

# Paris hunt for flying phantom

ILLEGAL night flights over Paris by a phantom pilot have led to a strong warning from the authorities that anyone caught will face the strictest penalties, including the loss of his licence, and fines or prison.

After the latest sortie, on Sunday night, in which a light plane buzzed Montparnasse and flew low over the 15th Arrondissement and Montrouge, evading a pursuing helicopter, the defence implications are recognised.
