

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Astrologer warned Reagan of UFO invasion

National Examiner, May 31, 1988

ATOP astrologer convinced Ronald Reagan that a UFO invasion from outer space was a distinct possibility, the EXAMINER has learned.

Amazingly, the warning from renowned star seer Carroll Righter persuaded Reagan to seek the recently signed arms control agreement with the Soviet Union, according to a veteran freelance journalist.

"Righter said the president believed we and the

Russians would have to work together to fight off the alien invaders," explained the journalist, who extensively interviewed Righter shortly before

the 88-year-old astrologer died in April.

The well-known Righter, who wrote several books on astrology plus a syndicated daily column for 166 newspapers around the world, said he

told Reagan that a reading of heavenly bodies persuaded him that a UFO attack could very well occur before 1993.

"Reagan and I have spoken often over the years, and he takes what I say very seriously," Righter disclosed to the reporter.

"I could tell he was very impressed by my warning. He was silent for several minutes, then began thinking out loud over what to do to meet the threat."


One idea Reagan said he would seriously consider was turning Star Wars from a defense against the Soviet Union to a planetary shield against alien forces.

"He told me he might be willing to share Star Wars data with Gorbachev, if it meant saving the Earth from outside beings," Righter revealed.

Reagan recently added fuel to the uproar over the use of astrology at the White House by disclosing publicly that he often wondered what would happen if the Earth were invaded by "a power from outer space."

"I've often wondered what if all of us in the world discovered we were threatened by a power from another planet," Reagan said in Chicago.

"Wouldn't we all of a

sudden find that we didn't have any differences between us at all, we were all human beings, citizens of the world, and wouldn't we come together to fight that particular threat?"

Meanwhile, fallout continues from the revelations by former White House Chief of Staff Donald Regan that the president and his wife hardly made a move or decision without consulting California-based astrologer Joan Quigley.

Reagan says Nancy Reagan's interest in astrology became serious after the assassination attempt on the president in 1981. After that, no public appearance or travel was planned without Quigley's approval.

"At one point," writes Regan in his sensational book *For The Record* (Harcourt Brace Jovanovich,

1988), "I kept a color-coded calendar on my desk (numerals highlighted in green ink for 'good' days, red for 'bad' days, yellow for 'iffy days') as an aid to remembering when it was propitious to move the president of the United States from one place to another or schedule him to speak in public or commence negotiations with a foreign power."

Reagan said he told Vice President George Bush about Nancy Reagan's dependence on astrological advice.

Bush listened with surprise and consternation on his face before exclaiming: "Good God. I had no idea," Reagan discloses.

But as the EXAMINER reported in our world exclusive of September 7, 1982, Bush owes his current position in the government to Reagan's fascination with astrology.

Crashed Saucers and Little Spacemen

One of the most persistent rumors in the world of UFO observers is that an extraterrestrial spaceship has landed in the United States and is being held in secret at an airbase by officials of the U.S. Air Force. The general belief is that an actual saucer and its defunct alien inhabitants have been held under wraps at either Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Ohio or Edwards Air Force Base in southern California—or possibly both.

According to one popular theory, a UFO crashed in the New Mexico desert in 1948 and the remains of a number of alien crewmen, killed by decompression and the crash, were recovered. The bodies of the alien crewmen were described as being from four to five feet tall, with heads larger than those of normal humans, longer arms, flat noses, and ears without lobes. According to the persistent reports, Air Force doctors performed autopsies on the bodies, which appeared to be of creatures in their thirties; but examination of brain tissue revealed that the crewmen may have been as much as 200 years old.

Charles J. Wilhelm, the executive director of the Ohio UFO Investigators League (UFOIL), is one of the most ardent proponents of this theory. Based on his own research, which includes dozens of actual eyewitness reports, Wilhelm says that the remains had been kept at the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton but have now been removed to Langley Air Force Base in Virginia and placed under the control of the CIA.

One of the sources Wilhelm has consulted frequently, author Leonard Stringfield, claims to have talked to at least twenty-two people who have actually seen the Wright-Patterson spaceship and the bodies of the crewmen, one of which is said to be intact. Stringfield says that the United States military have recovered more than thirty alien corpses since the 1950s. While autopsies were performed on these corpses in different centers, the majority of the specimens ended up either at Wright-Patterson

or in the Air Force's underground complex near Colorado Springs. These alien bodies were between three and a half and five feet tall, were slender, and had oversized hairless heads. They were without digestive tracts or sex organs and had colorless blood. Stringfield refuses to identify his sources but claims he got the information from two doctors and six military personnel connected with the recovery operations.

The witnesses, Stringfield says, include:

1. A former air force pilot, who claims he actually saw three alien corpses secretly delivered in crates to Wright-Patterson in 1952. The bodies had been recovered from a saucer which crashed in Arizona. An officer had told him that the aliens were still breathing when military personnel arrived but had died despite attempts to administer oxygen and first aid.

2. "Carl," an air force sergeant and air policeman, who in 1973 was blindfolded and driven to a secret location where he was ordered to guard a room. Peeking inside, he saw, to his horror, three alien corpses, stretched out on a large table. They were just over three feet tall, with abnormally large heads.

