

Holiday watch for Flying Saucers

THE HUNT is on. If there are any Flying Saucers circling Britain then we shall soon know for sure—provided they fly over Warminster, Wilts.

For that is where the British Unidentified Flying Objects Research Association have mounted a week-long sky watch using 50 members.

It is one of the biggest observations so far, and some BUFORA members are giving up their holidays to take part in the 24-hours-a-day watch.

Cloudy day

They are stationed on three hills around Warminster—Arn Hill, Battlesbury Hill, and the 784ft.-high Cley Hill.

With three "fixes" on any unidentified object it should be possible to work out its speed, altitude and bearing. Yesterday it was cloudy most of the day and on Saturday night nothing exciting was spotted.

Several hundred people in the Warminster area claim to have seen flying "things" and descriptions range from "silver cigar-shaped craft which split open to pour out multi-coloured shapes" to "two red hot eyes in the sky."

One watcher said: "It may seem an odd thing to do for a holiday but you certainly get away from the crowd this way."
