Queens UFO Investigator Takes Reagan's Speculations on 'Alien Invasion' Seriously

Second in a two-part series.

In our previous column we discussed what appears to be something President Reagan thinks often about: how an alien invasion from outer space could unite the nations of Earth in a common front. The idea had been speculated earlier by General Douglas MacArthur, yet almost nobody has paid attention to it. Colman von Keviczky, a retired Major with the Royal Hungarian Army and the founder and director of ICUFON, a small UFO research organization based in Queens, is the exception to this rule. The Hungarian-American military biologist believes both Reagan and MacArthur didn't pose a rhetorical or hypothetical question with their alien invasion scenario, but actually issued a veiled warning to the public that this indeed was the case.

Von Keviczky received his Master of Military Science and Engineering (MMSE) at the historical Ludovica University in Budapest. As a Captain and then Major with the Royal Hungarian Army, he created the Audio-Visual Department of the Hungarian General Staff before World War II. After the war he worked for the U.S. occupation forces in Germany, and emigrated to the United States in 1952, the year his interest in UFOs began. Von Keviczky is a member of the American Institute of Aeronautics & Astronautics (AIAA) and his biography appears in *Who's Who in Aviation & Aerospace*.

In the mid-60s, von Keviczky worked with the United Nations staff audio-visual department, where he became involved in a controversy over UFOs and the U.N. In 1966, von Keviczky was actually commissioned by Secretary General U Thant to work on a preliminary memo on how the UFO problem could be inserted in the U.N. agenda. However, the Major found he no longer had a job at the U.N. after he leaked news of this assignment to the press. Yet U Thant confided around that time that "he considers UFOs the most important problem facing the U.N. next to the war in Vietnam," as reported in Drew Pearson's syndicated column.

Out of the U.N. in 1966, von Keviczky has pursued this "UFO Crusade" on his own and through ICUFON

from his home in Queens. Through countless contacts in Europe, Japan, Brazil, and many other countries, he has amassed a remarkable collection of UFO photographs and documents from around the world. The best of the documents have been presented recently in his latest massive memoranda filed with the Secretary General and several U.N. Missions.

The Memorandum consists of four "Dossiers," divided in: A) "The UFOs Potential Threat Syndrome;" B) "Military Disposals on Armed Defense against the Extraterrestrial Intruders (UFOs);" C) "Undeclared Warfare against the UFO-Galactic Forces;" and D) "Road to the Star War and the Question of Survival." Altogether, they contain about 300 declassified documents, which describe some 140 "classic cases."

The first dossier deals with a number of UFO incidents over atomic installations, oil fields, and other power sources, close encounters with commercial airliners, vessels, and motor vehicles, and finally the mystery of so-called cattle mutilations. The documentation includes CIA, FBI, USAF, and other U.S.

government documents released under the Freedom of Information Act, as well as report forms from commercial airline companies, scientific sources, and the news media.

The Major has not always been successful in retrieving documents to prove his point. For instance, on June 14 and on July 24, 1984, "a huge elongated solid structure" was seen by security guards at Reactor No. 3 of the Indian Point Atomic Power Plants in Buchanan, upstate New York. Although investigator Phillip Imbrogno personally interviewed the witnesses and published an account of the case in his book about the Hudson Valley UFO flap, *Night Siege*, neither Imbrogno nor von Keviczky were able to obtain under the FOIA a single official document about this incident. In what the Major nicknamed a "rolling FOIA ball," he was given a complete run-around by the N.Y. Power Authority, the NRC, DOE, the USAF and NASA. Since we know that something potentially serious took place at Indian Point, we must conclude that these agencies are either incompetent or are engaged in a cover-up regarding this incident.

The following dossiers in a similar fashion produce whole lists of UFO incidents at various war fronts, military bases, leaks by military personnel, etc. Some cases, like the 1976 dogfight between Iranian F-4 "Phantom" jets and a UFO over Teheran, or the disappearance in 1978 of a Cessna plane in Australia, are well known in the UFO literature. Others are certainly not, and the author must be congratulated for making these known. A case in point is a July 1985 "restricted" report from the UN Military Forces in Cyprus.

The document's "ITEM 2" was titled, "Observation of UFO's in the Area of Famagusta." It informed the UN about UFO sightings in Famagusta, describing them as

"bright lights changing from white to red and green," and adding to "ask UN to give information if UN would have recognized the incidents. UN promise to investigate." Yet when von Keviczky inquired about this report with the UN Military Staff Committee, he was told that such report didn't exist, and that "the United Nations has no organization that follows the sightings of UFO's."

A significant portion of the dossiers contain political and diplomatic documents about space agreements between the super powers. Of particular interest is a little known clause of an "Agreement On Measures to Reduce the Risk of Outbreak of Nuclear War" between the USA and the USSR, signed by Secretary of State William Rogers and Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko on September 30, 1971. "Article 3" reads, "The Parties undertake to notify each other immediately in the event of detection by missile warning systems of unidentified objects, or in the event of signs of interference with these systems or with related communications facilities, if such occurrences could create a risk of outbreak of nuclear war between the two countries." Furthermore, "Article 8" tells us that, "This Agreement shall be of unlimited duration."

The Major believes that the super powers are well aware of this UFO threat, and that SDI should really be called "Star Wars," since its real target are the "UFO Forces" and not the Soviets. The rest, he says, is a propaganda campaign launched both by Washington and Moscow to deceive world attention about the purpose of this and other space weapons. Although this will sound preposterous to many, the whole collection of documents released by ICUFON must be read before one can pass judgment on the Major's theory.

In any case, whether you become convinced or not that Earth is facing a potential alien invasion, Colman von Keviczky has certainly produced a valuable package of UFO-related documents that should be of interest to anyone who wants to study this contemporary problem. Even Robert Sheaffer, a prominent UFO skeptic, once commended von Keviczky for preserving for posterity a number of classic UFO documents.

Foreword

By Major Kolman S. VonKeviczky

'The hour-hand on the pages of history is very late. Your opportunity to rise to the occasion and to act *now*, on behalf of your own nation's security and that of other nations of the world, is indeed very great and in your lifetime will never occur again'. – C.W. Stackhouse, ICUFON's staff

Since February 25, 1942, when the first 1,350 rounds of ammunition were fired in vain above Los Angeles, California upon alleged Japanese reconnaissance planes, the 'floating silver balls' appearing over the European and Far East theatres have become a reality neither as an Axis Power intrusion, nor as a weapon in the post-war superpowers' armoury – but as some sort of flying craft of surveillance of unearthly origin.

United States military and intelligence-gathering agencies – e.g. the FBI and CIA – had by 1951 verified that the alien craft are constructed and built by means of scientific and technological principles vastly transcending our own. Moreover, it has been established that these sinister extraterrestrial task forces' most favoured subjects of observation are energy sources, military industries, installations and operations, transportation and communication systems – all of which are of a prohibited nature, especially to foreign detection. Hence the suggestion that a nation of the stature of the United States must be coerced into undertaking sufficient precautions to insure national security, with special attention to the highly confidential military, nuclear and space research experimentation then in progress.

The initial strategic directive regarding unidentified flying objects, implemented by the Pentagon in September 1951, was issued by the Joint Chiefs of Staff Joint Communication-Electronics Committee of the United States, with Canadian support to assure its continental effectiveness. The JANAP 146 (B) general order to the Armed Forces of USA and Canada, periodically updated by supplements (C) through (E) until 1973, set up the largest global emergency network – NATO, NASA's global tracking stations, and the UN International Civil Aviation Organisation included – against the galactic task forces. The concealed military armed confrontation by this network are confirmed by the leading of several 'strictly confidential' orders, the reports of the international news media, strategical and tactical

war games of the high military leadership in relation to galactic forces, the US Air Force Academy's textbook *Introductory Space Science* (Chapter 33, Unidentified Flying Objects), and last but not least the former head of the USAF Project Blue Book in the Pentagon, Capt Edward J. Ruppelt's *The Report on UFOs*.

Let us first consider the legal aspects of our defence confrontation to this illicit intrusion into the earth's aerospace:

According to international law, it is each nation's sovereign right to initiate military action against any unallowed intruder on or above its national territory. (On May 7, 1960, a U-2 reconnaissance plane of the US was shot down above USSR.) *However, no international provision has yet been set up to restrict armed intervention by those unidentified airborne and waterborne objects whose confrontation is hazardous, and further, could lead the world into an awesome space war.* This vital international security problem has been suppressed for over three decades, and the world public has been intentionally and dangerously misinformed.

