

1. At 23:30 hrs. Thompson RCMP received a complaint from c/n's mother, [REDACTED] of a possible UFO in Deerwood Park. The complainant stated that her son and daughter as well as a neighbour's daughter had just entered Deerwood Park from Caribou Road when they saw lights moving all around them, lights shining on the ground around them and in the trees around them. The lights were pale blue in colour. The kids, all aged 12 years, continued down the emergency pathway they were on until they reached a large snow hill, approximately 100 to 150 feet into the park. The snow hills were man-made as part of the City snow removal system. As they approached this hill they noticed a bright light at the top of the hill (in the sky). As the light was turned off they saw a large being standing on the top of the hill. The being as described by [REDACTED] was approximately 8 feet tall, hairy all over, with a bony torso and large legs and feet. The being was also said to have red glowing eyes. The hair on the being was described as something like a bear would have. With [REDACTED] at the scene was [REDACTED] lives at [REDACTED]. C/n went on to say that when they saw this being, they became frightened and started running away. The being descended the hill and started chasing them. The children said that they ran to [REDACTED] which is within sight of the park, and told a clerk of their encounter. The clerk

stepped out of the building and looked for the being but could not see it. She then went back into the gas bar. The children then stepped out and they said they saw it peering at them from behind a fence. At that point they ran further into town and then finally back home. The complainant was told to calm the children down first, then to get as much information from these children as possible before calling the police again.

2. At 00:05 hrs. Thompson RCMP received a call from the Thompson General Hospital stating that the parents of the a/n children had brought them in for treatment as they were hysterical with fright and that the parents could not calm them down. The admitting nurse basically witnessed what had already been stated. Two members of the Thompson RCMP attended the hospital and it was decided that they would go back to the park with [REDACTED] and his father so that [REDACTED] could show what had happened. Once there, further information was revealed showing that the children had followed 3 to 4 intoxicated males, carrying beer, into the park. [REDACTED] stated that one of the males turned to him and said, "you better watch out up ahead." The 3 to 4 males then disappeared and moments later the children saw the monster on top of the hill. [REDACTED] stated that the males were carrying beer and police found an empty beer bottle on top of the hill, at the point where the monster was supposed to have been standing. After examination, the children were released to their parents in a much calmer mood.

3. At 21:00 hrs. a statement was taken from [REDACTED] while he was in attendance at the Thompson Detachment. The statement basically covered all the same points as outlined in the original complaint. [REDACTED] stated that there were 4 to 5 males in the park as opposed to his earlier comment of 3 to 4 males.

4. At 21:40 hrs. a statement was taken from [REDACTED] while she was in attendance at the Thompson Detachment. She basically reiterated the original complaint, however she did say that she never got a good look at the monster while in the park but only a glimpse of something while back at the gas bar. It is felt that the panic and fear as shown by [REDACTED] transferred onto [REDACTED] was frightened and ran away from something she never really saw.

On 92-04-03, [REDACTED] reported a sighting of an object to Ethelbert R.C.M.P. [REDACTED] advised that on 92-03-31 while proceeding west on P.R. # 271 approximately 8 miles east of Pine River at 22:30 hours, he had viewed the object in question. In attendance with [REDACTED] was his son, [REDACTED], both of Pine River. [REDACTED] stated that previous to viewing the same, dust was kicked up on the road as if something had flown or passed just over it moving south. Immediately after, he noted a brilliant flash southwest of his location. The flash was described as similar in nature to a fluorescent light, but very harsh to view. [REDACTED] could not detail the distance involved but considered the object to be large in size. He did believe that there would be remains or markings on the ground where this happened. [REDACTED] is adamant that the flash he observed was a result of the object in question exploding.

On 92-04-04, [REDACTED] was flown over the area in question with police, but no indications of the object were present. Approximately, one and one half hours of air time was afforded, but to no avail.
