This is in response to your four Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests all dated August 13, 2000, for correspondence or photographs from the Nixon Presidential Materials, the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Library and the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library. We received your requests on August 21, 2000.

We referred your request for a photograph of President Nixon with Jackie Gleason to the Nixon Presidential Materials Staff for appropriate handling and response. We also sent your request for correspondence between President Ford and Jackie Gleason to the Gerald R. Ford Library in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Your requests for a photograph of President Reagan with Steven Spielberg, and correspondence with Jackie Gleason were forwarded to the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley, California. These presidential libraries will respond directly to your requests, since the materials are located at the presidential libraries.

Please be advised the FOIA does not apply to President Nixon's presidential papers, which are governed by the Presidential Recordings and Materials Preservation Act; President Ford's materials are governed by his deed of gift donating his papers to the United States.

This is not a denial of your request. If you believe that it is, you may appeal these decisions by writing to the Deputy Archivist of the United States (ND), Room 4200, at the above address, and briefly state the reasons why you think it does not meet the requirements of the FOIA. Your letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." The appeal should include a copy of the initial request and denial, and must be received no later than 35 calendar days after the date of the denial letter.

If you are dissatisfied with the results of this appeal, judicial review is available to you in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which you reside or have your principal place of business, in the district where the records are located, or in the District of Columbia.

Enclosed is a brochure "Presidential Libraries of the National Archives System" for your convenience. You will note that the addresses and telephone numbers to each of the presidential libraries is listed on the brochure. We suggest that you contact the presidential libraries to determine if the information you are requesting is already available for research use and the fees for any reproductions.

Dear Ms. Davis,

I have written to ask you a simple question, and I hope you will take a minute from your busy schedule to provide me an answer. I am working on a manuscript, and a part of the manuscript is an appendix which deal with US Presidents and their views, involvements, and statements on UFOs. (there are surprisingly a large number of them)

Lou Cannon, in his book *President Reagan: The Role of a Lifetime* said, "Patti Davis describes her father as fascinated with stories about unidentified flying objects and the possibility of life on other worlds."

In the epilogue of your book *The Way I See It* you described how your father would take you out and tell you about the constellations. It appears that you clearly understand your father's views in this area.

As you probably know Presidents once briefed on the subject as in office never speak about the subject again - at least in public. This was particularly true of your father and President Carter who both had UFO sightings prior to becoming President. Carter and Ford were both very vocal about UFOs prior to being elected.

I hope you can elaborate on what Cannon wrote about your father's view on the subject, and about the sightings he had prior to being President. You probably don't know much about the truth of the situation that he received in his Presidential briefing.

This may not seem like a critical issue to you, and this I can understand. However, if you chose not to answer me, I hope you will take the time to discuss the issue with Daniel Sheehan who I am sure you know, because of his involvement with the Karen Silkwood case, his exposing of Oliver North, his involvement with Three Mile Island, his involvement in the defense of the New York Times in the Pentagon Papers case, and the Watergate Burglary Case. Mr. Sheehan has described

UFOs as “**probably the most important single public policy issue in the entire world.**” Further he had described the cover-up of the facts as “profoundly unconstitutional.”(I can provide any of three - three hour interviews that Sheehan has done on the subject in the last year)

Daniel can describe for you efforts he made for President Carter to get the answers, and he can describe evidence he viewed that indicated to him how important this issue is in this the 21st century.

My involvement is simply to list stories surrounding Presidents from Truman to Clinton - their sightings, statements and letters while in office, and stories which clearly indicate the military industrial complex (not the President) now controls the information. Mine is a simple book looking at Presidential involvement. Sheehan is the person who has a plan to force the issue into the open.

I have enclosed Daniel’s contact information and contact information for myself. I have also enclosed two e-mail addresses I use which might make it easier for you to answer. I hope you will consider helping. If you require a draft of what I have written so far on your father or any other President I would be happy to provide it.
