The object did not appear to be moving very fast. Although the wind was blowing from the north to the south the object moved in a northerly direction i.e. (north-east into the wind).

The object appeared to be approximately 70 feet in diameter.

On 81-07-17 a complaint was received from Bruce BOSENCE to the effect that he and his wife had seen an unidentified flying object near Hampton. The sighting occurred at approx 0827 and lasted for about sixty seconds. The observers were travelling west on Hwy 1, approx 2 kilometers from Hampton. In the vehicle were Mr BOSENCE, his wife Dianne, and their daughter Shelly, 5 yrs. old.

The object was described as round, flat, white in color BOSENCE likened it to a large ping-pong ball. It was observed moving at a steady speed across the sky, then disappeared over the horizon. There were no other lights on the object.

Report forwarded to National Research Council as per Operational Manual 1.2.E.22.a.2.

81-07-27

Spoke to Mr. BOSENCE and his wife regarding this matter. He is still very insistent on what they saw. Statements obtained from Bruce BOSENCE (DOB 47-09-05) and DIANNE BOSENCE (DOB; 42-04-23). In their statements they state what they saw, where and when. Story did not vary from the one they gave ten days before. Statements were taken separate from each other and the story was exactly the same.

Mr BOSENCE is a computer technician and the Vice President of a firm in Saint John. It is very doubtful this could be a practical joke as I questioned the BOSENCE and they seemed very sincere.

The district air traffic control office was called and they stated there was nothing unusual reported on radar that date, time and area. They also report no aircraft in the area at that time.

There were no further reports of sightings that day by anyone. Statements of Mr and Mrs BOSENCE attached. The sighting remains unexplained.

Proceeding to work 17th July 1981 from Hampton to Saint John about 8:26 A.M. just beyond Island View Esso saw what I first took as a balloon in the general direction of Hammond River. At first thought it was stationary, only our movement making the object appear to move. As we rounded a slight bend in the road we had the object straight ahead and it was definitely moving. Disappearing from view behind a large tree about 20 sec after first sighting.

The object was round and white, with the apparent color and texture of a table tennis ball. It was low on the horizon (day sunny, few small white clouds) moving as would a jet plane coming into SJ airport. We considered it might have been the sun on a plane, but dismissed this due to the very round shape and not really that shiny a color.

From our viewpoint, it was not possible to guess a distance or size of the object.

At 2:00:59 EDT on July 29, 1981 while travelling
in an easterly direction on highway #7 (difficult to

Mounties aren't laughing at report of UFO in Alta.

SMOKY LAKE, Alta. (CP) — RCMP officials are not laughing at a recent report of an unidentified flying object in the Smoky Lake area, 80 kilometres northeast of Edmonton.

A confidential report, with pictures and ashes from a possible UFO crater, has been sent to RCMP headquarters in Ottawa.

The excitement began Aug. 22 when Pat Wilson and her husband Jim saw a strange fire burning in a field on their acreage.

"It wasn't like a normal fire," Mrs. Wilson said in an interview. "There was no crackling sound, no smell and it was a bright orange color."

They went to the site and found no fire, "just mounds of cold ashes and a weird sulphur smell."

The Wilsons are convinced the fire was a UFO taking off from their field.

"What we saw was definitely not normal," Mrs. Wilson said.

RCMP officials questioned the Wilsons and investigated the site carefully before filing their report.

"The ground was burned to a depth of six or seven inches," said an RCMP officer who wants to remain anonymous.

"The ash was grey-black with a crater-like surface. It was soft. If you stepped on it you would sink up to your ankles.

"The area was cigar-shaped, about 30 feet across. If you let your imagination get away you could almost see jet propulsion marks."

Samples of the ashes have been sent to Ottawa and to a University of Alberta professor for analysis.







3. Statement taken from Mrs. COOMBS. Copy attached. Also attached is a drawing she did of the object.

4. Mr. MERSEREAU, who appears bright and sincere, did not see the object. He confirmed that Mrs. COOMBS had woke him up on the night in question and related the same story. He also confirmed that the bottom far limb of the tree was shortened, it was curved down and used to be upright. The leaves on the branch above died overnight and the limbs in the immediate area of the downturned limb were blackened. I should point out that Mrs. COOMBS keeps a diary and in it she has an entry for 81-09-08 making reference to the sighting.