During 1968-9 hundreds of American soldiers were kidnapped in Vietnam's demilitarized zone as a result of armed confrontations with disembarked crews of galactic spacecraft (UFOs). "One of them even triggered an air and sea battle in which an Australian destroyer was hit", disclosed the present USAF Chief of Staff, General George S. Brown, to startled newspaper reporters in Chicago, Illinois, in November 1973. He declined any further comment.

This disclosure by a highly responsible national defence authority is not only massive evidence of United States' confrontation with galactic forces, but it is the gravest indictment against USAF, its Condon Report and the National Academy of Sciences, contradicting the United States Government's official attitude of December 17, 1969, at which time its armed forces had incurred heavy losses of manpower during assaults by galactic forces. Somehow it remains a duty of the US Government to explain this highly inconsistent statement at the same time to the nations, that "no intelligent life from outside of our solar system has any possibility of visiting Earth in the next 10,000 years" (*Scientific Study of UFOs*, page 28).

Undoubtedly, United States domestic and foreign policy for more than three decades tried to conceal the real reason for its covertly organized emergency network and its armed activity from the rest of the world, in order to prevent their instigating a United Nations investigation of unidentified flying objects. This US attitude may be categorized into the following three phases:

(1) US governmental policy cleverly circumvented this international

security problem by ceaselessly reverting to the 'scientific study' until its exhaustion. The endless polemics on the subject were aimed to discredit the bona fide UFO sighting reports by technically qualified observers, to paralyse the activities of private UFO organizations, and to calm the public with *ex cathedra* pronouncements implying that UFOs are merely unexplained atmospheric phenomena.

(2) Unable to calm public anxieties, the government attempted to tranquillize the populace by declassifying and reopening the 'public' UFO project (*Project Blue Book*) – and by compelling well paid scientists to corroborate with persuasive public statements government policy on this controversial topic.

(3) When on December 9, 1969 the Intercontinental Galactic Spacecraft UFO Research and Analytic Network (ICUFON) submitted a proposal, wherein it requested all governments to convene a World Congress for the International Consideration of Non-Terrestrial Spacecraft Operation, the US Secretary of the Air Force, Robert C. Seamans Jr., publicly stated on behalf of President Richard M. Nixon that "There is no evidence that UFOs are extraterrestrial".

It is deplorable that American science, in spite of its reputation for space technology since the 1940s, was unable to determine the origin of these internationally sighted alien craft, whose existence is confirmed by earthly optical and electronic instruments, radioactive landing marks, accidents, injuries and deaths of military and civilian personnel.

After 30 years of wilful misinformation the world's governments and the scientific community must after all seriously assume that the galactic powers' operation clearly indicates a centrally conducted 'interstellar reconnaissance' with the ultimate objective of a landing operation on earthly soil. Any confrontation with inadequate weaponry to an immensely superior scientific and military technology, to force their departure, could ruin the whole world – solely because of governments' and countries' lack of foresight.

* We must realize that, without the existence of an international authority which secures the essential co-ordination of the world's scientists and researchers on this global problem, all humanitarian efforts, scientific studies and research, are futile. We are hunting for signals of human existence in the depth of the universe instead of finding them on and around our own celestial body.

The three men believed the impressions were made by the UFO when it landed.

At 8.45 pm on January 12, Sherry Eckhardt of Oklahoma City was talking on the telephone to her mother, Mrs R. Parker, when a peculiar kind of interference began. A voice said: 'This is Norad Tinker UNG Two. Red Alert.'

Mrs Eckhardt called her husband to the telephone and he reported hearing conversations between Air Force Bases in Texas, Florida, New Mexico, California and North American Air Defence Command headquarters in Cheyenne Mountain, Colorado. Thinking it was some kind of practical joke, Eckhardt hung up.

Mrs Parker called her daughter again and they discovered the strange conversation still taking place. The subject, according to the Eckhardts and Mrs Parker, seemed to be two flights of UFOs – one approaching Houston, Texas, and the other Los Angeles.

A voice reportedly from Houston repeated several times: 'This is not a test. We are under red alert!' and then went on to discuss the activities of two Air Force jets which had been sent up to intercept near Alamogordo, New Mexico.

Investigation teams were being dispatched, according to what the Eckhardts and Mrs Parker reported hearing. Then, they said, Houston kept saying: 'Hold the line for the President.' After a few moments of garbled transmission, Eckhardt said: 'A voice, which sounded very much like President Nixon's said in effect: "This is probably the most unusual telephone call I'll ever make."'

All officials contacted denied that such events or conversations took place, some suggesting a hoax of some kind. The White House issued a denial saying President Nixon was in seclusion working on his State of the Union Message. The Defence Department, North American Air Defence Command and Tinker Air Force Base, all issued denials. The Telephone Company admitted that though it was unlikely that such a thing could happen by means of what was termed 'frequency drift' due to severe or unusual weather conditions, it was possible.

A spokesman at Holloman Air Force Base in Alamogordo, said: 'We're not allowed to say anything about it.' A Sgt Swanson at Tinker Air Force Base said he couldn't release any information about North American Air Defence Command communications.

On February 8 in Charlotte, North Carolina, a yellow-orange circle was reported left on the ground after a UFO beamed a 'searchlight like beam' on a frightened dog (which mysteriously disappeared). The witness was shocked

by what he saw and stopped his car to watch the entire episode which occurred on the Providence Road.

Residents in the Colorado Springs area reported on April 16 to the American Defence Command, a bright light hovering in the vicinity of the moon. Some of the witnesses said there were antennas visible.

According to *Grit* newspaper, Dighton, Kansas, a town of 1,050 residents, has for several months been receiving visits by a UFO. It has been described as a cluster of bright lights by the Chief of Police, several policemen and other citizens who reported seeing it. The UFO has been sighted several times a month, usually between 11 pm and the early morning hours, since late February. Police Chief M. Shelton said the UFO remained stationary until an investigating policeman radioed another car about it.

'Every time we transmit, it moved,' he said. 'I'm dumbfounded and think: "What the hell is it?"' he added.

The theory was that a mother ship is hovering high over the earth and dispatching smaller craft to look the earth over.

A chart of the UFO sightings shows them all within a near-equilateral triangle, with sides about 120 miles long. Hayes lies in the centre of that triangle and reported the majority of the recent sightings. The south-west corner of the triangle is at Dighton where the UFOs reappear every three to four days. Along with positive sightings – most verified by police officers – there have been a few even more unusual reports. A Hayes police dispatcher said one citizen called in to report craft with something like strings or 'parachutes' hanging below them.

Police Chief Shelton, himself, saw it and chased it with his car at speeds of up to 100 mph. He stated it would run parallel to his car, or slightly ahead of it.

A Forbes Air Force Base spokesman at Topeka said: 'After checking their records they cannot account for any low-level flights' – low level being ground level to 3,500 feet. Forbes does have a plane equipped to take infra-red photographs but the spokesman said it flies well in excess of 50,000 feet, and it can't hover – it's a twin-engine jet. McConnell Air Force Base at Wichita also indicated it had no flights over the area.

Shelton said authorities decided not to call in the Air Force to check on the UFOs, partly out of fear of not being believed.

Residents of Lafayette, California, and other central county communities reported UFOs passing overhead early on the morning of August 5. One observer watched 'two large spheres land in Briones Regional Park'.

Most of the callers reported the same thing – a large, orange sphere gliding overhead in a north-westerly direction. The Contra Costa County Sheriff's

My Dear President Reagan:

On 28 January, 1981, with the most sincere intentions and faith in our nation, ICUFON Inc. and its joint U.S. and foreign UFO Research Organizations requested that you, as the President of United States, and the Highest Commander of its military forces, take the initial step for the solution of the decades-long suppressed first and the foremost vital international and security problem - THE EXTRATERRESTRIAL UFO FORCES EARTHBOUND OPERATION, - BEING VALIDATED BY THE UNITED STATES and ALL THE NATIONS' MILITARY FORCES.

// We were flabbergasted that over the past eight months you have ignored us, and the White House did not even deign to confirm our Memorandum. Suspiciously - as if a central command had been silently issued - your closest associates including the White House Chief of Staff, Edward Messe; the Honorable Howard H. Baker Jr., Majority Leader of the Senate; John G. Tower, Chairman U.S. Senate Committee on Armed Services; Thomas P. O'Neill, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and others, were wilfully ignored even for the usual confirmation of those persuasive evidences, which basically demanded their prompt attention.

But - your affirmation on our Memorandum became justified by the Pentagon's subsequent ban to declassify further UFO documentation under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C.552), which indicated to us that you were SILENCED by the highest national security authorities rather, than SILENT on the UFO problem, which must be on the top of your Military Agenda.

