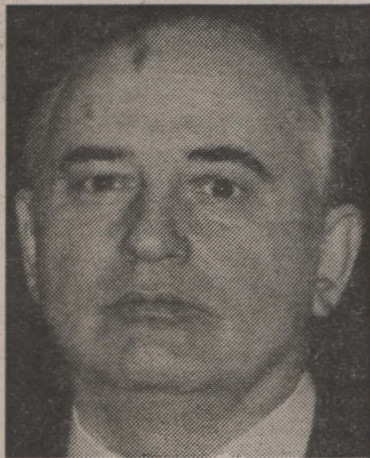
# Injured

Soviet doctors are treating three space aliens who survived a fiery starship crash in Siberia late last year, a West German surgeon reports.

Dr. Ulrich Loewe said documents obtained from a highly-placed Kremlin source say the aliens received massive burns and internal injuries in the crash but are expected to recover fully.

The secret report also says the aliens are collaborating with the Soviets while waiting for a rescue ship from their native planet, the

port are vague but the overall message is clear," he continued. "These extraterrestrials owe their lives to the Russians and intend to repay them in a very substantive way.

"I can't speak for the aliens, of course, but it's obvious that the Russians expect to get the technology, training and hardware to build advanced starships of their own."

Soviet officials would neither confirm nor deny Dr. Loewe's report but indicated that a statement might be forthcoming.

The expert himself insisted that his Kremlin source is "unimpeachable" — and challenged Soviet boss Mikhail Gorbachev "to issue a full statement on the situation immediately."

"Dealing with an alien civilization cannot be a unilateral initiative," said Dr. Loewe. "The entire world must be involved. It's not an overstatement to say that the future of mankind is at stake."

Dr. Loewe's documents said the starship crashed on December 29 due to an unspecified mechanical malfunction.

The Soviet military had the starship on radar when it went down, he added, and were able to mount a rescue mission within minutes.

At least nine alien crewmen were

said to have perished in the crash. The three survivors were airlifted to an undisclosed military hospital, where they underwent surgery and skin-grafting for their burns and injuries, the documents said.

Strangely enough, a full description of the aliens was blocked out of the report. But a later reference suggests that they look like humans with the exception of "unusually large, bulb-shaped heads."

Dr. Phillip Colson, the Dutch UFO researcher, echoed Dr. Loewe's call

for full disclosure of the incident by the Soviets.

"We have a right to know everything about alien visitors to this planet," he said. "In fact, it is beyond comprehen-

sion that the Soviets would even try to keep something of this magnitude secret," Dr. Colson said.

"The United States, Britain, France, even the Netherlands already would have issued a statement to keep the world abreast of developments. It is criminal for the Russians not to do the same.

"It's time they told the world what they have found."
