

Secretary vanishes after encounter with space aliens

UFO Kidnap!



A 39-year-old secretary vanished from the face of the earth less than 24 hours after she told friends that space aliens were trying to abduct her!

Now authorities are trying to figure out if Jackie Smith is in hiding or in the clutches of the extraterrestrials who allegedly had been tailing her.

"Either way it's an alarming situation," UFO investigator Jenny Randles told reporters in Warrington, England. "The young woman who disappeared is not some kind of UFO nut."

"Her friends and co-workers say she is rock solid. When she told them space aliens were after her they believed her."

The woman's boss, Andy Egan, recalled how terrified the woman was the day before she vanished.

"She turned up at the office in a panic," he said. "She said she was driving along in her Toyota when it was whisked into the air and mysteriously transported 'to a different place.'"

"The next thing she remembered was waking up in the

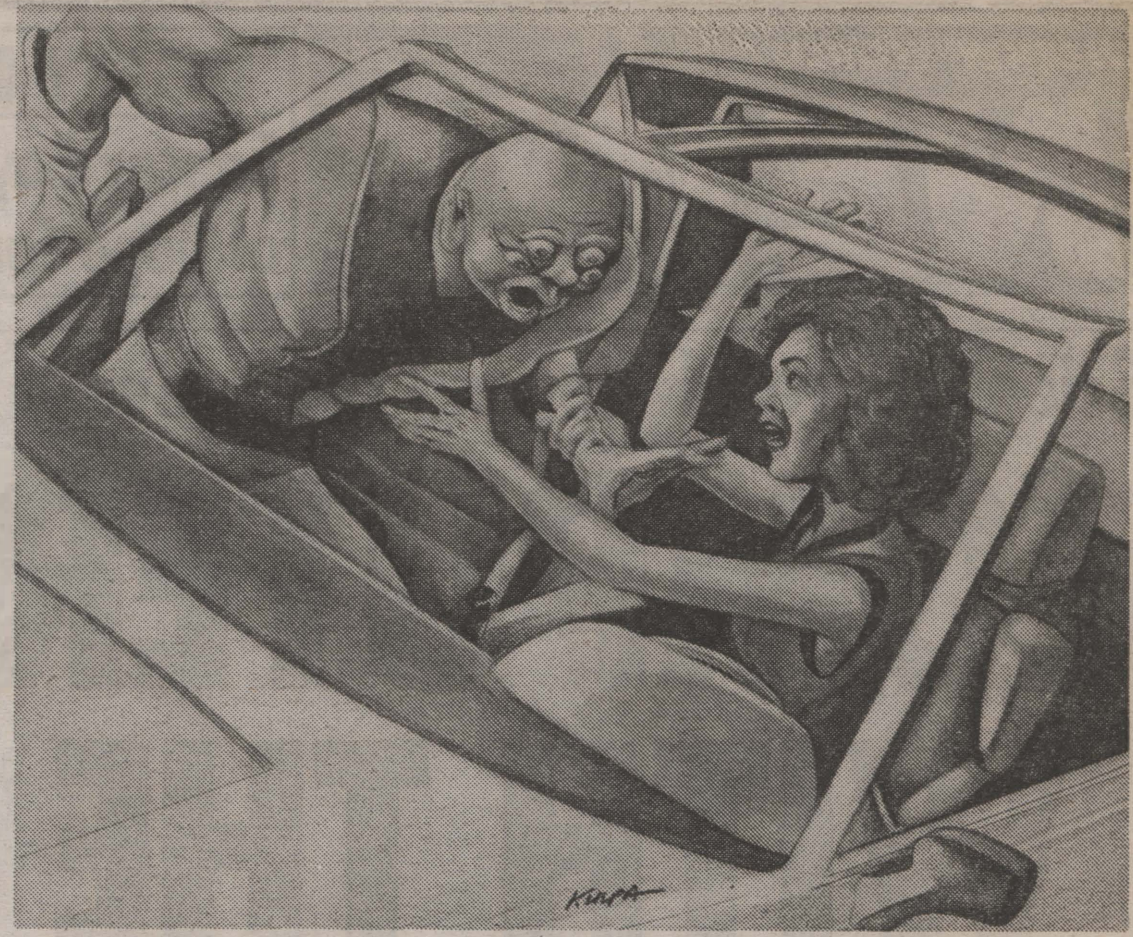
car about six hours later with blue dots on her ankles and neck."

According to a co-worker, Sally Warren, Miss Smith also said that several "strange beings suddenly appeared in her car" a few seconds before the vehicle was transported through the air.

Miss Smith described the aliens as being "tall, manlike and extremely muscular, with small round heads and four eyes," her friend said.

"The blue dots on Miss Smith's ankles and neck are classic signs of testing by aliens," said Mrs. Randles. "She may be in hiding, terrified they'll come back to get her."

"It's also possible that they already have come back and

Miss Smith is now with them."

The young woman's mother, Rose Smith, is frantic. She said her daughter used to telephone her everyday come hell or high water — but hasn't called since she disappeared.

"Something bad has happened to her, I just know it," said Mrs. Smith, 66, of London. "Jackie isn't the kind to play a joke of any kind, much less something so upsetting as this."

"What if those spacemen

did get her?" she sobbed. "I pray to God that they bring her back unharmed. The least they could do is come and get me."

"The least they could do is let me be with my daughter."

Government officials refused to discuss Miss Smith's disappearance and referred questions to police.

Police spokesman Michael Fletcher said detectives are baffled by the woman's disappearance. There is no evidence

of foul play. And a search of her house revealed that all of her clothes are still there.

"She left in a hurry," Fletcher said. "Her car is in the driveway. Her closets are full of clothes. Her checkbook is on a dresser."

"I've never been a big believer in UFOs," he said. "But this case makes me wonder."

"Maybe they do exist and maybe they are coming down to Earth. It's not a pretty thought."
