UFO war jets scare

FAMILIES in the Cotswolds thought the Martians were landing when a giant fireball exploded over their homes.

tery was solved when the U.S. Air Force admitted its jets were responsible for the scare.

The drama began late on Wednesday night when the pilot of an American F1-11 jet found his undercarriage had jammed and decided to

climb to 11,000 feet and jettison his fuel.

But the after-burners in an accompanying F1-11 ignited the fuel causing a flash of flames like a missile.

Both jets landed safely at the USAF base in Upper Heyford, Oxfordshire.
