





UFO Matrix of Belief

The following is a matrix of the spectrum of scenarios found in current literature which are used to try to explain so-called UFO or ETI activity, or the lack thereof. Each matrix entry has a supporting constituency. Some of these constituencies are quite vocal, and others less so, but each are apparently confident that their current belief structures are the most reasonable, given the data which are generally accepted. There most certainly is a large minority which is not willing to commit to one matrix entry over another, or in combination, until additional data are available.

0. All sightings except for a small minority which lack detail can be explained in terms of naturally occurring phenomena.
1. Craft from off planet, but from the visible universe.
2. Interdimensional penetrations by intelligent life-forms, based in or operating from another (parallel) overlapping dimension than our own space-time.
3. Earth-based "others," referenced throughout history, who may be other life-forms, or predominately resident in realms or dimensions we term spiritual.
4. Hoaxes or dramatic scenarios perpetrated by various intelligence organizations as part of broader security or disinformation campaigns.
5. Broader social engineering, or population mind-influencing programs, designed to promote a more universal planetary consciousness and to reduce the influence of nationalistic or religious traditions.
6. Examples of technologies springing from multi-dimensional science, either Earth-based and surrounded by a bodyguard of lies, and / or non-Earth-based but rejected by most as outside the current scientific paradigm.
7. Any combination of the above, including "all of the above." Intent: unknown.




UFO MATRIX OF BELIEF (CONTINUED)

Possible U.S. Government levels of awareness, involvement and/or control of the phenomena termed UFO.

0. No activity, inasmuch as the phenomena are explained by naturally occurring events.
1. Aware, but not directly involved or in contact with the perpetrating forces.
2. In contact to some degree, and cooperating with at least some of the source-phenomena or entities, either for technology trading or because government believes it has no choice.
3. Government is the perpetrator of at least some of the phenomenology, perhaps drawing on the source experience for ideas and methods, but employing the events for other purposes, such as intelligence, disinformation or to alarm other nations.
4. At least some UFO phenomena are results of government or other agency sponsored experiments in mind-control, or social control experiments or initiatives.

Note: The Human Potential Foundation, Inc. does not endorse any of the entries of the preceding Matrix of Belief. The Matrix has been prepared to stimulate discussion and research into the broad spectrum of ideas that are represented in current literature addressing what are popularly known as UFO phenomena.

COMMENTARY ON UFO BIBLIOGRAPHY

Various perceptual phenomena grouped in common parlance as involving UFOs, or Unidentified Flying Objects, are having a significant and measurable impact on public consciousness and citizen concerns in the United States and worldwide.

Since the mid-1980s, preoccupation with what are termed "abduction phenomena" has resulted in emergent therapeutic and support system development in the psychiatric and psychological fields, and an expansive literature on the subject.

Public opinion surveys have consistently indicated public acceptance of and concern with these reported phenomena, as well as a hypothesized population either claiming involvement in such phenomena or exhibiting certain "qualifying" characteristics that some researchers opine may indicate some type of involvement in these phenomena, below the level of consciousness.

The purpose and direction of the attached bibliography, as outlined by this commentary, are to provide the reader with exposure to good examples of popular literature presenting a broad spectrum of analysis, beliefs and speculation concerning UFO phenomena.

The Foundation has not taken any position on the validity of the research and opinions contained and expressed in the referenced books.

The Foundation is planning an international conference, *When Cosmic Cultures Meet*, to take place in Washington, D.C., in April 1995. Presenters from a wide spectrum of disciplines and interests will address implications, preparations and responses for the time when there is no ambiguity about the understanding that cosmic cultures are meeting, and that Earth is one of the meeting grounds.

RELIGIOUS CONTEXTS AND CONCERNS

A relatively recent development in the UFO/Abduction issue has been the emergence of more books and periodical articles on the topic in books promoted



and sold through Evangelical outlets and Christian bookstores.

The interpretations and concerns expressed by this group of commentators are not completely new, nor are they relegated to fringe sects or authors. Given the political and social force represented by this population sector, its views are worth considering, especially when assessing circumstances that many observers agree have such a potentially significant impact on humanity's world view and perspectives about its own history, purpose and relation to "the universe."

The Rev. Billy Graham has made specific reference to the phenomenon (Graham, pages 148 & 149) in his writing, and his views were recently reinforced in a television interview Dr. Graham did with David Frost.

