

3. Mr Webber reported finding 2 rings (3.5-4m in diameter) of dead grass in a paddock on his property adjacent to a dirt road. He said this is not the first time such rings had been found in the area, although he believes this is the first report.

1. At 2115 HRS 23 Apr 91 I recieved a phone call in my capacity as Orderly Officer, from a Mrs P Webb of the following address:

2. She claimed that at 2103 HRS she observed an unusual object flying overhead in ~~that~~ direction of RAAF Williamtown. Her description of the object included the following details:

a. The object made the noise of a normal ~~air~~ aircraft (similar to Hercules).

b. One flashing red light underneath the object at the front, pointing forward.

c. Two large white lights at the rear of the object, pointing aft, not flashing.

d. A single flashing green light on either side of the object.

1. Sighting made by Orderly Officer, FLTLT D. DAVISON of ADGE SDU at 6914.
2. Sighting made between 2030 and 2045 9 MAR 91.
3. Direction of object was virtually overhead, slightly south from rear door of Officer's Mess. White light was flickering, moved in circles, figure eights quite rapidly. It stayed in the same position till 2042 then flew generally north till 2045 when it went out of sight. It then appeared to have red navigation lights. It might be explained as a helicopter, but the circular and figure eight movements were too rapid, and when it flew north it was too fast for a helicopter. It flew north at the speed of a 737 overflying Williamstown, but this does not explain the manoeuvring in the same general area between the first report of 2000 and when I lost sight of it.

- f. The object was roughly equivalent in size to a Hercules.
3. Mrs Webb stated that it had been the unusual ring of flashing white lights which initially grabbed her attention and differentiated this from a normal aircraft. She also reported that her young son had seen the object.



UFO SIGHTING

1. UFO sighting reported at 2020 by Ms Grieves, 25 Delia Ave, Budgewoi, Phone 043-900502. Caller sounded rational and there were no background noises. Before giving her name she wanted an assurance that this would be treated in the strictest confidence.
2. Ms Grieves was in her garden at 2000 when she noticed a bright (very bright) light in the sky to the SW. The light was below the clouds, and the light intensity was omnidirectional. The light moved very slowly, would stop and then continue on very slowly. This pattern was repeated continually. When the light got closer to her it stopped and then made a rapid vertical ascent, before descending and continuing onwards at a 'reasonable' speed to the NE.
3. Object 'appeared' round but caller was not sure. The object also had a 'soft' motor noise.
4. I advised caller that the details would be forwarded to an Intelligence Officer who may wish to question her. She understood this, and agreed to write down all the details. Phone call lasted 10 minutes. Caller reiterated desire to 'do the right thing'.

Whilst travelling south through the village of Federal we noticed a bright light in a stationary position above a farm house. We pulled off the road as we drew level with the house. At this point we were some 50 metres from the house.

We estimate that the light was approximately 20 metres to 30 metres above the ground. The light was a very bright sphere, yellow to orange in colour and about 1.5 metres in diameter.

As the car came to a standstill the light began to move due south in a horizontal line.

We drove down the hill for some 300 metres with the light on the passenger side of the car.

The light turned through some 90 degrees to the east, diminished in size to approximately a quarter of its original diameter.

Our view was obscured by road-side trees and the road embankment.

We stopped the car, got out and walked back along the road to our last vantage point.

The light was no longer visible.


Despite it being a clear and still night, we heard no sound that could be associated with aircraft of any description.

Details

- Received UAS report from above lady. She reported seeing bright lights, brighter than night stars in the vicinity of her house. No noise or unusual colouring were associated with the sightings. She has seen the lights only at night and have been visible for about a year. She has pointed the lights out to other people including her grandchildren.
- The lights sometimes hover before moving behind a nearby mountain. She believes they are not aircraft because they are usually visible for about an hour.
- Without additional information it is impossible to say what the lights are. The lights, however, are consistent with a weather balloon or maybe a helicopter. There is believed to be a number of private airstrips in the area and ^{therefore,} helicopter traffic originating from these strips can not be discounted.

1. ON THE 23MAY90 AT APPROX 0650 LOCAL (2120Z) A RESIDENT OF KATHERINE SIGHTED A BRIGHT SILVER LIGHT STREAK FROM EAST TO WEST. AS THE LIGGHHHTTT MMMOOVVVEED, A YELLOW/GOLD FLASH DETACHED FROM THE REAR OF THE


1. ALLAN McARTHUR RANG THE ORDERLY OFFICER AT 2050 HOURS ON 18 JUL 90 TO REPORT AN UNUSUAL AERIAL SIGHTING. THE SIGHTING WAS MADE FROM THE REAR OF HIS RESIDENCE AT 9 ALFRED STREET GLENDALE, HIS PHONE NUMBER IS 548338.
2. THE SINGLE WHITE PEA-SIZED LIGHT WAS OBSERVED BY LOOKING ~~SOUTH~~^{EAST} AND UPWARDS AT 45°. IT WAS MOVING FROM NORTH TO SOUTH, AND WAS AT AN ALTITUDE THAT SEEMED TO ALLOW IT TO FADE AS IT WENT THROUGH CLOUDS. THE SIGHTING OCCURRED AT 2040 HOURS ON 18 JUL 90. THERE WAS NO ACCOMPANYING NOISE.

Thankyou for your report of an unusual aerial sighting given to the Duty Officer at RAAF Williamtown on 6 March 1990.


The Royal Australian Air Force receives many unusual aerial sighting reports. Approximately 90 percent of the sightings are attributed to causes which include aircraft, satellites, meteors, space debris re-entry, meteorological balloons, stars and planets. About seven percent of reports are received too late or do not provide sufficient information to permit proper analysis and evaluation. Three percent of reports are attributed to unknown causes.

It is difficult to say for sure what caused your sighting. But you did say that you saw a long rectangular object similar to a fluoro tube; this suggest you may have seen a Meteor. Meteors often appear for only short periods and sometimes very low in the sky as was the case in your sigting. Your might also be interested to know that a number of unusual aerial sightings have been reported in the Maitland/Kurri Kurri area during the last couple of weeks. Although, apart from the area of sighting, there has been nothing in common with each one.



About seven percent of reports are received too late or do not provide sufficient information to permit proper analysis and evaluation. Three percent of reports are attributed to unknown causes.
