Dear Senator Kennedy:

There is a danger that this letter may find its way into your "crank" file but I am hoping that you or one of your assistants will read it carefully and give it some consideration. I would hate to think of myself as being a "crank" or a "crackpot". This concerns the perplexing stance taken by the U.S. Air Force on the subject of "Flying Saucers".

I am a professional writer, author of a number of books and countless magazine pieces on a wide variety of subjects. Although I have extensive background as a globetrotting reporter and once served as Science Editor for the Funk & Wagnall's Encyclopedia, I have been toiling in more recent years in the wasteland of television. Like most writers, I have a wide range of interests, a skeptical turn of mind, and an insatiable curiosity. I have been collecting information about UFOs since the appearance of the mysterious "Foo fighters" in World War II. But I did not fully believe in their existence until 1954 when I actually saw a "Flying Saucer" maneuvering over the Aswan Dam in Egypt. It was hovering at a low altitude and was obviously a solid metal object, circular with a dome on top. After a few minutes the outer rim started to revolve rapidly and it moved off at very high speed. Similar objects...or the same one...were later reported over other areas of the Middle East. (For the record: I was employed as Chief of Continuity and Production for the American Forces Network in Europe, 1953-54.)

This sighting, however, has no bearing on the purpose of this letter. It was an isolated incident and I have never written about it. In fact, I have never written anything about UFOs but have left them up to the cultists and pseudo-scientists.

As you undoubtedly know, there was a considerable amount of UFO activity in 1965. They appeared in great numbers all over the world and reportedly landed briefly in France, South America, and even in Minnesota. The U.S. Air Force, as usual, came up with a series of absurd explanations for them. By now, hundreds of thousands of people throughout the world have observed these things. A number of governments have issued statements to the effect: "they exist...we don't know what they are...but apparently they are harmless." Our own government has been silent...even strangely secretive...on the entire subject.

Recently I visited my hometown for the holidays...the town of Perry, N.Y. which is about fifty miles from Buffalo and Niagara Falls...and I learned that the area had been inundated with UFOs during Oct.-Nov. '65. Everyone had a choice story to tell me and a number of people had managed to take photographs. I even saw a strip of 8mm movie film which clearly showed a solid metallic disk hovering in the sky. Since Perry is a small town (pop. 5,000), the arrival of the saucers was a major event. Whenever one was sighted, everyone would jump into their cars and drive out to gawk at it. One hovered over the Perry-Warsaw airport for about two hours one night, apparently causing the airport beacon to go out. These objects were hedge-hopping and many people got a close look at them. I was told (I didn't check it out) that groups of these things gathered nightly above Attica, N.Y. for about a week. The descriptions were too graphic to be the product of some kind of mass hysteria.

It was during this period that we suffered the great power blackout. I found that everyone I talked to was convinced that the blackout was somehow caused by the UFOs...particularly since there were a number of incidents in which automobiles stalled when the objects passed over, radios ceased to function, etc. ---standard phenomena with sightings all over the world.

Naturally, I didn't spend my whole visit discussing flying saucers. I hadn't been home for the holidays in 19 years. And since all of the reports were basically the same, there wasn't too much sense in pursuing the matter. Oddly enough, of all the witnesses I talked to, only ONE person had bothered to call the Air Force in Buffalo to report a sighting. Most people were afraid to report what they had seen...for fear of ridicule. And many people expressed outright contempt for the U.S. Air Force's attitude towards UFOs.

A week ago a UFO was sighted over New Jersey. It appeared at night and projected a powerful beam of light towards the ground. A number of people saw it and they were all astonished and chagrined when the Air Force told them that they had seen a helicopter. (There have been quite a few "searchlight" sightings over the past few years.)

So, at last, we arrive at the point of this letter. Hundreds of communities all over the United States have been the site of intensive UFO activity. Many thousands of people have seen these objects in one form or another (formations of moving lights, low-flying "fireballs", solid objects of various shapes) and they are all sneering at the U.S. Air Force for trying to tell them that they have seen a distant planet, a weather balloon, or an ordinary aircraft.

The Air Force started out by trying to ridicule the notion that strange objects were maneuvering over our country...and now this approach has backfired. It is the Air Force that is looking ridiculous. In fact, our Air Force is beginning to look downright incompetent. The time has come for the Air Force to reassess their public attitude towards UFOs. Their present approach of "explanation and denial" is no longer acceptable to the American Public. And this approach has caused them to lose the support of the public.

wading through tons of literature on UFOs, and all available proclamations on the subject, I am forced to conclude that we are unable to investigate this mystery properly. It seems as if the Air Force knows no more about UFOs now than it did 19 years ago. Alien objects are traversing our skies, maneuvering at will above our towns, cities and military installations, and we are totally helpless to do anything about it. Judging from the stepped-up UFO activity last year, we can expect more incidents in the future and perhaps even greater numbers of these objects will appear. Public concern will certainly increase and more demands for an adequate explanation will be heard.

Over the past few years there have been many well-publicized pronouncements by distinguished astronomers and scientists to the effect that there is a strong possibility of intelligent life forms existing in other star systems throughout the universe. The average American today believes that life can exist beyond our planet. And a poll taken a couple of years ago revealed that 75% of the population does believe in the existance of "flying saucers". Yet the Air Force continues to try to maintain its unbelievably naive attitude...or is it just trying to cover up its own inadequacy?