A recent book summarizing the concerns of the Evangelical Christian community is *UFOs in the New Age* (Alnor), which includes a credible history and analysis, from the Christian perspective, of how the phenomenon appears to that population. Alnor draws upon some of the more thoughtful researchers and writers in the UFO genre for analyses he uses in support of his concerns about the UFO phenomenon, the New Age movement and their impacts on society.

This sector of the field, and the relatively large and activist audience being reached by the Evangelical and Christian political-social movement's principal drivers, merit examination and understanding.

For a comprehensive analysis of the historical perspective, from the Christian viewpoint, we have included *The Alien Agenda*, (Wilson). Dr. Wilson gained early notice for his *Crash Go the Chariots*, which addressed the widely circulated writing and ancient astronaut theories of Erich Von Daniken, in the 1960s and early 1970s. Dr. Wilson's perspective, which is based on his seemingly thorough and reasonably accurate accounting of the modern-day UFO field, (from 1947 to present), makes his an interesting and representative approach to this sector of the field.

POLITICAL AND GOVERNMENTAL ISSUES

The literature generally supports widely held public perceptions that the U.S. Government, as well as the governments, military and intelligence commu-



nities of other nations, have had and maintain various degrees of interest in the phenomena collectively referred to as UFOs.

More recently, reports and books which seem to come from credible or sincere writers about their own or others' experiences, have alluded to possible U.S. Government or other agency involvement in UFO phenomena in more direct ways.

Timothy Good's *Above Top Secret* is a relatively comprehensive compendium and summary of the government-involvement component of the situation and thinking among UFO researchers, although they obviously will vary in their detailed analyses and conclusions.

Revelations (Vallee) is a provocative review of the various phenomena, reflecting Dr. Vallee's long career of independent thinking and analysis. The "Conclusion" of this book is particularly intriguing for its allusions to military intelligence and disinformation components in the UFO phenomenology.


Vallee's collective works have been among the most broad in their approach to attempting to study the UFO phenomenon from historical, folkloric and psycho-social perspectives. However, he carefully is not implying that UFO phenomena fails at all times to exhibit physical properties.

Vallee's other included book in this list reports on his recent visit to the former Soviet Union, and his encounters with sectors of the UFO investigative community there.

CRASHED DISC SCENARIOS AND COVER-UPS

One of the most popularly promoted and pervasive components of the UFO scene, and one which has enjoyed renewed and intensified interest in recent years, is the long-sustained story that (at various times) the U.S. Government obtained an alleged crashed saucer.

Various versions and investigations of this component of the UFO phenomenology allude to recovered remains of aliens, or "EBEs" (extraterrestrial biological entities). *UFO Crash at Roswell* (Randle & Schmitt) is a current report on these stories.



CONTACTEE EXPERIENCES AND STAGED ENCOUNTERS

Throughout the recent (1947 to present) history of the UFO phenomenon, well-publicized encounters between Earth citizens and the aliens have been reported. Some have likened these encounters to religious contacts, such as Marian visions at Lourdes and Fatima. Other scenarios have involved the "contactees" being taken on rides in alien craft to one destination or another, and with their variously receiving messages from purported alien personalities. Contactees are charged to go public to share the message, or to warn the planet about impending doom and the urgent need for planetary behavioral changes.

A recent and widely publicized series of encounters is reported in *The Gulf Breeze Sightings* (Walters), which like all such reported events, is mired in controversy about whether some or all of it was a staged hoax by the purported percipients of the events. This book is interesting, among other reasons, because it provides instructive description of how these kinds of controversies emerge from some kind of "source" phenomenology, as the percipient and society, the UFO investigative community, sympathetic scientists and the news media interact.

ABDUCTIONS

Clearly the most widely publicized and potentially troubling component of the UFO phenomenology is the increasing attention focused on what are termed "abductions."

It is in the abduction area that thinking from previously separate and even competitive UFO investigative sectors are converging, with hypotheses ranging from actual off-planet contact or alien science being done on humans, to questions about spiritual or demonic contacts as reflected throughout human history and theologies, to government or other-sponsored mind-control or societal engineering theories.

Careful reading of the literature, as well as primary research and investigations by the Foundation, have not yet led us to come to any specific conclusions



other than credible evidence exists that some combination of the Matrix entries included with the attached materials is taking place.

Clearly there has been some government involvement in the UFO phenomena in recent history. The intent, extent and perpetrators remain unclear and speculative.