3. A former army intelligence officer, who, in 1966, at Wright-Patterson, viewed nine alien bodies in deep freeze in a glass-enclosed preservation room. He was told that thirty bodies are currently being held in preservation.

He overheard talk of the "blue berets," a specialized trained force, whose mission was to mobilize instantly for UFO recovery missions. In addition, he heard of five UFO crashes occurring between 1966 and 1968 in the areas of Ohio, Indiana, and Kentucky. After one of these crashes, three alien bodies were recovered following a skirmish between the aliens and the United States military forces, who believed the aliens were hostile.

4. A former major and pilot in the air force, who, in 1952, observed alien bodies in the underground preservation chamber at Wright-Patterson. He also learned of secret Air Force orders,

released in the early 1950s, directing pilots on UFO missions to shoot down their targets.

5. A colonel, who, in 1968, confronted aliens on the grounds of Ellis Air Force Base, Nevada, where they had emerged from their saucer. He was paralyzed by a beam of light. The aliens then boarded their ship and departed.

6. A doctor, who claimed he had actually observed, in the early 1950s, a partial autopsy on an alien corpse. The doctor described the corpse as just over four feet long, with a pear-shaped, oversized head. The eyes were Mongoloid in appearance and recessed into the head. There were no eyelids, earlobes, teeth, or hair. The skin was grayish in color. The doctor was not present for the internal autopsy.


Stringfield's statements, of course, are considerably weakened by his refusal to identify his informants, but others have supported his general ideas.

Robert S. Carr, a former lecturer in mass communications at the University of South Florida, says that he was involved in "highly classified

secret government project," and in the course of his government work learned that on February 13, 1948, twelve miles west of Aztec, New Mexico, a thirty-foot flying saucer made a crash landing, killing all twelve "little men" aboard. The bodies were whisked away to Dayton, Ohio, to Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, where, according to Carr, they remain today in cryonic suspension. Carr claims that the incident has been covered up by the CIA. But despite the efforts of the intelligence agency to hush up the story, Carr, says it is "the worst kept secret in America."

According to Carr, "at least 500 highly placed people in the medical profession, the academic world, and the intelligence community, have examined the humanoids and the craft they arrived in."

Carr's description concurs largely with that of Stringfield and his informants except that he adds that all the dead aliens were wearing "dark blue uniforms made out of a metallic, flexible thread." But Carr too will not betray his source,



On December 31, 1978, an Australian film crew flying in the darkened sky along the New Zealand coast took 23,000 frames of 16mm color film showing a strange object which twenty scientists now verify is an authentic UFO. Additional confirmation came in the form of strong radar blips which could not be explained. The object was sighted about thirty-five miles outside the town of Christchurch and continued to follow the TV cameramen for a considerable distance.

At one point, the UFO increased its brightness, and by studying the film, scientists have determined that it could easily


although he claims that even President Eisenhower had seen the frozen humanoids. To do so, Carr says, would be to put the finger on individuals he considers "people of vision and courage."

Spokesmen for the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base categorically deny that there are any spacecraft or "little men" on their premises. "The report is without foundation," an Air Force spokesman said.

The story was further discredited in 1950, when a book called *Behind the Flying Saucers*, by the late Frank Scully, was published. Briefly, it reported on the saucer crash in Aztec, New Mexico and told of a scientist Scully had met who had possession of metal artifacts taken from inside the craft—proof that it was from outer space. But an investigation revealed that Scully's scientist was a fraud, and belief in the crashed New Mexico saucer began to die down. Still, Stringfield and Wilhelm began to turn up witnesses who insisted that the story was true and that they had personally seen either the

saucer or the defunct crewmen, or both. None of the witnesses, however, would agree to be identified.

Finally, though, Fritz Werner, a technician on special assignment with the U.S. Air Force, swore that on May 21, 1953, he had assisted in the investigation of a crashed unknown object in the vicinity of Kingman, Arizona. (Here again the UFOIL group refuses to give the actual identity of the witness. Werner is a fictitious name, although Wilhelm and his investigator, Raymond Fowler, swear that they have the witnessed and signed statement referred to here.) Werner, a project engineer on an Air Force contract with the Atomic Energy Commission at the atomic proving grounds in Nevada, was involved in measuring the blast effects on various types of buildings erected for the tests. On May 20, 1953, according to Werner's sworn statement, he was ordered on special duty and driven to Indian Springs Air Force Base, near the proving grounds, where he joined fifteen other specialists. They were told to leave all



be compared to a 20,000-watt bulb. Nothing this bright has ever been manmade. The craft itself was believed to have been yellowish-white in color and at a distance of ten miles from the plane.

their valuables behind in the custody of the MPs, then were put on a military plane and flown to Phoenix, Arizona.

"We were not allowed to fraternize," Werner stated. "We were put on a bus with other personnel who were already there. The bus window was blacked out so we could not see where we were going. We rode an estimated four hours. I think we were in the area of Kingman, Arizona, which is northwest of Phoenix and not too far from the atomic proving ground. . . . During the bus trip we were told by an Air Force full colonel that a super secret Air Force vehicle had crashed and that since we were all specialists in certain fields we were to investigate the crash in terms of our specialty and nothing more."


