## NOTICE

### WARNING CONCERNING COPYRIGHT RESTRICTIONS

The copyright law of the United States (Title 17, United States Code) governs the making of photocopies or other reproductions of copyrighted material. The law extends statutory rights of authorship to unpublished works that were previously protected by literary property rights under common law. Such works do not have to be registered with the Copyright Office to receive protection under this law.

In general the law provides copyright protection for a term of the life of the author plus 50 years. Unpublished and uncopyrighted works created before January 1, 1978, are covered as of that date by this same provision and are protected at the minimum until December 31, 2002. Works already in the public domain and works prepared by U.S. Government employees as part of official duties are not protected by copyright.

Under certain conditions specified in the law, libraries and archives are authorized to furnish a photocopy or other reproduction. One of these specified conditions is that the photocopy or reproduction is not to be "used for any purpose other than private study, scholarship or research." If a user makes a request for, or later uses, a photocopy or reproduction for purposes in excess of "fair use," that user may be liable for copyright infringement.

Persons wishing to publish any unpublished writings included in the papers of the Library should obtain permission from the holder of the copyright. Permission to reproduce copyrighted materials in the Library's still photograph, motion picture, cartoon, and oral history collections must also be obtained from the copyright holder. ### CITING LYNDON B. JOHNSON LIBRARY MATERIALS

Citations should identify items clearly, specify their file locations, and end with reference to the LBJ Library. Most citations will concern items from the manuscript collections and should contain these elements: type of document; names of sender and recipient or title of document; date; folder title; box number; collection title; and the words "LBJ Library." "WHCF" is the common abbreviation for White House Central Files; "C.F." for Confidential File; and "NSF" for the National Security File. The following are examples of citations. Dear President Walker:

Naturally I have a great interest in the young leaders who are emerging in our colleges and would like to get to know them and their thinking as much as I can. With this in mind, I am inviting to the White House a group of student leaders from representative colleges and universities throughout the country.

The occasion will be on Saturday, October 3. It will begin at 5 p.m. and will consist of a reception of the students by Mrs. Johnson and myself; some remarks by me; talks by Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara, Secretary of Labor Willard Wirtz, and Ambassador Adlai Stevenson; and a buffet dinner and entertainment at which my daughter Lynda will be hostess.

The young person I would like to invite is the college student in each institution who, while maintaining a good academic record, has also shown special qualities of character, leadership, and interest in college and public affairs. He or she might be the president of the student body, of the senior class, or of the undergraduate council, or a person who holds no high student office. I want to leave to you the designation of the fine young man or woman whom you feel would well represent your student body.

Would you be good enough to select this student? I would also like to request that you consider this letter an invitation to the White House for the young man or woman and that you will so inform the student. He will receive a formal invitation a little later. I am assuming that the expenses of the trip to Washington will be borne by the student, his campus organization, or his college.


Please inform me by telegram at the earliest possible time the name and address of the student you designate.