We know that UFOs have been around a long time. Historical records of sightings go back many centuries. And yet there is no concrete evidence that they have ever made a serious attempt to contact us. We can therefore assume that they will be around for a long time to come and that they will remain aloof. Where they come from and what their mysterious missions are is open to all kinds of conjecture. I do not expect the U.S. Air Force to come up with any spectacular conclusions or out-of-this-world explanations. But I do expect it to stop playing the fool and stop calling baffled witnesses to this phenomena liars and idiots. The average American knows the difference between a round metal disc that flies in total silence and a noisy helicopter. The average American knows that comets do not fly horizontally in "V" formations.

It's time for the Air Force to give the public whatever concrete information it has been able to gather. It's time for officials to tell the thousands of UFO witnesses that they did see something and put to rest all of the rumors that ~~xxx~~ are sweeping our country. This is not a serious situation---yet. But a few more seasons like the one we had last year will really put the Air Force out on a limb.

Already, average sightings of UFOs no longer make the press. Newspapers are bored with reporting that Joe Doakes saw something in the sky. Perhaps if they returned to Perry, N.Y. tomorrow they would cause less stir. And in the years to come, our skies could be filled with Trojan Horses.

So I urge you to press Air Force officials for an improvement and expansion in their methods of investigating this situation. And I ask that a full and sensible appraisal be offered to the public.

Dear Senator Kennedy:

I refer to your letter of February 7, 1966. Thank you very much for the courtesy of your reply. I appreciate it.

The enclosed material should give you a start. The UFO's are certainly real, as you can see from the photostats of the newspaper write-ups re the Wanague UFO, seen there recently, in New Jersey. The fact that I do, and have been, communicate with these UFO's, is a solid fact. I have the proof, as I have said...and need to see you and talk with you about it.

You are correct, in that not all UFO's are manned vehicles...some are, some are not, sir. The Wanague UFO was a guided, unmanned UFO...still containing intelligence, and weaponry.

Now, sir, let us get down to serious business. First let me give you my references in this most unusual matter.

(1) Mrs. (Dr.) Louisa Rhine, wife of the famous J. B. Rhine, parapsychologists at Duke University. Address: P.O. Box 46, Rt. 3, Hillsboro, North Carolina. (While at Duke Dr. and Mrs. Rhine, and other scientists tested me for ESP phenomena...and I was successful, while surrounded by them, in knocking a pair of scissors clear off a table some 10-15 feet away, with my mind. You certainly are welcome to check on this.)

(2) Mr. George Clark, Central Intelligence Agency, Wash. 25, D.C.

(3) Mr. Eastwood, Inventions, N.A.S.A., Wash., D.C.

The above three parties have been receiving proof for some time that I can accomplish things not otherwise humanly possible. If you cannot get access to CIA and NASA files, you probably could get pertinent information from Mrs. Rhine, My two children, ages 15 and 16, Rick and Lornie Owens, who live at 1021 S Myrtle #11, Inglewood, California, c/o Shannon (my ex-wife) can also give you a valuable insight into my work, for they were with me through a great part of it until just recently.

As fantastic as it sounds, the situation is this: The UFO intelligences (I call them Si's) wish to help the U.S. in its present pitiful plight; then the rest of the world. With their particular powers, which are not known on earth, this can be done. To try and bring this about they have been causing catastrophes for the U.S. Government, and notifying me first so that I could write to the above parties beforehand and call the shot...which I have been doing, accurately. If I could show you my complete files, you would understand more readily what I am trying to say in a few paragraphs.

The Si's advised me to contact you...and ask your help in the matter. In return, they will give you anything you wish in this life. The Presidency, if you want it.

This is not a frivolous statement on my part...many things the Si's have told me to pass on to the U.S. Government, I have doubted...but they have happened, almost without exception. For instance, they told me to tell George Clark that they would change the electro-magnetic condition at the North Pole for \$10,000—a bargain...it would be in the newspapers when it happened. I thought this was ridiculous, and resisted mailing it to George...but finally did. (Newsclips enclosed.) Notice that in my letter to George, before this happened, mentioned the ray.

A rainmaker has come to Philadelphia.

He says he'll break the drought for \$10,000—a bargain rate.

"I'd want \$50,000 to do it in New York," he said.

He's been here since the first of July. He said he whopped up the big storm that hit the city the weekend of July 11—remember? — the first and only soaking rain we've had since December.

"It wasn't easy," he noted. "I had to work on it for more than a week."

Working on it, he said, requires a combination of parapsychology and "some things my grandfather told me about the way the Apache Indians used to make rain."

The rainmaker is a slightly balding, well-fed man in his middle 40s with a pleasant smile and an engaging personality.

Knife-Thrower in Circus


His name is Ted Owens and he was once a professional knife-thrower with the circus. "I'm probably the best knife-thrower in the country," he said, modestly.

He wrote a letter to The Bulletin as soon as he arrived in the city and said he was working on a big rainstorm. He wrote another letter after the storm hit, pointed out that he had made everybody happy, and explained why:

"I live here now and I do not like hot, dry weather. Therefore Philadelphia will be wetter and cooler than the rest of the U. S. this summer. The people here are lucky . . ."

He also said he was working on another storm for Philadelphia for the next weekend.

The rain came, a bit north of the city, but enough to produce a good downpour here and .8 of an inch in Montgomery County.



Letter Arrives

The letter came the next day—Monday, July 19.

"Well, I told you," wrote the rainmaker.

"You just enjoyed my storm which I referred to in my letter. I was right there in Rittenhouse Square yesterday, calling down the storm and especially the lightning, which is my trademark."

He signed his name THE RAINMAKER, c-o Owens. He was finally located in a Spruce st. hotel.

