15-8-71:

1. At approximately 4.00P.M., this date, Mr. [redacted], Margaree Harbour, Inv. Co., N.S., approached the writer stating that while travelling towards Inverness, on highway 19, in the area known as Strathlorne, he observed a ball of fire in the sky over the Cape Mabou district. He stated that when he made this observation, [redacted] of Inverness had also seen this object.

2. The aforementioned Cape Mabou area, is a densely forested highland region, having an approximate above sea level elevation of 1000 feet at it's highest point, gradually sloping over a distance of 1½ miles to an approximate above sea level elevation of 150 feet, at the side of highway # 19. This area is inaccessible except for the MacIsaac Rd., which leads in the woods for a distance of about ¼ mile and there runs into a dead end, therefore, a foot search of the area was not conducted since it was felt by the parties concerned that this object had fallen much deeper in the wooded area.

3. Since Mr. [redacted] was in a hurry at this particular time he was advised that he would be contacted in the near future regarding this incident.

4. Mr. [redacted], Mr. [redacted], Mr. [redacted] and Cst. F.J. HICKEY, all of whom live in the Strathlorne area were contacted and interviewed with negative results.

5. [redacted] was then contacted by Cst. J.G. KELLY and myself at which time the following statement was obtained:

..... FIRE IN THE SKY. The sky was quite heavily overcast and it was raining at the time. I pulled my vehicle to the side of the road in behind another vehicle and the gentleman asked if I had seen it and what I thought it was. I told him I didn't think it could be anything except a plane. I did not hear any noise from this object as I was not out of the car. This object was very bright; it was much brighter than the moon. It was red and then it became a glaring light and then got bigger and was round-shaped. It then burst and then all we saw was smoke. From the first time I saw it until it burst approximately two minutes passed by. This object appeared to be approx. 1000 feet above the trees and was not travelling in an arc but on a horizontal plane and it did not appear to travel very far before it exploded.

6. [REDACTED] stated he made no observations as the object exploded as he was no longer concerned or interested in it. He stated he then returned home and awaited our arrival.

7. [REDACTED] is a United Church [REDACTED] who has lived in this area for several years, having been transferred here from Quebec. He appears to be quite intelligent and there is no doubt as to his sighting the fireball, however, the circumstances under which he viewed it may be quite different from those which actually occurred, since he gave the impression of being quite apathetic to the incident and it is therefore felt that his observations may have been somewhat haphazard due to his apparent disinterest.

..... WERE DRIVING TOWARDS Inverness from Truro on highway #19 and when we were in the vicinity of Hugh MacLEAN's garage I saw a ball of fire in the sky off to our left. It was a couple of miles away and a couple of miles high. This ball of fire was as bright as the sun and approximately the same size. We observed this thing for a few minutes. The object never stopped but dropped towards the earth in a straight line. While the ball of fire was present there was smoke all around it and all of a sudden the fire disappeared and then I saw a black object which turned grey and then white and fell to the ground. It did not drop in a straight line then but appeared to waver sideways as it fell. It might not have been two miles away. It was between the road and the mountain.

10. Mr. [REDACTED] who was present at this time, declined to comment, saying that his observations were the same as his wife's and he could not elaborate on the incident.

11. Mr. [REDACTED] is a [REDACTED] in the town of Inverness and a very upstanding citizen of the community. He and his wife appear to be very sensible and mature persons who were very interested in the phenomenon which they witnessed. Neither appears to be highly excitable and the writer considers Mrs. [REDACTED] version of the happenings to be a more accurate description of the occurrence.

12. Mr. [REDACTED] was unable to be contacted as he left the area shortly after this incident to vacation in Boston, Massachusetts, U.S.A. and is not expected to return to the area until the second week of September. It is felt that any information supplied by him would be very similar to that already obtained from Mrs. [REDACTED] and would add very little to the investigation.


1. Mr. **[REDACTED]**, Miller Mtrs. Edmn., Alta., advised that he had been told of strange hole in the ground. It had been found near a farm yard on 7 July 71, three weeks after the daughters of **[REDACTED]** had been startled by a light and explosion. The data was recorded and brought to the attention of Ponoka Detachment. From the information received and the one the member investigated, the following is recorded as per existing instructions.

