On July 25, 2000, Secretary Dick Cheney, current Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of Halliburton Company, was asked by the Republican nominee for President, George W. Bush, to serve as his Vice Presidential running mate. Secretary Cheney has had a distinguished career as a businessman and public servant, serving under three presidents, and as an elected official. Throughout his service, Secretary Cheney served with duty, honor and unwavering

leadership.

Secretary Cheney grew up in Casper, Wyoming and was born in Lincoln, Nebraska, on January 30, 1941. He earned BA and MA degrees from the University of Wyoming.

His career in public service began in 1969 when he joined the Nixon Administration, serving in a number of positions at the Cost of Living Council, the Office of Economic Opportunity, and within the White House.

When Gerald Ford assumed the Presidency in August 1974, Mr. Cheney served on the transition team and later as Deputy Assistant to the President. In November 1975, he was named Assistant to the President and White House Chief of Staff, a position he held throughout the remainder of the Ford Administration.

After he returned to his home state of Wyoming in 1977, Mr. Cheney was elected to serve as the state's sole Congressman in the U.S. House of Representatives. He was re-elected five times and elected by his colleagues to serve as Chairman of the Republican Policy Committee from 1981-1987. He was elected Chairman of the House Republican Conference in 1987 and elected House Minority Whip in 1988. During his tenure in the House, Secretary Cheney earned a reputation as a man of knowledge, character and accessibility.

Cheney also served a crucial role when America needed him most. As Secretary of Defense from March 1989 to January 1993, Mr. Cheney directed two of the largest military campaigns in recent history – Operation Just Cause in Panama and Operation Desert Storm in the Middle East.

He was responsible for shaping the future of the U.S. military in an age of profound and rapid change as the Cold War ended. For his leadership in the Gulf War, Secretary Cheney was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President George Bush on July 3, 1991.

Secretary Cheney married his high school sweetheart, Lynne Ann Vincent, in 1964. Lynne Cheney, is a distinguished public servant in her own right, having served as chair of the National Endowment for the Humanities. She is also a leader in developing high standards and sound curriculum for public schools. Mrs. Cheney was born in Casper, Wyoming. Secretary and Mrs. Cheney have two children, daughters Liz and Mary.



Bush Runs, With a Lexicon of His Own

AUSTIN, Tex., May 7 — Gov. George W. Bush has never been considered much of a wordsmith. But bit by bit, he is developing a political dictionary all his own.

For example, when Vice President Al Gore distorts the Texas governor's record and proposals, at least as Mr. Bush sees it, Mr. Gore is not "lying," two syllables that never escape Mr. Bush's lips. Rather, Mr. Gore is behaving in a manner that is "disappointing," four syllables that the governor much prefers and has begun to use ad nauseam.

And while Mr. Bush, the de facto Republican presidential nominee, says that he will soon identify numerous ways in which the government can save money, none of these plans will be "cuts," a four-letter word that the candidate avoids. They will be "savings" that make the government more "efficient" — kinder, gentler terms.

It is a name game all the more interesting for the fact that Mr. Bush, with little smiles and wiggles of his eyebrows, wholly acknowledges that he is playing it. And this unspoken but unmistakable admission has precipitated endless rounds of semantic jousting between Mr. Bush and reporters, who are constantly trying to get him to say what he clearly means.

On his campaign plane on Wednesday, as he flew from Austin to Palm Springs, Calif., he said the vice president was demonstrating a predilection to "stretch the truth."

Was that not the same as lying?

"I'm just disappointed," Mr. Bush said, with a "nice-try" twinkle and grin. "I think that's the word I'd like to use. It's a disappointing thing."

Mr. Bush, a savvy enough candidate, understands that in politics, diction establishes tone, and tone is everything. And he turns to euphemisms to resolve inherent tensions in his campaign, like his pledge to run a positive race and his simultaneous resolve to wage an aggressive fight that exposes what he believes to be Mr. Gore's shortcomings.

