

Flying Object Proof Sought By Camera Crew

FORT SMITH, Ark. (AP) — Camera crews engaged by a Fort Smith radio station will try tonight to get photographic proof that unidentified flying objects are in the air over Oklahoma and West Arkansas.

"We'll be shooting both color and black and white," said Tony Delaney, news director of station KFSA, who is himself convinced that something unusual is going on aloft.

Delaney said he and two others set up a UFO watch on Wildcat Mountain Monday night and made three separate sightings of strange flying objects.

"I went out there as a skeptic, but I'm not a skeptic any more," Delaney said.

Using binoculars, Delaney said, his party watched a group of four objects for about five minutes, a pair of objects for about 10 minutes and a single object for several minutes.

"We also sighted two aircraft and the Tyros weather satellite," Delaney said. "But these objects weren't aircraft. They weren't meteors, either. Meteors fly in a straight line. These things went right, left and up and down."

Delaney said the objects were brilliant blue and green but changed to brilliant white under acceleration.