- (a) Experienced last portion of June, believed weekend of 19/20 June, 71. Understood to be at night, time not given.
- (b) Sky condition not given, but incident was first attributed to thunder and lightning.
- (c) Observer was in bedroom with two younger sisters.
- (d) Flash of light and explosion, but descent not witnessed.
- (e) Luminosity was not measured except that house was lit up.
- (f) Color not stated.
- (g) Form not stated. (descent not witnessed nor claimed)
- (h) Duration not stated.
- (i) Sound as of explosion but relation to light not reported.
- (j) Position not given. Hole in ground is at an angle.
- (k) 25 foot hole, 8 inches across found 200 feet from farm house. Hole is not burnt, no mud or dirt in area. Large trees in area of this pasture. One branch above hole broken off cleanly, again not burnt. Gieger Counter tests of various soil levels reported negative by farmer, **[REDACTED]**.

2. Matter made known to the office of Prof. R.E. FOLINSBEE, University of Alberta. The incident could not be attributed to any recorded sighting. Major OWEN, Office of the Commanding Officer Canadian Forces Base, Edmonton, Alta., was advised in the event any object had been dropped from a passing aircraft. He was aware of a similar incident near Victoria B.C. within the last three years. Dr. BAYROCK, Meteorite Division, Alta. Research Council, Edmn., Alta., could not offer an explanation, but may wish to take a digging team to the site of the unusual hole.

1. On 12 JUL 71 [redacted], Hotel Harricana, Joutel, Que. D.O.B. 2 FEB 28, Occ: [redacted] (Cage Tender), reported in person at this office an unusual incident believed by [redacted] to be or having been caused by a U.F.O.

2. [redacted] reports the incident as follows: On the above date when parked on the road to Joutel, Que. near a bridge he noticed in the Harricana River approx. 1000 feet south of the bridge an unusual water phenomenon. The phenomenon consisted of a circle 15-20 feet in diameter with bubbles coming from around the circumference and from the center of same a jet of water reaching a height of approx. 20 feet. When the water jet had settled he noticed in its place an object cylindrical in shape, 6-8 feet in length, rusty black in color. After a short period of time the object leaned to one side and very slowly took on a horizontal position and then sunk. The depth of the river at this location is approx. 20 feet.

3. In accordance with CO-Air the following is submitted in the indicated sequence:

- (a) 8 JUL 71 1:15 - 1:30 p.m. D.L.S.T.
- (b) Cloudy, light rain
- (c) Identified in para. 1, no special qualifications.
- (d) 1000 feet from sighting on the road from Joutel near the bridge over the Harricana River.
- (e) No other person.
- (f) Para. 2 above.
- (g) Duration of observation 30 secs.
- (h) No other relevant information.





1. On this date at approximately 10:15PM this office received a call from [REDACTED] of Rollo Bay. Mr. [REDACTED] said that he had seen a red light in the sky and was not quite sure what it was and thought that he should report this to the police.

2. I went to [REDACTED] home in Rollo Bay where I learned that while on his way home that evening around 9:50PM he was travelling east on Highway #2 in the Fortune area when he saw a red light in the sky. He kept on driving and when he went into a dip in the road he lost the sight for a short time, however when he regained his previous elevation he once again saw the light. He parked on the road for awhile and watched the light. At that time it appeared to have landed on the ground and was not moving. He then called this Detachment and reported what he had seen. It should be noted that at the time of the sighting a snow storm was building strength. I went to the spot where [REDACTED] had parked his car however, we could not see the object as visibility was poor. We then made a thorough search of the fields in which [REDACTED] believed the object to have been however our search was negative. I then returned to the detachment where a radiogram in accordance with C.S.O.'s and Operational Manual, CO-air paragraph 6 and 7, was complied with and was sent to Canadian Forces Headquarters the Commissioner and the N.R.C. Meteor Centre.

26 MAR 71

3. On this date I returned to the area of the sighting at approximately 3:00PM however, could not locate the object described by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is an outstanding citizen of the community and does not drink. Persons in the area have a very high regard for him as he is a man of his word as they call him. I then again returned to the area at approximately 8:00PM where I could see the red light described to me by [REDACTED]. At this time I was able to make a positive identification that the red light believed to be a U.F.O. by [REDACTED] is the red light belonging to a new radio tower which has been installed at Bear River, P.E.I. This tower has only received electrical power on 25 MAR 71 and therefore this would be the first night that the red light was showing. In view of this information this file is being shown as hereunder.