The bus finally stopped after dark in an undesignated area and the men were escorted by the military police to the area they were to inspect. Two spotlights were centered on the crashed object, which was ringed by guards.

"The lights were so bright that it was impossible to see the surrounding area. The object

was oval and looked like two deep saucers, one inverted upon the other. It was about 30 feet in diameter. It was constructed of a dull silver metal like brushed aluminum. The metal was darker where the saucer lips formed a rim which were what looked like 'slots.' A curved, open hatch door was located on the leading end and was vertically lowered. There was a light coming from inside but it could have been installed by the Air Force.

"My job was to determine from the angle and depth of impact into the sand, how fast the vehicle's forward and vertical velocities were at the time of impact. The impact had forced the vehicle approximately 20 inches into the sand. There was no landing gear. There were also no marks or dents that I can remember on the surface—not even scratches. . . .

"An armed military policeman guarded a tent pitched nearby. I managed to glance inside at one point and saw the dead body of a four-foot human-like creature in a silver metallic-looking suit. The skin on its face was dark brown. This



The McMinnville photos shown here became famous when even the skeptical Condon Committee could not conclude that they were faked. "This is one of the few UFO reports," the committee stated, "in which all factors investigated . . . appear to be consistent with the assertion that an extraordinary flying object, silvery metallic . . . tens of meters in diameter and evidently artificial, flew within the sight of two witnesses."

The photos were taken at 7:45 p.m. on May 11, 1950, in the backyard of a farm near McMinnville, Oregon, by Mr. Paul Trent. Photo 2 was taken fifteen seconds after the first picture. Dr. Allen J. Hynek, noted UFO student, classifies these as "daylight disks"—objects that are oval or circular in shape, appear to be metallic and are capable of high-speed maneuvers or hovering not within the range of known aircraft.

may have been caused by exposure to our atmosphere. The face was not covered but it had a skullcap device on its head."

When the group returned to the bus, the colonel in charge had them raise their right hands and swear not to reveal what they had seen. According to Ray Fowler, who took Werner's statement for the Ohio UFO group, Werner held several engineering and management positions at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base between June 1949 and January 1960. During that period, he worked in the Office of Special Studies of what was then the Air Material Command Installation Division. Later he designed aircraft landing gear and became chief of Alighting Devices within the Aircraft Laboratory at Wright Air Development Center.

Fowler, in evaluating Werner's statement, said that there were a few inconsistencies, but these seemed to be "in the realm of lapses and exaggerations by the witness."

Fowler interviewed former employers and found that Werner was held in high esteem and all described him as a "highly competent and moral individual." Werner had also published a number of technical papers and holds a membership in the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

While the Aztec, New Mexico crash is the major story involved in what has become known in saucer circles as the "retrieval" reports, information coming from other parts of the country and around the world tend to support the observations made by witnesses who saw the spacecraft allegedly stored at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base or Langley Field. A new item dated Oslo, Norway, 1955, quotes Colonel Ger-

rod Darnbyl, chairman of a Swedish board investigating a damaged UFO. "We wish to state emphatically that it [the UFO] has not been built in any country on Earth. The materials used in its construction are completely unknown to all experts having participated in the investigation."

That same year, in May, Dorothy Kilgallen, in an item from London, England, said that she had been told by a British official of cabinet rank, "We believe on the basis of our inquiries thus far that the saucers were staffed by small men—probably under four feet. It's frightening, but there's no denying that flying saucers are from another planet." This official cited scientists he had spoken to as saying that a flying ship of this type could not have been constructed on Earth.

"The British Government," Kilgallen stated, "is withholding an official report on the flying saucer examination at this time, possibly because it doesn't want to frighten the public."

There are many other foreign reports in recent times telling of alleged UFO crashes and retrievals, and of little humanoids on the loose doing seemingly ludicrous things. Many of these reports have conventional explanations but others—like the report of the circular craft that crashed in Nauta, Peru on November 11, 1975—do not. This craft was reported to measure twelve feet eight inches in diameter and featured a strange metallic coating. Another like it is said to have crashed in Naura, Australia in May 1976 and still another in Mexico in August 1977. In each case, military intervention prevented close examination of the crashed saucers.

over the trees, or touching the ground and then suddenly taking off vertically with a tremendous burst of speed. Pilots have continually reported sightings, and sometimes several planes have given chase—always unsuccessfully. Persons unknown to one another have described identical phenomena seen in the same night—or daylight—sky. Radar tracings are not uncommon either, and occasionally fleeting views have been captured by cameras.”

Although Mead was willing to accept the possibility that the sightings could have been pure and simple hoaxes, she pointed out that just because some of the observations were the work of pranksters, there was no reason to rule out the possibility that some sightings might be legitimate.

Asked how she could account for the fact that inhabitants of UFOs had not contacted any government here on Earth and had never landed en masse, Mead explained that it was possible that the occupants were simply watching what we were up to, “that a responsible society outside our solar system is keeping an eye on us, in order to see that we don’t set in motion a chain reaction that might have repercussions far outside our solar system.”