He said he was born in Indiana, has had 20 different "professions" besides knife-throwing and studied extrasensory perception at Duke University.

Says Combination Works

He was living in Phoenix, Ariz. in 1963, he said, when he decided to try combining ESP with the Apache Indian rain-making act.

"The Indians had a good thing going but they didn't really know what they were doing," he said. "They thought they had to dance and take drugs and that sort of thing."

To his surprise, the combination worked and he got "eight violent storms in five days," he said.

He opened one of three well-stuffed briefcases and pulled out a folder containing newspaper clippings of each of the eight storms. The clippings were neatly pasted up, numbered and dated.

"This proves it," he said. "The storms nearly wrecked that part of Arizona."

Close House Hit

One bolt of lightning hit his own house. He said he wasn't scared, "just amused."

He moved to Los Angeles and said he produced some rainstorms which culminated in the big landslides of November, 1964.

The rainmaker said he doesn't really want to hurt anyone. Pictures of storm damage—houses with the roofs blown off, automobiles wrecked by falling trees—bothered him at first. But he said he got used to them.

He went to Washington, D. C. to try to explain his talent for

producing storms to the government.

Turned Down by Government

He took all three briefcases along to prove his point. But, he said, he couldn't make the right contacts.

Since the government didn't want his information for free, he decided to try at least to make a living out of it.

He said he came to Philadelphia because it is in the center of the present drought area and he wanted to interest some big cities in buying his services.

He was reluctant to explain just how he went about producing a storm—not that there was any big secret to it, he said, but because it is a complicated business.

Visual Imagery

"It's partly a matter of contacting the intelligence behind nature," he said. "It also involves imagery."

To explain visual imagery, he took a piece of paper and wrote numbers from one to 20 down the left side.

He handed the paper to an observer and told him to write down an object after each number, calling out the number and the object as he did so.

1. Umbrella. 2. Paddle. 3. Camera. 4. House, etc.

Without looking at the paper, he read off the numbers and the objects, first going from one to 20; then from 20 back to one.

He had the observer pick out numbers at random, and he called off the corresponding object. Then he had the observer call the objects and he gave their numbers.

Maybe the rainmaker has just been lucky with storms.

But there's certainly nothing wrong with his visual imagery.

Note: I threw knives around Steve Allen on his TV show. Not a circus performer - but was in night clubs, offered to break the East Coast brought free to President Johnson. no answer.

At N.J. Reservoir

WANAQUE, N. J. (AP) — An unidentified flying object, described as a brilliant disc of light, hovered over the Wanaque Reservoir for more than one hour Tuesday night, and then disappeared from view, police said.

"It was real. I saw it and so did the mayor and the civil defense director and hundreds of other people," said George Dykman, 38, a patrolman on the Wanaque Reservoir Police Department.

The officer said the weird light was first spotted earlier in Oakland, then in Pompton Lakes and then over the Raymond Dam at the reservoir—about 200 yards from the police station.

"It was very bright, like a star," said Dykman. "From where we stood, it looked like it was about two feet in diameter and it was in the shape of a disc.

"It moved in over the dam in a circular motion and then stopped and hovered over the reservoir.

"It was too low to be an airplane.

"As it dipped down over the reservoir, we saw a round light reflected in the water about nine feet in diameter."

Dykman said he spotted the strange object about 7:30 p.m. after receiving a telephone call

from the Passaic County Police radio network. About one hour later, he said, it moved away from the dam and paused briefly over Lakeland High School.

"Now it's gone," he said late Tuesday night. "We have men searching, but whatever it was, thank God it's gone."

In addition to Dykman, several other police officers saw the strange object. So did Wanaque Mayor Harry T. Wolfe and Civil Defense Director Bentley Spencer.

Howard Ball, night suburban editor for the Evening News of Paterson, spotted the object in Wayne on Hamburg Turnpike while driving to work.

He said he saw the light when he reached the crest of a hill and thought it was the planet Venus. "Then it took a lateral movement toward the West. I knew it wasn't Venus. I thought it might have been an airplane, but the light was too brilliant for that."

Police departments throughout the Bergen-Passaic County area reported being flooded with telephone calls from alarmed residents.

Officials at McGuire Air Force Base in Wrightstown said they were as mystified as everyone else over the strange object.

What Did They See Hovering Over Jersey?

What was the strange flying object that hovered over the Wanaque Reservoir in Northern New Jersey all through the night, baffling police and terrorizing thousands of residents in neighboring townships?

The UFO—which is all anyone could call it — was still unidentified at dawn today.

The police of Wanaque, Wyckoff, Pompton Lakes, Riverdale, Ringwood and Paterson all witnessed the strange, bright light, which resembled a disc, as it dipped and rose over the 15-mile-long reservoir from 7:30 p.m. yesterday until early this morning.

HEARD OF IT

They didn't know what to call it.

Officials at Stewart Air Force Base, Newburgh, N. Y., and McGuire Air Base, Wrightstown, N. J., said they'd heard of the UFO—but acted as if they wished they hadn't.

Both bases clamped a tight lid of silence on the subject and denied they had sent planes to investigate the phenomena. A spokesman at the Air Phenomena Branch, Wright Patterson Field, Dayton, Ohio, which processes all UFO sightings, said early today the Wanaque UFO had not been reported to his office.

FIRST SIGHTING

Ptl. George Dykman, of the Wanaque Reservoir police, first spotted the weird disc about 200 yards from the police station.

"It was very bright," Ptl. Dykman said, "about two feet in diameter and, as it dipped over the dam, a round light about nine feet in diameter was reflected in the water . . ."

