

UFO according to Tass . . .

Scientists have confirmed that an unidentified flying object recently landed in a park in the Russian city of Voronezh.

They have also identified the landing site and found traces of aliens who took a short walk around the park.

Aliens visited the place after dark at least three times, according to local people.

A large shining ball or disc was seen hovering above the

park. It then landed, a hatch opened and one, two or three creatures similar to humans and a small robot came out.

The aliens were three or even four metres high, but with very small heads, witnesses say.

They walked near the ball or disc and then disappeared inside. Onlookers were overwhelmed with a fear which lasted for several days.

"We identified the landing site by means of biolocation,"

Genrikh Silanov, head of the Voronezh Geophysical Laboratory, said in an interview.

"We detected a circle 20 metres in diameter. Four 4-5 centimetre deep dents, each with a diameter of 14-16 centimetres were clearly visible. They are situated in the four points of a rhomb. We found two mysterious pieces of rock."

At first glance they looked like sandstone of a deep-red col-

our. However, mineralogical analysis has shown that the substance cannot be found on earth. However, additional tests are needed to reach a more definite conclusion."

Silanov used biolocation to trace the earthly trails of the aliens.

Witnesses were not informed about the experiment, but the route along which the aliens walked as described by the onlookers, and the one

established scientifically, coincided.

Many also claim to have seen a banana-shaped object in the sky and a characteristic illuminated sign, as described in the US Saga magazine.

It is unlikely that residents of Voronezh could have read the magazine.