He did the same thing in the primaries, watering down the nouns and verbs he used to describe and disparage his principal opponent, Senator John McCain of Arizona. Mr. Bush's mantra at the time was that Mr. McCain "says one thing and does another."

Did that not make the Arizona senator a "hypocrite"?

Mr. Bush flinched at the mere suggestion. No, he said, it made the

senator a man practiced in the ways of "Washington," a word that was perhaps dirtier but much less explicitly mean-spirited.

Support From Far Away

Throughout the Republican primaries, the Bush campaign trumpeted seemingly any and every endorsement, whether it came from the governor of a large state or the secretary of a small sewing circle.

But last week, the Bush campaign took that tendency to the outer limits.

Mr. Bush showed reporters in the back of his campaign plane a recent copy of Weekly World News, a supermarket tabloid, with a cover story on the extraterrestrial support he was receiving. The front page featured a photograph of the governor standing beside an oblong, hairless, vaguely reptilian space alien.

This was not to be taken lightly. As the newspaper noted, the same intergalactic kingmaker had backed Bill Clinton when he was first elected president in 1992.

And as Mr. Bush noted, his alien encounter was further proof of his commitment to expanding the Republican Party's appeal.

"New faces, new voices," he said as he held the front page high. "It goes to show I'm willing to reach across certain demographic lines."

Earthier Exchanges

The exchange also went to show what a prankster and funnyman Mr.

Bush fancies himself, a persona on vivid display last week.

Mr. Gore was hurling accusations and put-downs in the governor's direction, and Mr. Bush was laughing, establishing a contrast that may not have been accidental in the least.

His humor was broad. Asked by reporters during an airborne news conference one afternoon if he would be giving a lengthy stump speech at the airport in Palm Springs, he blanched.

"Not outdoors!" he gasped, alluding to the desert heat and one of its less attractive effects on the human body. He tugged at the portion of his dress shirt covering his underarms. "Pit city," he said.

He recalled his exodus from Washington the week before, after several campaign stops there, and how one local man reacted to the passing of yet another motorcade by pulling down his pants.

But Mr. Bush said the man was really "mooing authority."

The governor seemed a bit less sanguine when the topic turned to a profile, in a major magazine, of the campaign's chief strategist, Karl Rove. Mr. Bush has a thing about advisers eclipsing the candidates they serve.

And he jokingly wondered what he should expect next: a Playgirl magazine pictorial of his campaign manager, Joe Allbaugh? Mr. Allbaugh is older and burlier than a typical centerfold, but Mr. Bush had a vision.

"I'm going to have him wear a bikini bathing suit," he said.

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SPACE ALIEN RATES GEORGE W. BUSH: 'HE STINKS!'

WASHINGTON -- The mysterious space alien whose endorsement of George W. Bush helped him win the election has issued a candid assessment of Bush's first 150 days in office -- and he gives our new commander in chief a humiliating D-minus!

5. Promising to open Alaska's Arctic National Wildlife Refuge and other protected lands to oil drilling -- "We cannot tell you how many planets there are which have become barren pits with no natural beauty because of this kind of folly," the E.T. says.
6. Cutting the budget for research into renewable energy and conservation by \$200 million -- "You simply cannot keep plundering the Earth's natural resources," the E.T. says. "Renewable sources of energy are your only hope for survival."
7. Proposing we build more nuclear power plants -- "Radioactive waste remains deadly for 10,000 years," the alien warns. "The disaster at Chernobyl is nothing compared to what awaits future generations of mankind if you build more of these monstrosities." The White House has not issued any public comment on the alien's thumbs-down rating, but privately, aides concede, President Bush feels betrayed by the fickle E.T.

According to an administration insider, the President said, "First this guy stabs my dad in the back, now he's doing the same thing to me."

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CIA Resurfaces, in the Oval Office

Tenet, Bush Develop Close Relationship

The CIA and its director, George J. Tenet, have developed a close relationship with President Bush over the past six months, rivaling the bond between the agency and the first Bush White House, according to senior administration officials.

Tenet meets several times a week with Bush, a sharp contrast to what former CIA director R. James Woolsey recently called his "nonexistent" relationship with former president Bill Clinton.

