# 8 Calves Shot And Mutilated In Strange Eastman Incident

There's some strange things going on near Eastman when Don Betz, an Eastman area farmer, reported that someone took eight of his Angus-cross calves, two had been shot in the head and were dead, one of the calves had its head severed and a fourth was found badly decomposed in a deep ditch.

Betz reported the eight missing calves July 4. He told sheriff's department deputies at 9:05 p.m. Tuesday, July 11, that he had found the missing calves. Only four of the 250-pound calves were found to be in good shape.

Chief Deputy Roger Lund said there are some leads in the case.

#### Expensive Equipment

Kenneth Wymore, who occupies Lot 24 at Sportsman, rural Prairie du Chien, reported Jan. 13 that he had some expensive fishing equipment stolen from his boat while it was moored at The Barn Marina, north of Prairie du Chien.

Taken were two tackle boxes and fishing poles that were valued at several hundred dollars.

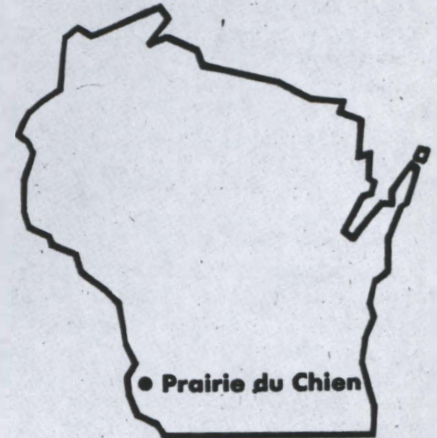
#### Truck Vandalized
