Dear Ms. Murguia,

A congressional legislative assistant suggested that I send the enclosed letter to President Clinton, along with the approximately 20,000 signed declarations that accompany it, to your office. The declarations are a part of a mainstream, grassroots effort, the International Roswell Initiative, whose purpose is a general declassification of any information that the government might possess regarding the UFO phenomenon or extraterrestrial intelligence. The shipment accompanying this letter consists of seven boxes containing approximately 13,000 signed declarations. The remaining 7,000 or so declarations will be sent from locations in Texas and Illinois and should arrive within the next two weeks. Additionally, a significant number of signed declarations have been collected in Australia, England, France, and Germany, and may be turned into the U.S. embassies in those countries.

Although I was the initiator of the International Roswell Initiative, because of new evidence in the case, I have now become one of the 1947 Roswell UFO

incident's most outspoken skeptics. In the last couple of weeks, for example, I have debated the issue a number of times on radio and even national television.

Over the last few years, Roswell has practically become an American icon. opinion polls show that close to two thirds of the American people don't believe the government's explanation of what happened. The controversy and media attention surrounding Roswell is therefore unlikely to go away anytime soon.

Unfortunately, from a public relations standpoint, the government has handled Roswell, along with the UFO phenomenon in general, very poorly -- all but ignoring the issue. Such a cavalier approach, in combination with the public's intense interest in the subject, has exacerbated feelings of distrust and suspicion about government actions and motives. A positive and forthright response to this issue on the part of the President would probably be viewed and appreciated by most Americans as a refreshing change to the perceived (albeit, perhaps, unfairly) long-term policy of stonewalling and avoidance by the government.

Any attention you or the President give to this matter will be greatly appreciated. The letter accompanying the declarations, along with any meaningful response from the President, will be published on numerous Internet sites and in UFO publications worldwide.

In view of recent worldwide media attention and apparent public misconception concerning the 1947 Roswell incident, we have chosen to issue a joint statement in an effort to help set the record straight on this most controversial matter. We are taking this step strictly out of a sense of responsibility to the truth, and are doing so of our own volition, without any pressure or encouragement from the U.S. military or government.

Over the past years, innumerable documentaries, books, television shows, and movies have conveyed the impression that the 1947 Roswell event is a matter of historical fact. Incredible-sounding but unsubstantiated claims by alleged witnesses and participants have further exacerbated the situation.

Consequently, according to recent opinion polls, the majority of Americans now believe in the reality of an event that never occurred -- the crash of an alien spaceship northwest of Roswell, New Mexico, in July 1947, and its subsequent recovery and transportation by the U.S. military to Wright Patterson Air Force Base near Dayton, Ohio.

Wright Patterson is indeed where the Air Force's technical and intelligence experts were, and still are, concentrated. It is where the recovered wreckage from a foreign craft of any kind with the potential for invading our skys, including an alien spaceship, would be taken and kept for technical analysis. Contrary to the Roswell legend, however, no such craft was taken to and stored at Wright Patterson Air Force Base. If such an event had occurred, as ranking officials of the Foreign Technology Division (FTD) at Wright Patterson, we would have known about it. During our collective tenure there, which spanned a period of 17 years -- 1957 through 1974 -- there was no alien spaceship, and no secret hangar housing it -- of that we give our word.

Going on record with such an unequivocal statement is not something we take lightly. As retired military officers, we would not dishonor ourselves, our military careers, our families, or our country by lying to the American people, especially about an issue of such great potential significance.

Any doubters should note that if an alien spaceship were actually being kept at Wright Patterson Air Force Base by the U.S. government, the administration in power could choose to declassify the matter at any time.

With that uncertainty, publicly lying about such an issue, on top of all else, would be pure folly.

As is surely the opinion of the vast majority of Americans, both civilian and military, we are in total agreement that anything as important and profound as knowledge of other intelligent life in the universe would be information that should not be suppressed or censored by any government. It would be information to which all humanity should be entitled.

I can think of no better way to celebrate NASA's 40th Anniversary than to come here today and witness, along with each of you, history in the making. With the return of John Glenn to space, NASA has reignited the sense of excitement and national purpose that is so much a part of our space program.

Today, President Clinton will be at the Kennedy Space Center in Florida to view the launch of the Space Shuttle Discovery, which will take Senator John Glenn and six crewmates into space for an almost nine day mission, during which time the crew will conduct more than 80 scientific experiments ranging from the inner realm of the human body to the study of the Sun and solar activity.

The President Salutes Senator Glenn's Leadership And Courage. More than thirty-six years ago, Senator John Glenn made history when he became the first American to orbit the Earth, and today, he will return to space as part of a multi-national crew with the launch of the Space Shuttle Discovery. This mission will accumulate valuable scientific data, and Senator Glenn will be a test subject for specific investigations which mimic the effect of aging, including the loss of muscle mass and bone density, a depressed immune system, and the loss of balance. As he returns to space, Senator Glenn, who inspired many current astronauts to pursue space flight as a career, continues to inspire people of all generations with this flight.

