

bothered to examine all the facts, he were to unmercifully beat down all evidence that does not suit his fancy. But alas, Dr. Manas is anything but a skeptic; He believes in reincarnation, astral planes of various sorts, spirits, telepathy, mediumship, astral projection, and a host of other assorted doctrines, which he expounds mainly in the second half of his book. Several diagrams, which purport to show the physical, etheric, astral, mental and spiritual planes of the Earth, are complete gibberish to our metaphysically untrained mind. Dr. Manas, who is Greek, pretends to be a philosopher in the tradition of the ancient Greeks. Whereas the ancient Greeks can be excused for their many errors, - not having modern scientific method to guide them, - Dr. Manas can hardly be excused for agreeing with modern science only when it suits him!



Worst of all, Dr. Manas does believe in life on other planets and in communication between the planets by various mystical non-physical means. His main argument appears to be with those who believe that saucers are physical 3-D interplanetary spaceships. Were he to apply the same rigorous criticisms to his own beliefs as he does to those whom he does not agree with, he would find himself much more hard-pressed than they in regard to demonstrable proof of any kind. But when it comes to metaphysical doctrines, Manas does not need proof. He states blandly, "The interplanetary space which fills our solar system....is a mysterious something, a spiritualized substance, which is permeated with the consciousness of the Creator of our solar system and the various Cosmic forces which work in and through this mysterious 'something,' this spiritualized substance, the interplanetary ether.....However, let it be known that each planet has its own invisible government with no interference from any other planetary government. The Exalted Planetary Intelligences in charge supervise the evolution of all beings living on our planet Earth according to certain immutable laws, which no mortal can violate because he cannot change them...." If any of our readers fully understand the above statements, they should let us know at once!

To top it all off, Dr. Manas does not even believe that mankind will ever get further out into space than the various nearby astral planes shown on his charts. Says he, "In spite of the optimism of our scientists that within a few years manned spaceships will go to the Moon and to our nearest planets, Venus and Mars, we are of the opinion that man will never be able to send out a ship to navigate the mysterious interplanetary space, of which modern science admits that it knows nothing, and reach our Moon and our nearest planets. Approximately above 400 miles in space the main region of the astral plane or zone begins. This astral region is formed of a very fine space substance and it vibrates at a high rate unknown to our scientists. (How does HE know? - Editor.) It is permeated with solar invisible radiations which are undetectable by any of our instruments. These high radiations will permeate the etheric and physical bodies of the crew and decompose their body's cells

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then indeed they must be directed by the gods, for surely such infallibility and perfection does not reside with mere human-kind.

Each sect of belief proves its case for saucers by focusing upon certain types of reports and ignoring others. This rejection of certain kinds of cases is usually accompanied by much rationalization, such as lack of evidence. But the truth is that there is a lack of

evidence for any of the saucer theories, not just the contact claims. The analyses of the so-called conservatives are permeated with assumptions which are unjustified by the facts. I am not saying that the contact reports are to be accepted as being as reliable as a more documented sighting; but proof resides with neither. By consciously or unconsciously selecting those types of reports which conform to his a priori view, the researcher creates a false pattern of intelligent activity and purpose. Thus, other researchers, by focusing upon other kinds of reports, are able to come up with other and different "patterns of intelligence."

The saucer phenomenon remains as complete a mystery as it was in 1946. All notions of "progress" are illusionary, and in view of this it would be of value to re-appraise many of the conclusions that have been made by investigators. The Air Force part of this matter, for example, might be completely over-emphasized, and might constitute the gropings of people who are just as confused by the saucers as civilians are. It is not hard to understand the various Air Force "policy changes" in view of the fact that no proof has emerged over the years. Enthusiasm has a way of transforming into pessimism with increasing frustration.

We are therefore at a crossroads in flying saucer research, and we must ask and answer this crucial question: Is the core of the saucer problem a real, external problem? I suggest that the answer to this question cannot be determined without a re-evaluation of all types of saucer reports. I believe that the saucer phenomena embrace the entire saga itself and that researchers are not so much confronted by the phenomenon as they are participating in it! This re-formulation of the saucer problem deals with the paradox of the extensive belief in saucers and the complete lack of proof for that belief. How does one account for a prevalent but unsubstantiated belief? How does the believer himself account for the fact that he continues to believe, without being able to demonstrate the validity of that belief?