In June 1978, the International Security Department of the State Dept. had announced (Dep.Dir. Michael Michaud) that the United States - obviously with its allies - is ready to drive a war against the Galactic - UFO - Forces.

(Just a reminder to the late Gen. Douglas McArthur address to the West Point Military Academy in 1962.)

We are sorry, but these indications created the verifying components of our firm belief in the EXISTING INTERNATIONAL CONSPIRACY. This conspiracy over the decades has been hazarding with the UFO problem, and speculating beyond the honesty of the blindfolded nations about the impending space war. May I present you its highest chain of evidences as the follows:

Exhibit # 1 and 2. On March 1966, Gerard R. FORD, Congressman of Michigan, as Minority Leader rattled his congressional sabre in his letter, addressed to Rep. Mendel R. 

DEAR CHAIRMAN RIVERS: No doubt you have noted the recent flurry of newspaper stories about unidentified flying objects (UFO's). I have taken special interest in these accounts because many of the latest reported sightings have been in my home State of Michigan.

The Air Force sent a consultant, Astrophysicist Dr. J. Allen Hynek of Northwestern University, to Michigan to investigate the various reports; and he dismissed all of them as the product of college student pranks or swamp gas or an impression created by the rising crescent moon and the planet Venus. I do not agree that all of these reports can be or should be so easily explained away.

Because I think there may be substance to some of these reports and because I believe the American people are entitled to a more thorough explanation than has been given them by the Air Force to date, I am proposing that either the Science and Astronautics Committee or the Armed Services Committee of the House schedule hearings on the subject of UFO's and invite testimony from both the executive branch of the Government and some of the persons who claim to have seen UFO's.

I enclose material which I think will be helpful to you in assessing the advisability of an investigation of UFO's.

May I first call to your attention a column by Roscoe Drummond, published last Sunday in which Mr. Drummond says, "Maybe all of these reported sightings are whimsical, imaginary or unreal; but we need a more credible and detached appraisal of the evidence than we are getting."

Mr. Drummond goes on to state, "We need to get all the data drawn together in one place and examined far more objectively than anyone has done so far. A stable public opinion will come from a trustworthy look at the evidence, not from belittling it."

"The time has come for the President or Congress to name an objective and respected panel to investigate, appraise, and report on all present and future evidence about what is going on."

I agree fully with Mr. Drummond's statements. I also suggest you scan the enclosed series of six articles by Bulkeley Griffin of the Griffin-Larrabee News Bureau here. In the last of his articles, published last January, Mr. Griffin says, "A main conclusion can be briefly stated. It is that the Air Force is misleading the public by its continuing campaign to produce and maintain belief that all sightings can be explained away as misidentification of familiar objects, such as balloons, stars, and aircraft."

I have just today received a number of telegrams urging a congressional investigation of UFO's. One is from retired Air Force Col. Harold R. Brown, Ardmore, Tenn., who says, "I have seen UFO. Will be available to testify."

Another, from Mrs. Ethyle M. Davis, Eugene, Oreg., reads, "9 out of 10 people want truth of UFO's. Press your investigation to the fullest."

Ronald Collier of Los Angeles, who identifies himself as "a scientist from MIT," urges that you "do everything in your power to make Air Force Project Blue Book (the Air Force name for its study and verdicts on UFO reports) known to the people." Are we to assume that everyone who says he has seen UFO's is an unreliable witness?

A UPI story out of Ann Arbor, Mich., dated March 21, 1966, states that "at least 40 persons, including 12 policemen, said today that they saw a strange flying object guarded by 4 sister ships land in a swamp near here Sunday night."

Matt Surrell of Station WJR, Detroit, cites an eye witness account of a recent UFO sighting by Emile Grenier of Ann Arbor, an aeronautical engineer employed by Ford Motor Co. He points out that an aeronautical engineer can hardly be considered an untrustworthy witness.

In the firm belief that the American public deserves a better explanation than that thus far given by the Air Force, I strongly recommend that there be a committee investigation of the UFO phenomena.

I think we owe it to the people to establish credibility regarding UFO's and to produce the greatest possible enlightenment on this subject.

Dear Ambassador Griffith:

I wanted to convey to you my views on our extra-terrestrial visitors popularly referred to as "UFO's", and suggest what might be done to properly deal with them.

I believe that these extra-terrestrial vehicles and their crews are visiting this planet from other planets, which obviously are a little more technically advanced than we are here on earth. I feel that we need to have a top level, coordinated program to scientifically collect and analyze data from all over the earth concerning any type of encounter, and to determine how best to interface with these visitors in a friendly fashion. We may first have to show them that we have learned to resolve our problems by peaceful means, rather than warfare, before we are accepted as fully qualified universal team members. This acceptance would have tremendous possibilities of advancing our world in all areas. Certainly then it would seem that the UN has a vested interest in handling this subject properly and expeditiously.

I should point out that I am not an experienced UFO professional researcher. I have not yet had the privilege of flying a UFO, nor of meeting the crew of one. I do feel that I am somewhat qualified to discuss them since I have been into the fringes of the vast areas in which they travel. Also, I did have occasion in 1951 to have two days of observation of many flights of them, of different sizes, flying in fighter formation, generally from east to west over Europe. They were at a higher altitude than we could reach with our jet fighters of that time.

I would also like to point out that most astronauts are very reluctant to even discuss UFO's due to the great numbers of people who have indiscriminately sold fake stories and forged documents abusing their names and reputations without hesitation. Those few astronauts who have continued to have a participation in the UFO field have had to do so very cautiously. There are several of us who do believe in UFO's and who have had occasion to see a UFO on the ground, or from an airplane. There was only one occasion from space which may have been a UFO.

If the UN agrees to pursue this project, and to lend their credibility to it, perhaps many more well qualified people will agree to step forth and provide help and information.

I am looking forward to seeing you soon.







This fact, like so many others that make up the full flying saucer story, has never before been told.

I know the full story about flying saucers and I know that it has never before been told because I organized and was chief of the Air Force's Project Blue Book, the special project set up to investigate and analyze unidentified flying object, or UFO, reports.





As a means of promoting vigilance and thus extending the early warning coverage for the defense of the North American continent, the U. S. 

Information below was issued by Peter GERSTEN, Attorney at law, who under the FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT by Court Judgement forced the U.S. Government, Pentagon, and Intelligence Agencies to DECLASSIFY WITHHELD and SECRET UFO DOCUMENTS.

Abstract: CUBAN - SOVIET MIG-21 (UM E76) JET DISINTEGRATED BY UFO

Intelligence Report to the U.S. National Security Agency (NSA) of the Air Force Security Service (AFSS), 6947th Security Squadron's Detachment A, - located at Key West Naval Station, Florida.

Origin: statement of a Security Specialist of one of the Detachment A Group (name withheld for security reason), positioned off the Boca Chica Key Island, - east from Key West, 97 miles from Cuba. The group monitors the Cuban Air Force operation, communication and radar transmission.

In March, 1967, the Cuban radar air defense control reported a "BOGEY" - UFO - nearing at an altitude 10,000 meters with a speed of 650/mph. the NE cost of the Cuban airspace.

Two MIG-21 jet fighter were ordered by the Cuban Air Defense to intercept the object, which was radioded by the flight commander as a bright metallic craft(consult U.S.Capt Thomas Mantell disaster on Jan.7, 1948) within a spherical envelop. No national insignia or additional details were visible from the distance of 5 km.

When the radio communication failed - as usual - the Cuban Air Defense Command ordered to the flight leader:

DESTROY THE OBJECT!

(The MIG-21 is equipped with the K-13A air-to-air type missiles.)

Seconds later the wingman screamed to the control station that his flight leader's jet had exploded! - Further communication cleared up that the jet had desintegrated because no smoke or flame was visible.

The UFO climbed forthwith up to 30,000 meters, heading to SSE toward the south American continent.

The National Security Agency (NSA) directed at once to trasmit all the tapes with the relevant data recorded on the incident. 15-20 members of the Detachment A were fully informed about the unusual event, which became to light ten years later by a witness, who disagrees with the U.S. government's policy to silence and suppress a potential threat steeming from outer space.

Assault against Army Helicopter (U.S.A.)

His statement about his perilous encounter and assault by a "nuts and bolts" galactic spacecraft was explained on November 27, 1978, before the U.N. Special Political Committee Session as follows:

18. Lt. Col. COYNE described an incident that had occurred on 18 October 1973 involving a United States Army utility helicopter, of which he had been in command, and an unidentified flying object. The incident had almost resulted in a mid-air collision.