Steven Spielberg

“I’ve been fascinated by UFOs since I was a kid,” Steven Spielberg, award-winning director of *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*, stated recently. “And while I’ve never had a sighting of my own, I’ve always been intrigued by the idea that flying saucers have a basis in reality.”

Spielberg feels that his movie should be taken seriously. “It’s not just meant as another science fiction yarn, but as something that could really occur tomorrow or the next day.”

Barry Goldwater

“I’ve been flying now for 44 years and I’m the last guy that’s going to say I don’t believe they’re up there. I’ve never seen one, but when Air Force pilots, Navy pilots, airline pilots tell me they saw something come up on their wing that wasn’t an airplane, I have to believe them.

“I can’t believe that in this never-ending universe our planet is the only one with intelligent life. I’m not convinced, after having been around for 65 years, that human beings are the smartest creatures in the universe.

“I certainly believe in aliens in space. They may not look or talk like us, but I have very strong feelings they have advanced past our mental capabilities.

“I remember the case in Georgia in the 1950s of a National Guard plane going after a UFO and never returning. And I can recall the case in Franklin, Kentucky, where four military planes investigated a UFO. One of them exploded in midair and on one knows why.”

Although Goldwater admits that he never saw a UFO, he says he has heard strange signals, apparently from outer space, on his ham radio set. “These signals were delivered in a cadence or sequence which sounded like a code. It wasn’t like any code I’d ever heard before.

“The United States and other countries like Russia have picked up noises from space. But nobody knows where they come from or what they are. I do know that the National Aeronautics and Space Administration is doing a lot of research into this.”

Goldwater states that he has been thwarted in his attempts to see research files at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, where UFO investiga-



What did Jimmy Carter see and when did he see it? People have been asking that question ever since Carter, as governor of Georgia, said

Dear Mr. Carter,

I have written you with a sincere hope that you will provide some answers on the ~~man~~ problem of UFOs. As far as I am aware no former President has ever made a statement on the subject and hope you will lead the way to doing so.

As has been often quoted you promised to "make every piece of information the country has about UFOs available to the public." Yet as Mr. Victor Marchetti (formerly executive assistant to the Deputy Director of the CIA) stated in his article "How the CIA Views the UFO Phenomena," your silence on the subject is one of the best indications that there is truth to the conspiracy theory.

Mr. Wilbert Smith, the Canadian gov't's leading expert on UFOs till ~~the~~ his death in 1962, stated that all gov'ts know the answers, and that the truth would not come till the gov'ts were ready to release it (enclosure #)

A former associate of Du Cannon Bush who I think you know was heavily involved in UFO research, has stated in a Sept 1, 1987 interview (not yet made public) that the U.S. gov't had recovered saucers and bodies, but that researchers were fighting the wind if they thought they would get proof of

the UFO phenomenon as nothing more than something that exists only in the public's imagination.

This sequence of events can mean only one of three things. What Jimmy Carter saw in 1973 was: a) a reflection of a physical event which has since been explained to him; b) the testing of a secret weapon to which he is now privy, but for reasons of "national security" it is still a secret; or c) a UFO. If what President Carter saw falls into category a, there is no reason why he could not publicly say so. As presidents go, he has been relatively humble and honest on other matters of personal embarrassment. If it falls into category b, there is again no reason why he should not admit to the fact. There is no way that such a weapon system could possibly still be a secret from the Soviets. But if what he saw was a UFO — and there is a secret international agreement among the great powers to withhold this information from the people — then Mr. Carter would act exactly the way he has. He is neither smart enough nor tough enough to override the pressures of the Establishment.

Thus, the CIA would be called upon once again. This time to release to the public all the information it has regarding the UFO phenomenon . . . after, of course, the usual and long ritualistic procedures of litigation under the Freedom of Information Act. We can safely assume, however, that the CIA would not disclose everything it knows or that it would reveal any data it believes would not advance the UFO cover-up. The CIA, like other intelligence organizations, has little respect for the public's right to know. It has an attitude they all consistently display.

Ironically, however, among the vast body of circumstantial evidence pointing to the existence of UFOs or contacts from outer space, the FOIA documents recently provided by the CIA have done more to make the public suspect there is an official conspiracy than any of the recent

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
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be maintained, after a couple of false starts. And when public interest continued to build, another scientific panel (the Condon Group) was assembled to assure us that there were no such things as UFOs. With that accomplished the US Government—the Earth's spokesman on the issue—could call off all further official investigations, slamming the lid of secrecy on the problem.

But despite governmental proclamations, the sightings—often by astronauts, professional pilots, and even prospective presidents—have continued. Public pressure is again building for an honest, authoritative explanation of



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UFOs.

Of all the evidence that exists with regard to UFOs, the single, most impressive item (to my mind) is the Jimmy Carter experience. One night in Georgia in 1973, the man who was destined to become the President of the USA and his son, Jeff, saw what they believed to be a UFO. Three years later when campaigning for the presidency, Carter promised to make "every piece of information the country has about UFOs available to the public." He never fulfilled that pledge. Nor has he ever again spoken out publicly on the subject. Meanwhile, his White House staff has parried all queries on the matter and both his Director of NASA, Robert Frosch, and Secretary of Defense, Harold Brown, have officially dismissed

this.