There is more to the saucer problem than meets the eye, but the average investigator never sees these things, for he doesn't pause long enough during his quest to ask himself a few significant questions. Perhaps it is the persistent reluctance of the researcher to give up his beliefs which prevents him from asking these questions, but one thing is certain: The time is rapidly approaching when he will be unable to talk of "intelligently directed vehicles" and "the plan of the space people" without being painfully aware of the paradox inherent in such talk. We must learn to differentiate between knowing and believing, and between emoting and thinking. In my view, the so-called

If THE SAUCERIAN did not get out since February, that did not reflect a paucity of news.

Although the H-Bomb and Congressional committees were in the forefront of attention, many saucerenthusiasts with their eyes toward the heavens could see many things--and wondered why the newspapers would not (or could not) report what they were witnessing.

Saucers seemed to be everywhere. But the Air Force continued to double talk, apparently disregarding the hundreds of sightings pouring in each week. ## Many Disc Sightings, Hush-Hush Data Told

Are you susceptible to hysteria and does the mere thought that we here in Los Angeles may be under observation by space ships from other planets give you the creeps?

Or are you one of the sceptics who smile fatuously at the mention of flying saucers?

At any rate, in the National Press Building, in Washington, D. C. this morning Major Donald E. Keyhoe, U. S. Marine Corps (retired), author of "Flying Saucers From Outer Spaces," published by Henry Holt, held a press conference, presenting to writers and foreign correspondents evidence to prove his conclusions that the scores and scores of sightings of flying saucers are evidence that this country is under observation by aircraft from outer space.

He has worked closely with the U. S. Air Force Project Bluebook, investigating flying saucer sightings, and from Intelligence has obtained the release of hush-hush reports hitherto unpublished because they could cause nation-wide fear.

### Reports Saucers 'Buzzed' White House

These releases mark a departure in Intelligence policy, indicating a desire to inform the public so that if one of the saucers should make a landing the people would not see in it cause for hysteria.

He says that the Air Force has motion pictures of saucers in flight, that Air Force Radar has tracked flying saucers at speeds above 7000 miles an hour, and that for some hours a formation of flying saucers hovered over Washington and actually "buzzed" the White House.

We quote from his book.

"On the afternoon of Jan. 7, 1948 a huge, round, glowing object was sighted by hundreds of people at Madisonville, Kentucky... State police estimated it to be at least 250 feet in diameter... Thirty minutes later it appeared over Godman Air Force Base not far from Fort Knox... As it hovered over the field, alternately glowing red and white, Captain Thomas Mantell, flying a F-51 passed over and was asked to investigate.

Service, who provided perhaps the world's first interpretation of immigration laws re little men.

"Brush Creek is not a port of entry," he said.

"Men from Mars are not citizens. Non-citizens are aliens. Aliens without visas issued by American Consulates cannot enter. There is no American Consul on Mars or anywhere else in outer space."

But such visitors would not be sent away without a hearing, according to Holton, who further observed, "It is inconceivable, however, that the outcome would be other than an order of exclusion and deportation to point of origin, aboard whatever carrier brought them here -- and at the carrier's expense."

A Mr. Pre at Locronan, France, published an ad in the Brest Telegramme offering a reward of 10 million francs (\$28,000) to anyone "who brings me a live inhabitant of the planet Mars."

#### Germans See Saucers

Germans were also seeing saucers. In Muenster a 42-year-old movie projectionist, Franz Hoge, said he watched some weird little men get out of a cigar-shaped craft. He first noticed a bright blue light and thought it must be a crashed airplane. But upon closer examination he saw the strange machine hovering about six ft. above the ground and giving off a brilliant blue radiance which nearly blinded him.

