considered appointee to be person of excellent character, reputation, and morals. Both recommended appointee for position of trust in the Government. Philadelphia confidential informants [REDACTED] advised appointee considered "unethical" in business matters. They alleged as follows: WALKER served on Board of Directors, Bellefonte Trust Company. WALKER's activities as a member of the Board of Directors, Bellefonte Trust Company, relative to attempted establishment of branch bank in State College, Pa., set forth. WALKER allegedly refuses to "open" purchasing procedures of Pennsylvania State University to public. It was alleged approximately 80 percent of the office equipment of Pennsylvania State University was supplied by [REDACTED] brother of [REDACTED] attorney for Pennsylvania State University. [REDACTED] Pennsylvania State University, allegedly saved the university \$20,000 by having coal "trucked" into the university in preference to use of rail. This action allegedly alienated member of Pennsylvania State University Board of Directors who was employed by Pennsylvania Railroad. [REDACTED] thereafter resigned his position. [REDACTED] banking officials, advised WALKER's efforts to establish branch bank in State College area well founded. Both believed WALKER to be honest and trustworthy. Both recommended WALKER for position of trust with Government. Credit **excellent**; arrest checks negative.

At University Park, Pa.

On March 2, 1962, [REDACTED] Pennsylvania State University, advised as follows:

Since previously interviewed on May 3, 1960, he has continued employment as the [REDACTED] ERIC ARTHUR WALKER, of Pennsylvania State University. He said he could only reiterate that WALKER is a person of very fine character, reputation, and morals. He recommended him highly for a position of trust with the Government. There was no reason to doubt the loyalty of WALKER.

In January 1962, WALKER was elected President of the Engineers Joint Council, which is composed of 15 separate engineering societies. It is considered to be the top award for those in the engineering profession. In addition, WALKER has been appointed to other positions of trust in the Government. He has been appointed President of the Board of Directors of "Sirimar" (international society for marine research). He said "Sirimar" is an Italian corporation which is under contract to NATO to conduct research in matters regarding anti-submarine warfare.

He furnished the following biographical data regarding Dr. ERIC ARTHUR WALKER:

He felt that the above biographical material speaks for itself and again recommended WALKER for a position of trust with the Government.

On March 2, 1962, Dr. [REDACTED] of Engineering and Architecture, advised since he was previously contacted on May 4, 1960, he has maintained close personal contact with Dr. ERIC ARTHUR WALKER. He considered him to be a person of very fine character, reputation, and morals. There was no reason to question the loyalty of Dr. WALKER. He felt he could recommend him highly for a position of trust in the Government.

He said he continues to be a social contact of Dr. WALKER's. In addition, they often play squash together as Dr. WALKER believes firmly in physical fitness. He has found Dr. WALKER to be an excellent sportsman. He felt that Dr. WALKER would be a real asset to any position of trust given him in the Government.

On March 5, 1962, Philadelphia confidential informant [redacted] advised as follows:

Appointee was considered to be a person who had above-average ability. He was an outstanding member of the engineering profession. As President of Pennsylvania State University, he accepted a position on the Board of Directors of the First Bellefonte Bank and Trust Company, Bellefonte, Pa. Soon thereafter, WALKER exhibited an "unethical" method of doing business. He cited as an example efforts of WALKER to establish a branch of the First National Bank of Bellefonte in the State College area. WALKER directed a letter using stationery of Pennsylvania State University in which he pointed out the alleged need for additional bank services in the State College area. In this letter, WALKER failed to mention that he was a member of the Board of Directors of the First National Bank of Bellefonte, which had applied to the Pennsylvania State Banking Association for permission to establish a branch in the State College area. It was further alleged that since this appointment as a director with that bank, WALKER has given [redacted]

It was alleged that WALKER has [redacted] of Pennsylvania State University. It was estimated that [redacted] for Pennsylvania State University was furnished by [redacted] Bellefonte, Pa. [redacted] is a brother of [redacted] who is an attorney for Pennsylvania State University. Both are close personal friends of President WALKER.

[redacted] advised no information ever came to his attention which would cause any doubt as to the loyalty of appointee to the United States.

On March 5, 1962, Philadelphia confidential informant [redacted] advised as follows:

No information was ever received which would cause any doubt as to the loyalty of the appointee to the United States.

He furnished background information concerning [redacted] Administration, Pennsylvania State University, who resigned under "unusual circumstances." It was noted [redacted] had

instituted a program of delivering coal to the university through the use of trucks. It resulted in a saving to Pennsylvania State University of approximately \$20,000 a year. It was alleged that a member of the Board of Directors of Pennsylvania State University was an official of the Pennsylvania Railroad. This official, name unknown, objected vehemently relative to the loss of business by the Pennsylvania Railroad. This matter was brought to the attention of [redacted] by WALKER, and [redacted] thereafter offered his resignation and it was accepted. It was stated that [redacted] believed it to be in the best interest of Pennsylvania State University for details regarding that transaction which triggered his resignation to remain concealed from the general public. [redacted] was unable to furnish any additional information regarding appointee.

