

GEORGE'S STRANGE ENCOUNTER

As Rotherham pensioner George Moore got ready for bed, he noticed that his Yorkshire terrier Harry seemed unusually restless.

It was just before 2 a.m.

George's attempts to calm his pet seemed useless.

Then, quite suddenly, the terrier "went berserk" — yelping, whimpering and leaping around in apparent terror, said George.

Thinking he might have burglars, George made a quick search of his bungalow home but drew a blank.

It was only when George looked through his bedroom window that he saw what had so upset his little dog.

For up in the clear night sky, hovering silently, was a strangely luminous, "cone-shaped" object... a UFO.

For well over five minutes, George stared in fascination, his terrier still whimpering at his side.

Eventually, the object moved off at speed — horizontally — and disappeared — only to reappear a short time later, accompanied by a smaller through similar object.

The final episode in this bizarre sequence of events came about 20 minutes later when George, unable to sleep, noted the appearance of aircraft following the same flight path as the UFO's.

"I'm no flying saucer fanatic — and I'm not gifted with fantasy," declared George, of Thorogate, Rawmarsh.

He said: "It was a strange experience. I've

travelled to over 30 countries all over the world. I've been to nine states in America, to Canada, and I've seen electric storms in Mexico. But I've never seen anything like this.

"Harry was upset all night by it; I couldn't pacify him. I couldn't sleep myself because of it."

"SOMETHING OUT THERE"

George added that he thought the aircraft he spotted after the incident last week included what appeared to be military jets and a helicopter.

He added: "I don't care what people think about me. I know what I saw. If you'd mentioned the subject of UFO's to me a couple of weeks ago, I would have laughed at the idea. But now I'm not so sure.

"This experience has definitely changed my beliefs. There must be something out there. There's no other explanation."

One of the most remarkable aspects of George's story is the way it tallies with similar recent reports — none of which George has either seen or heard about.

Most concern luminous "cone shaped objects" and many sightings have been corroborated by a number of independent witnesses.

Among the most remarkable sightings were those seen at the beginning of this year over the Fenton Road area of Kimberworth.

An identical object had been spotted on the same night over Ecclesfield, Sheffield, by two police officers.