At 9:00 PM this date ██████████ advised this office that he believed he just saw an aircraft explode in the air. ██████████ stated that he was watching a red and blue light in the sky and then suddenly an orange flame could be seen at the rear of the object and then a large burst of white sparks resembling an explosion. ██████████ saw the burst of white sparks at a point believed to be approx. 10 miles N.E. of Mazenod,

2. Cst. D. Ryan and Cst. G. Madsen of Assiniboia, Sask. were on duty in the Congress Dist., Sask. at this time, and they proceeded to ██████████ residence for further details. Assiniboia members made further enquiries and searched the general area, which met with negative results. ██████████ of Mazenod, Sask., owner of a light aircraft, was contacted and he agreed to fly over the area of the proposed incident. ██████████ flew over the area north and east of Mazenod, which also met with negative results.

3. The Canadian Forces Base in Moose Jaw, Sask. as well as the Swift Current, Sask. and Regina, Sask. airports were contacted, and it was learned that there were no planes reported missing and no known aircraft flying in this area. The Regina airport in turn contacted D.O.T. officials in Winnipeg, Man. and advised them of the foregoing. I hurried and got our binoculars and then went outside and stood on our back step. I looked at this object through the binoculars. The red and blue lights were the only things that were visible, and I was unable to make out the shape of the

SHAPE OF THE....object. The red light appeared to be on the rear of the object and the blue light on the front. Suddenly I saw an orange flame at the rear of this object which was similar to a rocket blast, and then I saw a large burst of white sparks. Then there was nothing. I thought the object exploded. Approx. 2 or 3 minutes elapsed from the time I first saw the lights until they disappeared. It appeared that the object was approx. 10 miles north and slightly east of our farm when it exploded.

I then contacted [REDACTED] a friend of mine, and told him what I saw. [REDACTED] suggested that we advise the police, so we did. ENDS.

5. [REDACTED] appeared very definite on the facts, and there was nothing to suggest anything to the contrary. This incident was also discussed with [REDACTED] parents, and they are convinced their son saw the object in the air.

6. This same A.M. members of this Detachment and members of Gravelbourg Detachment canvassed the area north and east of Mazenod to ascertain if anyone else saw or heard the object. No further information came to light. Members strongly considered the possibility of a downed aircraft.

7. A Telex message MBI was dispatched to the NRC Meteor Centre, Att: Canforcehed. The Commissioner, "F" Div., and Swift Current Sub/Div. were also advised

8. To date no further information in this regard has come to light. It is believed very possible that this incident could be attributed to a U.S. aircraft or some other unreported flight. It appears very doubtful that an aircraft exploded in the air. Also there is nothing to suggest that this object falls in the category of something from outer space. The object does, however, remain to be unidentified. Should additional information come to light the appropriate action will be taken.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both ran out of the house and looked at the object verifying Milton's description as to it being saucer shaped, color unknown, approximately the size of two cars, flying approximately 5' to 10' above the treetops. It apparently remained stationary for approximately two minutes then left in a westerly direction at approximately 15 mph. All three subjects stated they knew and had seen a helicopter on previous occasions and maintained that this object was definitely a U.F.O. and not a helicopter. 1. Mr. [redacted] of Wardlow, Alberta contacted this office to advise that he and his wife sighted what they thought to be an unidentified flying object. The sighting occurred at approx. 5:25 A.M. 17 FEB 71. Mrs. [redacted] was up feeding her daughter when the lights started to flicker off and on. She then looked out the window and saw the object. It is described as a large round object, dual orange in colour with a line around same approx. $\frac{2}{3}$ way down from the top. The object appeared to be approx. 400 feet from the ground. She got her husband out of bed and they both observed same for approx. 15 minutes and then went to bed. When they got up at approx. 6:30 A.M., the object was gone.

On Saturday morning, 9 JAN 71, I left home at about twenty-five to eight and travelled to the Success Compressor Station - Saskatchewan Power. Just past Cantuar I observed an object ahead of me to the left. It was quite a ways ahead of me. It was five hundred to a thousand feet high. It was travelling towards the town of Success. It had white light, dull like you get through a light shade. It was long and narrow. My impression was that it was about eighteen inches wide and quite long. It appeared to be flat surfaced. It went all the way to Success in this form and I turned on the turn off to the Compressor Station. I could see the object go over Success and then it turned and headed towards Caswell's farm, about two miles down the road I was travelling on. It was now in a different form - it appeared to be a round disc laying horizontally with a second smaller disc under it. The discs were of a yellow light. This was easy to see, however, it was not a blinging light.