On Tuesday the 8th of September at about 10:10 p.m., I was about to draw the curtain on the east side of my bedroom. I noticed an object go by the south bedroom window. I watched it go out over the road and the lights went out. The object was shaped like a vertical cylinder. It was about 3 feet high, 1 1/2 feet in diameter. It had vertical wavy black lines about three inches apart. Between the lines there appeared to be red tinted glass from which a pulsating light was emitted. The object went by about three feet from the house. It produced no sound.

The next day I looked out the door at the elm tree and the lower far branch was broke off. An upper branch had all the leaves missing. The branches were black. The lower far branch was upright the day before. The morning after it was curved downward towards the road and appeared charred. The day before it had three prongs on it about 1 1/2 feet long where the telephone people cut it off. That part of the branch was missing.


I should point out that I look at that tree everyday. It definitely changed one day to the next.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I'm afraid I hardly know ~~how~~ to begin, but the reason I'm writing to you is because, of some things I've noticed in the recent months that might be of interest to you and that have me extremely baffled. To begin with I ~~live~~ live across the street from an oil tank farm which lies on the west side of the Rideau River here in Kingston. One early morning (about 3 A.M.) in early August (I forget, the exact date) it was an extremely humid hot sticky night with a light mist in the air and I, being too uncomfortable to sleep, got up out of bed and stood looking out the window at the Rideau River with the oil storage tanks in the foreground. A light which was moving over one of the tanks attracted my attention (I took it for a star before it began motion). After a short while it grew much larger and what was more surprising it was darting about extremely fast in a most erratic manner over the oil storage tanks and the river. The most striking thing about it was

its motion which was in a very slippery fluid motion like ~~quicksilver~~ quicksilver darting about erratically, the colour also was like quicksilver. I watched this thing dart about over the river and tank farm for about an hour before I grew tired and went to sleep. I woke up a couple of hours later and went to see if anything was still visible but could not see anything. I could not think of anything that would account for what it was; but that was not the end of it. About a week later (about the 8th or 9th of August) the conditions were almost the same, it was a humid, uncomfortable night once again and I again got up in the night and eventually went and glanced out the window and what did I notice, to my astonishment, but another strange object. What it appeared to be was a luminous bluish-white sphere which appeared to be about the size of a basketball. It was hanging over one of the oil tanks, occasionally it would dart about short distances always returning to its same position. It would dart over and slide along the nearby power lines then return to hang over this one oil tank. I watched this ~~thing~~ amazed, for about 2 hours until it got light when it became no longer visible ~~when~~ when dawn came. The first object I saw a week before appeared

to be solid, but the second object a week later was a luminous sphere which was transparent as I could see the telephone and power lines through it. It was the strangest thing I've ever seen. I've not seen anything odd since, but I'd sure be glad if you might be able to tell me what you think it probably was I saw. I know I'm not a good writer and I apologize if this seems confused. Thanks for your attention.



On the above noted date BUTCHER was on her way back from Calgary to Lethbridge, Alberta. While BUTCHER was driving on Hwy 23 approx. 15 miles north of Vulcan she observed a white light following behind her: Copy of BUTCHER's statement attached. BUTCHER did not stop her vehicle and continued until she arrived at Vulcan. At this time she contacted Cst. J.A. HENDRY on main street in Vulcan. A statement was obtained and then a patrol was made north of Vulcan on Hwy 23 where BUTCHER claimed she saw the U.F.O.s. At this time no other vehicles were seen on the Hwy. The sky was clear and no other objects were seen at this time. BUTCHER continued on her way back to Lethbridge without further incident.

It is not known the reliability of BUTCHER. She was by herself at the time of the sighting. Due to the time of the sighting there was very little traffic on Hwy 23. There were no other reports of U.F.O. sightings on this date in the Vulcan area.

