

'FLYING SAUCER' IN DEATH CRASH?

MELBOURNE, Monday.

MMOTORIST Ronald Sullivan was cruising along in the moonlight when the beam of his headlights "bent" inexplicably to the right.

"Had I followed them I would have run off the road," he told police at Maryborough, near Melbourne.

"I managed to stop before I crashed.

"Just then I saw a display of gaseous lights in all the colours of the spectrum in a nearby field. An object rose about 10ft. in the air—and disappeared."

Later, he returned to the scene—and found that 19-year-old motorist Gary Taylor had been killed the previous night in a crash at the same spot.

Police checked and found in a freshly ploughed field a circular depression from two to five inches in depth and about five feet in diameter.

They regard 38-year-old Sullivan as an intelligent and highly respected business man—who does not believe in flying saucers.