GOES, RETURNS

Ptl. Charles Theodora said the disc disappeared at 8:30 p.m., but returned about 2:20 a.m. It was motionless for about an hour then moved back and forth several times.

"It raced about six miles up and down the dam at supersonic speed," said the officer. "At one point it flashed a ray of light on the ice. Ptl. Al Campana and I drove up to investigate. We found a hole in the ice about 40 to 50 feet in diameter—there is no explaining it. The rest of the dam is covered solid."

Jack Burchill, an aerospace student at N.Y. Institute of Technology, Westbury, L.I., and Richard Scott, Paterson, a student at Stevens Institute of Technology, Hoboken, gave this analysis:

"It doesn't twinkle so it is not a star. It's too bright to be a planet or a celestial body. It gives off its own light. It can't be a helicopter, for it is soundless and appears to move at better than 1000 miles per hour."

'DON'T KNOW'

Wanaque Mayor Harry T. Wolfe, Civil Defense Director Bentley Spencer, and Howard Ball, suburban editor of the Paterson Evening News, also spotted the UFO. Mr. Ball said:

"I was driving up a hill. I thought it was the planet Venus. Then it looked like an airplane—but it was too low. I don't know what it is—or was."

Need Deep Look At UFO Reports

By ROSCOE DRUMMOND

You can't dismiss the possibility that some of the Unidentified Flying Objects — those "flying saucers" which so many people have sighted in so many different places — are real, not imaginary.

There are, of course, UFO buffs who seem to want to believe everything and discount all kinds of logical explanations. But Air Force officials assigned to check up on these sightings seem so bored and totally skeptical that many here in Washington have the impression that they think the public would go panicky if all the facts were brought into the open.

This isn't good enough. Let's not leave the search for more knowledge either to those who tend to accept everything uncritically or to those who tend to dismiss every UFO as just too ridiculous.

The time has come for either the President or Congress to name an objective and respected plan to investigate, appraise, and report on all evidence about what is going on.

THE PHENOMENA have been coming at such a rate that they can't be wholly explained away by the expert unbelievers. For example:



"Did you really spot a UFO or are you on LSD?"

Last week more than 100 persons (some of them trained observers) reported seeing "flying saucers" in seven states, from Maine to Texas to Colorado.

Last year Project Blue Book, the small Air Force unit created to keep tabs on these things, had 886 reports of UFO sightings.

During the last two years the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (NICAP), a private group headed by a retired Naval Academy Marine Corps pilot, received 3,000 such reports.

During the past 10 years NICAP lists some 8,000 reports and says that 1,500 of them "seem pretty substantial and unexplained." The Air Force totals 10,147 UFO reports and states that 646 of them remain unexplained by provable natural phenomena.

MAYBE ALL of these reported sightings are whimsical, imaginary, or unreal. But we need a more credible and detached appraisal of the evidence than we are now getting.

Maybe there is no intelligent life on the other planets.

There is no evidence that the American people are timidly holding their breath in fear of some kind of aggressive invasion for extra terrestrials. And even if they were, no good can come from pooh-poohing the perplexing evidence which already exists.

We need to get all the data drawn together in one place and examined far more objectively than anyone has done so far.

A stable public opinion will come from a trustworthy look at the evidence, not from belittling it. This is why a Warren Commission-type panel seems to me to be in order.


In 18 years of investigating over 10,000 reports of UFOs, the evidence has proved beyond reasonable doubt that all reported aerial phenomena have been objects either created and sent aloft by man, generated by atmospheric conditions, or caused by celestial bodies or the residue of meteoric activity.

There has never been any evidence that UFOs reported to the Air Force represented extraterrestrial vehicles. No such object reported to the Air Force has given any indication of a threat to the United States nor has any UFO exhibited characteristics beyond the scope of current technical or scientific knowledge.

The Air Force will continue to investigate all reports of unusual aerial phenomena over the United States, and evaluations and conclusions reached will be released to the public.

For twenty and more years, and ever since the first Atomic bomb was exploded on earth, citizens of every country have seen Unidentified Flying Objects, often called 'Flying Saucers' in great numbers, all over the world. The United States Congress and the President has exempted itself from responsibility to bring the facts into the open by relegating answers and investigation to the United States Air Force. The United States Air Force has been impeded by tight security regulations and has given generally noncommittal answers in reply to millions of queries from the public.

Now the time has come when the Congress, the President can no longer step aside, the responsibility must be faced!

Russia, the nation most reluctant to admit UFO has now taken the world lead in calling for an international investigation. They say the UFO have been on their radar for twenty years. Several hundred NICAP personnel, in investigative units throughout the country, interview witnesses first-hand and investigate all aspects of a UFO sighting. Qualified specialists in photography, aviation, physics, astronomy and other technical fields assist us with analyses and evaluations.

It is our position that the accumulated evidence overwhelmingly establishes the reality of UFO's. In order to facilitate a scientific investigation of this evidence, NICAP has a four-phase program: Investigation of reports; establishment of conventional explanations where possible and analysis of the evidence where conventional explanations fail; dissemination of information to Congress and to the general public; and continuing evaluation of the accumulated solid evidence.

S U M M A R Y

On August 19, 1965, several witnesses in the Cherry Creek Area reported seeing an unidentified flying object in the air and on the ground. Witnesses reported that, at different times, they heard a "beeping" noise, saw the object emit a red vapor, heard a loud blast comparable to a sonic boom, and watched a cloud turn a luminous green color when the object seemed to be behind it.

