RE: UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT SIGHTING

On January 09, 1995, the RCMP received a report from [redacted] that between 01:05 a.m. to 02:00 a.m. on this date she observed an Unidentified Flying Object from her home near Cold Lake, Alberta. She stated that she was awoken from her sleep and observed two shapes in her bedroom near the door. As well she noted a beam of light entering the room through the window which was facing west. Upon looking out this window she observed a round object in the western sky which the light source was emitting from. It stayed for approximately one hour and then disappeared. [redacted] was asked if a member could attend her residence and investigate further this report. She agreed.

On January 11, 1995 Constable LAROCQUE of the GRAND CENTRE Detachment attended the [redacted] residence. [redacted] showed the bedroom where the incident took place. No physical evidence was found by the investigator. [redacted] a drafts person by trade, sketched two diagrams that pertained to her sighting. The first is a plan view of her bedroom and an elevation of the wall that the shapes appeared on near her door. The second is a plan drawing of her perception where the object was in relation to her house and barn. Copies of the two diagrams are enclosed with this report.

[redacted] then afforded a twenty two minute taped statement that detailed her sighting. The statement has been transcribed and again included with this report. The investigator was impressed with [redacted] detail and the clarity thereof.

An inspection of the yard around the house and barn did not reveal any evidence as to a plausible explanation to [redacted] sighting. [redacted] does not consume alcohol or non prescription drugs. The prescription drugs she takes are for high blood pressure and diabetes but has been on them for some time and has not had any adverse affects before.

A check with the weather office on Cold Lake Air Force Base shows that on January 09 at 1:00 A.M., the weather conditions were high thin broken clouds at 25,000 feet, relative humidity of 73% and the temperature was -23 degrees C. The visibility was excellent at approximately 15 miles. January 16, 1995 was the period for the full moon.