On March 8, 1962, [redacted] Federal Savings and Loan Association, Bellefonte, Pa., advised as follows:

WALKER is a controversial figure in the State College area. He is extremely able and intelligent. He is considered to be honest and trustworthy. His ethics were questioned when he became a Director of the First National Bank of Bellefonte, approximately 1957. At the present time WALKER is a Director of the First Bellefonte Bank and Trust Company and has held that position since January 1960. That bank is now the principal depository for funds of Pennsylvania State University. WALKER, approximately two years ago, attempted to have a branch of that bank established in the State College area. This action was well founded because of inadequate banking facilities in the State College area. His efforts to establish a branch bank met with negative results.

WALKER has a close personal relationship with [redacted] attorney for Pennsylvania State University, and [redacted] his brother. [redacted] is in the office furniture business, and his principal customer is Pennsylvania State University. [redacted] submits bids for all contracts with the university, and there is no reason to believe that his business dealings are other than legitimate.

In the past, [REDACTED] submitted a bid for furniture of approximately \$20,000. This bid was furnished to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] bid was the lowest of those submitted but was not accepted by [REDACTED] because in the margin he had written notes. The contract was awarded to the next highest bidder. [REDACTED] objected vehemently to [REDACTED] regarding his action. [REDACTED] believed [REDACTED] erred in this transaction.

It was believed WALKER had the reputation of being "short" with people and that he had few real friends. This was caused to some extent by his own personality and to some degree because of the position he holds as President of Pennsylvania State University.

On March 8, 1962, [REDACTED] First Bellefonte Bank and Trust Company, Bellefonte, advised as follows:

He has been acquainted with ERIC ARTHUR WALKER for approximately ten years. WALKER on January 1, 1960, became a Director of their bank. On December 24, 1957, he had been elected a Director of the First National Bank of Bellefonte. When that bank merged with Bellefonte Trust Company, January 1, 1960, WALKER became a Director of his bank.

He considered WALKER to be a person of excellent character, reputation, and morals. He felt that WALKER had good business ethics. Approximately two years ago, WALKER attempted to establish a branch of their bank in the State College area because of the inadequate banking facilities being offered in State College. Because of politics, they were unable to establish a branch bank in the State College area.

He recommended WALKER highly for a position of trust and responsibility with the Government.

CREDIT AND ARREST

On March 1, 1962, [REDACTED] Manager, Centre-County Credit Bureau, advised their files reflected a report regarding ERIC A. and JOSEPHINE S. WALKER dated

February 1960. WALKER at that time was President of Pennsylvania State University. He was married and resided with his wife JOSEPHINE and their two children on the campus of Pennsylvania State University. He maintained an excellent credit rating.

On March 2, 1962, [REDACTED] clerk, State College Police Department, State College, Pa., advised their files failed to contain any information regarding appointee or relatives.

At Bellefonte, Pa.

On March 1, 1962, [REDACTED] Prothonotary, Centre County, Bellefonte, advised their files contained no information regarding appointee or relatives.

DETAILS: AT WASHINGTON, D. C.EMPLOYMENTS

On February 28, 1962, Mrs. [REDACTED] Personnel Officer, The White House Office, advised SA [REDACTED] b7C the appointee has not yet entered on duty with The White House Office and said her files contained no additional pertinent information regarding him. She said that any prior employment with the National Science Board could be verified at the National Science Foundation.

On March 7, 1962, Mrs. [REDACTED] Supervisor, Personnel Records section, National Science Foundation, made available the appointee's file to SA [REDACTED] b7C. That file revealed the additional information that the appointee was appointed May 1, 1960 as consultant in the Office of the Director, National Science Foundation. On July 31, 1960, his services were terminated. The file contained no additional pertinent information.

Mrs. [REDACTED] stated there is no one currently available who would have worked with the appointee during the above period.

On March 7, 1962, Mr. [REDACTED] Security Officer, National Science Foundation, advised SA [REDACTED] the files of his office contained no additional pertinent information regarding the appointee.

The following investigation at the Naval Research Advisory Committee, Office of Naval Research, was conducted by SA [REDACTED] on March 9, 1962:

Miss [REDACTED] Supervisor, Personnel Records section, Office of Naval Research, made available the appointee's file which revealed he was re-appointed January 1, 1962, to a three year term on the Naval Research Advisory Committee. The files contained no additional pertinent information.

Mr. [REDACTED] Security Officer, Office of Naval Research, advised their files contained no record for the appointee.

Dr. [REDACTED] Office of the Chief, Office of Naval Research, advised his comments regarding the appointee would be substantially the same as those he furnished when previously interviewed in 1960. He said he knows nothing of an adverse nature regarding the appointee and knows him officially through infrequent visits by the appointee to Washington, D. C. in connection with the Naval Research Advisory Committee.

