For 10th up in the starry sky was a "shiny blob" which started travelling through the sky.



Bob, being rather a keen "ufologist" went for his binoculars and, during about an hour, saw another five.

"I was absolutely amazed. They were so clear and definite I just could not ignore them. One particular one was obviously under some form of systematic control.

"I was able to differentiate between four meteorites which we