Then he saw four creatures about three and one-half ft. in height. They had "thick-set bodies, oversized heads and delicate legs," and wore rubber-like clothing. Hogue observed the machine and the little men for about ten minutes from about 200 ft. away, but was afraid to go any closer.

#### Russian Saucers?

If other saucerians had long black hair, kissed earthians and took on other Freudian connotations, a saucer pilot in Sardinia had a political axe to grind.

Giuseppe Milla claims to have seen "an aviator clad in luminous overalls" alight from the saucer. The aviator is said to have fled when Milla approached but to have left a package containing anti-Communist propaganda, printed in Hungarian, behind.



Freudian connotations?

In Russia, where it was unpopular to see saucers, no sightings were reported. Don't worry about a saucer attack, the Communist party line assured the world.

They are not an unknown weapon, but simply large pieces of cardboard, wrapped in silver paper, attached to balloons and lighted with 15 lamps powered by a battery.

This statement came from the newspaper Contempranul, published in Communist Romania.



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

The Reds further reflected, "With this primitive instrument which it has brought to Europe, the United States wants to impress those people who believe American propoganda, and wants to stir up against Moscow a flying saucer psychosis."

Meanwhile some wondered why Russia, like the U.S. Air Force, was talking down saucers, as they recalled rumors of strange aircraft seen near the iron curtains. They wondered if there could be any truth to an article in the German picture magazine, FRANKFURTER ILLUSTRJETRE (Nov. 14 & 21, 1953 -- See Feb., 1954 SAUCERIAN), about the captured German scientist, Dr. Walter Lewetzow, generally regarded as a crackpot, but whose anti-gravity theory, it was said, had been developed into a power source by the Russians, who were actually powering saucers with it.

The Germans were also having a crack at theorizing. Hans Haffner, an eminent German astronomer of Hamburg, had the opinion that the saucers -- apart from those which could be classed as hallucinations or reflections in the air -- were "balls of lightening at great heights." All this in an article in the West German weekly newspaper, Die Zeit.

Fact Or Fiction?

THE SAUCERIAN wondered if most of the little men tales were hoaxes or of the imagination, touched off one by the other. Or if they were mainly true, it would seem there were a variety of saucers and saucerians giving earth a look-see.

In England, Patric Campbell, who writes a popular column, "Patric Campbell's Piece," for the Sunday Dispatch, said the stories "all have an increasingly powerful tendency to make me think."

"The arrival of these spacemen will, of course, have a profound effect upon all existing international and racial animosities. Broadly speaking, indeed, the arrival of the spacemen might well bring about in a few moments the ideal of world unity that has eluded for centuries the most devoted efforts of human beings.

"Personally, however, I have less interest in the global effect of such a landing than in the question of what for the love of Mike I'm going to do when I see one of these child-size figures in transparent sacking looking at me, with intentions I cannot possibly define.

"I don't imagine...that I shall jump up immediately and rush out of my shed, extending the glad hand of welcome. There's bound to be an interval of several minutes for prickings, vertigo, cold sweat and shortage of breathing. It will be up to me, then, to demonstrate that my feelings toward the visitor are warmer and less susceptible to change even than the love of Romeo for Juliet, or vice, if necessarily versa. Because, of course, I shan't know for some time if the visitor is male or female -- or whether the visitor thinks I'm male or female. Indeed, under the circumstances, I'll be pretty lucky if I know myself.

"But how can I find a practical method, in which there must lie no possibility of misunderstanding, of showing this great love? I'm not so sure about the glad hand of welcome. I can't see if the visitor's got any hands, himself. If I advance upon him, sticking out five pink tubes, he may think it's my death-ray gun and let me have a taste of his before we have a chance to clear up the confusion.

"What about smiling? I have no guarantee that they have smiles where he comes from. I don't even know if they've got teeth. If he sees me bearing down upon him with a great gap in my face fitted with two snapping, serrated edges, he may think I'm going to bite him in the helmet and let in the deadly terrestrial air."