On October 4th, 1981 I left Calgary about 2:00 am - I turned at High River + came down on Hwy 23. I was on my way to Lethbridge.

It was too hard to tell how far away they were but they did not get any closer.

To compare the lights to ~~the~~ car headlights I would say they would have been approx 1 km behind me.

About 7 or 8 minutes ~~before~~ before I came into town I saw 6 white lights, 1 yellow light & 1 red light altogether.

Just before I turned into town the lights seemed to disappear.

I then turned into Vulcan & found a phone & phoned Lethbridge R.C.M.P.

1. On this date Cst. D. GORMLEY received a call from Thompson Telecoms who advised that one Albert PUNCH of Garden Hill, Island Lake had reported the sighting of an Unidentified Flying Object. Cst. GORMLEY contacted PUNCH immediately at which time PUNCH briefly related the details of the sighting. PUNCH was advised by Cst. GORMLEY that the writer, Cst. C.R. COCHRANE was scheduled for an inland patrol 81-10-22/26 and would investigate the incident at that time. Telex 81-113 was forwarded on the incident as per Operational Manual I.3.E. 22.a,

2. On this date a statement was obtained from Albert PUNCH which is attached as APPENDIX "A". In his statement PUNCH advises that he observed the object at approximately 20:45 hours. The weather was clear and calm at the time and it was dark. PUNCH had taken his wife and young children out cutting wood and were just coming home travelling south approximately 7 miles North of Garden Hill. The object was coming from the North at a high rate of speed. PUNCH stopped his outboard motor to determine if the object had any sound which it did not. PUNCH restarted the motor at which time the object began coming towards them.

PUNCH advised that the object came within a few hundred yards from the boat and the outboard motor stopped completely. The object lowered to approximately four to five feet from the surface of the water and it was at that time that electric arcs jumped from between the water and the object. The object then

moved up again and rapidly moved back and forth in the sky.

PUNCH describes the object as being at least 200 feet in diameter. The object had bright lights around it somewhat similar to that of an arc welder flash. There was also a blue flashing light on top of the cone shaped object. The bottom of the object was convex rather than flat. There was also no detectable noise from the object.




Saw some unusual looking aircraft last

2. The time of the sighting was 1510 hrs., 81-11-03. Peter SPEIGHT was the only person who sighted the object. He described it as a round silver disc, dull in appearance with no lights or vapour trail. It was spotted out of the West proceeding in an easterly direction. The subject estimated that it took the object approximately ten seconds to cross the horizon. It had an altitude of approximately one and one-half miles over Lake Ontario. The subject stated the sun was not obstructing his vision. The sky was clear at the time.

3. Ray FERGUSON, Watch Supervisor at the Toronto International Airport, stated nothing unusual was reported on the date in question. He indicated, however, that aircraft landing in Malton on that afternoon were approaching over Lake Ontario.

I refer to your letter dated June 19th, 1962, concerning a reporting made by our Alberta Division to CANAIRHED.

2. This reporting concerned the sighting of a fireball or meteor in Alberta and was reported to CANAIRHED in accordance with our present instructions.

3. * * * Earlier this year this Force agreed to assist the National Research Council, Associate Committee on Meteorites through Mr. J.C. ARNELL, Scientific Adviser to the Chief of Air Staff, for reporting of fireball sightings by members of this Force in the field.

4. As certain misunderstandings arose as to the proper reporting of information under this heading and those under the Reporting of Fireballs or Meteors - both instructions concern unidentified flying objects - the matter was again referred to the Scientific Adviser for the Chief of Air Staff on file 004-74/57 (CAS/SA). In order to provide consistency and have a clearing house for all reports, it was arranged whereby an information copy of all messages for fireball reportings would be sent to CANAIRHED OPS.