19. The helicopter, with a crew of four men, had left Columbus, Ohio, for Cleveland, Ohio, at 10.30 p.m. on a clear night. During the flight, a red-lighted aircraft had been observed approaching the helicopter at very high speed. He had immediately contacted Mansfield, Ohio, approach control by radio, asking if any high-performance aircraft were in the area. After an initial acknowledgement, no further response had been received from the ground, although the helicopter's radio still seemed to be functioning. Although all evasive action had proved futile, no collision had in fact occurred. The aircraft had positioned itself directly in front of the moving helicopter. It had been 50 to 60 feet long with a grey metallic structure. On the front of the aircraft, which was symmetrical in shape, there had been a large, steady, bright red light. From the undercarriage, a green light had emerged, which had then swung through an angle of 90 degrees to shine directly into the cockpit of the helicopter. He had noticed that the magnetic compass on the helicopter instrument panel was no longer holding a steady course, but was spinning slowly. Attempts to establish communication with the ground using the emergency radio frequency had been unavailing. The helicopter, with the object still positioned in front of it, had begun to climb at a rate of 1,000 feet per minute, in spite of the fact that the controls were still set for a 2,000-foot-per-minute descent. At 3,500 feet, he had applied a power change to the helicopter, and at 3,800 feet, a bump had been felt. At no other time during the incident had any extraneous noise been heard, or any turbulence felt by any member of the crew. The UFO had then moved slowly westward, away from the helicopter, and the green light had been retracted, with the helicopter settling into a descent. The object had been momentarily positioned above the helicopter, at which point a bright white light had been observed. As the object's distance from the helicopter increased, the light had become even brighter and a noticeable increase in speed had been observed. After first flying west, the object had turned north-west at even higher speed and had disappeared. At that point, communication had been re-established with the ground.

20. No noticeable wings, landing gear or vertical or horizontal stabilizers had been observed on the object. Nevertheless, it had demonstrated its ability to change or maintain altitude and headings and to change speed.

21. He was convinced that the object had been real and that such incidents should be thoroughly investigated.

The meeting rose at 12.45 p.m.

Excerpt: L.H. STRINGFIELD: SITUATION RED - The UFO Siege

What The Intent - a Priority Question

KOREA

A dense fog was lifting over the coastal waters off Binn, Korea, on a fall day in 1974. On shore, for the men of the Air Defense Artillery, the day was starting like any other day. In such "attack" units it is always a matter of wait and see and being in bit preparedness in the event the North Koreans should strike south. Hawk missiles, three to a pad, were always on a "ready alert."

About 10:00 A.M., the base radar unit picked up a blip. It was a "bogey" moving in fast from out at sea toward Binn's shore-line defense system. At seven hundred yards there was a visual contact. The men on duty could see its massive form in the haze. The form was oval-shaped; a glowing metallic disc, estimated to be one hundred yards in diameter, ten yards high, with red and green pulsating lights moving around the rim counterclockwise. Suddenly the huge craft stopped, at less than seven hundred yards range, its lights blinking rapidly. It was not a missile or a conventional aircraft, nor was it marked by any insignia. For certain, the craft's lack of identity and its menacing position in the Binn area meant SITUATION RED. The command's decision: the craft is hostile!

The captain of D Battery gave orders to fire the first Hawk missile. Ignited, it started off the pad. In clear view of the men wait-

ing anxiously from a remote-control zone, the missile, according to my informant at the scene, "never made it." It was hit by a beam of intense white light and destroyed! So was the launcher! Both were melted down like lead toys. In a matter of minutes, the unidentified craft, making a sound like a swarm of bees, departed from Binn at extraordinary speed and disappeared from the radarscope!

Whatever the purpose, the UFO was an armed vehicle prepared to operate either defensively or offensively. Certainly the super-brain behind the mission to Binn must have known of the dangerous circumstances, and also that it had the upper hand, with the ultimate weapon.

My informant relates that the captain of D Battery was dumbfounded by the action. And, in everyone's view, was a melted mass representing millions of dollars of highly sophisticated equipment. Fortunately, because of the missile base's remote-control mechanism, there were no casualties. The next day, all members of the battalion on duty were summoned to a secret meeting and told by the commanding officer that the disaster was absolutely hush-hush. But, regardless of UFO secrecy, the men on the base never felt secure again.





Major Urges Global Pact To Avoid Interstellar War

"Stand Me Lord and be identified!"

"A great man indeed, but who passes with you? Any man of the Queen's court must stand back and not enter!"

"No royalty indeed," the Earl of Clancarty replied, "but a commoner and a foreigner, my good man, a visitor from the former Colonies, now America, who also distinguished himself in battle in Hungary and who fought with the Allies in the last war."


"Ye may pass, me lord, as well as your companion. And a good day to you, General!"

He liked the other man, and was just catching on to his wry, underplayed sense of humor, such as his reference to...

'A POTENTIAL THREAT TO US!'



A Conversation With Maj Colman VonKeviczky

BARKER: Well, Major, it certainly is nice to speak to you personally and get answers to some of the questions that came to mind as I was reviewing your House of Lords presentation. First I'd like to clarify your recommendations that the great military powers get together, share information, and work out common defenses for the threat of the UFOs. Would you elaborate on this?

VONKEVICZKY: Yes, the military authorities of all nations should cooperate. They could do this without giving away their own vital military secrets. They could agree to share ONLY that information relating to the UFOs which would not compromise purely military information. This cooperation might lead to further international efforts to prevent what I term an impending 'space war.'

BARKER: I assume this should also involve the scientific community?

VONKEVICZKY: Yes, the formal scientific establishment should be involved. But this should also include the participation and input of whom I term "UFO pioneers," such as yourself, representing the civilian interests, and at the same time contributing enormous amounts of data from the private sector.

BARKER: Do you believe that the UFOs represent a hostile threat to us, that they might be planning to attack us?

VONKEVICZKY: While I cannot, of course, read their minds, years of ICUFON research indicate that 80 percent of UFO surveillance involves military installations and quasi-military sites such as those where nuclear energy is researched and developed, or nuclear products manufactured. Much of this surveillance involves SECRET installations, indicating that the Galactic Force is well aware of our most highly secured operations.

BARKER: If a so-called "intergalactic war" should develop, and the UFOs attack us, would we have even a remote chance of defending ourselves against what may be a technology advanced many years ahead of ours?

VONKEVICZKY: Rather than address that question I would rather stress the idea of the peaceful establishment of contact and communication

... onto the floor of the select House of Lords UFO Committee, which had been invited to lecture on the problem of UFO sightings. Clancarty had initiated the formal UFO Debate that recently had taken place in the House of Lords, and while there had been voiceferious opposition by skeptics, the body had ruled that a continuing study be set up, embodied by the formal Committee. Lords had invited not only VonKeviczky, but also spokesmen from England and European countries, to report on UFO research being done in the West.

Few would be equally qualified to speak for American research or possess the background of the Major. Born in Hungary, he was graduated from the historical Ludovica Military University in Budapest with a Master of Military Science and Engineering degree. During 17 years of his distinguished military career, he completed more academic studies which qualified him for a promotion to major. Due to his skills in the field of communications, he was named Chief of the Audio-Visual Military Education Department of the Royal Hungarian General Staff and Ministry of Defense.

After 1945 he served seven years in an exchange officers' program with the Third U.S. Army and Constabulary, and the International Refugee Organization in Europe. While in the program he contributed his skills as motion picture cameraman and director, and in public relations. He immigrated to the U.S. in 1952 and became an American citizen.

While a staff member of the United Nations Secretariat's Office of Public Information he became interested in the subject of UFOs after seeing secret documents and reading press coverage. Then after confidential talks with many diplomats and visiting scientists he became convinced that there was an unofficial "cover-up" practiced by many governments which were puzzled by the phenomena and tended to try and "sweep it under the carpet." During a visit to France in 1963 he had an opportunity to confer unofficially with old military friends who had seen many startling official UFO reports and were deeply concerned about the problem.

But the skilled scientist woefully lacked expertise in another, even more specialized field - Washington politics - and this led to his undoing.

VonKeviczky made his fatal career mistake when in 1966, he submitted selections from his files of UFO evidence to Secretary General U. Thant, suggesting that the massive problem of UFO incursions be placed under international control, not only for exchanging information and developing a modus operandi for dealing with a potential threat, but for developing policies for communicating with the interplanetary visitors and legal philosophies that would be necessary, should the intruders land openly.