In March of 1959, Mrs. Moore sent me a postcard, saying that they had recently had another visit - this time by two men from Wright-Patterson Field, and that she would tell me more about it if I cared to come over. I went to see the Moores, and on that occasion Olden told me that a saucer researcher named Dan Haber had come to him and had convinced him to make a tape recording about his saucer experience. Moore had made the tape to please Haber, and the latter had apparently proceeded to circulate the tape and even sent a copy of it to the Air Force. It was because of this tape that the two officers from Wright-Patterson visited Moore. This official visit, rather

than the earlier ones, is probably the one which entered into the discussion between Mr. Moseley and Col. Friend.

In any case, these officers from Wright Field told Olden that what he had undoubtedly seen, back in November 1957, was a giant fireball. They said that on rare occasions these huge fireballs were seen for periods of very short duration before disappearing or vanishing from sight. Moore's wife was convinced from this conversation that what her husband had seen was indeed a fireball, but Olden told me that while he let the officers think they had convinced him, they didn't change his mind one bit. He told me: "I know I saw a solid object that night, because I was close enough to it to see the reflection of the moonlight on the object's mirror-like surface. It wasn't any fireball. I know what I saw and nothing they said changed my mind on that score."

It is entirely possible that Col. Friend is unaware of the events that took place at the time of Moore's sighting. If this is the case, then, - smugly thinking he knew all the answers, - he accurately told Mr. Moseley what little he did know about the matter. Or, perhaps an inaccurate version of the case had been given to him by someone else. From my personal knowledge of Olden Moore, one thing is certain: Either Col. Friend was ignorant of Moore's visit to Washington or else he withheld the real facts from Moseley. There is no doubt in my mind that Olden Moore is telling the truth!

### THE MYSTERY OF THE DISAPPEARING PLANES

- by Sandy Moseley -

Readers of Major Donald Keyhoe's book "The Flying Saucer Conspiracy" will recall his description of the amazing case of the disappearance of five Navy planes off the coast of Florida on December 5th, 1945. This disappearance has been called one of the greatest and most incredible mysteries in the history of manned flight. Recently the story has been told in more detail in a fascinating article appearing in the April 1962 issue of "The American Legion Magazine." It is from the latter source that the following article has been condensed.

On December 5th, 1945, a flight of five TBM Avenger bombers took off on a routine patrol flight from the U.S. Naval Air Station at Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The weather was clear, and flying conditions were almost ideal. The flight leader's plane carried a crew of two, while the remaining four carried three men each. All of these fourteen men had flight and navigation experience ranging from as little as thirteen months to as much as six years. The planes were expected to make a triangular patrol, flying east for about 160 miles, north for 40 miles, and then back to Fort Lauderdale.

of an unidentified man near Fort Collins who said he saw a gray, disc-shaped object come down to earth in daylight, though no details are given in this story. According to the county sheriff, checks by ground and air search parties failed to turn up any sign of the various UFO's that had been sighted....

George Gruber, a physics lecturer at Rhodes University in South Africa, stated recently that he has been receiving radio signals from Jupiter on two wavelengths since July 24th. The transmissions sound exactly the same, like waves breaking on a pebbly beach, and have no sign of intelligence to them.....On the evening of September 2nd, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Bacigalupo of Chicago, Illinois made a close sighting. They were sitting on the porch of their home when they saw a huge saucer, lit up from the inside, with a row of red lights around its center. It was flying slowly just above the tops of the trees.....Numerous people near Richwood, West Virginia, saw a weird triangle-shaped UFO last September 26th. One of the witnesses was a private pilot named Robert Kerns who was flying at 1,000 feet when his plane almost collided with the object. He described it as a triangle about 12 feet tall that looked like aluminum tubing. It had a light in each corner.....On the night of July 29th, a brightly-lit object was seen on and near the ground by many people living in the vicinity of Lincoln, Wisconsin. It seemed to have antennas, according to the witnesses. It was seen at a considerable distance, floating near the ground most of the time, and occasionally rising higher to do "U-turns" and other unusual motions in the sky....

