# The night a UFO chased off women

FOUR local women were scared out of their wits when a brightly-lit unidentified flying object appeared to chase their car.

The four were travelling to Wisbech for a night out when two of them spotted a large, star-like object in the sky, keeping pace with the car.

And all four women noticed the diamond-shaped object — lit up with red, blue, green, orange and mauve lights — when it shot towards their car.

The driver — who has not been named — then panicked and sped off in an attempt to lose the

object.

But it caught them up, sped past and landed ahead of them, which caused the driver to slam on the brakes, and the car spun round before coming to a halt.

By now the women were so terrified they abandoned their night out and turned around to go home — and were again struck with terror when they saw flashing blue lights in the distance.

These turned out to be coming from four police cars parked by the roadside, with six policemen nearby — two carrying what the women thought were rifles.

The women did not stop, but reported their close encounter to the

Yorkshire UFO society.

Now their amazing story has been told to the world in *The UFO Report 1990*, edited by UFO expert Timothy Good and published by Sidgwick and Jackson.

Co-writer Mark Bird-sall said he had promised the women not to reveal their identities and would not divulge the date or exact location of the incident.

The Evening Telegraph checked with police in Cambridgeshire — as well as Norfolk and Lincolnshire because Wisbech is close to the county border — but all said they had no record of any recent incidents involving the possible sighting of UFOs.
