The Sky

A CAMERA made to cover the whole of the sky is hoped to be in use in time for an all-night watch for unidentified flying objects on September 18 by members of the Isle of Wight Unidentified Flying Object Investigation Society.

The society will be meeting at a secret location with binoculars, compasses and star maps ready to plot anything unusual in the sky.

The full details of any incident will be filed ready for a dossier which the society hopes to eventually bring out for the benefit of similar societies in Britain.

Interest in finding out more about unidentified flying objects is growing, said the society's secretary, Mr. Frederick Smith, of Connaught-road, East Cowes.

He added: "A few years ago mention a Saucer and people would be inclined to laugh. Now there is genuine interest in our work, and there are about 17 similar societies in the country."