In Jacksonville, Florida, a number of strange lights, accompanied by power failures, were reported on October 4th. One of the most unusual stories was told by Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Raker, who saw a ball of fire moving through a field behind their house, just at twilight. Mrs. Baker said that she looked out her window and saw a round ball with a pinkish light that almost blinded her. It hovered outside her kitchen window, less than six feet away, and then floated around the corner of the house and crossed the road they live on. Another woman claimed that a formless glow moved right through her house, greatly scaring her and her children.....On the night of August 2nd, a series of brilliantly-colored flying objects lit up the runways of the airport at Liberal, Kansas, and were seen by many people there. Similar reports were made at the same time in Albuquerque, New Mexico; Pueblo, Colorado; Garden City, Kansas, and Guymon, Oklahoma.

About October 18th, two youths living in Ogallala, Nebraska, reported that they saw a lighted UFO fall from the sky, and that the object followed their car at speeds above 25 mph. The sighting, plus an explosion accompanying it, was confirmed by many people over a wide area, but the story told by the two young men was the strangest. They said that they approached to within a short distance of the object, which was on the ground, and then got out of their car. As they did so, it started moving toward them. The UFO was about "half or 3/4 of a block long and about a street's width wide," according to the boys. It was a plain white light, dim around the edges and flat on the ground. It did not seem to have any height or to be a solid form.....On August 6th, a "mother ship" was seen to give birth to a "baby" by Ed Olson of Pasco, Washington. The

(Here Swift states, in a matter of fact manner, that the astronomers have discovered two moons of Mars, and he gives their distances from the planet and their periods of revolution.)


"If any town should engage in rebellion or mutiny, fall into violent factions, or refuse to pay the usual tribute, the king has two methods of reducing them to obedience. The first and mildest is, of course, by keeping the island hovering over such a town and the lands around it, whereby he can deprive them of the benefit of the sun and rain, and consequently afflict the inhabitants with dearth and diseases; and if the crime deserves it, they are at the same time pelted with great stones, against which they have no defense...."

Is there any reason to take seriously this suggestion of an "island in the sky" populated by scientists and powered by an anti-gravity device? The remarkable accuracy of Swift's statements about the moons of Mars forces us to take a good long look at the rest of his claims. At least we can examine them for consistency, and perhaps do some second guessing in terms of our present-day scientific information.

The island of Laputa, says Swift, consists of a base rock layer two hundred yards thick, covered with a one hundred yard layer of topsoil. This would make the island weigh something like 100 million pounds, assuming a conservative figure of 5 for the average density of the island. It is simply not possible for an axle 12 inches in diameter to sustain such a weight, and that is what Swift seems to think is happening. The loadstone, at best, could only be a small guiding force working in conjunction with a gravity nullifying device.

A close look at the forces involved will explain our point. In order to move the island, three forces must be overcome: The island's weight must be counterbalanced; the inertia of the island must be overcome to get it moving, and to stop or change the direction of movement; and finally, wind resistance must be overcome. Even at the leisurely 2½ miles per hour which Swift experienced on his trip to Lagado, the wind resistance of the island would be tremendous. An anti-gravity device would, theoretically, take care of the weight and possibly the inertia of the island, leaving the loadstone to battle wind resistance alone. But it is inconceivable that the spindly arrangement in the Astronomer's Cave could manage such forces. Compare the amount of rigging required on a sailing vessel with the size and mounting of the loadstone.

The loadstone can't have the force field properties of a magnet and operate in the manner Swift describes. He says that the stone can be "moved by the weakest hand," and that it will remain in any position the operator chooses. "When the stone is placed parallel to the horizon, the island stands still; for in that case the extremities of it, being at equal distance from the earth, act with equal force, one in drawing downward, the other in pushing upwards, and consequently no motion can ensue." But if one end of the stone attracted the earth and the other repelled the earth with force enough to move that great mass, the loadstone would flip to a vertical position, with the attracting side down, and stay there. Nothing could move it. For the loadstone to function as advertised, it would have to be a ray device, emanating attracting and repelling rays from its ends.

