Ban on

mystic

crops

urged

BAFFLED scientists are urging the Government to ban crops growing in mysterious circles across southern England.

More than 160 circles — between 10 and 25 yards in diameter — have now been discovered in fields of cereals.

One worried MP has tabled two Commons questions on the phenomenon.

The circles — perfectly formed by flattened crops — are being examined by 60 experts.

They say an unexplained energy source appears to be changing the molecular structure of some of the six cereal crops involved.

Alarm

One scientist taking part in the study based near Winchester, Hampshire, warned: "They should be kept out of the food chain.

"It is possible that a molecular contamination is taking place."

He added: "This is a major development. The circles started appearing in 1946 but since 1975 it has gone berserk."

Tory MP Teddy Taylor, who tabled the Commons questions, said: "People are becoming alarmed. Something strange is going on."

The affected areas of Hampshire, Wiltshire and Dorset are criss-crossed by ancient ley-lines associated with energy forces dating to the Druids.