Reporting of Vital Intelligence Sightings

- 1 As discussed, Supt. E. Porter, TIC "K" Division C.I.D., Edmonton, has addressed correspondence to Commanding Officer CANAIRFD. Presumably, this is the address recorded in his instructions for forwarding reports on either vital intelligence sightings or on sightings of unidentified flying objects.
- 2 Approximately two years ago, AFHQ delegated responsibility for collation and investigation of reports of UFOs to the AOC, Air Defence Command. Delegation with respect to UFO reports was compatible with the reporting of vital intelligence under the provisions of a Canada/United States agreed reporting system. This system, JAFAP 1/6(D) - Communications Instructions for Reporting Vital Intelligence Sightings (CARVIS/MERINT), has been adopted by DUT, all Canadian Services and, I believe, your Department. Instructions have been promulgated to all concerned outlining the procedures to be used in reporting as expeditiously as possible to the AOC, Air Defence Command any matter which may be of intelligence value. Reports can be sent by mail, by wire or by telephone on a collect basis. The mailing address is AOC, Air Defence Command, RCAF Station St Hubert, P.Q.
- 3 You may wish to review your instructions to your field units and, for reports of this nature, revise the address to that stated in the above paragraph.

1. On the 18-3-61, while sealing on Coronation Gulf at Lat. 67°58' and Long. 114°55' observed an object descending to earth in a southeast direction at approximately 2000 Z.. The object disappeared behind one of the Couper Islands, followed by two explosions a few seconds apart. The contrail remained for some time but the smoke trail disappeared shortly after. _____ was hunting in the same area as corroborated his report.

2. _____ who was travelling on sea ice at a position, 67°46' Lat. and 114°20' Long. reported hearing a single explosion at approximately the same time. He observed the contrail and the smoke trail after hearing the explosion, but did not see the object. The smoke trail indicated that the object struck on the mainland southeast of him.

3. _____ who was near the ASIAX RIVER at approximately Lat. 67°20' and Long. 114°05' reported hearing the explosion which he said came from practically due north from where he was. He did not see the object only the contrail and smoke trail.

4. _____ who was near the mouth of the EUGARYUAK RIVER at approximately Lat. 67°42' and Long. 113°18' reported hearing the explosion practically due west. He seen the object and described it as being shiny and oblong. When the object got closer to the earth it burst into flame.

5. Mrs. _____ a resident of Coppermine, reported seeing the object from the settlement. Her description of the object was identical to that of _____ and _____.

6. Taking the various positions that the object was seen and heard from, would indicate that it struck at a point approximately 67°35' Lat. and 114°10' Long.. A search was made in this area by dog team with negative results. There was a light snow fall and a ground drift in this area on the 19-3-61 which would obscure any evidence to show where it struck.

7. The Department of Transport Radio Station acting local Ground Observer Corps were notified of this object on the 19-3-61.

8. This file will be considered as shown hereunder, subject to be reopened should any further information come to light.

1. Reference the above, this will advise that at approx. 5.00 PM of the 19-4-58, a telephone call was received from Mrs. [redacted], Lower Ohio, Shel. Co., N.S. to the effect that she was in possession of some aluminum or tin foil which she had found in the woods.

2. She stated that she had found same clinging to the top of a tree located in back of her home. It was seen shining very brightly in the sun's rays and was taken down on the same day, that being the 30-3-58.

3. Patrol was made to Mrs. [redacted] home where she showed the writer numerous strips of aluminum or tin foil. They were all approx. 2' in length and 1/2" wide. She also stated that more of same had been sighted approx. 1/2 mile back in the woods from her home. The area in which these strips were found is quite densely wooded.

4. The reason Mrs. [redacted] called this office was due to an article appearing in the Halifax Mail Star of the 17-4-58 which stated this type of foil had been found in the Province of Quebec and was being investigated by the RCMP at that point for the possibility that it may have come from "Sputnik" or some other airborne aeronautical device.

5. At approx. 4.30 pm of the 21st inst. [redacted] of Shelburne, N.S. called in at this office and produced two large sheets of transparent plastic, similar to that used for plastic storm windows. One sheet was approx. 10' long X 6' wide - the larger one was approx. 20' long and 5' wide. [redacted] stated that he lived on the outskirts of town on the shore of Shelburne Harbour. At approx. 10.15 AM of the 20th inst. his wife had been out in the yard when she observed a large object drifting down from the sky in a south-westerly direction. It landed in the water approx. 20' from shore. She went over at once and found the larger sheet of plastic in a tree top near his driveway. These sheets of plastic have been examined and no identifying marks found. [redacted] felt these sheets of plastic may have originated from an airborne balloon of some kind.