As I approached Caswell's farm, the object met me there. It changed to a deep wall of mixed colours, the shape was irregular, with the lights moving vertically, the sight simikiar to that in northern lights. It was over Caswell's yard and faded out over the trees. When I got past Caswell's yard, I saw it again in the shape it came across the field from Success. It was about a quarter of a mile ahead of me on the right, about one hundred feet off the ground, or lower, and it illuminated the ground a bit. I went to the turn off and it veered to the right, going around the edge of the Compressor Station Sight. Near the north east corner of the Station Sight it changed to a red ball, similiar to a red sunset, with a line across the bottom. The colour appeared to move.

I drove into the yard. I shut the engine off and left the lights on. This red object stopped in front of the car between the tanks and trees. I went into the building and told [REDACTED] who was working. [REDACTED] came out and looked at it. We called [REDACTED] the maintenance man, and I later told him to go to the window and look. To me the object appeared to stay between the tanks and trees. It stayed there about fifteen minutes. It disappeared into the distance - it just faded out. It seemed to retain the same ball shape and colour. The size was bigger than the sun.

When the object was ahead of me on # 32 highway I switched my lights off and on. The object here must have been travelling at one hundred miles per hour or more.

The sky was overcast with the air being clear and peaceful.

The object never left a trail behind. I did not hear any sounds as the compressor sight has an abundance of noise.

On Saturday afternoon I checked the areas by the tanks and found nothing out of the ordinary.

At about 8:10 A.M. on January 9th, 1971, [REDACTED] called on the intercom and told my husband to look out the living room window. My husband went and looked and went back to the phone. He looked again and it appeared as though the tanks were on fire. There was a red mass or ball hovering over the tanks. He was mumbling and I got up. When I looked I saw a red ball at about the horizon, to the north of our home. It just appeared to set - somewhat similar to a sunset, however, there was no extra glow from it.

[REDACTED] came to the house, somewhat shook up, and he related that while he was coming to the station he observed this object from Cantuar proceeding a distance ahead of him and it continued towards Success, when he turned off the highway. The object appeared to go to Success, turn in an arc, and met him on the corner two miles west of the highway. It then went along to the side and ahead of him, turning right and then went to the north around the buildings and went south to the tanks.

The sky was cloudy and frosty, or haze.

The brightness appeared to be a dark red of comparable intensity as that of the setting sun. The colour was a dark red. It did not have any trail or outer glow. The form appeared larger than the moon.

At about 8:00 A.M. on Saturday, January 9th., 1971, [REDACTED] came to relieve me at the Success Compressor Station. He drove up to the door and rushed in and called me out and told me to hurry. I ran out in my shirt sleeves. He pointed to an object to the northwest of the yard. I seen a thing that appeared like a big full moon. He started to tell me about how it followed him and came around there. He was really excited and shaking. He kept saying, "What is it". He and I watched it for about five minutes before he ran in to call [REDACTED], the maintenance man. I watched it steadily. It was a dull red. It would change colour slightly to a yellowish. The sphere was constant. It was hazy and you couldn't get a distinct outside line on it. When he was calling [REDACTED], I backed the car up and shone the lights towards it. Then [REDACTED] came out. Him and I sat in and watched it. I viewed it for a good ten minutes and it stayed in this position. Then in three to five minutes it appeared to go away and fade out. As it was going straight away you could see movement of the sphere bobbing around a bit. Then we decided to move the car to see if we could attract it. As I drove the road was blocked so I had to back up. By then it had completely disappeared. I told [REDACTED] I would go to Swift Current and see if it would be attracted to the vehicle. I watched all the way back in and I didn't see any signs of it.



1. [REDACTED], Havelock R.R. #2, Fork Stream Road, Canaan Forks, Queens County, NB reported to this office that for the past two weeks on clear nights he had been observing a strange phenomena in the sky. His observations are shown later. He advised that he could observe the object around 8:00P.M. and, on occasion, it was still visible when he retired after midnight. The object was still visible at approximately 6:00A.M. and clearer.

2. Although the area of the sighting is in our Chipman Detachment area, a patrol was in the Havelock area and Cst. G.R. BAMBURY patrolled to the area. He could observe the object, but not in the detail described by the observer in the early A.M. This could be attributed to its high altitude.

