

UFO REPORTS PASS 50 AS SIGHTINGS CONTINUE

THE riddle of the Chilterns UFO's deepened this week with the revelation that at least 50 sightings have been reported recently.

Despite Chiltern Newspapers coming up with a possible solution of a kite called UFO Sam, recent spotters of the strange objects remain convinced.

Tony Elkins, 24, of Little Chalfont, spotted a UFO the same night journalist Bill Potts and friend Pete Walker reported one three weeks ago, over Bledlow Ridge.

Tony, who owns a kitchen shop in Chesham, said: "I saw red, yellow and green lights in the shape of a huge rubber dinghy and the lights were moving round.

"It was a Friday night, about 12.30am, and they were above the tree line in Latimer, near Little Chalfont."

Tony, who was alone in the car at the time, slammed on his brakes but when he stopped, the object had disappeared.

"There's a beacon in Latimer, but the lights were 300 foot above that," said Tony.

"When I got home I woke up the bloke I share a house with and told him. Next morning we went out to see if we could find anything, but there was nothing.

"I had a nose bleed afterwards, something I've never had before.

It may have been the shock."

Tony rang RAF Halton, near Aylesbury to report the sighting.

"They told me they'd had 50 to 60 sightings reported recently.

"When people used to tell me they'd seen something I used to believe them rather half-heartedly.

"But I've never seen anything like it and now I'm getting books on the subject."