His arguments convinced U. Thant, who began holding delicate private talks with trusted diplomats. But the late Drew Pearson, predecessor of Jack Anderson, sniffed out a leak and devoted a

... as his lectures to the House of Lords Select Committee on UFOs.

column to the Secretary General's interest in UFOs.

Readers may recall that these were the days after the convening of the Robertson Panel by the CIA and the decision to downplay UFOs in the public's mind. Powerful intelligence sources flushed out VonKeviczky as the source who had influenced the Secretary General and brought about pressures to dismiss him. Not only was he removed from the U.N. but he also was blacklisted as a scientist where Government employment was involved and became "too hot to handle" in universities and the private sector where Government grant handouts often carried many informal "conditions."

So like Baron Nicholas E. Von Poppen, whose secret of the crashed saucers was preserved by his fear of loss of political asylum (See Issue No. 11), VonKeviczky found it necessary to adapt to a lesser life style and to struggle for a living. Like Von Poppen, VonKeviczky turned to a technical skill for survival and became a commercial photographer. Eventually his growing clientele, along with a modest inheritance taken out of Hungary before the Communist takeover, enabled him to live comfortably and to set up his world non profit organization, the Intercontinental UFO Research and Analytic Network, Inc. (ICUFON).

The Major's "Bombshells"

"Highly Esteemed Chairman - Distinguished Peers of Her Majesty's House of Lords:" spoke VonKeviczky after the Committee Chairman Earl of Clancarty's introduction.

"I deem this my personal invitation requested by the noble Earl as an extreme privilege to enlighten you with our organization's 18 years of military, scientific and technological research, and to make you aware of the entire world's most acute and burning security and scientific problem."

The major began his presentation with several "bombshells" designed to surprise and shock his audience. One of his most startling revelations concerned the North American Air Defense Command (NORAD) in Colorado and its admission that sophisticated infrared sensors, satellite sentries and global network detect daily from 800 to 900 unidentified flying objects whose flight characteristics cannot be satellites or have ballistic trajectories.

"Now my Lords, these are alarming figures, even though one half might be discounted by your objective and skeptical minds. Even though, my noble audience, we reduce this to 30% Nay, not even this do I ask of you! Instead, gentlemen, let us accept only 10% of this figure and attribute it only to those objects which were OBSERVED ONLY BY THE NAKED EYES OF WITNESS, OR FILMED WITH INEXPENSIVE CAMERAS, OR REPORTED ONLY IN THE NEWS MEDIA.

"Even after discarding such massive scientific data, we are left with a frightening summary:

... of the UFO problem. This is what I essentially stressed in my recent communication with President Reagan. I told him that the recent military secrecy and rash confrontation with the superior science and technology of the exploring space civilizations constitutes a rash act; no, I would rather call it an INSANE act. Speculating that we will gain by hostile action against them is, simply stated, an IRRESPONSIBLE GAMBLE WITH THE EXISTENCE OF OUR CIVILIZATION. Well, it seems I have addressed your question after all. But, again, let me stress PEACEFUL contacts rather than confrontation. Such contacts could bring immeasurable benefits for the Earth, such as NEW ENERGY SOURCES. Energy shortages pose threats from WITB-IN, which over the long haul may represent threats to our existence even greater than the speculated invasions from space. Communication would also stimulate a revival in science and technology throughout the world.

BARKER: Do you think it is possible to communicate with them?

VONKEVICZKY: Yes, this is possible, because the United States Military forces has very sophisticated technology that could accomplish this. While it is unlikely that such communication has not been carried out, I have no way of knowing because this subject is top secret.

Appeals to Reagan

BARKER: After your House of Lords presentation you went on to Europe to meet privately with UFO experts there. In England and France you complained that your news releases had been suppressed. Did these releases involve your Memorandum to President Reagan?

VONKEVICZKY: No, of course not. President Reagan was then not yet inaugurated. My remarks in Europe concerned my earlier releases. My Memorandum to Reagan was released on January 28, 1981 and first sought to redress my grievance of the Johnson Administration's placing me illegally on the notorious 'black list,' or security risk list of scientists. One of the important elements of this Memorandum was a review of my original proposals made to the United Nations in 1966 the business which originally got me - how do you say it? I have not yet a good command of the American slang idiom - perhaps it might be called 'on the hot seat'!

BARKER: Many of our readers are not familiar with those 1966 proposals. Could you boil these down for us briefly?

VONKEVICZKY: What?
BARKER: Could you summarize these proposals?
VONKEVICZKY: Oh yes. I was saying that the UFOs represent a potentially dangerous situation involving global security problems. I insisted that the UN was the logical agency to deal with this situation.

BARKER: How did you suggest that the UN go about accomplishing this?

VONKEVICZKY: COMMUNICATION. That was the key I stressed that might prevent a so-called 'space war.' I did not at that time suggest a military solution, but more of a political one. I said that the nations of our celestial body should seek



Major Urges Global Pact

"EVERY HOUR MORE THAN THREE OBJECTS OF EXTRATERRESTRIAL ORIGIN VIOLATE ILLEGALLY OUR GLOBAL AIRSPACES - TO KEEP UNDER CONTROL THE EARTHLY POWERS AND THEIR ACTIVITIES!"

VonKeviczky reviewed the massive missile buildup by the U.S. and the Soviet Union, despite pending SALT agreements, and then referred to a computer failure at NORAD during November, 1979, which could have touched off a nuclear war.

"The hazardous risk of continuing secrecy among nations on the subject of UFOs could at any time easily trigger a fatal misunderstanding, and activate between the superpowers the final holocaust of the third, and maybe even a space war."

The Major suggested a solution. The military nations of the world should agree to immediately release from secrecy all of their UFO data that would not compromise their military systems and capabilities.

"This would not inflict the smallest damage to the official military secrecy of these nations."

Then he quoted Lord Kimberly who, speaking during the official UFO debate in Parliament on January 18, 1979: "WE KNOW THAT WAR IN SPACE, ONCE A PIGMENT OF THE IMAGINATION, IS VERY NEARLY A FACT NOW."

A solution to the danger of an interplanetary war, as predicted by the late General Douglas MacArthur*, might be a better understanding of the motives of the space invaders and mankind's reactions to them. In the U.S. these reactions had been largely hostile. He exposed armed actions against the UFOs, quoting Commanding General Benjamin Chidlaw of the U.S. Continental Air Defense that "the United States has lost many men and planes trying to intercept them."

VonKeviczky proposed a world organization to initiate a better understanding of the UFO problem. The first phase might be a voluntary alliance of the initiating nations for what might be termed a "World Authority for Spatial Affairs," to be founded "by the nations and for the nations" on a publicly donated ground territory. The resulting foundation should be governed by the associated nations and include representatives such as Military Forces, the Scientific Community, and even interested laymen who might represent the many private UFO research groups which had pioneered open studies and getting the information before the public.

The foundation's initial thrust would be in three fields:

(1) Combining the expertise of the best minds in each nation to secure expert analyses of UFO cases.

(2) Seeking ways to contact and communicate with UFO's in efforts to achieve mutual understanding and to avert hostilities on both sides.

(3) An educational program for the peoples of

Dwight D. Eisenhower at first believed them to be Nazi secret weapons, until intelligence reports indicated the Germans thought just the opposite and that they were ours."

In an apparent whack at his adversaries, Hynek and Vallee, VonKeviczky continued: "We live in the reality of a three dimensional physical world, but according to certain 'scientific' theories we

might exist within a multi-dimensional INVISIBLE world. But in reality, during the history of mankind, ghosts and spirits, though they have groaned and rattled their chains, have never created any real danger to humanity (laughter)."

"This fundamental principle is self-evident in the U.S. General Staff's 30-year-old determination of the UFO evidence as consisting of 'nuts and bolts' - it is in the Summary Report on UFOs by Commanding general Nathaniel P. Twining, Chief of Staff of the U.S. Air Force, dated Sept. 18, 1947, submitted to his Chief of Staff, Gen. Omar N. Bradley. I think this statement should be considered a 'bit higher' than the private views of two astronomers!"

VonKeviczky quoted from Twining's report, recently (and perhaps accidentally declassified along with a volume of other material):

"(A) The phenomenon reported is something real and not visionary or fictitious.

"(B) They are objects probably approximating the shape of a disc, of such appreciable size as to appear to be as large as man-made aircraft.

"(C) Operating characteristics such as extreme rate of climb, maneuverability belief of the possibility that some of the objects are controlled either manually, automatically or remotely.

"(D) Apparent common description of the objects: (1) Metallic or light reflecting surface; (2) Absence of tail, except in a few instances when the objects apparently were operating under high performance conditions; (3) Circular or elliptical in shape, flat on bottom and domed on top; (4) Level flight speeds normally above 300 knots are estimated."

