

Poll Shows . . .

64% in Group of Most Intelligent People In U.S. Believe UFOs Are 'Spaceships From Other Planets'

Nearly two-thirds of a group of America's most intelligent people believe that UFOs are "spaceships from other planets."

And over half believe that the craft "are carrying passengers who are studying our behavior."

These are some of the surprising results of a poll conducted exclusively for The ENQUIRER by MENSA International, an organization of people with IQs over 130 that places them in the top 2 percent of the intelligence spectrum.

In a recent issue of the MENSA Bulletin, the monthly magazine for some 20,000 U.S. members of the organization, the question was asked:

"Do you think that UFOs are spaceships from other

planets?" Of the members responding to the poll, 64 percent said they did.

To the question — "Do you believe UFOs are carrying passengers who are studying our behavior?" — 51 percent answered "yes."

Sixteen percent of the members responding to the poll said they had actually seen a UFO themselves, and an amazing 67 percent said they would "accept an offer to board a UFO if its occupants were not visibly hostile."

In summing up results of the poll, answered by 380 members, psychologist Dr. Max Fogel, MENSA's director of science and education, said:

"It's a significant survey — the responses are a good representation of what thinking men and women believe in."
