

FOLLOW-UP TO UFO REPORTS

1. Enclosed is the photocopied material onforwarded to 82 Wing recently by [redacted] West End. The material includes a personal letter addressed to a 'Mrs [redacted]
2. I have onforwarded both the letter and the material to West End Police on the basis that [redacted], who has a propensity for reporting UFOs, is known to your staff as an otherwise harmless resident who, prima facie, may require ongoing psychological or psychiatric assistance. My own assessment, resulting from my conversations with [redacted], is that he is suffering some degree of mental disturbance - probably as the result of a motor vehicle accident.
3. You may wish to either retain this material to provide some 'background' data for State medical authorities should it be required, or else return it to [redacted]. Of note, I have the impression (from conversations with your staff) that [redacted] residence shows no evidence of any marriage/live-in relationship, as such. Also, [redacted] says that he has a 14-year-old son.
4. Also of note, I gathered from [redacted] comments that he may have, circa mid-1989, attempted to enter a secure area at Eagle Farm Airport in an attempt to 'warn them (security personnel) about UFOs', whereupon he was forcibly evicted.
5. Please understand that the RAAF is not recommending any particular course of action concerning [redacted]; he is but one of the several citizens who regularly report bizarre UFO sightings - usually on a three-four monthly cycle. The majority of the UFO reports received by us are from balanced, bona fide citizens.

1. He started off by saying that the questionnaire which the RAAF had sent did not really relate to his experiences. I advised that where the questions were irrelevant that he simply say so and write of his own experiences.
2. It seemed that the main point that he had called about concerned the current airlines dispute. "If the airlines go back within the next ² weeks [ie 25 Aug - 06 SEP? (my thoughts)] then something disastrous would happen [assume to the airlines and RAAF as we are involved in the strike indirectly] to us within the next 4-5 years that no one could prevent.. not the President of [USA], the Pope etc."

Preliminary investigations have shown correlation between your sighting and at least two Regular Public Transport (RPT) airline movements into Brisbane in that time frame. The distortion effect of the atmosphere on reflections of aircraft navigation lighting during thunderstorm activity is a well known phenomenon, and probably accounts for your sighting.

2. At about 1845 the previous evening, several people observed a fast moving, very large red flashing light (as on an ambulance). It was followed a minute or two later by three more lights near the ground and in close formation. They were white, but followed the same path, heading towards the south. No noise was associated with any of the phenomena.

The investigation of reports of U.F.O.s in Australia is carried out by the Royal Australian Air Force, Directorate of Air Force Intelligence, at the Department of Air in Canberra. A considerable amount of effort is spent in investigating each report and the majority of observers are interviewed by selected RAAF personnel.

Between 23rd January 1960 and 30th December 1971, the RAAF received 595 U.F.O. reports. Department of Air has assessed that 93 percent were explainable by present scientific knowledge. Six percent of the reports did not provide sufficient information to permit proper analysis and evaluation. One percent of the reports were attributed to unknown causes.

6. The United Kingdom Air Ministry has stated that on an average, 90 percent of the sightings it investigates are explainable by causes ranging from meteorological balloons and meteors to aircraft lights. The other 10 percent probably remain unexplained because of lack of reliable information.

7. In 1966 the University of Colorado, under contract to the U.S.A.F., spent two years processing and investigating all American reports. Its findings have been published by Bantam Books as the 'Condon Report'. Its general conclusion is that 'nothing has come from the study of U.F.O.s in the past 21 years that has added to scientific knowledge' and that 'further extensive study of U.F.O.s probably cannot be justified in the expectation that science will be advanced thereby'. A panel of eminent scientists, chosen by the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, has examined and endorsed the Condon Report.

8. The U.S.A.F. 'Project Blue Book' investigation of unidentified aerial objects between 1953 and 1965 analysed 7,641 U.F.O. reports. It concluded that :

- a. 80 percent of sightings were natural phenomena, hoaxes, birds or man-made objects;
- b. 17 percent of sightings provided insufficient data to permit thorough analysis and evaluation; and
- c. three percent were unidentified.

U.S. and Soviet space exploration has found no evidence to support the theory of life on planets in our solar system. It seems that the Mariner series of space exploration to Mars has proved it a 'dead' planet. The only other source of extra-terrestrial life, then, would have to be in another 'solar system'. It would seem, therefore, that whilst it may be possible for extra-terrestrial life forms to visit Earth, it is improbable.