VonKeviczky continued:

"To calm the concern of the public at large with UFOs, governmental sources prefer to accentuate that they are 'peaceful visitors' from outer space. The international UFO research community, too, widely advocates that UFOs are 'saviors' of our humanity.

A "Political Problem"

"Let's examine this question with common sense and clear logic. How could we accept as PEACEFUL INTENTION any exploring extraterrestrial force, which over the decades has NEGLECTED TO CONTACT AND COMMUNICATE WITH OUR NATIONAL OR INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTATIVES, such as governments, the United Nations, NASA, scientists, etc?"

But this was Sunday, and VonKeviczky vowed to take respite from his Mission and to relax, if even in his unfamiliar hotel room. He must not be so impatient!

Archimedes had boasted, "Give me a lever and I can move the world!" And of course he had done it, but not literally. Instead he had moved an even greater weight, the minds of people from their hide-bound inertial states. And he had not "moved the world" within his lifetime, nor had many other scientists who espoused radical and unpopular ideas. The General knew he too might not see his own ideas reach fruition.

He put on his dressing gown and ventured through the double windows onto the balcony outside his room for a few moments. Though it was late January, the temperature was surprisingly moderate for London. This city, this land, had witnessed the first birth of freedom, from serfdom and slavery, both of the body and the mind. Here the Magna Charta. Here the first effective legislature of the people. Here the Common Law, etched by an archetypal linotypist upon the soul of Western Man.

He hoped his House of Lords address had done some good, had planted some small kernel of truth, and that, like some Johnny Appleseed of his adopted country, his kernels would also grow.

But momentarily he forgot about all this, and his mission. Once again he imagined himself a child, bundled up, on a cold Sunday morning.

"What are you saying, Colman," his waking wife asked from inside. He didn't answer immed-

VonKeviczky "Scratched"

As VonKeviczky addressed the select gathering he was pleased and even surprised at the rapt and serious attention his presentation was receiving. And his mind flashed back to his troubles resulting from his efforts to secure interest in the United Nations toward goals he proposed.

Apparently, whatever persons or agencies were originally behind efforts to frustrate his efforts to gain international cooperation for UFO research were still very active in 1978. These new problems began after his receipt of a telegram from Sir Eric M. Gairy, Prime Minister of Grenada, who had employed his small nation's voice in the U.N. to promote UFO research. The telegram invited VonKeviczky to attend a meeting on July 13, 1978, with Kurt Waldheim, the Secretary General, and

other parties. The meeting would discuss preliminary arrangements for Sir Gairy's address to the General Assembly, scheduled for October of that year, and involve the development of documentary film presentations and exhibits on UFOs and related phenomena to complement the address.

But at the last minute VonKeviczky's part in the meeting was "scratched," on the excuse that scientists taking part did not approve of the Major's approach to the subject, and due to threats that they would not take part if he were present.**

"Japanese Saucers"

Much of VonKeviczky's presentation to the Committee is particularly interesting because it revealed much data heretofore never published, and no doubt obtained through his diplomatic and military connections. One such revelation is of a UFO "flap" predating the Kenneth Arnold sighting by five years:

"On Feb. 25, 1942, 80 days after Pearl Harbor, a massive group of 15 to 20 UFOs carried out strategic reconnaissance along the U.S. Pacific coastal territory between San Diego and San Francisco, perhaps to survey the huge concentration of manpower and military hardware staged there ready for embarkation to the Far East theatre.

"The whole area was alerted. According to the report of the 37th Anti Airborne Artillery Brigade, between 3:12 and 4:15 A.M., 1430 rounds of ammunition were fired in defense of Los Angeles at alleged "Japanese warplanes," though these "warplanes" were completely noiseless, and though a Los Angeles Times photograph unmistakably shows two wingless disc-shaped craft rounded by halos."

No bombs were dropped, and despite their relatively low speed of 100 miles per hour and altitude of less than 18,000 ft, no direct hits were apparently made.

"Chief of Staff Gen. George C. Marshall's secret report to President Roosevelt called the craft 'mysterious objects.'

"Of course the mysterious 'foo fighters' are better known. Sir Winston Churchill and General

civilization which has navigated for centuries around our celestial body should select for communication only so-called 'contactees' who are basically not qualified as well as educated to be a liaison in any way.

"According to international law, aerial vehicles intruding illegally over nations' sovereign airspace affect their national securities. UFO forces, as 'illegal intruders,' should be affected. Thus the nations' armed action against them, IN LACK OF INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS WHICH I PROPOSED FOR THE U.N., ARE PERFECTLY LEGAL. This aspect should be thoroughly studied by an international organization, lest an 'interplanetary war' be touched off.

"I was impressed by a statement by Dr. Robert Spencer Carr, a noted expert in the field of non-verbal communications, who observed that, 'The problem of dealing with the UFO's is not a military problem primarily, but, instead, A POLITICAL PROBLEM.'"

As VonKeviczky's lengthy presentation drew to an end, he urged his audience to "Lift the 30 years of military secrecy regarding UFOs. Voluntary nations should convoke a congress, represented by all the nations' military people, national academies of science, and UFO research groups, to determine, at long last, and before it is too late, AGAINST WHAT HUMANITY IS FACING FROM OUTER SPACE!

"THE HOUR HAND ON THE PAGES OF MANKIND'S HISTORY IS VERY LATE. THE OPPORTUNITY TO RISE TO THE OCCASION AND ACT ON THE WORLD PEACE AND SECURITY OF THE NATIONS IS INDEED SUBLIMELY GREAT, AND IT MAY NEVER OCCUR AGAIN WITHIN OUR LIFETIMES."

On to Europe

Maj. Ret. Colman S. VonKeviczky arose at 9:00 A.M. on Sunday morning, a late hour luxury he permitted himself only on weekends and holidays. Not until late afternoon would he depart to France, the first stop on his European trip to gain acceptance of his ideas. He wondered about the effectiveness of his address to the House of Lords select Committee. True, reception to his remarks had been incredibly favorable, and members had kept him for hours afterward with their personal questions.

But so far the Press, though informed by his official releases and personal interviews, had remained silent. Yet he was patient.

He had experienced all of this before. The downplaying of the UFO evidence may not have been the result of an official conspiracy as much as it had been an innate and 'natural one' - the inertia to resist radical new ideas and to preserve the status quo. Such as the refusal of the clergy to look through Galileo's telescope at the swirling rings of Saturn, or through Leeuwenhoek's microscope at the regions of paramacia which darted voluminously and relentlessly as they fed and divided.

For the multitude of church bells, some near and voluble, but the most of them faraway; reminded VonKeviczky of his own little town of his birth, and of his native Hungary.

*General MacArthur stated on Oct. 5, 1955, that "the nations of the Earth must someday make a common front against attack by people from other planets," and in June, 1962, at the West Point Military Academy, spoke of the "ultimate conflict between a united human race and the sinister forces of some planetary galaxy."

**Whoever "blackballed" VonKeviczky, the Major believed that Allen J. Hynek and Jacques Vallee were responsible. In a July 25, 1978, letter to Waldheim, he noted:

"To my great regret, my visit was suprisingly cancelled only a few hours before our meeting. It was excused by Sir Eric that our line of research does not meet the approval of the invited scientists' view on the UFO evidence."

VonKeviczky charged that Hynek/Vallee "advocated the phenomena's reality on the basis of parapsychology, paranormal and 'beyond reality' theories, represented by the respected scientists, Prof. J. Allen Hynek and Prof. Jacques Vallee."

Whether the General's inclusion in the meeting was "scratched" by the parties mentioned, or by the more "sinsister" forces of the "coverup," cannot be pinned down. Our only genuine documentation is a copy of Sir Gairy's original telegram inviting VonKeviczky to attend. Our copy of the letter to Waldheim does point out the basic conflicts between VonKeviczky's "nuts and bolts" approach to UFOs and the Hynek/Vallee "4-D" philosophy expressed in their writings, notably Vallee's THE INVISIBLE COLLEGE and their joint work, THE EDGE OF REALITY: A PROGRESS REPORT ON UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS

The full text of VonKeviczky's lecture before the Committee indicates he believes they may have been responsible for scuttling U.N. interest:

"Ex-governmental and media promoted scientists are lecturing world wide about the UFOs' parapsychological existence, such as the pronouncements of Drs. J. Allen Hynek, former USAF UFO consultant, and Jacques Vallee, whose pronouncements before the U.N. Special Political Committee on Nov. 17, 1978, that UFOs are 'beyond reality' and 'psycho-psychological phenomena' totally discredited the subject, which consequently was removed from the agenda, along with any further attention at the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space."