President Clinton Has Helped Transform The U.S. Space Program. Over the past six years, the Clinton Administration has established and implemented a series of space policies to address a broad range of civil, national security, and commercial activities. These policies are based on the cumulative experience of the United States in space, they recognize the current domestic and international environments—most importantly, the end of the Cold War—and they reflect the growing maturity of U.S. government, commercial, and international space capabilities. America's space program enhances our knowledge of the Earth, solar system, and universe through human and robotic exploration; strengthens national security; enhances the economic competitiveness and scientific and technical capabilities of the United States; and promotes international cooperation to further U.S. domestic, national security, and foreign policies.

A Strong Record Of Accomplishment. America's accomplishments in space under the Clinton Administration span a range of civil, commercial, and national security programs that support hundreds of thousands of high-tech, high-wage jobs across the country. Specific highlights of U.S. space accomplishments under President Clinton include:

- ***The International Space Station.*** Under President Clinton's leadership, NASA is now leading a 15-nation partnership to build an International Space Station. Since the Administration's redesign of the space station in 1993, the U.S. and its foreign partners have built over 400,000 pounds of flight hardware and the first elements are scheduled for launch and assembly in orbit this November

and December.

- Space Science:** Under the Administration, Americans and people the world over have been awestruck by historic space exploration images, Mars Pathfinder's dramatic descent on the rocky planet's detection of possible subsurface ice, the discovery of Mars' polar ice caps, and scientific evidence of planets around other stars in our galaxy. NASA has revolutionized space exploration by replacing larger, complex space-craft with smaller, cheaper, lighter craft that have cut average development costs by more than half while also doubling the number and frequency of space science missions.
- Space Transportation:** In 1998, the Clinton Administration announced a strategy to pursue low-cost access to space. In October 1998, government and industry announced the design, along with government contracts and private investment, to develop and fly two families of Evolved Expendable Launch Vehicles (EELVs) that may reduce launch costs by 25 to 30 percent over the next 10 years, facilitating access to space for both commercial and government payloads well into the next century. NASA is also developing, in partnership with industry, revolutionary new technologies for next generation reusable launch systems that promise to reduce costs by a factor of ten within ten years. The first of these test vehicles, X-33 and X-34, are scheduled for flight tests next year.
- Exploring Planet Earth:** President Clinton has continued to support government efforts to develop and operate new tools, including NASA's and NOAA's satellite missions, which allow us to better understand weather patterns, droughts, floods, violent storms, and other phenomena, including El Niño and variations in the ozone hole over Antarctica.
- The Global Navigation Satellite Positioning System (GPS):** In March 1996, the President announced a new policy for the use and management of GPS, a service that is offered free of charge to U.S. allied and military forces and civilian users all over the world. GPS offers a wide range of important applications in areas such as navigation, global change research, and mapping. As demand grows for GPS services among civil users, the Administration is devising a way to ensure adequate civil access to GPS while protecting precise positioning service for authorized military users.

Q -- just a little while ago, Mrs. Clinton was asked about questions that keep coming up about efforts -- whether the White House knew of or was behind or whether there were any efforts to pay hush money to Webster Hubbell. And she called it part of the continuing saga of Whitewater, the never-ending fictional conspiracy that honest-to-goodness reminds me of some people's obsession with UFOs and the Hale-Bopp comet. (Laughter.) And I was wondering --

THE PRESIDENT: Did she say that? (Laughter.) That's pretty good. (Laughter.)

Q I was wondering if you share that sentiment? And also, we haven't had a chance to -- (laughter.)

THE PRESIDENT: Well, if I didn't, I wouldn't disagree with her in public. (Laughter.)

Q We haven't had a chance to hear what your comment is to the apology that Webb Hubbell and his claim that he was a con artist who fooled people here at the White House. Are you angry at him now? He seems to have caused you a whole lot of trouble, and he seems to be causing it.

THE PRESIDENT: Well, no, I'm not angry at him anymore because he's paid a very high price for the mistake he made. And if he hadn't come up here and he'd stayed home and tried to work it through, he would have paid a price, but it would have been a smaller one.

But let me remind you that everybody pays in life. There's -- somehow we all wind up paying for whatever we do, and he paid a very high price. And he's apologized and I accept his apology. He's got four wonderful children and a fine wife. And he's done a lot of wonderful things in his life, and I hope he'll be able to go on and do some more wonderful things.

And as far as I'm concerned, that's why we have a criminal justice system: people get punished, they pay their price, and they're supposed to be able to go on. He got punished and paid quite a high price, and I hope he'll be able to go on with his life now.

Dear Ms. McClendon,

I am a researcher here in Canada working on a manuscript related to the work of the late Wilbert B. Smith, who headed up the official UFO program for the Canadian Government from 1950-1954.