By most accounts, Tenet is not a policy player. Unlike Secretary of State Colin L. Powell or Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld, his official role is not to set policy but to provide information to the government's top policymakers, including Powell, Rumsfeld and other Cabinet members as well as the president and vice president.

Still, Tenet is the sole holdover from the previous administration in Bush's inner circle, and he has gained unusual access to the Oval Office.

The ties between the CIA and the White House vary from administration to administration and generally reflect the importance that each president places on the agency's reports.

Anxiety swept the executive offices on the CIA's seventh floor when stories circulated early in the previous administration that Clinton had little interest in intelligence, though that did not turn out to be true. Now, the agency's access to the Bush White House is boosting morale at CIA headquarters, which was renamed the George Bush Center for Intelligence two years ago in honor of former president Bush, the only president to have served as director of central intelligence.

Tenet and the current President Bush "have really hit it off," said a former senior agency official. One reason, he added, is that Tenet's unpretentious way of presenting serious material suits Bush's style.

"George is a very genial guy who a lot of people like, and he's doing a good job, and the agency is doing a good job," Woolsey said. "And I think the president senses that and finds it valuable. The director of central intelligence is not a policymaker. His overall responsibility is to pull intelligence and call it the way he sees it. He is the only adviser without any incentive to make it seem that things are working out."

Tenet would not discuss his relationship with Bush. But unlike many of his predecessors, the spymaster personally goes to the White House most mornings to discuss the "President's Daily Brief," a top-secret, 10-page compendium of reports and analysis that the agency prepares for the president and a few other top officials.

After a formal, 10- or 15-minute presentation by senior CIA analysts who regularly brief the president, Tenet or his deputy, John McLaughlin, expounds upon aspects of the daily brief with Bush, Vice President Cheney, national security adviser Condoleezza Rice and White House Chief of Staff Andrew H. Card Jr.

Bush has also asked Tenet on several occasions to brief him at Camp David on weekends. And, for the first time, the president has started taking CIA briefers with him on international trips. In such instances,

the President's Daily Brief is encrypted and sent abroad over secure links.

The briefing "provides a very important opportunity for the president to think about issues and ask questions," Rice said. "It also helps the president to stay fully abreast of the most urgent matters."

One sign of Bush's trust was his decision in June to send Tenet to mediate a cease-fire between the Israelis and the Palestinians, reviving a role the CIA director had played during the Clinton administration.

Because their conversations center on intelligence matters that government officials routinely decline to discuss, it is hard to measure Tenet's influence on Bush. But on occasion, the president has sounded very much like his CIA director.

For example, Tenet frequently uses the word "inches" to describe his view of how to measure progress in the Israeli-Palestinian negotiations. When Bush emerged from a June 26 meeting with Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, he said: "Progress is in inches, not miles, but nevertheless an inch is better than nothing."

"The relationship between the president and the CIA director, if close, can assist enormously in the creation of foreign policy," said Robert M. Gates, CIA director under President George H.W. Bush from 1991 to 1992. But to be effective, Gates added, "the director has to be in the innermost circle."

During the Reagan administration, Vice President Bush was briefed daily by the CIA, while President Ronald Reagan was briefed by his national security adviser. But the agency's lack of face time with the president was offset by the fact that its director, William J. Casey, was Reagan's close friend.

When the first President Bush took office, the situation changed dramatically.

Gates said he met with the president once or twice a week if "there was something I ought to talk to him about. The best part about meeting face to face with the president was to get instantaneous feedback on what his agenda was. He asked questions and we would get answers to him, and thus had a direct dialogue with the president that is most often missing in the normal daily mix of things."

After Clinton's election in 1992, the president-elect began receiving regular briefings in Arkansas by a senior CIA analyst, often the deputy director for intelligence, "and was quite interested," according to a senior agency official.

However, after Clinton moved to the White House and named Woolsey to head the agency, his schedule became more haphazard. The intelligence briefing often was pushed to the afternoon and occasionally did not take place.

