

# High School Student Sees UFO in Wayne

WAYNE — Nick Sunday, of 33 Manor Dr., a high school junior who has been star-gazing since he was a small child, came up with an unusual find early Saturday morning.

As a result, police have an initial report of an unidentified flying object over Wayne.

Nick, who boards with Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Swift, 33 Manor Dr., told police that at 4:25 a.m. he spotted a bright object, about the size of a star, which traveled from one side of the sky to the other in about five minutes.

It was not a satellite nor a meteorite, Nick told The News. He explained that the object appeared to be about the size of a star but with "points" on it.

Disproving the satellite theory offered by police, or the possibility of a meteorite, Sunday said the object did not follow a straight course; could slacken speed and followed a zig-zag pattern.

While it was the first UFO report in the memory of police, it was a second for Nick. He saw one several years back while residing in Prospect Park and reported it to police there.

The fact that Sunday resides with the Swifts led to an initial report that Mr. Swift had seen the object. Sunday's sighting of Saturday morning, like that at Prospect Park, was verified by two witnesses.

Nick, 18, said he has been interested in the heavens for many years and uses an ordinary telescope in his work. He often stays up all night, sleeping the following day.
