

# Mr Flying Saucer draws a blank on the Night of UFO

**T**HE reported sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects over Europe have given the International Sky Scouts their biggest fillip for years.

The Scouts, of course, are devout believers in Flying Saucers.

"I've been following reports extremely closely," says Brinsley Le-Poer-Trench, their 55-year-old British leader.

"I've no doubt that at least some of the Unidentified Flying Objects were Flying Saucers."

Le-Poer-Trench, half brother of the Earl of Clancarty, is an acknowledged world expert on such matters.

"Coming on top of our international spotting day last month it's all very exciting," he adds.

Since 40,000 of his members left their beds and took to the hills on June 24, reports of strange and wonderful happenings have been flowing in to him.

"I seem to be the only

person up that night who didn't see anything," says Le-Poer-Trench.

"One of our Scouts in the Argentine, Professor Ricardo Fondizi, wrote to say he had seen squadrons of disc-like objects.

"The important thing was that they flew in from the direction of Peru and then turned and went back.

"This seems to disprove any argument that they might have been satellites."

But actual concrete proof of Unidentified Flying Objects is still avoiding Le-Poer-Trench.

He came near recently when he wrote to the director of an observatory in South America who claimed to have taken twenty colour photographs of a six-foot-high Spaceship.

Le-Poer-Trench said sadly:

"He offered them to me for 5,000 dollars."
