Foreword

In the Summer of 1984 a two-day seminar on Intelligence was held at Erindale College. The seminar was sponsored by York University and an American organization, the Consortium for the Study of Intelligence. The idea of having such a seminar in Canada--the first such seminar or non-professionals to be held--came about as a result of discussions between Dr. Roy Godson and myself. Dr. Godson, Program Coordinator of the Consortium for the Study of Intelligence (CSI), mentioned the growing number of courses in Intelligence being taught in the United States. The increasing volume of primary and secondary sources available in federal archives relating to the wartime and post-war eras has been a major factor leading to the widening interest in Intelligence affairs among academics and others. In 1979, the CSI was formed under the auspices of the National Strategy Information Centre. In turn, the CSI began to sponsor a number of seminars on Intelligence in the United States. It was after attending one of the week-long seminars at Bowdoin College in Maine that I became aware of the volume and variety of source material available to the public, and had the opportunity to meet a number of people who were interested in Intelligence as a field of study.

Invitations to the two-day seminar in Toronto resulted in some 35 people attending. Although most of the topics dealt with American and British subjects, several papers were of primary concern to Canadians. At the end of the seminar, it was felt that we in Canada should form our own organization, the Canadian Association for Security

and Intelligence Studies (CASIS). This was done, an executive elected and the decision was made to have our first meeting in Montreal at the same time as the Learned Societies in May 1985.

One of the items on the agenda at the Montreal meeting was the problem of preparing a bibliography on Intelligence and Security matters relating to Canada. An approach was made to the Canadian government and this present work was prepared under a contract. A professional librarian, Mr. Rand Flem-Ath, was hired on a part-time basis and during the latter months of 1985 and on into January 1986, the task of collecting, identifying and sorting out the material was carried out at an intense pace.

Quite naturally, the amount of the contract placed strict limitations on the scope of the bibliography. These limitations are defined in the Scope Statement. In brief, we had to confine ourselves to the 1945-1985 era, to printed material (government documents, books and articles) with the exception of newspapers, and to items within those categories which bore almost exclusively on the Canadian scene and which did not encroach on the numerous peripheral areas overlapping the Intelligence-Security areas. As a result, this is not to be considered a definitive bibliography, but rather the first segment of what is hoped will be one. More work will be required to cover the pre-1945 era, and to include such other sources as newspapers, theses, unpublished manuscripts, etc., as well as material published outside Canada but containing significant Canadian content, and so forth.

Most of the credit for compiling this bibliography goes to Rand

Flem-Ath. Although working under my supervision, he is the one who has ferreted out the surprising amount of material which comprises this volume. We would also like to acknowledge the help given us by Mrs. Barbara J. S. Nelson, a professional librarian who has had considerable bibliographical experience herself. Enquiries on special problems were put to local members of the RCMP and the Canadian Security Intelligence Service. Both were most cooperative and showed great interest in the project. Mr. D. A. Guertin of the Department of National Defence provided us with a list of items on military intelligence which we might have missed. We would also like to thank the staffs of the library at the University of Victoria and Royal Roads Military College for their kind cooperation and assistance.

A preliminary draft of this bibliography was sent to a number of members of the Canadian Association for Security and Intelligence Studies for their comments and criticism. Despite the short time I was able to allow them to reply, I want to thank them for their suggestions and potential additions. The limited parameters of the bibliography was their main and quite legitimate complaints. Much more work is needed to expand the bibliography and let us hope this will be only the first of more to come.

This is the first bibliography in the strictly Canadian field from Canadian sources. Despite our best efforts, there is always the possibility that we may have overlooked some items which should have been included. We would welcome advice of any errors of this nature. This bibliography, although supervised by the Chairman of CASIS, should

not be regarded as a production of that association.

CANADIAN INTELLIGENCE AND SECURITY,
1946-1985, A BIBLIOGRAPHY

Scope:

This bibliography on Security and Intelligence contains a listing of unclassified materials originally published in Canada from September 1945 to September 1985. Material originally published outside of Canada is not included.* The emphasis is on espionage, counterespionage, terrorism, and counterterrorism and security within the borders of Canada. Material relating to the War Measures Act is included, as are references to the Front de libération due Québec. Articles (but not cases) from Canadian Law journals are included where the emphasis is on specific instances of espionage, terrorism or subversion in Canada.

Excluded from this bibliography is material relating to freedom of information, the right to privacy, external affairs, and criminal investigations other than those falling under the jurisdiction of the Official Secrets Act. Industrial espionage and industrial terrorism are excluded unless the acts are politically motivated. Material relating to groups not considered a threat to the Canadian state, such as Native Indians or Doukhobors, are not included. French language material is

restricted to that obtained in English-language bibliographies and indices. Book reviews and works of fiction, and theses are not included, nor are newspapers and non-print material.