1. At approx. 8.30 PM, this Detachment received a call from Mrs. [REDACTED], St. Charles, P.E.I. of a UFO which had just landed in there yard. At this time Mrs. [REDACTED] wished a member to attend.

2. Cst. M.B. O'NEIL and myself made a patrol to the residence of [REDACTED] and the object was pointed out to us. This object landed approx. 50 yards from the residence of [REDACTED] in an open field. At the time this object landed the sky was clear, and [REDACTED] advised that it appeared to be like a star and that flashes of light were emitting from same. [REDACTED] further advised that this object was one of three which she observed from 6.30 PM this same date, the other two landed somewhere in a wooded area some distance from her house. Further information gained to the effect that this object came from the South and was under observation for 5 to 10 minutes and made a noise similiar to that of air escaping from a balloon. I might add that this object extinguished when it came in contact with the snow. The object was retrieved and brought back to this Detachment.

3. The physical appearance of this object is as follows, it has the appearance of a large plastic bag and measures approx. 4' in lenght and 2' in width. A rim on the mouth of this object is made from cardboard and attached to the rim is a piece of wire with a coil on the end with some type of cloth attached to the coil. This object appeared to be scorched and a certain amount of soot was inside this bag type object.

4. This date, CFB Summerside personnel attended at this Detachment and picked up this object in question. This file will be considered closed unless advised to the contrary.





CO-OPERATION WITH CANADIAN FORCES
SIGHTINGS OF METEORS OR FIREBALLS

1. The Canadian Forces have requested our assistance in reporting sightings of very bright meteors or fireballs, and are launching a country-wide publicity effort to bring this to the attention of the Canadian public.
2. A fireball is a bright meteor with a luminosity which equals or exceeds that of the brightest planets. It is usually seen moving rapidly across the sky and sometimes a trail of glowing particles is left behind. The meteor may explode with a burst of light and a loud sound, that may happen several times during a single fall.
3. When a sufficient number of fireball observations are obtained over an area of 100 miles or more, it is possible to combine the observations and predict the most probable area in which meteorites associated with the fireball may have reached the surface of the earth. Since freshly fallen meteorites are of considerably more interest than old falls, sightings should be reported as soon as possible.
4. When sightings occur, the Detachment concerned is to provide Sub-Division Headquarters with the following information by the most direct manner:
 - (a) date and time of sighting;
 - (b) condition of sky (clear, cloudy, haze, etc.);
 - (c) location of observer (either precise position on ground or geographical reference);
 - (d) occurrence of bursts (number and approximate positions along path);
 - (e) luminosity (brightness compared to planets or moon and occurrence of shadows cast by nearby objects, (if any));
 - (f) color (distinguish between color of fireball and any persistent train or trail after passage of fireball);
 - (g) form (size in relation to moon and shape);
 - (h) duration (both of fireball in motion and persistent train or trail in the sky);
 - (i) sounds (description of sound and time interval between sighting the fireball and hearing the sounds);
 - (j) position in sky (positions of beginning and end of fireball path, both azimuthal and elevation);
 - (k) any other unusual observations.



1. At 9:15 P.M. Mr. [REDACTED] (B. [REDACTED]), a resident of Haines Junction, Y.T., reported personally to our detachment advising that he and his wife had observed a U.F.O. from the location of mile 1024, N.W.H.S., around 9:00 P.M. even date. [REDACTED] gave the following information relative to this sighting: - That a large ball of blue light with a trailing blue streak of light, similar to the glow given off by an acetylene torch, flashed across the sky from the south at an enormous rate of speed, and disappeared over the northern or northwestern horizon. The object was estimated at a height of 35,000 - 40,000 feet and travelling at an angle to the earth's surface of 45 degrees or more. Estimated duration of the sighting was approximately 30 seconds. The object was described as being slightly smaller than a close full moon, with the tail section covering a narrow streak in length of approximately half of the visible sky. Throughout the viewing of this object the entire countryside was illuminated brighter and more intense than natural daylight. Following the disappearance of this object over the horizon a time interval of approximately 30 seconds elapsed and then a loud boom-like explosion was audible, with several subsequent explosions, similar to underground mine rumblings, following shortly thereafter. It was estimated that this object made earth contact approximately 75 miles from the location of the sighting.

window of his lodge. Mr. [REDACTED] described the flash as instantaneous and very white, with the entire countryside being illuminated. On the disappearance of this light Mr. [REDACTED] went outside his lodge and, after a period of less than two minutes he heard two or three explosions in the north or northwesterly direction. He estimated the explosions at a distance of 5 to 10 miles from his lodge.