6. It is not known what further action, if any, should be taken by this office to determine origin of unidentified object. May this detachment be further advised, please.

Embodied hereunder is the contents of report submitted by our Grande Prairie Detachment relative to an unidentified flying object reported in the Teepee Creek district of Alberta.

" 11 May 62

1. This date [redacted] of the Teepee Creek Dist. Alta., reported to this office and stated that at approx. 3:00 PM on 9 MAY 62 his hired hands, [redacted] & [redacted] saw a flying object, while working in a field on the Hollingsworth farm. [redacted] further stated that on the 10 May 62 he searched the area they believe this object landed in with no success. [redacted] was assisted in this search by his hired men.

31 May 62

2. A patrol was made to the [redacted] farm and further interviewing was continued. The sighting of this flying object took place on N.W. 1/4-8-74-4-W.6th. The sky condition at the time of the sighting was clear. The object was described as: oblong, about 18-24" long, black in colour, made a sound like a jet plane that is along distance away and had no colour trail. No bursts were heard along the path of this object and no sound heard when it landed or was believed to have landed a short distance from where [redacted] and [redacted] were working. At the time of the sighting the object was about 50-100 ft. above the ground and coming toward the ground at a very steep angle.

3. The flying object is believed to have landed in a very bushy area and approx. where the object landed is a slough approx. 3 acres in size and about 18" deep. It is felt that any attempt to search this slough would meet with negative results. This slough is expected to dry up by about the end of August. Should a search of this area be required a search about the 20-30 Aug. 62 would be far more effective than at this time. "

Should you require any further data in regard to this matter, would you please advise.

Dear Supt. Cooper:

Since our last telephone conversation, I have reviewed your instructions covering the sighting of meteors or fireballs and have also discussed the subject with CDR. Willson, Deputy Director of Naval Intelligence.

CDR Willson agrees with me that most sightings of fireballs are recognizable as such and are unlikely to be considered unidentified flying objects. Therefore there would be little confusion between the two types of sightings. Because of this, arrangements are being made for a Naval order to be issued in essentially the same language as the original Air Force order, of which you have a copy. This Naval order is going to direct that copies of all messages be sent to CANAIRHED OPS, in addition to the Associate Committee representatives.

In order to provide consistency and to have a central clearing house for all reports, would you please arrange to have your Instruction CO-Air 20 amended to include that an information copy of all messages be sent to CANAIRHED OPS.

The present system will therefore be retained and all reports will be directed to this Headquarters.

CO-OPERATION WITH ARMED SERVICES

(AIR FORCE)

1. SIGHTINGS OF METEORS OR FIREBALLS - The RCAF have requested our assistance on reporting sightings of very bright meteors or fireballs, and is launching a country-wide publicity effort to bring this to the attention of the Canadian public.

2. A fireball is a bright meteor with a luminosity which equals or exceeds that of the brightest planets. It is usually seen moving rapidly across the sky and sometimes a trail of glowing particles is left behind. The meteor may explode with a burst of light and a loud sound, that may happen several times during a single fall.

3. When a sufficient number of fireball observations are obtained over an area of 100 miles or more, it is possible to combine the observations and predict the most probable area in which meteorites associated with the fireball may have reached the surface of the earth. Since freshly fallen meteorites are of considerably more interest than old falls, sightings should be reported as soon as possible.

4. When sightings occur, the Detachment concerned is to provide Sub-Division Headquarters with the following information by the most direct manner:

- (a) date and time of sighting;
- (b) condition of sky (clear, cloudy, haze, etc.);
- (c) location of observer (either precise position on ground or geographical reference);
- (d) occurrence of bursts (number and approximate positions along path);
- (e) luminosity (brightness compared to planets or moon and occurrence of shadows cast by nearby objects, if any);
- (f) colour (distinguish between colour of fireball and any persistent train or trail after passage of fireball);
- (g) form (size in relation to moon and shape);
- (h) duration (both of fireball in motion and persistent train or trail in the sky);

4. (i) sounds (description of sound and time interval between sighting the fireball and hearing the sounds);
(j) position in sky (positions of beginning and end of fireball path, both azimuthal and elevation);
(k) any other unusual observations.