About 8:20p.m., Harold Butcher, 16, who had been milking cows and listening to the radio, heard loud static on his radio, noticed that the tractor running the milking equipment had stopped, and heard his tethered bull bellow and screech. He ran to the barn window, and saw a football-shaped, metallic-looking object hovering just above tree level, an estimated 450 feet from the barn.

While outside the barn, he watched what looked like a "huge silver platter, 50 feet long and 20 feet wide" spurtng a "red vapor" and emitting a "beep-beep" noise, descend behind a large maple tree. Soon, the UFO rose rapidly, the red vapor spurting from the edge (as it had done on its descent), the "beep-beep" noise became shriller until he heard a noise similar to a sonic boom. The object disappeared behind a cloud, which then turned a luminous green. The same object, apparently, was seen twice later by other members of the family and Miss Brougham. Again, it emitted reddish vapor and caused clouds to glow green.

A bluish liquid substance was found where the object was first seen. Samples of it were obtained by the U.S. Air Force and NICAP. Analysis by the Kawecki Chemical Company, on behalf of NICAP, showed the major constituents (more than 10% each) to be calcium, magnesium, potassium, silicon, and sodium. The analyst suggested the pungent odor of phosphine may have been caused by phosphorus found in weed samples from the site. Nothing in the analysis was considered unusual. Two samples indicated slight radio-activity above normal background count, but analyst doubted that this was significant.

Although the young members of the Butcher family are not unusually intelligent, and their behavior in recounting the experience not completely objective, the physical markings and other independent evidence indicate the basic truth of their story. State policemen in the area reported UFO sightings within a few days of this incident, unknown to the Butcher family.



MEMORANDUM FOR WHITE HOUSE CONFERENCE, FEBRUARY 13, 1961

Subject: Attitude of Committee on Science and Astronautics
Relative to the National Space Program

1. Insufficient Urgency in the Program

NASA and the civilian space program badly need a shot in the arm. The Committee is not particularly critical of the NASA program as it has been presented, but it is important to note that this is a conservative program. The recent Venus shot of the Soviet Union and the fact that our own program does not contemplate such a plan for several years is dramatic evidence of the need for an accelerated space exploration schedule. The word "accelerated" is emphasized. We believe the program can be speeded up without the expenditure of unnecessary funds.

2. Foreign Relations

Any step-up in the program must be designed to accelerate a civilian program of peaceful space exploration and use. In taking this position, the Committee in no way intends to derogate from military research or military space systems. But the emphasis, certainly the public emphasis, must be placed on the civilian program, and any reorientation of the space program should be undertaken with this in mind. This is very important from the standpoint of international relations. If the space picture which we hold out to the world emphasizes military applications, we may

be playing right into the hands of the Soviet Union insofar as public relations and propaganda are concerned. The Soviets have scored many points with other nations because of the "peaceful" picture which they have painted for their space program. We should not forget this fact. Note, too, that a strong peaceful use program will serve to facilitate (a) our treaty and other foreign negotiations, (b) the cause of disarmament, and (c) mitigate possible international stress arising from such instances as the misfired Transit II Able, part of which fell on Cuba several months ago.

3. Economic Advantages

By the same token, it is this Committee's view that the practical uses and by-products of the space program will have, indeed are already having, a pronounced and beneficial effect on America's civilian economy. Such effect has already been sustained and documented by reports of this Committee. (See report of Committee on Science and Astronautics, "The Practical Values of Space Exploration", July 1, 1960.) Note, also, that in the communications satellite endeavor, private enterprise has committed itself to enter the field on its own.

4. Booster Needs

A point of immediate attention must be the booster program, with particular emphasis placed on providing alternate or backup systems to those crucial areas of research which appear to be marginal -- and on an accelerated program in the development of solid propellents. Solids offer

so much potential in the booster area that they should be seriously considered as a means of placing heavy vehicles into space.

5. Budget Increases

Of course, the space program, for the foreseeable future, depends upon its allocation from the Federal budget. The current suggested allocation of slightly under \$1.2 billion, in our view, appears to be inadequate. We do not see how the space program can do what must be done -- at a very minimum -- for less than \$1.5 billion. In this connection, it is important to note that some of our best space scientists and technicians feel that we should proceed at a budgetary rate of 2 to 3 billion dollars per year for 10 years, exclusive of military systems, if we are to assume a commanding position in space exploration. We also believe that a special \$50 million dollar fund made available to the National Science Foundation for basic research in areas sensitive to the needs of the space program would be invaluable. This would have marked utility for both civilian and military programs. It might result in tremendous economic breakthroughs in such complicated but potentially valuable missions as the Nike-Zeus antimissile system. (Note: Research emphasis of this type is not inimical to the B-70 or supersonic transport programs which have their separate reasons for being.)

6. Programs Reported Cut from NASA Requests

While the Committee has no direct knowledge of this, it has been reported that in the neighborhood of \$250 million was cut from NASA requests for the 1962 fiscal budget. According to these reports, the

following major programs have been affected -- either eliminated or drastically reduced.

(a) Big Dish Radio Telescopes. These are crucial. Without them we cannot keep track of and make sense of communications from long distances. The Pioneer V 23-million-mile experiment was possible only with the help of Britain's Jodrell Bank telescope, which was never designed for this type of thing. These radio telescopes take some time to build, and eventually we must have them.

(b) Solid Propellant Boosters. These might reduce costs considerably for major launches and serve as backups to liquid propellant systems, the reliability of which is marginal. They would have considerable utility both for peaceful and military purposes.

(c) Project Apollo. Main manned vehicle concept for space station and lunar flights which could be used for any number of purposes.