5. Mr. [REDACTED] was drinking liquor at the time of his observation and it is therefore felt that the accuracy of his information should be assessed with this in mind. He estimated the time of his observation at 9:02 P.M.

6. Mr. [REDACTED] (B. [REDACTED]), a resident at mile 1026 of the N.W.H.S., was standing beside his car in the yard of MacIntosh Lodge when he observed what he described as a flash in the sky. He described the flash as being similar to a fluorescent light, with a duration of a second or two. Mr. [REDACTED] failed to observe anything in the sky as he was making repairs to the engine of his car at the time of the occurrence. He stated that following the disappearance of the light he heard a thunder-like explosion in the northwesterly direction followed by two or three rapid rumbles. He estimated the distance of the explosion at 50 miles, and stated that these explosions followed the disappearance of the light by approximately one minute. Mr. [REDACTED] estimated the time of the occurrence at 9:00 P.M.

7. Mr. [REDACTED] is a [REDACTED] at the United States Army Pumping Station situated at mile 1026. Mr. [REDACTED] is a well-respected resident of this district and is considered to be a reliable observer.

8. Several sightings of a bright light only were observed by several other residents of Haines Junction and by a few residents of Destruction Bay, Y.T. However, these observations were made through windows of dwelling houses and no information of value could be learned from these observers.

3 DEC 70

9. Mr. [REDACTED] informed me that he had observed vapour clouds rising from the area that the fireball is believed to have crashed. [REDACTED] stated that he observed these clouds during the daylight hours of the 1st and 2nd of December, and that these clouds were no longer visible on 3 DEC 70.

10. No additional reports on the sighting of vapour clouds have been reported to our detachment.



Col. RUSHTON stated that the sighting had been made by one of the men under his command, Cpl. [REDACTED]

7. Cpl. [REDACTED] of Baccaro, Shel. Co., N.S. was interviewed concerning the sighting and he stated that he had sighted the lights at approx. 9:40 pm at Smithville, Shel. Co., N.S. [REDACTED] account of the sighting is very similar to that of the [REDACTED] brothers. He stated that he saw four reddish orange lights stretched out in the sky in a perfect straight line. These lights were in a North West direction from him at the time of the sighting. He stated that the most Southerly light would have been in the altitude as the lights were at a 20° slant from the horizontal. He stated that the lights were about 18 inches in diameter and were perfectly round with no light reflecting off them. His girlfriend [REDACTED] and her mother were with him at the time. Statement of [REDACTED] attached hereto.

8. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were interviewed at their home at Smithville, Shel. Co., N.S. and they related how they had seen the lights in the sky. Their account of the sighting compared with that of [REDACTED] but they also stated that the lights were about 300 to 400 feet away and that one of the center lights went out and then came back on again. The height of the lights would have been just over the tree line. The duration of the sighting was approx. 30 seconds. [REDACTED] stated that the lights disappeared by gradually sinking below the trees, statements attached.

9. Message was forwarded to Halifax Sub/Division in accordance with instructions.

10. With regard to the reliability of the witnesses, I can say that I have known the [REDACTED] brothers for approx. 5 months. [REDACTED] is not superstitious and does not believe in common superstitions. I have known [REDACTED] as a personal friend inasmuch as we have gone on fishing and duck hunting trips together. Approx. 9:00 pm, 25 DEC 70 I met with the [REDACTED] brothers at Barrington, N.S. They were looking for [REDACTED] daughter who had left home after school that day without saying where she was going. This would have been approx. 40 minutes prior to the sighting and both were perfectly normal and neither had been drinking. I feel that the [REDACTED] brothers are reliable in this instance. As for Cpl. [REDACTED], I can say that Col. RUSHTON felt that he had no reason to disbelieve him. I do not feel that [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] are persons to make up stories. It is just a coincidence that two of the witnesses in each sighting had the surname [REDACTED]. There is no blood relation.

11. These sightings were made at two points approx. 20 miles apart in a straight line. The sighting at Bear point, Shel. Co., N.S. would have been approx. 20° to the North from due West from the sighting at Smithville, Shel. Co., N.S.