Dear Mr. Kassen:

I refer to your most recent letter, dated 30 March 1962, on the subject of unidentified flying objects.

Your statement that USAF Regulation 200-2 permits only the release of salvaged unidentified flying object reports to the press is not entirely accurate. This restriction applies to base commanders only, for the reason that final investigation and co-ordination of reported incidents is accomplished by higher headquarters. In any case, this USAF Regulation is not applicable to the Canadian forces, our policy being as set forth in my previous letters on this subject, and amplified hereunder.

I gather that your desire is that all reports of unidentified flying objects held by the RCAF or Department of National Defence be made available to the press, for further investigation. I must make it quite clear that this Department has neither the authority nor desire to prevent the press from investigating any incident of this sort that come to their attention. However, since all incidents that have come to the attention of this Department have been thoroughly investigated, and since these investigations have produced no evidence of any activities that would justify "national" as opposed to normal military vigilance, no useful purpose would be served by making these investigation reports public. Furthermore, many of the reports gathered in these investigations were given by the witnesses concerned on the understanding that they would be treated as "strictly confidential". It is therefore not possible for us to release these reports, even if it were desirable to do so.

1. Reference is made to your S940-105 Vol. 4 (CAS) dated 27 March 62 in which you suggested a reply to Mr. Kaasen's letter of 12 March. Attached is a copy of Mr. Kaasen's reply to our letter of 28 March (your suggested letter).
2. Your advice as to what we should say in reply to Mr. Kaasen's third paragraph would be appreciated. If we say merely that military security demands that we withhold information concerning certain unidentified flying objects, he will, of course, assume that we are withholding information concerning a great many sightings. If the facts would permit us to do so, it would be desirable to say that we have had no reports of sightings which, after investigation, would lead us to believe that the objects belonged to a foreign power, terrestrial or otherwise.
3. Throughout his correspondence Mr. Kaasen has assumed that the R.C.A.F. follows U.S.A.F. regulations, or similar regulations, with respect to release of information concerning unidentified flying objects. It would be appreciated if you would let me know whether this is the case.

Dear Mr. Kaasen,

I refer to your letter of 12 March 1962, concerning an apparent contradiction in our correspondence concerning unidentified flying objects. The apparent contradiction seems to have arisen from the interpretation of the term, "unidentified flying objects." If this term is used to mean artificial objects which are directed by an intelligence other than human, and of extra-terrestrial origin, then we can state that there is no evidence of the existence of such objects and that if any evidence became available, it would not be withheld from the Canadian public.

However, the term, "unidentified flying objects," may be used to cover aircraft or space vehicles of a foreign power. Clearly, in certain cases, prudence and the requirements of military security might demand that particular information be withheld until a complete investigation could be made.

I can assure you that there is no department of the government that desires or has instructions to withhold information on objects that might be of extra-terrestrial origin. None of the available reports on unidentified flying objects could be interpreted as providing evidence of objects which are not natural phenomena or man-made. Nevertheless, we are most interested in receiving and investigating reports of this nature, both from the aspect of what they might yield scientifically and from the standpoint of any threat that might be posed to national security.

I am a member in the "National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena" (NICAP) of Washington D.C. I wonder if you can give me some information on Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) over Alberta. As you know, UFOs have been sighted all over the U.S. & Canada since 1947, by people on the street, and reputable observers. I hope you can answer some questions:

- (1) Are you (RCAF Edmonton base) under order of JANAP 146 (d)?
- (2) How many UFOs have been sighted over Edmonton (and all Alberta if you know) since 1957?
- (3) Has a RCAF jet ever pursued a UFO over the Edmonton area?
- (4) Do you know of any case of an Alberta Airlines pilot sighting a UFO on a flight?
- (5) To your knowledge, do you know of any case of a UFO landing in Alberta?
- (6) To your knowledge, has there been any sightings of "green fireballs" over Alberta?

