RE: Laurance S. Rockefeller Interest in Extraterrestrial Intelligence

This is to inquire as to progress on follow-up on our meeting with Laurance S. Rockefeller and his associates regarding extraterrestrial intelligence. You suggested that you would initiate an informal inquiry into the availability of information within federal agencies about the 1947 Roswell, New Mexico, event. Is there anything to report?

In this connection, I note that the proposed Executive Order on classification review is still being circulated among the agencies. What are the prospects for a relaxation of the classification system and do you think it will be helpful in producing more information about extraterrestrial intelligence?

Laurance's interest remains high and his approach continues to be one of being helpful to the President and the Administration. Recently, he has begun to wonder whether a U.N. Conference would be useful. Obviously, its success would, in large measure, depend upon meaningful participation by the U.S. Do you think this is a possibility?