Mr. [REDACTED] Naval Research Advisory Committee, advised he knows the appointee professionally through the appointee's coming to meetings in Washington, D. C. He said the Naval Research Advisory Committee meets three or

four times a year. He said his comments regarding the appointee are substantially the same as those he furnished in 1960 and said he would recommend the appointee for a position of trust and confidence.

CREDIT AND POLICE AGENCIES CHECKS

The files of the Credit Bureau Incorporated were caused to be searched on February 28, 1962, by IC [REDACTED] and contained no record for the appointee or his wife, JOSEPHINE WALKER.

On March 15, 1962, [REDACTED] of Engineering, Pennsylvania State University, advised as follows:

He has been acquainted with WALKER from [REDACTED] to the present. He considered WALKER to be an outstanding member of the academic community. WALKER was termed a person of excellent character, reputation, and morals. He said he could only furnish information of a favorable nature regarding WALKER. He recommended him highly for a position of trust with the government.

He described WALKER as a person with extreme intelligence. WALKER does not have any sympathy for any member of the faculty who would like to "vegetate" on the campus. He drives himself very hard and expects the most of his employees. WALKER is socially "graceful." He is very moderate in his use of alcoholic beverages.

Mr. [REDACTED] studied under [REDACTED] at Harvard University, who was the faculty advisor for WALKER. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that WALKER was very well thought of at Harvard and that he operated "on a high intellectual plane." WALKER is a person who possesses outstanding managerial ability. WALKER is never one to waste time. Whenever he goes on a trip, he always takes with him reading material of importance to his position as President of Pennsylvania State University. He reads at a very rapid pace and is considered to be an excellent administrator.

He believed that WALKER would do an exceptional job in any position given him in the government.

On March 15, 1962, [REDACTED] of Engineering and Architecture, Pennsylvania State University, advised he has been acquainted with WALKER from [REDACTED] to the present. For approximately [REDACTED] prior to [REDACTED] he was a neighbor of appointee's. He found WALKER to be a person of excellent character, reputation, and morals. He could only furnish information of a favorable nature regarding appointee. He recommended him highly for a position of trust with the government.

On March 15, 1962, [REDACTED] Department of Mineral Industries, Pennsylvania State University, advised he has been acquainted with ERIC WALKER since [REDACTED]. He said he could furnish nothing but favorable information regarding WALKER's character, reputation, and morals. He said there had been rumors on the campus regarding WALKER's association with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is reputed to be the principal supplier of office furniture to Pennsylvania State University. He felt that if there were anything questionable in this association, it would be known to [REDACTED] former [REDACTED] Pennsylvania State University, who is presently [REDACTED] University of Bridgeport, Bridgeport, Conn.

He advised WALKER does not have many close friends. WALKER "likes to run his own show." He said WALKER is extremely able and intelligent. He felt that WALKER would do a creditable job in any position of trust with the government, and he recommended him for any such job.

On March 15, 1962, [REDACTED] Pennsylvania State University, believed WALKER to be a person of excellent character, reputation, and morals. He has been acquainted with WALKER for approximately [REDACTED] years. There was no reason to question the loyalty of the appointee. He recommended him highly for a position of trust with the government.

At State College, Pa.

On March 15, 1962, [REDACTED] Bellefonte, Pa., advised as follows:

He has been acquainted with the appointee since [REDACTED]. At that time WALKER was in charge of the Ordnance Research Laboratory, which was being operated by Pennsylvania State University. As a result of doing business with the Ordnance Research Laboratory in selling them office equipment, he came to know appointee. They soon became close personal friends and have maintained that relationship up to the present time. He, WALKER, and [REDACTED] for Ordnance Research Laboratory, formed a corporation known as Centre Electronics Manufacturing and Engineering Company, Bellefonte, Pa. This company was formed for the specific purpose of manufacturing a machine which would assist in the detection of gallstones and kidney stones.

He stated when WALKER became Vice-President of Pennsylvania State University, he sold out his interest in Centre Electronics Manufacturing and Engineering Company to him for \$1.00. He did so lest there be a

conflict of interest between his duties at Pennsylvania State University and those with Centre Electronics. WALKER was considered to be completely ethical in business matters. He has never been an officer of [REDACTED]

Every contract that [REDACTED] receives from Pennsylvania State University is the result of a bid he submitted for the particular job. He understands that five bids are required. He said he was aware of "malicious gossip" which was heard around State College concerning his association with WALKER. He said this association has always been of a legitimate nature. He said the sources of the "malicious gossip" were his competitors.

WALKER is completely dedicated to the field of education and has turned down jobs in private industry which would pay him \$50,000 a year. He recalled WALKER's showing him a letter from Pullman Company, which reflected an offer of a position with that company for WALKER which would pay the \$50,000 a year. He asked WALKER when he was leaving, and WALKER advised that he was going to refuse the offer. WALKER told him that in his position as President of Pennsylvania State University he may be able to contribute something to the development of a scientist who would do some real good for mankind.

He recommended WALKER highly for a position of trust with the government.
