Thanks for your letter. I was wondering what happened to your paper.

Although I have heard of him, I have no idea who Robert Lazar is. As a result, I cannot comment on any information he may have furnished to you.

As to Dreamland, I have no doubts that the United States Government is engaged in highly classified research and development activities at that location. I have seen no credible evidence to suggest that these activities are in any way related to alien technology or crashed saucers. If somebody has credible evidence, I would be most anxious to see it. All I have seen on the subject are copies of Lee Graham's endless stream of requests, none of which, to my knowledge, has produced anything substantive. Obviously, the Government is reluctant to talk about their activities there, and understandably so.

The government must be quite disturbed by all the interest being shown in Dreamland and stealth aircraft. No doubt they are not sure there isn't a concerted effort to gain access to legitimate secrets under the pretext of a link between crashed saucers and stealth/Dreamland. For all the government knows, it could be a Soviet intelligence effort. I've wondered about that myself.

I agree that there is a government cover-up only to the extent that the government does not wish to have legitimate technological secrets revealed. Again, in my opinion, no credible evidence has surfaced linking these secrets to alien technology or crashed saucers. However unlikely I may think it is, it remains possible that this technology has links with crashed saucers, but I have seen nothing credible to suggest that this is the case.

As noted above, I have heard of Robert Lazar, but I have no details of the story he is trying to peddle. Could you summarize his claims for me?

Regarding your paper, I would appreciate it if you would tell me, generally, what conclusions you and Scott have reached concerning the alleged Eisenhower briefing and the Truman-Forrestal memo.

Sorry I can't be of any help, but if I had any good leads, I'd do everything I could to check them out myself.