But, that there are people who are coming forward perceiving that they have been involved in various abduction scenarios is undeniable.

While our introductory survey includes a spectrum of approaches and hypotheses, the Foundation's purpose in compiling this bibliography was not to advocate any particular viewpoint. Some very credible and thorough researchers and writers are giving this topic and related issues serious attention. There is both a growing public readership and body of thinking that are being influenced by these writings and the opinions and implications being purveyed.

Obviously any list would have to include the two most important (to the field) books by Whitley Strieber, which essentially launched the abduction-fascination to the broader public in 1987. Lesser known, but very interesting and informative, is Ed Conroy's *Report on Communion*, a narrative of the aftermath of publication of Strieber's books, and of the impacts on Strieber and UFO community at large.

Budd Hopkins' *Intruders*, which appeared at about the same time as Strieber's first book on the subject, provided the first overview of the current approach to the abduction scenario, as creating victims of purported alien hybridization schemes. Hopkins also discusses the methodologies used to explore the abductees' experiences, of interest because these methods are the subject of some controversy (Vallee, Fiore, Thompson).

David Jacobs' *Secret Life* is a more comprehensive survey of the abduction phenomenon, and credibly outlines the various approaches of investigators within the UFO community who have interests in this facet of the experience. Jacobs also does a credible summary of various hypotheses about what may be going on, given the research known publicly to be underway.

Dr. Edith Fiore's *Encounters* is another clinician's description of her experiences using hypnosis to help clients reconstruct UFO abduction perceptions, and is quite interesting for its inclusion of clients' own observations and recollections.

This breakthrough book challenges the limitations of current counseling approaches to spiritual issues, employing a practiced, clinical approach.

An Editor's Guide to UFO Phenomena, Human Potential Foundation staff. In progress, this book will be an essential desk-side guide for newspaper and broadcast editors who want to identify important individuals and organizations, and the pivotal issues associated with various UFO phenomena. Anticipated publishing date, late summer 1994.

Collected Works on Qi Gong Science, a translated Chinese book. Hu Hangchang and Wu Qihui, editors, with a new technical edit for the lay reader by Dr. Eldon Byrd. This will be the first book in English that details ten years of scientific research and experimentation in the Peoples Republic of China on qi gong (*chi gung*) energy and other examples of "extraordinary human functioning." The manuscript has been translated and edited. Publication date depends upon completing negotiations with the Beijing University Science and Engineering Press.

1995 Conference. A three day international conference, *When Cosmic Cultures Meet*, will be held in Washington, D.C., in April 1995. Presenters from a wide spectrum of disciplines and interests will address implications, preparations and responses for the time when there is no ambiguity about the understanding that cosmic cultures are meeting, and that Earth is one of the meeting grounds.

Cetacean Communications. A series of conferences and meetings are being planned that focus on dolphin and other cetacean communication research. A research matrix will be developed in order to identify research accomplishments and gaps in our efforts to understand and communicate with these oceanic intelligences.

Center for Intercultural Medical Exchange

Qi Gong. The Foundations has a joint agreement with the Chinese Academy of Somatic Science in Beijing to demonstrate and research in the United States the use of external qi gong in accelerated bone healing. The protocol to be used has been validated and is in clinical use in China. The Academy will provide highly qualified qi gong masters for this comparative study of Eastern and Western medical techniques.

Subliminal Negotiations. Following a successful Foundation sponsored symposium by Dr. Igor Smimov and Sergey Kvasovets from the Moscow Medical Academy in March 1993, the Foundation has been invited to assemble a small scientific/medical team to visit Moscow. The purpose of the visit is to be briefed upon and to see demonstrations of second and third generation Psychoanalytical and Psychocorrection computer technologies.

Center for Thanatology and Survival Research

Survey of Death Attitudes of Medical Professionals. A survey instrument is to be developed that will measure attitudes held by medical professionals toward death and the terminal dying process. The hypothesis is that there will be correlations between personal attitudes toward death and the dying process and how these are translated into decisions about treatment of critical and terminal patients. There may also be a correlation between death attitudes and how physicians and other health providers care for themselves. The developed data may provide insight into issues such as the extraordinary costs to terminal patients during their last thirty days in the hospital, and into the high incidence of physician suicide and drug addiction.

The EBOS Program, a multidisciplinary approach into basic and applied research in the field of multidimensional phenomena.