Two researchers in the field of UFOs claim that they have documents related to your briefing on the subject after becoming president, and have claimed they are going to make it public.

In this light I hope you will enlighten me on whether or not you were even briefed on the subject, and what your present position is. The silence in this area has lead many people, including myself to believe that if the public can be deceived on this point, it can be deceived on any subject such as the recent Iran Arms incident.

It is my sincere hope that you will ^{take time from your busy schedule.} put pen to paper to clear up this important area of concern. Thank-you for taking time to read and consider my request.

In answer to your questions;





tric energy, which can cause the "flow," or pull of gravity, to veer on all sides of the aeroform, and so annihilating gravity-pull and weight close to the saucer; or (2): by a downward-directed beam of electrons. This "diversion field" has been visible in some of the saucer sightings, when something like a corona discharge has been seen, a luminous envelope or skin of fire. The corona effect is also seen in the case of saucers powered by electro-magnetic energy.

Now, let us glance at some forms of the saucers detailed in this book as sighted by American observers: doughnut-shaped; fusiform or cigar-shaped, seen by myself, on July 23, 1954, over north Kent; spherical; rubber-heel shaped.

The *doughnut shape*: Seen over Maury Island, on the northwest coast of the United States by coast guards, at 2 P.M., June 21, 1947. It had an outside diameter of about 125 feet, with a cavity of some twenty-five feet, and thirty feet thick. It carries test equipment, very advanced technicians, and a crew of about fifty. It is used for technical experiments and observations. Drive: electromagnetic.

The *fusiform, or cigar shape*: Functions like a terrestrial aircraft or fighter plane—to protect the other types, if needed. About a hundred feet long and twenty-five feet wide, with a crew of about twenty entities. Its drive is the ray-jet, above, or the primary of space travel.

The *crescentiform, or rubber-heel shape* of saucer has about four types, and uses either the ray-jet or the electromagnetic system of propulsion. One of these types can be mistaken for a *fireball*. They are used largely for reconnaissance of this planet and *others*. The crew ranges from two to five.

The *spherical saucer*: About a hundred feet wide; a transport aeroform, carrying passengers and/or freight. Has a crew of twenty-five to thirty. It is driven by both ray-jet and primary space propulsion.

There are also global or spherical aeroforms, which are *not* manned, but remotely controlled from carriers or mother space-ships. They have devices for very long-range television-scanning and reporting. Some of them automatically collect earth, rocks, water and other things from this planet, for study. An American rocket technician at a base near the Oregon mountains, even declares that, in 1953, he was taken for a ride in one of these manless aeroforms controlled, he says, by posterity of old Mul

In 1949, there were persistent reports of flying saucers shot down in both Mexico and the United States. Of course

these reports are impossible to confirm. Imaginations have been busy with the dark side of our moon—the side we never see, except for an edge revealed by librations, or wobbings. None can know, short of an actual landing on the Moon, whether it has subterranean life, as H. G. Wells' space-novel imported. Some Americans hold that there is a way-station on the moon—perhaps on the dark side—and from it has come a carrier ship, with four-foot tall, humanoid beings manning satellite discs. These latter, it is said, were twenty-seven feet wide, with an aerodynamic surface of which the cabin occupied a diameter of sixteen feet. Propulsion was by earth-induction (electromagnetic). Their (pacific) purpose was to explore and gain knowledge of the earth. Somehow, their carrier ship went out of action, and the discs had no base or supervision. They could not return to the moon on their own, not being equipped for interplanetary flight.

A flying saucer from another world saw one of them over New Mexico, signalled it, got no reply and, believing it was hostile, caused it to crash on the earth. Several others were crashed by radar—it is believed, but not used for this purpose—by the United States Air Force. When their carrier ship did not return, saucers from another world, it is said, transported to the moon twenty-six of these thirty-seven aeroforms whose science had not shielded or could not insulate their propulsion and control from the interference of radar. Eight of these "lunar" machines crashed on the earth, and the fate of three more is unknown.

There is a vast, spindle-shaped, or cigar-shaped, cylindrical space ship of unknown origin, which was photographed over a blast furnace in Hamilton, Ohio, in 1950. It was also "snapped" by a young woman taking pictures of ordinary terrestrial objects at Hawthorne, Calif., when it was seen in the act of releasing satellite discs. It was seen over Denham, in England, and twelve hours later over Sweden, in 1949, again releasing discs which, at high speed, flew off in opposite directions. It is probably a space ship of hostile character and is suspected, both in England and the United States, of causing serious fires. In Europe, this weird space ship appears *solus*; in the United States such ships have been seen and photographed in squadrons of three.

Again, what in earth or sky, in our atmosphere, or in outer space, is the weird, vast white column of light seen, in one case, dropping reddish-yellow objects over Lake Geneva, in March 1763, and over the Cotswold Hills, in

Since I have no hoax to get across with the aid of daily gossip columnists, "strip-tease" sensational weeklies, and "chick-liters" and impostors, operating on suspicious pseudo-raps with strange "biometric" devices unknown to any laboratory, or "revelations" made on the radio and to clubs of saucer fans and nuisances, I fear I must end this *Prince Regga* story with what sounds like an anti-climax.

