

# Mystery light was seen in night sky

UNIDENTIFIED Flying Objects are once again a talking point and this week it was reported to the County Times that one may have been seen near Ealing Broadway on Friday evening.

The man who claims to have spotted the mysterious object is Mr. Frank O'Keefe (30), a member of the B.B.C.'s Central Programme Operations, who lives at 10, Kenilworth Road, Ealing.

Mr. O'Keefe says that he was walking down Windsor Road towards Ealing Broadway with his wife Ann, at 9.10 p.m., when they noticed a red light in the sky.

Thinking that it was an aircraft Mr. O'Keefe took no notice but five seconds later the light came closer: "The object seemed to be flying very low probably at about 2,500 feet," he said.

"We saw two bright lights

close together and each one in a perfect cross shape. We then saw some kind of red glow either in the middle of the object or behind it.

"We watched for about seven seconds and the object flew in a straight line in a North easterly direction and disappeared behind some houses."

Mr. O'Keefe is not confident that what he saw was actually an object from another planet but he said that it was unlike anything that he and his wife had seen before.

## NOT CONVINCED

"I have not heard any logical theory about U.F.O.s yet so I am not convinced either way. I would accept what I thought was a logical explanation," he added.

Earlier in the evening Mr. A. Mallet of 118, Homefarm Road, Hanwell, claims that he saw an orange object in the sky travelling towards central London. Mr. Mallet was standing in Longfield Avenue when he sighted the object.

Northolt Aerodrome report that they had no strange objects on their radar screen on Friday evening and that at 9-10 p.m. they had no aircraft in the sky.