Williamson had come into the saucer field as a result of the evangelical activities of the "Essenes of Kosmon" movement, the Faithist propagators of the Oahspe Bible. Since that time, Adamski has prepared himself to move on to greener pastures, and Williamson has continued to prevaricate at about the same rate as always, except that he has discredited himself with greater regularity than before, owing to the arrival on the scene of people who have even more in common with my Persian rugs than the redoubtable Ric.

The Oahspe Bible dates from an era when men still loved the sound of words, and would read outrageously dull novels and horrid sermons just for the sound of a few good round proper nouns such as abound in Trollope and the Old Testament. It is one of almost a hundred works that appeared during the 1870's which claimed to summarize the sum total of the wisdom

of all ages, together with observations on their history, political, economic and moral systems, all within the convenient compass of one volume. The greatest and most berated of these books was Helena Blavatsky's "The Secret Doctrine." The worst and most highly praised was John Ballou Newbrough's "Oahspe: A New Bible in the Words of Jehovih and His Angel Advisors," etc., ad nauseum. While Blavatsky's work is preserved today by the Theosophical Society, - a dull, unimaginative, almost conservative type group - Newbrough's opus has engendered the fanatical enthusiasm of one of the most likable groups of crackpots in the history of lunatic fringes. They are called the Essenes of Kosmon, or the Faithists, as mentioned above.

If the lack of word meaning is our problem, its profusion is Oahspe's greatest sin. There are words, rich in tone, weighed down with hidden meaning, - soft, gentle, unpronounceable, beautiful, sedate, and irreproachable. The words, words, words of Jehovih - such as "Hoogalomarakkadanapanwowow king of Itussakegollahamganseocolabah" (Page 369.)

In saying that Oahspe brings all the history of Man within the convenient limits of a single volume, I should mention that it has almost a thousand pages, many of which display diagrams and drawings worthy of a kabbalistic treatise, and in some cases even more puzzling. The Oahspe Bible is very unevenly divided into "Books," the titles of which are even more reminiscent of Mormonism than the contents: The Voice of Man; Book of Cpenta-Armig, Daughter of Jehovih; The Book of Divinity; and the like. The longest is the Book of Saphah, which boasts 24 subdivisions all of its own, including one entitled "Arbania'hiayaustoyi."

Anyone who suspects me of having written my series on extraterrestrialism as a work of fiction should long ago have been aware of the fact that, for sheer scope and breadth of conception, my version of human history is sadly deficient as compared with the overpowering elixir of Newbroughsia, (as I should like to call the malady of Oahspeism.) It has ever been the device of the contriving theorist to present his beliefs in a form so all-inclusive and over-bearing that critics would be effectively silenced by its sheer mass. Joseph Smith knew how to do this; Helena Blavatsky knew; Bishop Usher knew; Jesus Christ also knew how to do this; and so did John Newbrough. The average American of the 1870's owned few books, but his attitude toward the written word differed from that of Medieval and Classical Man because of the availability of newspapers and periodicals, which were inexpensive compared to books, and which were produced in an abundance all out of proportion to the number of books printed, - a condition that persists even now. Journalism has

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the Earth. Therefore there is no stationary temperate zone between the bright and dark sides as Adamski claims. Adamski is still further confused, for while in his temperate zone, he describes a day during which the sun rises and sets. How could it do so if there are permanently light and dark sides on the moon?

Even housewives know that the sweat that forms on metals such as water pipes, and on glass window panes, does not come from within these materials. It condenses from the air when the air is humid and the metal or glass is colder than the air. So Adamski's claim that everything must have moisture in it, and that there is air and water on the moon, is "all wet"!

There are many reasons why the moon has no air or moisture, and all scientific observations and measurements prove this to be true. So again the Professor's "known law and common sense logic" are all wrong.


But then, so do many other writers of saucer books. So if you are seeking the truth about flying saucers, be on your guard against FBI.

#### RECENT NEWS STORIES

**CLOSE SIGHTING BY CALIFORNIA POLICEMEN:** A huge object said to be at least the size of an airplane, emitting an extremely red beam of light ten feet or more across, was reported flying at low levels east of Corning, California, on the night of August 13th. The UFO was first spotted by two highway patrolmen, who saw what appeared to be a huge airliner dropping from the sky as if it were about to crash. They stopped their car and jumped out in order to get a better look. The policemen heard no noise at all, but they still assumed it was an aircraft with its engines off.