There has appeared a book in which two gentlemen speak of using the Ouija-board and short-wave radio contacts with "saucer men" from *Mars*, said to be the planet *Mars*. There they proceed to automatic writing, in the course of which pops up this same *Prince Regga* of *Mars*, called *Prince Regga* above. There also appears the portentous figure of one *Zo*, a gentleman with seven children, said to hail from the planet *Neptune*, but with a stop-off *Europa* on *Mars*. It is also curious—and here is one of the pitfalls of saucer fantasists who drag into the saucer theme "leit-motivs" from American pre-history, that these two gentlemen profess to be philosophers and scientists. One, who has appended his signature to an affidavit attesting the veracity and authenticity of still another gentleman's alleged stop-watch talk by telepathy and gesture with an entity in a landed saucer from "*Venus*"—a hoax impure and unsimple—is said to be an anthropologist, or prehistorian, and an authority on Indian cultures (as he may well be, for aught I know). His collaborator merely professes to be a "student of philosophy and science," employed, very oddly in relation to these studies, on the *Santa Fé* and *New Mexico Railroad*. It seems that some time before their book appeared, the publisher in California was sorely stricken with threats from someone to blow up his printery, and with dire menaces from another, suspected to be *Wilbur J. Wilkinson*, who alleged that all the material in this book was "snatched," or as the Artful Dodger said in *Oliver Twist*, "prigged" from him.

I am reminded in this mystery of a comic song which was howled, roared and barrel-organed when I was a boy, in the years of the Boer or South African War of 1899-1901. It had a refrain, a very pathetic refrain, as follows:

"Bill Bailey, won't you please COME HOME?"

My friend, Mr. Gray Barker, who at Clarksburg, West Virginia, runs a spritely little magazine called the "Saucer-

ian," says that in 1920 there was a song in America, of which the refrain ran:

"Mr. Gentle-man
Tell my Mammy to come back home.
I'm so alone."

I advise these gentlemen, as also another Californian who claims to have had a very remarkable ride in a saucer from *White Sands* proving grounds to *New York* and *Washington, D.C.*, and back again, *not* to adventure onto the shifting sands of ancient American history and Atlantean archaeology, when indicting these veracious books. Such adventures tend to draw the malign eyes of skeptics their way.

In April, 1954, I received an air-mail letter from a friend in California reporting a startling event in the flying-saucer drama.

"An unconfirmable report that President Eisenhower, in a recent visit to the Edwards Air Force base, California, was informed that a recent investigation of five types of flying saucers by experts and technicians there, has thrown them all into confusion and consternation. It is alleged that the experts have reported on the materialization and subsequent dematerialization, into a fourth-dimension of invisibility, of some of the mysterious types of non-terrestrial aeroforms, or unidentified flying objects."

There may be doubt whether President Eisenhower visited the *Edwards Air Force base* in person. It may be that he delegated a general to go there on his behalf. But from a reliable source in Southern California, I am assured that these five saucers actually did land voluntarily at this *Edwards Air Force base*. They were discs of different types and their entities invited the technicians and scientists to inspect their aeroforms and witness a demonstration of their powers.

Says my informant, who has a doctorate from an American university:

"I can positively assure you that a friend of mine visited Edwards Air Force base, soon after this demonstration. He was accompanied by (1): a man prominent in the Hearst news syndicate; (2): a bishop of either the Methodist or the Episcopal Church; (3): a

in the sky. It repeated these hovering and rushing maneuvers until close on midnight."

Opinions range all the way from a new type of saucer to a terrestrial space-station of some home or foreign government; but it seems more likely that this gyroscopic object may be a cosmic aerofoil linked with the elusive flying saucers. No one knows—outside a very narrow military and aeronautical circle—what any Government may, or may not have achieved towards establishing space vehicles.

The editor of "Nexus," a very interesting, mimeo saucer-sheet published at Fort Lee, New Jersey, kindly draws my attention to two news items: (1) The "sacking" in August, 1954, from his job, of the free-spirited news-caster, Frank Edwards. He is said to have incurred the displeasure of his sponsors, the American Federation of Labor, by dwelling on the theme of saucer sightings and what is being hidden from the public by the American defense authorities. It appears that the A.F.L. have been displaced by the avalanche of letters sent to Mr. Edwards by people who have seen saucers. (2) The alleged concealment, in official cold-storage, of a saucer and its parts, forced down near Columbus, Ohio, and hidden at the Wright-Patterson airfield of the American Air Force.

Concerning (2), Mr. James W. Moseley got on the trail of a woman he calls "Miss Y.," who, as a civilian employee at a large military and air base in Ohio, acted as night girl on the teletype, decoding messages and handling classified material. About August, 1952, she saw in the photographic laboratory twelve prints of a non-terrestrial flying saucer, which the cameraman said he had taken on a recent secret assignment to a location in Ohio, where an interplanetary saucer had come to grief. Some days later "Miss Y." handled official messages which said that the saucer was passing through her base under guard, en route to the Wright-Patterson airfield in Ohio, which is the location of the secret Flying-Saucer Investigation Bureau of the U.S. Air Force. She also found that, both before and after the transit, a Red and White Alert was on, indicating official fear that the landed saucer might have communicated with its space ship.