If you cannot answer my questions, I will know that you either have not got this information, or that you are under order of JANAP 146 (d). I'm sure you know about JANAP 146 (d), JANAP 146 (d); binding on armed forces, the CAA, Coast Guard and other agencies of the U.S. & Canada, orders (Regulation 200-2) AF personnel not to reveal unsolved UFO sightings. I'm sure JANAP 146 (d) covers Alberta too... but I may be wrong.

The National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (NICAP), was set up to evaluate and publish authentic UFO reports: Visual, radar and photographic evidence from armed forces and airlines pilots, rocket trackers, airport tower operators, astronomers, engineers and many other reputable observers here and abroad. Except for a few confidential NICAP reports, the USAF also has this factual evidence.

Statements from the RCAF concerning UFOs completely contradict your stand on UFOs. In a letter of reply to me, June 23, 1960, from Group Captain for Chief of the Air Staff, the Group Captain stated that UFO evaluations are not made public. This contradicts your statement that UFO reports are not kept from the general public.

The RCAF has also admitted to me, although most UFO reports can indeed be attributed to natural phenomena and man-made objects, that a small percent of sightings may be objects under intelligent control. JANAP I46 has been implemented by the RCAF. JANAP I46 provides for rapid secret transmission of UFO reports by aircraft in CIRVIS reports. The public is not aware of such orders as JANAP I46 and CIRVIS reports.

It is unfortunate that the Canadian people are not aware of the secrecy imposed on UFO reports.

Unidentified Flying Objects

In reply to your letter of Oct. 24, 1961 acknowledging my inquiry concerning UFOs. I am a member in the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (NICAP), located in Washington, D.C. NICAP is a non-profit, fact-finding organization. Policy is established by the Board Of Governors and carried out by the executive staff, with the help of the Panel of Special Advisers, Affiliates, and investigative Subcommittees (Canadian NICAP Subcommittees are in Calgary and Winnipeg).

The purpose of NICAP is to investigate UFOs, and claims, relative to UFO activity and to offset official secrecy. Two major goals are open Congressional hearings to end secrecy imposed on the UFO subject, and scientific investigation of UFOs.

Your statement that UFO reports are not kept from the press and general public is misleading. In the U.S. unsolved UFO reports are marked "For Official Use Only". USAF Regulation 200-2 orders Air Force personnel not to reveal unsolved UFO reports. UFO reports in Canada are classified just as they are in the U.S. and Great Britain.

You also stated that UFO reports are not necessarily offered to the press in every case, but if requested they are never denied. The reports that are given to the press can be explained either as natural phenomena or mistaken identity. The reports that cannot be explained; from military and airline pilots, radar observers, trained personnel and competent people in all walks of life, are classified and never become public knowledge. If UFOs are nothing more than natural phenomena and mistaken identity, why not open all the files on UFOs and let the press investigate all reports for itself? This will not be done.

On Dec. 24, 1959, acting USAF Inspector General Major General Richard E. O'Keefe issued a publication to all Air Force Commands warning that UFOs are serious Air Force business.

... Admiral W. Hillenkoetter (former
... of Governors revealed this Air Force directive
... American press. The directive states that our concern
with UFOs is three fold;

"First of all," the directive states, "is the object a threat
to the defense of the United States? Secondly, does it contribute
to technical or scientific knowledge? Thirdly, there is the question
of how to explain the sightings to the public."

Official Air Force publications warn that UFOs are a matter
of serious business. Vice President Lyndon Johnson has expressed
his concern regarding UFOs. When the Vice President was in the
U.S. Senate, he instructed a military subcommittee to report UFO
sightings to him personally. In early 1960 NICAP sent the Vice
President, who was then a Senator, a digest of documented evidence
on UFOs. The Vice President replied to the director of NICAP,
Major Donald E. Keyhoe, admitting his concern for UFOs. He told
the NICAP director that the Senate Preparedness Investigating
Subcommittee is investigating the Air Force investigations of UFOs.
Senator Johnson told NICAP that he was not at all satisfied with
the Air Force investigations of UFOs.