(d) Project Rover. Nuclear rocket engine which, at present, appears to be one of the best and the earliest of all potential lines of research for upper-stage and interplanetary propulsion. A vehicle adaptable to the Rover concept is also essential and, we understand, has also been postponed. Administrative difficulties between NASA and the Atomic Energy Commission in regard to this program should be settled and, we believe, place major responsibility for the program in NASA.

(e) Saturn II. This is the sopped-up Saturn intended to use a hydrogen second stage providing something like 800,000 pounds of thrust. This is a controversial concept, but we believe it should be carefully reviewed.

(f) Project Aeros. Most advanced of the fixed position weather reporting satellite systems, effective utilization of which might be very important to the Nation's economy.

(g) Extra Launch Complexes. We have too few launch pads at present. This is particularly true in regard to launching sites for large vehicles such as Saturn. Only two pads for vehicles of this type are being built. Plans for more have been rejected.

7. The Need to Act Now

Most of the foregoing concepts -- particularly the booster and large radio-telescope tracking facilities -- seem essential to us. In view of the long lead times required to develop this equipment and get it functioning properly, we cannot afford to wait any longer in correcting the deficiencies in the program. We cannot impress upon the Executive too strongly the need for urgency in this program. If we do not recognize it, we may falter badly in both our domestic and international relationships. It might be pointed out, in conclusion, that much of the work recommended for this program must eventually be done anyway, and that its acceleration now should have a beneficial effect upon the employment situation.

I do not intend here to speak for every member of our Committee. We have a number of new members and I am not conversant with their views. However, I am confident that the foregoing is representative of the feelings of a sizeable majority of our Committee.

Dear Senator Kennedy:

First, I would like to offer my belated congratulations to you for your election to the Senate. I am very pleased to have you represent me. I intentionally waited to write you since I didn't want the important topic of this letter to be lost in the shuffle of your getting settled in a new office.

For many years now, I have been aware of the phenomena called UFOs. You no doubt have some knowledge of the subject and of the stigma of ridicule which is subjected upon those who have reported seeing one. At first, I too was inclined to reject this "wild" idea. However, upon closer examination I discovered that hundreds of our most reliable and respected citizens have reported seeing these objects, and many more who haven't seen them believe them to be of extraterrestrial origin. I eventually became aware of a private, non-profit organization called NICAP. (National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena) This group has been investigating these sightings, gathering the facts with documented evidence, and through their bi-monthly publication, making them known to the public.

After a seven year study all the evidence thus gathered has been published in a facinating report (184 pages) and then distributed to all members of Congress and the Senate. I don't know if you have seen a copy. If you haven't, I would like to have one sent to you. It would be well worth your time to read it. If by chance you have read it, I would like to know your reaction to it.

I am well aware of the Air Force policy debunking and explaining away sightings. This secrecy policy is a grave mistake. The facts must be made known, and to this end I urge open Congressional hearings. My feelings are well stated by Dr. Charles P. Olivier (President of the American Meteor Society). "In serving as a NICAP Board Member, my only purpose is to help in forcing further scientific investigation. UFOs have not been fully studied scientifically due to suppression of pertinent data and subjecting reports of trained and reputable people to ridicule. It is possible UFOs might eventually have serious effects upon our planet and its inhabitants, either for good or ill. I have no personal theory to advance or refute. In view of the importance of the subject, no matter what the outcome, I would be glad to see a very full inquiry



Sen. Barry Goldwater, a jet-flying AF Reserve Colonel: "Flying saucers -- unidentified flying objects -- or whatever you call them, are real."

This is in response to your inquiry in behalf of Private First Class Gary E. Stemm concerning unidentified flying objects (UFO).

The investigation of UFOs reported in the skies over the United States is the responsibility of the Air Force. The name of this unclassified project is Blue Book. A vital part of the program is the release of information to the public.

There is no truth to the allegation that the Air Force withholds or censors any information on UFOs. The results of all Air Force investigations have always been made available to bona fide news representatives and scientific researchers. Press releases are issued as warranted, and an annual report on the project is available to the public.

In 16 years of investigating over 9,000 reports of UFOs, the evidence has proved beyond reasonable doubt that all reported aerial phenomena have been objects either created and sent aloft by man, generated by atmospheric conditions, or caused by celestial bodies or the residue of meteoric activity.

The Air Force will continue to investigate all reports of unusual aerial phenomena over the United States. The evaluations and conclusions reached by the Air Force will be released to the public.

The former Chairman of the House Armed Services Committee, Mr. Carl Vinson, as recent as September of 1964, indicated his

satisfaction with the conduct of the UFO program by the Air Force and stated that there is no need for Congressional hearings on this subject.



This letter is a serious one, based on documented fact. I realize that the subject which I am writing about is one that has long had controversy and also complete ridicule surrounding it. But because of the facts which have been realized by many in only the last few years, this subject is developing a degree of respect.

The subject to which I am referring is unidentified flying objects ---UFO'S---or better known as "flying saucers."

I am trying to represent, in the best way I can, a serious investigating organization which has its main offices in Washington, D.C. It is the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (NICAP) which has been operating since 1956, with around 5000 members in all fifty states and thirty foreign countries. NICAP has recently completed a six year study of UFO'S and has published its results in a 186 page, 200,000 word, illustrated document entitled "THE UFO EVIDENCE REPORT." This document contains proof that our own Air Force has been keeping important UFO sightings from the American people. NICAP has been promised support by many Congressmen and Senators. If you have not obtained a copy of this document, you may write to NICAP at 1536 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20036, or stop at our office, which is open to the public.