Two weeks later, after official experts had examined the captured saucer, the Alert terminated. According

to the reluctant witness, "Miss Y.," who would appear to have been talking too much, either for her own comfort or that of the authorities, the saucer was thirty feet in diameter, but had no "bubs" or blurbs, although there was a rim, or flange where the sections of the disc joined. She said its metals were riveted together and she had heard that the saucer had ports of a one-way vision, translucent material; that is, the entities could see through it without being seen. "Miss Y." further alleged that the U.S. experts had penetrated the saucer with considerable difficulty, and found that its metals were of alloys "unknown on the earth." No living creatures were found inside it. It appeared to have been remotely controlled. She also alleged that she had heard—of course, this is not evidence in any law-court or judicial sense—that dead bodies of humanoid creatures, five feet tall, had been found in other saucers previously captured and photographed. She said the saucer had floated down, not crashed, as if its magnetic propulsion had failed, or been cut off.

As one would expect, Mr. Moseley received a denial from the officers at the Ohio base that any saucers had been seen, much less photographed. He was also told by a high officer that the Department could not understand how "Miss Y.," an efficient member of their personnel, had come to make such statements. However, Mr. Moseley, who personally interviewed the lady, was impressed with her sincerity, and did not believe she was fantasizing, or hoaxing.

All one can say is that while there is no smoke without fire, and the U.S. air and military authorities would, no doubt, take a very "dim" view about alleged hoaxes by one of their personnel—these authorities, like those in Great Britain, are exercising a rigid censorship. For publicly reporting flying saucers seen from 1952 on, any officer would risk court-martial and possible degradation in rank.

Follows a story of a singular encounter in Norway:

August 24, 1954: The chief of police at Mosjøen, in the province of Helgeland, Norway, lat. 66 degrees N., has been told by two Norwegian women, sisters, aged twenty-four and thirty-two, that they were in the hills near Lake Røsvatn, picking blueberries, when a dark man, clad in a sort of khaki overall with no buttons, came up to them and motioned them to

heart of grace and confidence again, when the police of Lille trailed a rascal of a miner at Beuvry-les-Bethune, who said he had made saucers out of strong grey paper soaked in gasoline, and having lit a fire under them, sent them—1,000 of them (sic)—into the wind, with yellow and red lights. The police found one on a haystack. While this may be partly true, it would be distinctly unwise to jump to the conclusion that what these people saw all over France, a pretty big country, were just a miner's prank.

The furer died down again, until October 17, 1954, when the owner of a café at Toulon, named Rappellini, told the Toulon police the following odd story:

"I was motor-cycling between Hyères and Toulon, on the Mediterranean coast, when I saw a being step out from a disc-shaped saucer. He was dressed in some sort of overalls. I said to him: 'Are you from Mars?' He said: 'No, French.' With me was my engineer-friend, Monsieur Ottevisani, who will corroborate what I say. The being asked where he was, and when told, made a rapid vertical ascent in his disc."

My reader must form his or her own opinion of Rappellini's story, as to whether this may or may not have been some secret terrestrial machine.

Far away at Salisbury, in Rhodesia, Africa, a certain gentleman got on the radio and rashly vouched for the authenticity of some decidedly dubious photographs, published in a German newspaper of Cologne. One of these photographs depicted what looks like a wax mannikin held up by the arms by two gentlemen in trilby hats, such as might be worn by detectives on a spree. Behind them stand two handsome ladies. The caption informs us that the mannikin is not quite 28 inches high, and comes from Mars. An unnamed "War Department" is alleged to have said that: "It is not proven that he comes from Mars, but we are positive that he came from one of the planets in our solar system, or from a neighboring star."

People in Salisbury and Bulawayo write me asking: "Is this fellow a dupe or a plain liar?"

Curious incidents have been reported, both in the United States and in the North Pacific, between 1950 and 1953. These may import that some flying saucers which have no human or humanoid, or any kind of entity aboard,

may have been engaged in some kind of exploration or reconnaissance. For example:

Was a satellite disc—a flying saucer with no entities on board, and possibly controlled from some unseen spaceship—rammed and sunk by a specially equipped American plane in late April or May, 1953?

It looks like it, and the affair occurred in the waters of the North Pacific, off Tinian, one of the Marianas Islands, formerly mandated to Japan. On this island, it may be noted, are mysterious ruins of colossal, columned tombs which may be the monuments of one of the colonies of the lost and very ancient Pacific continent of Mu.

