SKYWATCH

Yorkshire UFO Society members and friends will be gathering at two venues in and around Carleton and Elslack Moors, North Yorkshire, between August 16th - 25th for a unique Skywatch.

This area, one and a half miles due south of Carleton village near Skipton, has experienced a great deal of UFO activity during the last five years. Photographs taken during this time, has led to some being heralded as Britains first confirmed UFO photographs by experts in the United States.

Society members from the region, as well as those living elsewhere in the United Kingdom, will descend on the area, and be based at a Caravan placed at a strategic point neat Carleton and Elslack Moor. Locals refer to the area as "Flying Saucer Alley" - a phrase adopted due to the numerous sightings reported by the local people themselves.

Sophisticated camera and photographic equipment, as well recording devices previously untried in this terrain, should enable any phenomenon visible to the naked eye, to be recorded for later scientific analysis. Already experts at the University of Sheffield have expressed a deep interest in photographic study of the enigma, to the extent that they are prepared to part-finance research.

Leeds University has individuals who have major experience in their particular fields of research, and some have agreed to attend, bringing along their own equipment.

The society intends, be it in the short or long term, to prove the enigma is real enough to warrant major scientific study. Such research is now being carried out by the University of Oslo in Norway, as well as by researchers at the Soviet Academy of Sciences in Moscow. Any member of the public is more than welcome to join the Skywatch (day or night) and perhaps discuss the subject with members of the Society who will be delighted to have their company.
