

U.F.O.s could start war

WORLD War Three might be caused by the Russians or the Americans picking up unidentified flying objects on their radar and thinking that the other side was attacking them.

Mr. Gordon Creighton, President of the British U.F.O. Research Association, said this in answer to a question by Peter Knife, vice-chairman of Harefield Y.C.s, during a talk to the branch on U.F.O.s last week.

In answer to another question, he stated that the creatures seen by many people may be what is known

in religious terms as angels and devils.

"I think we are approaching apocalyptic times. Our species is in a very great crisis and in great danger. Other people are watching us," he said.

One of the current theories about the origin of U.F.O.s and "spacemen" was that they came from behind the mirror, or from another dimension.

In his talk, Mr. Creighton went over some of the positive facts that are related to sightings of U.F.O.s. He said that both the United States and Russia now took U.F.O.s seriously.

He produced a copy of evidence given by a number of top American scientists to

House of Representatives Committee, and stated that the Russians have 15,000 sightings on file, and the Americans 10,000.

"We know that they are watching our power grids, water supply, power plants, airfields, atom plants and arsenals.

"I do not know whether we are under threat of invasion or occupation or whether they are running a patrol to see whether we are throwing any H-bombs or A-bombs.

"I do not think they really look on us as a very high form of life. They are probably concerned with safeguarding our planet," said Mr. Creighton.

Although there are a number of hoaxes, Mr. Creighton told the Young Conservatives that on the strength of the sheer number of sightings it was impossible to explain away U.F.O.s as something else.

To support this, he cited the case of a Venezuelan doctor, who said that when he went into his surgery one morning he found a creature waiting for him.

The creature asked, in fluent Portuguese, for a check-up. The doctor gave him a check-up and later reported his findings to the authorities, who could find no explanation for it.