In order to give you more information about NICAP, I will list a few main points:

1. NICAP is a serious research organization dealing in facts. Our Board of Governors and consultants include veteran military men and technical experts on aviation, space, astronomy, Intelligence analysis, etc.
2. We have many hundreds of verified UFO reports from military and airline pilots, airport tower operators, radar experts, other competent, reliable observers, including over 275 AF reports released to our director, Major Donald E. Keyhoe, before he became our director. Believe it or not, this documented evidence proves sufficiently that UFO maneuvers, formations, and speeds surpass any machines made on Earth.
3. NICAP has documented proof of UFO censorship, including the cover-up of fatal Air Force UFO chases and near-collisions with airliners in which passengers were injured.
4. All of these documented facts are now available in "THE UFO EVIDENCE," also the NICAP Board conclusion that the facts have been kept from Congress and the public. Dangers from the secrecy are growing, INCLUDING THE RISK OF ACCIDENTAL WAR FROM MISTAKING UFO'S FOR A SECRET SOVIET ATTACK.

Our Director, Major Keyhoe (USMC, ret.) has written an excellent article which is not intended to fool anyone.

I agree that there are the few in this field who are capitalizing on this subject---and many of them are leaving NICAP open for ridicule by using it as a springboard, unfortunately. I would not be involved with this organization or field if I wasn't absolutely positive that something is going on under the noses of every person in the U.S.A.



Dear Sir:

I am a member of the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (1536 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington 36, D. C.). Aside from other duties and responsibilities, this organization has published a report--THE UFO EVIDENCE--which I am told has been provided to members of Congress. Because I am deeply disturbed by the material contained therein, particularly with the sections dealing with unnecessary United States Air Force secrecy and censorship, I am writing to you for information and to request that you push for Congressional hearings on the subject. In the following pages I shall try to reveal some of the more important reasons why Congressional attention must be brought to bear on the facts as well as why this veil of secrecy imposed by the United States Air Force must be remedied immediately.

In World War 11, by official records, UFOs paced, circled and outmaneuvered our fastest aircraft--and the enemy's. Observers included hundreds of pilots, bomber crewmen, air-base and carrier personnel, radar-operators, and other members of our armed forces. Signed, verified reports in NJCAP (National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena) files show UFO speeds of 3,000 m.p.h. or more. Nothing used by the warring nations even remotely approached such fantastic speeds and maneuvers. It stands to reason that if any of the warring nations had had such tremendously advanced devices in 1942-45, whoever possessed them could have ended the war summarily--and controlled the world! If the United States or the U.S.S.R. had had such revolutionary craft after World War 11, the possessor long ago would have been operating in space--not with tiny "capsules" but with huge UFO-type spacecraft. Neither we nor the Russians would have kept on spending

billions on outmoded aircraft and rockets. The very idea is ridiculous. Furthermore, no such gigantic development could have possibly been kept secret all these years.

In 1948, at White Sands Proving Ground, Navy scientists and technicians saw and tracked a UFO at 18,000 m.p.h. In 1952, Air Force pilots, navigators and crewmen aboard a B-29 bomber saw and tracked formations of UFOs flying at 5,240 m.p.h., and also tracked a gigantic craft--apparently a carrier ship--at over 9,000 m.p.h. (Official Air Force Intelligence report.)

Today, these same UFO operations continue, in our atmosphere, at such terrific speeds that any conventional aircraft or rocket would burn up from air friction. Massive verified evidence proves that some revolutionary force is involved in UFO propulsion and control--something we have not to date been able to duplicate. Occasionally, an Echo satellite, a rocket launching or a re-entry has caused mistaken UFO reports. So, occasionally, have balloons or meteors. This does not, however, alter the basic facts. NO earthmade device can possibly explain the UFOs' speeds in our atmosphere. This was true in World War 11--and it is still true today. Where does this leave us then?

There are basically two explanations for the consistent, world-wide reporting of UFOs every year:

1. Widespread and presently unaccountable delusion on a scale so vast that it should be, in itself, a matter of urgent scientific study;
2. People ARE seeing maneuvering, apparently controlled objects in the atmosphere.

Of the two hypotheses, the second appears to be more reasonable and it is solidly grounded in empirical observations. It is also borne out, in enough cases to warrant far more scientific investigation, by instruments. However, the basic problem is to determine as conclusively as possible which hypothesis is correct. For obvious reasons, verification of the second hypothesis could be one of the most important discoveries of all time!

Given the evidence contained in the NICAP report, THE UFO

EVIDENCE, it is certainly a reasonable assumption that the unexplained UFOs are:

1. Real, physical objects rather than the result of imagination, hallucination, illusion or delusion;
2. Artificial, rather than purely natural, such as meteorological and astronomical phenomena;
3. Under the control (piloted or remote) of living beings.

To date, serious scientific attention to UFOs has been severely limited by several factors, including:

1. The Air Force practice of implying, through its public relations program, that all available information has been disseminated and there is no need for further investigations;
2. The Air Force practice of artificially reducing the significance of the data through the use of counter-to-fact explanations of sightings and issuance of misleading statistics;
3. The lack of governmental recognition, through the Congress and the Executive Branch, that a scientific problem exists which ought to be probed.

The basic problem and the key to the solution (at least as I see it) is to bring to the attention of responsible people something which, if true, could be of very great significance to the whole human race.