"In the last weeks (late April, 1953), our ships and aircraft have sighted numerous flying objects of unknown origin. Their flight courses were plotted and permit conclusions about their take-off and landing bases. Near the island of Tinian, one of these projectiles was rammed by a specially equipped airplane and sunk in the sea." (*Report of the Chief of the U.S. Defense HQ., D., Tokyo, May 9, 1953.*)

Tinian has an up-to-date military airfield from which flew the atomic bomb-carrier planes sent against Japan in 1945. Although a passage in the above report might seem to imply that these objects were terrestrial in origin, it seems pretty clear that the American authorities were forced to conclude that they were, in fact, a type of flying saucer.

Among the reports of alleged, forced-down saucers, is a blatant hoax published in the September, 1954 issue of the sensational New York magazine, "Sir." In this hoax, which cited names of fictitious "scientists" for "vraiesemblance," it is mendaciously stated that recently, on the island of Heligoland, off the western coast of Germany, a flying saucer crashed. It was found to carry "firing instruments" capable "of shattering glass with magnetic rays." Slumped round the crashed saucer were the incinerated bodies of seven humanoid beings, five feet eight inches tall. The saucer "was made of metal that even a temperature of 15,000 degrees Fahrenheit could not melt."

The only comment I would make on this impudent and clumsy lie is that, if the late Mr. Pulitzer had left a prize for journalistic mendacity, the concocter of this hoax would certainly have won it, as the sporting gentlemen say, "hands down."

Dear Mr. King.

I have written in response to your Sept 12, 88 interview of Whitley ~~Whitely~~ ^{Streiber}. In that interview you asked a number of interesting and serious questions of Mr. Streiber, which even though I think he knew the answers, he didn't provide.

Firstly you expressed a concern that the aliens seemingly only appear to famous sixty miles from the nearest city as opposed to "famous" people. Some of the names you referred to were Jimmy Carter, George Bush, Ronald Reagan, Mr. Cobachew, and Barry Goldwater. I will outline ~~that~~ this person ~~for~~ person (with supporting enclosures) that this is not necessarily true.

The problem is that "famous people" are not easily accessible to researchers for face to face interviews on the subject. How many of the famous people you mentioned have ever been questioned on the record as to their opinions or involvements? I have seen after press people for the last year to question people like Bush and Reagan. If you check the record you will see there are no incidents on the record.

Secondly you stated if the aliens are making contact ^{the telephone} you would like one on your show. I will provide for you two ^{numbers of} T.V. producers, one in Colorado and one in California, who were offered interviews with a live alien known as EBE-3. Both are open to talking about how this came to be (although the interviews never took place) and you will see the ~~idea~~ ^{concept} is not totally ~~pure~~ fiction.

No president has ever had to field a direct question as

to the validity of crashed saucers, bodies, and gov't alien contact. Yet there is a story about every one of them

(a) Eisenhower: Eisenhower was rumored to have met the aliens at Edwards Air Force Base in California in 1954. The press was on to the rumor, but dropped it when the White House provided an explanation as to where the President had disappeared to. Enclosure 1 is a research report on how valid the explanation turned out to be.

(b) Kennedy was rumored to have met with the aliens but this story has less substance. Enclosure 2.

(c) Nixon: According to Jackie Gleason's second wife unpublished biography of Jackie Gleason, Gleason was given access to Edwards Air Force Base in California Florida to view the bodies of dead aliens. According to James Bacon, Gleason's biographer Gleason discussed UFOs with four presidents. (enclosure 3)
I questioned Gleason's third wife about the dead alien story. She did not deny it, but simply stated she couldn't help me.

(d) Carter: Jimmy Carter had a well publicized UFO sighting in 1973. He stated that if elected he would release every piece of evidence on UFOs. However once in the White House he never mentioned the word again. Every inquiry was either handled by his science advisor or forwarded to NASA. Jimmie Spendera one of the T.V. producers who was offered an interview with EBS-3, also claims to have some Carter Briefing Papers on the subject that may be released before Reagan leaves office.

Please excuse this delay in responding to your letter of August 5. This has been an extremely hectic month, part of it spent traveling, and I'm behind on all my correspondence.

I talked with Jaime Shandera for the first time in about a month just yesterday morning. He told me things are proceeding well for The Release sometime between now and the end of the year. He said that things are opening up to the extent that he and Bill Moore are meeting face-to-face some of the sources who till now had been no more than voices on the phone. He said that on some days "multiple meetings" are occurring, all directed toward some significant leak in the next few months. He was obviously in good spirits. I guess all we can do is wait.

You ask why Moore "appears to many researchers as elusive as his sources." I don't know. He doesn't seem that way to me, perhaps because we've known and trusted each other for some time. Perhaps to others he appears otherwise because he just isn't interested in telling them what he knows. Although I know more than most about the story of the sources, I don't know everything and I have a number of questions I'd like to see answered. I assume that, one way or another, we'll have those answers before too terribly long. Bill and Jaime both tell me that, if this time things don't work out, they are going to abandon the quest and resume normal lives.

I hadn't heard the rumor about Reagan and an EBE on television till you mentioned it in your letter. Jaime tells me that that rumor is currently going the rounds and he's heard it from a number of sources. He didn't take it seriously and neither do I. It sounds like something that would occur to somebody after a few too many in a bar. Maybe I'm wrong, but I would be extremely surprised if it were true.

I hope your own research is proving productive.

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