Unlike most of his predecessors, however, Clinton did read the President's Daily Brief each morning, and on occasion complained that there was nothing new in it.

Making things worse was the president's weak relationship with Woolsey, a Washington lawyer whom Clinton had never met before he named him agency director.

"I saw the president very, very rarely, except at National Security Council meetings, and only had two semi-private meetings in two years," Woolsey said.

Clinton had three directors during his eight years in office. Woolsey resigned in frustration at the end of 1994. John M. Deutch, a scientist and veteran Pentagon official, left at the end of 1996 after Clinton passed him over for the post of defense secretary.

At the start of his second term, the GOP Senate balked when Clinton nominated Anthony Lake, his first national security adviser, to run the CIA. Tenet, a former Senate aide who had served on the National Security Council staff before becoming Deutch's deputy, took over on an acting basis and was confirmed by the Senate in August 1997.

Before last fall's presidential election, Tenet's future seemed uncertain. He was thought to have a shot at -- but by no means a lock on -- reappointment by either Bush or the Democratic nominee, Vice President Al Gore.

After Bush's inauguration, Tenet had one key supporter in his camp, the new president's father, for whom Tenet had rolled out the red carpet when the CIA's headquarters was named in his honor in 1999 under legislation passed by Congress. The elder Bush is said to have commended Tenet to his son.

I have just copied the correspondence to Vice President Dick Cheney and well as the letters from Congressman Asa Hutchinson. The "information" from NASA was included in Congressman Hutchinson's letter of 3 August 2001. This material will be sent to you today, 9 August 2001.

This is one of the offices he used to serve the people of the Arkansas Third Congressional District. I did NOT seal the letter. I considered it only fair that Congressman Hutchinson should be allowed to read what I was asking him to deliver to the Vice President of the United States.

I have never met Congressman Asa Hutchinson nor spoken with him. He and his very capable staff have provided service to me above and beyond the call of duty in several different matters over the years. I was saddened by his resignation from the U. S. House of Representatives.

Honorable Vice President Dick Cheney:

President Bush is fulfilling his campaign promises at lightning speed and I want to be sure the one he made to me personally does not get lost in the shuffle.

On 28 July 2000 you and then Governor Bush were in Springdale, Arkansas. I had the opportunity to ask Mr. Bush if he became president, would he finally tell us what is going on concerning UFOs? Mr. Bush said: "Sure. I will." This question and the answer were recorded by ABC NEWS and broadcast (partly) on NIGHTLINE the same evening and (more completely) the next morning on CNN. Part of an interview with me conducted immediately after I asked the question appeared 29 July 2000 in the WASHINGTON POST.

Several minutes later I again saw both of you and Mr. Bush said to me, while pointing to you, it would be the first thing you would do. When I asked if you really would, you answered: "Yes Sir." I had my tape recorder going so I have this exchange on audio tape. As far as I am aware, this exchange was not recorded by the media. Since Mr. Bush tasked you with this explains why I am writing to you.

In view of what happened after the election and the resulting compressed time for the transition, it is entirely possible that the promise made to me was overlooked. As a former member of the Army Security Agency I held a Top Secret and a Cryptological security clearance. Therefore, I may have a little more appreciation of what is involved in releasing classified information than the average citizen. I realize that it is highly likely that not everything can be released at the present time. Back engineering projects currently underway would almost certainly be in this category.

Please consider the following as a possible partial disclosure scenario: In view of the historical importance, either you or President Bush would make the announcements. The information would be released in stages, perhaps in the beginning in one week to two week intervals. No questions by the press would be allowed in the early stages.

STAGE ONE would be a short announcement. It would be stated that the U. S. Government has not told the truth about UFOs in the past because of national security concerns. And that even now not everything can be released. Then, assuming the following is true, simply state that some UFOs are indeed extraterrestrial and/or interdimensional or both, that they have apparently been around for thousands of years, that several different groups are coming here from various places, (mention the star systems of origin, if known)(perhaps even from Zeta 1 or Zeta 2 or Epsilon Reticuli, if my own research is valid), release one still photo of a craft showing the outside only and close the press conference for stage one.

