home.

"We have independent confirmation of aggressive UFO activity and

are taking them quite seriously," said aviation spokesman Wang Yen-sheng.

"The disappearance of the boy is most disturbing. The abduction of a citizen is something the People's Republic does not take lightly."

If there is anything government officials can do for the boy his parents, Ying and Chuu Chung-tse, wish they would do it fast.

They told *Xinhua* that they fear for their son's life.

"We do not understand what is hap-

pening," Chuu, the boy's dad, told reporters. "One minute our son was at home with us eating rice.

"The next minute a fiery ball appeared just outside our doorway. It shined a white beam on my son and made him drop the rice.

"Then he lit up very brightly and began to shrink. When he was only a few centimeters tall the beam lifted him up to the ball of light.

"He disappeared in the ball. Then the ball disappeared with my son."

Spokesman Wang said the Chinese government will "do everything in its power" to find out what happened to the boy but did not say how it plans to go about it.

Meanwhile, western UFO researchers are privately worried about the incident, believing that the abduction might invalidate treaties currently being hammered out by 17 world governments and an unnamed alien civilization.

As reported in the April 19 edition of *The NEWS*, those talks have been going on in secret for years and were expected to be finalized — and made public — next year.
