The UFO 'time travel' theory

TIME travellers could get quite carried away next week — for just £1 a head.

The Manchester-based Direct Investigation Group on Aerial Phenomena, which claims to be the oldest UFO society in England, has a lecture on Wednesday in the Derby Room at Leigh Library.

And the organisers promise startling new evidence, material, photographs and videos.

Electronic design engineer Arthur Tomlinson, a UFO investigator for 36 years, is giving the talk.

Steve Balon, aged 36, an investigator with the Manchester organisation, said: "Apart from photos of UFOs there will be top secret American documents about UFO crashes, which have only just been freed under the Freedom of Information Act."

He added: "The thinking about UFOs has now changed. We used to think they were nuts and bolts objects. Now we are inclined to regard them as psychic phenomena — sort of extra-terrestrial time travellers."

And the lecture will also show evidence of a close encounter by a former policeman on Ilkley Moor when he photographed an "alien."