Then, when the object was within 100 to 200 feet of the ground, it suddenly reversed its direction, and rapidly gained altitude until it was at approximately 500 feet. The strange craft was surrounded with a glow causing it to appear oblong. There were red lights at each end and on the sides, and at times white lights could be seen between the red ones. The startled police called the nearest sheriff's office, and also reported the sighting to the county radar base. According to the patrolmen, officials at the base said they were tracking an unidentified object on radar, but newspaper reporters were unable to confirm this.

As the patrolmen continued to watch the object, it came directly toward their car on two occasions, each time sweeping the area with a huge red light. As the UFO came within a mile of the officers, they turned on the flashing red light of the patrol car, and it immediately went away from them. The officers said that the UFO used its red light to sweep the area six or seven different times. The object then started moving slowly toward the east, and the police followed it in their car for several miles, until reaching a fire station, at which time they saw a similar object approach the first one from the south. The second UFO moved close to the first,

ing is mentioned briefly in Keyhoe's second book. In 1953 I made a long trip around the country interviewing saucer sighters, including Mr. Squires. I obtained details about him and his sighting that Keyhoe never knew about. Here is an outline of the story:

William Squires lives on a farm near Pittsburg, Kansas. On August 27th, 1952, he was driving to

work, when at about 5:30 a.m. (just as the sun was coming up) he saw an object shaped like two oblong saucers placed on top of each other. The object was hovering about 10 feet off the ground, about 100 yards from the road. It was between 75 and 125 feet long and about a third as wide. The UFO made a sputtering noise of some sort, and had a large number of very small propellers around its perimeter. There were three or four windows in a row, with blue lights shining out from them. Shadowy forms - perhaps people or machinery - were moving about inside the craft, and there was one smaller window behind which Squires could see a shadowy face. The UFO was visible for about a minute before it took off at great speed and disappeared in a matter of seconds. Later that day Squires returned to the exact spot with an Air Force investigator, who saw that the high grass in the area had been flattened down from the force of the wind made by the strange machine.

Years have gone by, and William Squires has not written a book, made any lectures, or "cashed in" on his experience in any way. In 1953 when I visited him he was known in his community as a sane and honest man. I assume that he is still known as a sane and honest man. The question is, Col. Tacker, what did this man see? Was it a temperature inversion, a bird, a spec in his eye, a vivid dream, a hypnotic suggestion from the Dark Forces, or what? Until Col. Tacker can solve this case and scores of others like it, we will have to relegate his book to the "light fiction" department, rather than consider it the factual study it purports to be.



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buyer who is said to be (as the Hollanders so aptly put it) "under the law." Mr. Otis T. Carr is still earthbound, and our old stand-by Mr. Townsend Brown's device is, I understand, still hovering a few feet off the concrete floor of a magnificent laboratory, but still with one aggravating wire trailing to the ground. Meanwhile, a shop on the Avenue de Capuchin in Paris has again had a window full of dandy little "saucers" hovering in mid-air in air jets, supersonic beams, and simple magnetic repulsion devices. Also, of course, Hover-Craft have been blossoming all over.

Then there's another side to the coin - the Russians. I'm beginning to think that the best thing that ever happened to America is the Russians. Nothing - not even the Depression, World War II, or TV - seemed to have been able to jolt us out of our com-

placent lethargy until little Sputnik sailed aloft. To heck with so-called modern ideas in education! 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
publicized their books. Surprisingly enough, even Moseley, who purported to espouse the "Earth Theory," gave most publicity to the contactee side of the picture.