The basic danger associated with UFOs is a danger to the very fabric of society if UFOs are in fact real unexplained objects maneuvering in our atmosphere. There is a danger of a reverse delusion -- fooling ourselves into believing nothing of any significance is being seen. There is a danger of an unprepared public, and the possibility of widespread panic if an external danger or threat to our way of life is suddenly imposed upon us without some prior knowledge of what has been learned about UFOs. Without psychological preparedness, a sudden confrontation with extraterrestrial beings (for example) could have disastrous results. If there is deliberate secrecy being practiced by authorities (rather than a semi-conscious failure to face up to facts), this would appear to be inexcusable!

Secrecy breeds fear and paves the way for panic, by introducing false fears and causing people to substitute imagination for reality. The danger of continuing such a policy was pointed out by NJCAP Advisor Morton Gerla, a professional engineer, when he said: "This short-sighted policy results in delaying the solution of the UFO mystery, leaving both the military and civilian populations unprepared for whatever steps may eventually have to be taken, whether peaceful or hostile. In the event of action being forced upon our government or people by UFO initiative, public confidence in a government following a policy of secrecy prior to being forced into action would be shattered, perhaps with catastrophic results to morale."

Why are UFOs important? Because if they are real (not explainable as a variety of conventional objects or natural phenomena), it is generally conceded by experts that they are most likely space ships. Their presence in our skies would naturally be a matter of utmost concern to all nations of the world.

I personally feel, as does the NJCAP Board of Governors, that the following steps should be taken to rectify a very unsatisfactory situation:

1. The evidence in Air Force files (after deletion of legitimate security information such as data concerning the capabilities of radar) should be made freely available to any interested citizens.
2. There should be a Congressional inquiry into the Air Force's Project Blue Book to establish,
 - a) the amount and kind of UFO information in the files, and whether all significant non-security data has been made public;
 - b) the scientific adequacy of the investigation (whether there has been a consistently objective, scientific study of the evidence, or whether it has been erratic and influenced negatively by high-level policy decisions, lack of funds, or other factors).

I have here presented but a few of the reasons why I am concerned about this problem. Included in the 184 pages of the NJCAP report are

enough verified facts to shatter the doubts of the most dubious skeptic and I ask that you please take notice. What I ask of you, Sir, is recognition of the problem, a sincere effort on your part to see that Congressional hearings are held and that a long overdue scientific investigation is carried out, once and for all. I am taking time to write you because of the tremendous amount of respect I have for you and your late brother and because I know you pay attention to the voices of little people who are without a platform from which to speak.

I will anxiously await your remarks and decision.



Dear Senator Johnson:

The report of your Committee on Aeronautical and Space Sciences, "Space Research in the Life Sciences" was kindly sent me, and I have been deeply interested in its content and in the conclusions.

The press has been quick to note your criticism of NASA for having organized a division of life sciences. In my own view, the administration may be liable to many criticisms, but this is one of the most constructive steps that NASA has undertaken. I say this both as a research scientist dealing with NASA on space science projects and from my experience as a member of the Space Science Board. This view also is shared by all of my scientific colleagues whom I have consulted. As I have greatly admired your support for science and for the space program in the United States Senate, I am especially anxious that you hear such a comment.

The organization of the Office of Life Sciences in NASA was particularly urgent to mobilize our scientific talent for the problem of exobiology, the nature of life on other planets. This is surely one of the most exciting challenges in our space problem and much more scientific support must be given this area to ensure the success of our intended missions. Without the advice of the new office, NASA could not have the expert knowledge to cope with these tremendous problems.

In fact, before now, some extraordinary nonsense has been promulgated in the name of space biology -- for a specific example, the breeding of "space monkeys." Such inanities have been widely publicized and have antagonized many informed people, especially biologists, to the point where the serious objectives of our national space program have become obscured in their minds. The Office of Life Sciences now gives NASA the means to screen new projects and ensure that only creditable ones are given the dignity of participation in the American program, for the same sober merit that attaches to our splendid accomplishments in space physics. Whether this office or any responsible authority will be able to moderate the publicity attracted by other silly projects in many scattered installations, particularly the military ones, is a problem that does deserve your serious consideration.

Another example of the need for expert knowledge in the NASA organization on problems of biology is in the unlikely field, for a rocket engineer, of disinfection. It has finally been recognized that we


need to ensure the complete decontamination of any vehicles that we may send to planetary targets to avoid the hazards of spreading earth-life forms elsewhere by inadvertence. Implementing this caution requires a well informed administrative authority.

It is not easy to see why the Department of Defense should wish to be involved in exobiology and indeed, I would strenuously oppose such involvement both in principle and for tactical reasons -- for example, hindrance to international cooperation for projects that have a close military connection.

Many inconsistencies and illogicalities must arise from the executive directive that there is no military mission in space. Since the Department of Defense will have to continue advanced programs in space technology and space science for patent defense needs as well as to avoid ugly surprises, such a directive can only provoke well-intentioned efforts at evasion. I hope that the next administration will give serious consideration to reinstating and clarifying the military interest in space programs -- and, for example, to returning the development of manned space flight to military supervision. It is difficult to find serious justification for a crash program in manned space flight for scientific purposes, but we should not overlook ultimate military applications. Many of my colleagues would deplore the frantic effort which the House Committee has urged NASA to make to send man to the moon. Thus, a continuing expert review of the capabilities and intended uses of man in space flight would be another indispensable purpose of an independent Office of Life Sciences in the Space Agency.

No one could quarrel with the insistence that government agencies must coordinate with one another to prevent waste. But for NASA to function effectively, it must have its own technical competence in biology, and biological problems must be represented in the formation of policy.
