

# Fort Smith Radiomen Report UFOs, Begin Watch With Cameras

FORT SMITH—A radio station here set up cameras on Wildcat Mountain Tuesday night to try to photograph Unidentified Flying Objects that have been reported over Oklahoma and western Arkansas and in six other states since the week end.

Tony Delaney, news director of station KFSA, is convinced that something unusual is going on and said that the watchers would be using both color and black and white film.

Delaney said he and two other persons set up a UFO watch on the Mountain Monday night after getting reports of sightings and made three separate sightings of strange flying objects.

"I went out there as a skeptic but I'm not a skeptic anymore," he said.

Delaney said they saw a group of four objects for about five minutes, a pair of objects for about 10 minutes and a single object for several minutes.

"We also sighted two aircraft and the Tyros weather satellite," he said. He was certain that the objects sighted

weren't aircraft or meteors. He said they were brilliant blue and green and changed to brilliant white under acceleration. They flew both horizontally and vertically, he said.

## UFOs Spotted In Minnesota

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Unidentified Flying Objects were spotted over parts of Minnesota and North Dakota Monday night.

Dozens of police officers on patrol between 12:20 and 2:30 a. m. reported sightings in the Minneapolis-St. Paul area. According to various reports, the objects "bobbed, dipped, hovered, stopped, jerked along and sped away."

An officer in suburban Shorewood radioed his dispatcher: "Boys, I hope you don't think I'm crazy, but I just got passed by a star."

The airport control tower said it had seen nothing on radar. The tower said also that a number of B-52 military aircraft were in the area.