VonKeviczky's mission to get U.N. sponsorship of his ideas was dealt a further blow when the government of Grenada was overthrown by a coup and Sir Gairy, the Major's chief ally in his efforts to get attention in that body, became an exile, and shorn of power after the most nations recognized the replacement government.

contact and communication with these extraterrestrial forces through an established International Authority. And what better authority than the UN, already in place? I backed up my recommendations with documentation demonstrating that the galactic origin of these spacecraft had been confirmed by the military and space exploring superpowers, notably, of course, the US and USSR.

BARKER: Your ideas of stressing a political solution remind me of statements made by Dr. Robert Spencer Carr. Do you know him?

VONKEVICZKY: No, but I do know of his work. He is a well known communications expert, who said, something like, "The UFOs do not represent a military problem but purely a political problem." While I do not go that far, I do respect his ideas, particularly his stressing communications, by way of a kind of "cargo cult" methodology of building sheltered landing/communication sites. But I think he proposed a US unilateral approach, which I do not agree with.

BARKER: Why not?

VONKEVICZKY: Because of the possibility of armed confrontation with the UFO forces, which is an INTERNATIONAL problem. Such a confrontation would not be with one nation regardless of what nation might provoke it. I have shown in my BLUE MEMORANDUM and in my House of Lords presentation that the US military and the military forces of other nations have attacked UFOs. Even if the superpowers might get together and agree to end such provocations, this would not prevent a small nation with an outmoded jet plane from firing upon UFOs and risking "interplanetary war" over the whole globe!

BARKER: How can this be prevented?

VONKEVICZKY: The UN shows the most, and perhaps only promise, for dealing with this. Although it has not prevented all wars, it has worked remarkably well. Its charter provides for the establishment of fundamental international security. A potential war with the UFOs would threaten this international security. What I proposed was merely an extension of this doctrine which would involve the UN with an OUTSIDE intergalactic party or parties.

The Crashed Saucers

BARKER: What is your reaction to the rumors that UFOs have crashed and been captured?


VONKEVICZKY: So far the military has in its possession at least eight UFOs which originally were kept at Wright Patterson Air Force Base at Dayton, OH. Military scientists have studied these thoroughly, and that helped enable them to establish the communication technology I just spoke about. They have studied these since 1952, and now it is almost 1962 - that is 10 years.

BARKER: General, I know that you are recognized, particularly among your colleagues in the European NATO theatre, as a highly regarded military expert, but I must play the "Devil's advocate" and remind you that you have been called "irresponsible" by US officials in your insistence that our military forces are provoking hostilities by firing upon unidentified flying objects? Can you back up your claims?

VONKEVICZKY: Although I have hundreds of such cases in my files, I don't think you would have the patience to listen to them now, nor the space to print them. You or any responsible UFO researcher, however, are welcome to inspect these documents, upon prior arrangement, of course. I can summarize this for you however. To begin, perhaps you have seen the motion picture, "1941"?

BARKER: Yes, and it was a great disappointment to movie exhibitors, who hoped this Stephen Spielberg film would be as great as his JAWS and CLOSE ENCOUNTERS OF THE THIRD KIND

VONKEVICZKY: I agree that it was a disappointment, though as a cinematographer I admired the special effects and the miniature work. But it was loosely based on an actual happening which took place, however, in the following year, 1942. In February of that year mysterious aircraft appeared over the West Coast. As you may recall, the Japanese had managed to direct some balloons carrying explosives to that area, and it was logical to assume that we were being attacked by enemy planes. Although the objects, when picked up by searchlights, appeared to be spherical or "saucer" shaped, nobody had heard of "flying saucers" at that time, and the mysterious "foo fighters" had been assumed to be secret German weapons. So the military opened fire and shot more than 1400 rounds at the aerial armada. But they were either unable to hit anything (although the objects moved relatively slowly) or to bring any of them down. This understandable hysteria, incidentally, may have been one of the origins of later CIA fears that the UFOs might trigger a nuclear confrontation between the US and USSR because of misinterpretation. But that is a digression. The point I want to make is that the US began firing on UFOs in 1942 and has been firing on them ever since!



VONKEVICZKY: I don't think so. Some, if not all of these crashes, occurred before this general order went out. I don't know what happened in those cases. Carr (Dr. Robert Spencer Carr) believes that these UFOs were somehow disabled by our radar before they developed countermeasures, but to me this doesn't sound very logical, though I do not have technical expertise in that area.

As best I can piece all this together, the UFOs generally eluded the intercepting and attacking jets, though in a few incidents our pilots were killed. The advanced technology of the objects is well illustrated by the recent incident in Iran which you may be familiar with.

BARKER: Yes, I'm printing a separate item about this in this issue. But to my knowledge these losses of our pilots have never been revealed, except for Capt. Mantell, now thought to have blacked out due to lack of oxygen at a high altitude while chasing what probably was a Skyhook Balloon.

VONKEVICZKY: These incidents were highly classified for more than one reason. First there was the fear of panic, though this may have been an excuse for the general rule to classify most everything. Then there was the problem with the many organized civilian groups who were studying UFOs and in some cases even claiming to communicate with them, though I doubt that. These groups who believed the "space people" were friendly and out to "save us" might set up a hue and cry, and already there were rumblings in Congress due to Maj. Donald E. Keyhoe's demands for investigation of what he believed was a government "coverup." But the so-called "coverup" was not as tight as some have supposed. A careful review of recently released and declassified documents and even clippings from the press reveal that high officials even made public statements to the effect that the UFOs were real.

BARKER: Major, that is difficult to believe! Can you cite these instances?

VONKEVICZKY: I think I found some of these when preparing for your phone call. (Pause) Yes. Yes. Now I am quoting. First the late General George C. Marshall, Chief of Staff between 1947 and 1949. He declared, "The United States Authorities have established the fact that flying saucers are manned by visitors from outer space." Then there is the now generally forgotten statement by General Benjamin Chidlaw, head of the US Continental Air Defense, who said, "We take them seriously when you consider we have lost many men and planes trying to intercept them." Even the US State Department had similar comments.

BARKER: Let's return to the subject of crashed UFOs. Now I know that there is so much rumor and circumstantial evidence that one cannot just dismiss all this. But there are many reasons to doubt these rumors. In my mind the chief reason

... years, a long time.
 BARKER: Have you, by any chance, seen secret documents which have led you to make this statement?

VONKEVICZKY: Such documents admitting this have never been declassified. However, among the hundreds of documents that have been released, it is possible to put together a rather good scenario of the crashed discs and the analysis of them, and this process is basically the methodology ICUFON has employed. This is the basis for our statements in our BLUE MEMORANDUM which I have sent to you.

BARKER: Major, during your travels in Europe - in France, in Spain, Germany and so on, did you find that the authorities in these countries were any more open than this country in releasing UFO information to the public and admitting their existence?

VONKEVICZKY: Gray, I have had talks with important people in many nations, even behind the Iron Curtain. In practically all these places, leading diplomats told me, "The US and the USSR are the superpowers. They should take the lead, and once they do so, we will certainly fall in line and help to deal with this problem. But we cannot initiate it without the leadership and impetus they could provide. And of the two, we suspect the role of the US as an initiator could bring the other into it. Once this problem is given world wide exposure and definition, nobody, not even the USSR, can ignore it - and certainly not the lesser powers."

BARKER: But the Soviets have consistently denied that UFOs exist and played down or suppressed sightings within Russia ...


VONKEVICZKY: This formerly was true. In 1966 when I originally presented my ideas to the UN, Soviet ambassador Trofimirovich Fedorenko declared to the media that "UFOs exist only in the nightmares of capitalistic imperialists headed by

the US, and are used to stir up propaganda against the Socialist Republics." Let me assure you, Gray, that this line is softening. Don't take my word for it alone. In more recent years Soviet Scientists have been given voice in the press to report on UFO sightings and to present all kinds of theories. And while I doubt that the Siberian explosion was the result of a UFO, as one of them insisted, such speculation did represent the softening of this official line. Remember that the Soviet press is controlled by and represents official government policy. Not only Russian scientists, but military authorities as well, have occasionally been quoted in regard to UFOs.



BARKER: Could the 1952 radar sightings over Washington, DC, when jets were scrambled to intercept what the military assumed to be enemy planes, represent a more modern analogy?