STAGE TWO would involve releasing more stills as well as motion pictures of various craft, again showing only the outside.

STAGE THREE would involve releasing stills and motion pictures of the inside of one or more crafts.

STAGE FOUR, perhaps four to eight weeks after stage three, would involve the release of a single still photo of an alien, with home star system, if known. Choose the most attractive photo possible.

STAGE FIVE would involve the release of stills and motion pictures of various aliens, if available, together with their place of origin, if known. The release of intercepted radio and TV transmissions would also be done at this time.

STAGE SIX would involve releasing information concerning contacts with aliens. The Holloman Air Force Base incident would be released at this time.

STAGE SEVEN would involve showing cadavers of aliens along with releasing the full autopsy reports as well as what has been learned about the body functions, structure and chemistry. Questions would now be allowed for the first time concerning these seven stages only. (Stage seven could be a place to halt for several weeks or months.)

STAGE EIGHT would involve an accounting of how many casualties we have undergone as a result of contact with aliens: planes destroyed or captured, abductions that ended fatally, deaths as a result of being too near a propulsion system, from weapon systems etc. Questions allowed.

STAGE NINE would involve introducing aliens with whom we have official or unofficial contact, if any. Questions allowed.

There is probably much that I have overlooked so I do not present this as a complete program for disclosure. But I do hope you will be willing to take it into consideration. If you could find it possible to invite me to be present for the announcement(s), it would be the greatest honor I have ever received.

The following information was furnished to SA [redacted] by [redacted]

An investigator for the Air Forces stated that three so-called flying saucers had been recovered in New Mexico. They were described as being circular in shape with raised centers, approximately 50 feet in diameter. Each one was occupied by three bodies of human shape but only 3 feet tall, dressed in metallic cloth of a very fine texture. Each body was banded in a manner similar to the blackout suits used by speed flyers and jet pilots.

According to Mr. [redacted] informant, the same [redacted] were found in New Mexico due to the fact that the Government had a very high-powered radar set-up in that area and it is believed the radar interferes with the controlling mechanism of the saucers.

No further evaluation was attempted by SA [redacted] concerning the above.

The US Government and Unidentified Flying Objects

No branch of the United States Government is currently involved with or responsible for investigations into the possibility of advanced alien civilizations on other planets or for investigating Unidentified Flying Objects (UFO's). The US Air Force (USAF) and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) have had intermittent, independent investigations of the possibility of alien life on other planets; however, none of these has produced factual evidence that life exists on other planets, nor that UFO's are related to aliens. From 1947 to 1969, the Air Force investigated UFO's; then in 1977, NASA was asked to examine the possibility of resuming UFO investigations. After studying all of the facts available, it was determined that nothing would be gained by further investigation, since there was an absence of tangible evidence.

In October 1992, NASA was directed by Congress to begin a detailed search for artificial radio signals from other civilizations under the NASA Towards Other Planetary Systems (TOPS)/High Resolution Microwave Survey (HRMS) program (also known as the Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence project). Congress directed NASA to end this project in October 1993, citing pressures on the US Federal budget. The HRMS did not detect any confirmed signal before it was stopped. However, similar work continued through efforts of private groups and through academic institutions. The Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence Institute (SETI Institute) in Mountain View, CA, effectively replaced the Government project, borrowing the signal processing system from NASA. The SETI Institute is a nonprofit corporation conducting research in a number of fields including all science and technology aspects of astronomy and planetary sciences, chemical evolution, the origin of life, biological evolution, and cultural evolution.

During several space missions, NASA astronauts have reported phenomena not immediately explainable; however, in every instance NASA determined that the observations could not be termed "abnormal" in the space environment. The 1947 to 1969 USAF investigations studied UFO's under Project Blue Book. The project, headquartered at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, was terminated December 17, 1969. Of the total of 12,618 sightings reported to Project Blue Book, 701 remain "unidentified."