I trust that the Canadian Defence Department is concerned
with UFOs. UFOs are a threat to the North American continent and
should be recognized as serious business. By putting UFO facts
on public record, America and Canada could offset any claim by
the Soviet Union that UFOs are Russian aircraft. The Soviet Union
could also make propaganda by charging that the West is keeping
UFO information from the people. Making UFO information public
would offset such propaganda that could be damaging.

I hope sir, that you and the Defence Department recognize
the importance of the UFO situation.

Unidentified Flying Objects

1 It is suggested that the questions regarding unidentified flying objects posed in a letter to the Minister of National Defence be answered as follows:

Question 1. Are unsolved UFO reports in Canada kept from the Press and general public?

Answer: No. While reports are not necessarily offered to the Press in every case, they are never denied.

Question 2. Does the Defence Department share American concern that UFOs pose a possible threat?

Answer: The Canadian Government is concerned with any report which might affect national security and, undoubtedly, this would be the attitude of the United States Government also. However, to date, UFO reports which have been investigated by various departments of the Canadian Government have not revealed positive evidence of anything which might affect national welfare and which could not be attributed to possibly natural phenomena or mistaken identity.

Question 3. What is the official RCAF stand on UFOs?

Answer: The RCAF position is one of complete open-mindedness. Each reported incident is investigated to the extent that circumstances, such as the apparent reliability and competence of the observer of the incident, seem to warrant.

Your letter of July 18th 1961 to the RCAF Headquarters at Ottawa was forwarded to Air Defence Command for our comment. Unfortunately we have very little information for you.

Various aerial phenomena occur daily over North America which to the untrained observer appear strange. For example, light reflection off high flying aircraft, navigation lights, aircraft anti-collision lights, satellites, weather balloons, meteorites, vapour trails; all of these visual things under certain circumstances could give the observer a false impression.

The event mentioned in your paragraph 2 cannot be confirmed or denied. However the writer recalls something of that nature in the Galt, Ontario area. It was reported by a very young boy and may have been written up in the Galt newspaper.

You may find this story on the funny side, but I'm sure this should be taken under consideration.

As my profession is Insurance Agent, I went out the other night to insure my wife's cousin in the country called St Boniface located about five miles outside of Shawinigan limits. After I arrived, talking about the usual conversation, weather, my wife's uncle came up on a subject that I have found worth of mentioning to you people. It just happened that what my wife's uncle saw would be classified by me as an unidentified flying object. Since I have been in the air force before and know quite a bit about flying objects such as Aircraft or weather balloons. The thing he saw, he and his wife, appeared in the western sky about 7:50p.m. on the night of Monday the 28 of February and lasted till around 8:30p.m. the same night.

The object was very bright and of a gold color and as described by my wife's uncle and her wife I have made a schema of it as it appears to look like to them. Here it is:

Letters from Mr. Ben Kason

1 This RI has been forwarded copies of letters dated 21 Apr 60, 23 Oct 60 and 2 Jan 61 to various components of the RCAF from a Mr. Ben Kason of Vancouver, B.C. who is apparently an ordinary member of the "National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena". His letters made various delusional remarks about military reporting of aerial phenomena and some remarks that were quite confused.

2 Because this RI acts as RI/Int ADG RI and receives all UFO reports within the RCAF he wishes to point out that many reports terminate here every year and that none have ever been proven to concern unusual phenomena. The RCAF has never undertaken any but primary investigations of these reports. Most of them are, as Mr. Kason states, balloons, flashing navigation lights and meteorites which have entered the earth's atmosphere rather spectacularly.

3 Mr. Kason should be informed that most UFO reports terminating here are unclassified. There is no reason to suspect that information on this subject is being withheld from the public. Such phenomena pose no threat to the safety of North America in so far as is known by this RI.

4 It would be appreciated if Stn Coteau would reply to Mr. Kason's letter dated 2 Jan 61 in light of these remarks and information already at hand.
