

I wanted to pass this "thing" as it was traveling at only about 70 KPH, but it was encroaching on the left lane by a meter or more. I noted the red illumination on the surface of the pavement, especially below the left corner. The width at the base of this triangular moving assemblage of lights almost reached the edge of the pavement on the right and was estimated to be about 4 meters in height. It looked like a neon sign. The intensity of these red lights was comparable to that given off by the tail lights of any conventional vehicle at night.

Imperceptibly the "vehicle" closed the distance between it and my 1990 GMC truck to within 10 m. I thought it was even closer. At least some of the lights were blinking on and off and most prominent were 3 elongated pairs each about a meter long and .2 m in width positioned vertically at each of the three corners of the triangle (Figure 1.) The top and left pairs blinked alternately, I am not sure about the pair in the right corner. The other lights which were of various shapes were estimated to be 15 or 25 cm in diameter or width. The only other component of this assemblage that was observed was a dark cylindrical or piece of material (metal ?) perhaps 15 centimeters long and 2 or 3 cm in diameter (Figure 1). These lights were observed at close range for no more than 3 or 4 seconds. The "vehicle", which emitted no audible sounds, seemed to float along about .5 m above the pavement. In retrospect, it seemed odd that at the time, I didn't suspect something strange.

Instantly these red lights went out and there was nothing there. I quickly put on my brights, but we saw nothing. No light or fire or anything suggestive that the thing took flight, could be seen. It simply vanished before us. It was at this point that we realized that we had witnessed something unusual - a U.F.O. or a U.V.O. (Unidentified vanishing object).
