Scientist takes light look

SCIENTIST Terence Meaden will be looking out for lights when he marks an unusual anniversary at Christmas.

Physicist Mr Meaden of Frome Road, Bradford-on-Avon says it is 24 years ago on Christmas Day since mysterious lights and strange phenomena first happened in Warminster.

Since then, the tales of the Warminster mystery, reputed by some to be unidentified flying objects has captured world-wide imagination.

Now Mr Meaden who runs Colour Developments in Bradford-on-Avon has been collating information about unexplained mysteries and hopes people will come forward with their experiences.

"It was first noticed through its strange noises and rooftop hammering at Knook barracks near Warminster and several residences in the town.

"Then followed an eventful period with reports of numerous happenings involving moving or hovering lights, unaccountable forces or winds and bizarre sounds," explained Mr Meaden.