Dan Fry's experience, although dated back in 1950, was not actually published until 1954. The sequence of the "contact story" buildup seems to have been planned by the CIA as follows:

- (1) "Little Green Men" stories - 1949-1950. No witnesses. (To "soften up" the public and start discussion of "space visitors.")
- (2) Contact by voice radio. Dan Fry, 1950. Also radio contact by Laimon Streeter with Williamson's and McCoy's group in 1952.
- (3) Contact with a human being "from space." Adamski, desert, 1952.
- (4) Contact with English-speaking humans "from space," and flights into "space." Adamski, 1953, at Camp Irwin, California.
- (5) Visits to "other planets." Angelucci, Nelson. (1952, 1954.)
- (6) Publicity for "midgets" contacting the general public, not restricting contacts to the "chosen few" contactees. 1955.
- (7) Publicity for full-size "human space people" contacting earth people. (Howard Menger, the Planetary Center, the California contact clubs, etc.) (1956-1957.)
- (8) Anti-Atom-Bomb propaganda disseminated by saucer clubs, all over the world. (1957.) (This led to the cessation of bomb tests in 1958.)
- (9) Current status of contactee cults: Most of the "saucer club" activity these days is oriented to the belief that "space people" are here on earth; that they are identical to human beings; and that either the human race originally came from other planets or the other planets were originally colonized from Earth; etc., etc. You pays your money and takes your choice. But the fraction of "saucer research" activity that is connected with technical subjects, such as propulsion, etc., is very small or almost nil, these days, and the whole subject of "saucers" now really means "space people." (1958-1962)

.....Although in 1952-1957, after seeing the Tremonton films in a private showing at the Pentagon (which I now realize was arranged by the CIA,

acting through Col. W. A. Adams of Air Force Intelligence), I firmly believed that flying saucers were real objects, I no longer believe this. I had thought that these were "secret U.S. aircraft or missiles," and perhaps that is what the CIA was hoping the intelligence agents of other countries would believe. But all during that period, my friends who worked in other Government agencies kept telling me that we had no such devices. I nevertheless believed that we did, and that it was

# SEERESS LOOKS AT 1964

## 'Thin Win for Democrats'

WASHINGTON: The Democrats will come up from behind to snatch victory in the presidential race next November, according to Jeane Dixon, Washington's world-famed seeress, who says:

"The crystal ball shows a paperthin majority for the Democratic slate. This will be an upset because the Republican ticket will be running ahead until the last votes are counted."

Mrs. Dixon, who in 1956 accurately foretold that a blue-eyed Democratic President elected in 1960 would be assassinated, more recently pinpointed the tragic event five days before it occurred."

Of President Lyndon B. Johnson she says: "I am not sure that he will run for the presidency this fall. He is still in a position of watchful waiting, but I am happy to report that the symbols show he has a firm grasp and control on our internal situation, which is crucial now."

### 'BIGGEST PROBLEMS'

Jeane's crystal ball tells her that our most pressing current problems are "racial, and Red China."

She says the former problem will be intensified during the year ahead "through Red China's infiltration in Africa, in Communist channels here, and its use of Cuban bases to foment race riots in the United States."

She sees great danger in both domestic and foreign affairs for the United States during 1964-67.

This, she says will be

heightened by a new leader who will replace Chairman Nikita Khrushchev within the next 18 months in Russia.

"This man's name begins with an S. He is the professorial, intellectual type," Jeane declares. "He is not too tall in stature, and he will be much harder for us to deal with than Khrushchev."

"He is already working with Soviet, Chinese and German scientists, and this combination is plotting our destruction by gigantic weapons capable of neutralizing our radar and immobilizing our communications for many hours. He will seek to destroy us, but he will not succeed."

During 1964, Mrs. Dixon insists, the United States "will interfere less in foreign governments."

In Britain, the Conservative Party will win by a small majority, she says.

England will increase its volume of trade with Russia, and Germany and Russia will establish greater economic ties.

The Berlin wall will come down, Mrs. Dixon forecasts, but probably not before the year's end.

President Charles de Gaulle of France will surrender his powers during 1964. Russia will continue

to turn to the West rather than the East politically, and India will face new economic troubles.

Her crystal ball tells her that last February a child was born in the region of Egypt who is destined to "be the greatest power for world good since the coming of Christ."