VONKEVICZKY: Of course I don't know if our interceptors were ordered to shoot at that time. That is still highly classified. By that date the authorities, though still insisting publicly that UFOs did not exist, had lost their naivete and may have been more cautious about confrontation. Immediately after these incidents (there were more than one of them), President Harry S Truman asked Dr. Albert Einstein for suggestions. Though I don't know why the President thought that Einstein knew anything about UFOs (though he held credit for initiating the development of nuclear weapons and may have been thought to know EVERYTHING), the mathematician did come up with a very sensible answer. "Do anything, but DON'T SHOOT," he told Truman. But Truman, whom I very much admire otherwise, shot from the leg (the General no doubt meant "shot from the hip" - GB). Six days later the Pentagon ordered jets to shoot down UFOs which refused to land when ordered.

BARKER: Did these attacks by our jets result in the crashed saucers you mentioned previously?

... as a craft built by a superior civilization is examined by our scientists, why has this technology that they have surely learned not shown up in our society? Such an opportunity should give us a quantum leap

VONKEVICZKY: Some of it has shown up, mainly in our space program, and more of it will come out some day. Some of this knowledge may have military applications which we may have duplicated but hesitate to use for fear it might be copied by the USSR.

BARKER: Now, Coleman, I can agree partially with that, but there is a flaw in this. Many experts will tell you that the REAL threat to our globe arises not from the UFOs, but from energy starvation which may eventually overtake us and which has already thrown the world into near economic chaos. The UFOs must operate on a radical source of energy, and a very compact and cheap one, considering the vast distances they must travel. I just can't believe our government would withhold this information, not only from our own citizens who are suffering debilitating inflation as a result of high energy prices, but because of the innate humanitarian concerns for the rest of the world that our nation has long demonstrated.

VONKEVICZKY: But that is the one thing they could not learn - the source of energy that powered these crashed discs. I understand that when, upon the one occasion of President Eisenhower's personal visits to one of the crash sites, he learned of this, he angrily cursed the scientists there and called them "dummies." But as I understand it they couldn't solve this mystery. In fact they couldn't discover ANY means of propulsion WHATSOEVER!

The Robertson Panel

BARKER: That is a fascinating area, but again, let's change the subject before our time and space runs out. In your BLUE MEMORANDUM you reproduce some documents about the Robertson Panel, sponsored by the CIA. One of these names Dr. Allen J Hynek as a panel participant, and I notice it gives him proper credit as a consultant to the Air Force Project Bluebook, whose policies he has largely renounced. But this document also names Hynek as an "OSI Consultant." This sounds like an intelligence organization. Just what does the acronym, "OSI," stand for?

VONKEVICZKY: For the Office of Scientific Intelligence, which is a sub-section of the CIA

BARKER: But according to Dr. David M. Jacobs, whose book, THE UFO CONTROVERSY IN AMERICA (Indiana University Press 1975) is considered an authority on the Robertson Panel, "Hynek was only invited to selected meetings," leaving the impression he provided only limited input, if any, to the proceedings.

VONKEVICZKY: An official document dated Jan. 27, 1953, and declassified in 1977, provides a different reading. It states that Hynek "sat in on all the sessions after the first day," however it states he did not sign the report as an official group member.

BARKER: But as I understand it, Hynek attended the Robertson Panel. (See Project Bluebook.)

VONKEVICZKY: However we must remember that Hynek had been retained as a member of OSI previously - BEFORE he became a consultant to Project Bluebook.

BARKER: I brought this subject up because I understand that Hynek was involved, along with a colleague, Dr. Jacques Vallee, in your efforts to persuade the United Nations to take action regarding UFOs. You sent me a copy of a telegram from Sir Eric M. Gairy, Prime Minister of Grenada, inviting you to attend a meeting on July 13, 1978, at the New York Hilton prior to presenting a program to the Secretary General Kurt Waldheim. You were to discuss documentary film and other audio visual presentations you would review with Waldheim prior to presenting them to the UN body. Hynek and Vallee had also been invited, along with others, including journalist Lee Spiegel and astronaut Gordon Cooper.

But at this last minute, YOU WERE EXCLUDED FROM THIS MEETING

VONKEVICZKY: Would you like to know why?

BARKER: Yes I would. That's the question I've been leading up to!

VONKEVICZKY: Hynek and Vallee informed Gairy they did not believe in my theories and that they, themselves, weren't certain just what the UFOs were.

BARKER: You're saying that they refused to attend if you were present?

VONKEVICZKY: That is correct! Apparently Gairy believed that their scientific credentials, and in particular, Hynek's favorable publicity in the news media, would greatly overshadow my importance in convincing UN members. Privately he even mentioned Hynek's position as a blue ribbon panel member of the National Enquirer's investigation (chuckles). So I was "thrown out." Once again my carefully planned strategies to gain UFO recognition of the UFO problem came to naught.

BARKER: Weren't your ideas used and carried out?

VONKEVICZKY: I had a big fight with Gairy about this. I told him that the psychological ideas espoused by Hynek and Vallee would have no effect in the UN. Because to get any action from such a body you must prove that security is threatened. The charter of the UN provided that

questions which dealt with global security had absolute priority and must be taken up and acted upon. My evidence proved just this, and this was the only line with which we could hope for a breakthrough. The UN would be unimpressed by "other dimensions" or "ghosts," which Hynek and Vallee were talking about!

But Gairy, who was very religious and himself bordering upon the mystic, became very greatly impressed with their parapsychological line. When he adopted it he became discredited in the UN, as I had predicted, and his ideas, which previously had been considered with some skepticism, now became untenable, and his efforts were completely ineffective.

BARKER: I have a question about Gairy, whose country was Grenada.

VONKEVICZKY: It's a very small island in the Caribbean.

BARKER: And Sir Gairy, he was not only its prime minister, but he represented his country, personally, in the United Nations?

VONKEVICZKY: That is correct.

BARKER: I understand that after this period we were reviewing, when you were working with him to get the UFO question before the UN, that there was a coup in his country, and his government fell, leaving him an exile.

VONKEVICZKY: Yes. I understand that he is now living in California, but I have not communicated with him since the coup.

BARKER: Do you think the change in government in Grenada had anything to do with his interest in UFOs, or, because of this or some other reason, engineered by an outside intelligence agency?

VONKEVICZKY: No.

BARKER: Again, regarding Dr. Hynek. Do I understand you correctly? Are you saying he convinced a lot of people at the UN that the UFOs were not a threat to us?

VONKEVICZKY: Yes. During the Acapulco Congress in 1977 I screened the military documentation and I proved with genuine photographs that the General Twining report of 1947 to the Chief of Staff of the United States was completely true, because my photos showed that he was "1000 percent" correct. After I screened these documents I confronted Dr. Hynek and told him, "You, Dr. Hynek, have twenty years of access to information while with the United States Air Force, but you say you don't know if they exist. Yet here is the military evidence that these UFOs are solid objects. Now what is your reaction to the evidence, Professor?" Do you know what he said? "I'm sorry don't understand your question."! This exchange took place in front of the entire panel.

BARKER: I could have understood your position some years ago when he was a consultant for the Air Force and OSI, and participated in the Robertson Panel which probably had a major role in persuading the military to play down and ridicule UFO sightings. But this is 1981 and Hynek has reversed his thinking since leaving those positions. In fact he now heads the Center For UFO Studies, a major civilian agency for disseminating UFO data. What about that?

VONKEVICZKY: Let me say that we have more than 4,000 documents on file, from many military sources, all contributing to our proof that UFOs do exist and are solid objects. Yet in NONE of these documents can I find his name. This might be explained by his being only an astronomical consultant. Perhaps this expertise with which you and others attempt to endow him was gained by some sort of "crash course" after he left those positions.

BARKER: Our time is almost up and there are so many questions I no doubt have failed to ask you. Just one of my many remaining notes is about your petition to President Reagan. I have seen a copy of a letter you received from President Reagan before the election. Do you feel that the new administration will react more positively to the

VONKEVICZKY: Gray, I am always optimistic, but I do not want to discuss this matter while my petition is under consideration by the President. But let me reiterate that I hold you in high esteem as a "UFO pioneer," and hope that I can call upon you for participation should there be a real breakthrough.

BARKER: Thank you, very much, Colman, for that compliment, and for your time and effort to grant this interview. My only regret is that, considering the enormous amount of information you have to impart, I may have only scratched the surface. I do hope I have helped you to present at least a general overview of your ideas to our readers. I hate to end this, but we must. I do wonder if you have any final thought, any short concluding statement that might help sum up your work?



BARKER: That's an excellent "wrap up," Major! Good Night.

VONKEVICZKY: Good Night!