About 9:30 PM to 9:40 PM I was driving home with my brother [REDACTED]. I was driving between 40 and 45 M.P.H. I got about half-way between the two Bear Point roads. [REDACTED] said up in back of the lilly pond there was a lot of deer sign. I came over that little rise coming west towards Shag Harbour.

I saw one small light about the size of a pop top. I was going to say what is that to [REDACTED] when the five lights lit up. I was within 200 feet of them when they came on. I said, "[REDACTED], there it is". We didn't speak. Second light from the left was 4 or 5 feet over the left one, and between 10 and 15 feet apart. The next one No. 3. was down in line with the first one. The fourth one was on a 45° angle to the right vertically, 10 to 15 feet apart to the right. The next one to the right was up behind a tree 20 to 25 feet. For further information see diagram attached as described to me by [REDACTED].

The second light from the left went out and came back on again at least once. Then the next thing I remember about my car was that she was stopped when they went away. I don't remember if the motor stopped or not. I backed up to look up to see if the lights went over the trees or not. I drove home along the highway and I could not see anything when I came home or hear anything.

These lights were a bright fiery orange in color with no light reflecting rays off them.

No's. 1, 2, 3, and 4, were perfectly round. They were about 16 inches in diameter. It didn't seem like they stayed longer than 20 to 30 seconds. There could have been a lapse of time or a blank in my memory and the lapse in time could not have been over 10 minutes. When my car stopped I had the feeling that my car was going and I wasn't going with it. Before I got that feeling I saw No. 2. go out and come on again. My tape player went off and when the lights went my player was still muffled.

Last night between 9:30 PM and 9:40 PM I was a passenger with my brother [REDACTED]. We were driving towards Shag Harbour from Barrington. As we approached a point about halfway between the two Bear Point roads we saw five or six lights between 30 and 50 feet in the air. There was one that was flashing on and off but it was not going completely out. The car stopped but the motor didn't stop. When the car stopped I could not feel any forward motion on my body. The tape player stopped and started up again after the lights left.

It felt like there was pressure inside the car as well. I'd say the lights stayed for half a minute and then they disappeared without moving. We searched the sky after we drove home but could hear or see nothing. We didn't get out of the car at the place. The lights were between red and orange in color. They were about 25 to 30 inches in diameter. These lights appeared perfectly round. They seemed to be about 150 feet from the car.



1. At 9:15pm this date Mr. [redacted] of Courtenay phoned the office and reported sighting a U.F.O. near 19th Street in Courtenay. A patrol was conducted to this area by Cst. ANDERSON and myself. When we were at this location a light orange object was sighted and observed travelling in an easterly direction approximately thirty seconds in all and then disappeared. Canadian Forces Base Comox Comox was notified of this sighting.

2. Courtenay's message number 370 was dispatched to N.R.C. Meteor Centre (Telex 013434), as per Operational Manual CO-Air.

2 DEC 70

3. On this date it was learned that a boy, named [redacted] of Courtenay was responsible for sending up the U.F.O. This was done by obtaining a plastic bag, which is used by Dry Cleaning businesses to wrap dry cleaned cloths. A hoop, made out of light gauge wire, is attached to the open end of the bag. This hoop is then dissected with a piece of wire in such a way as to suspend a piece of cotton in the centre of the hoop. The bag is then filled with hot air by using a torch. The ball of cotton, which has been soaked in a solvent, is ignited and the bag begins to elevate. In view of the above no further investigations were conducted into this case.



1. On this date at approx. 2:30 PM a call was received from [REDACTED] of Box 101 Lorette, Man. She stated that while driving down a municipal road one mile south of #1 highway and P.R. #206 on the 8 OCT 70 on her way home at about 11:15 PM she had spotted some strange lights in the sky which came down on her and then disappeared. She said that she thought that it might be a U.F.O.

2. At approx. 3:00 PM a telex was sent out to N.C.R. Meteor Centre, info. CONFORCEHED.

14 OCT 70

3. On this date [REDACTED] was interviewed at her home. She stated that while driving east she saw three lights at about eye level. First she thought it was a car but then she noticed that it was too high in the sky for a car. The two outer lights were the brightest. She said they were coming at an angle toward the car and thought they would hit her. At this time she was just about stopped. She said it seemed to hang over her car and then suddenly took off with a lot of noise sounding similar to an airplane. After she went home she watched it for approx. one hour in a stationary position. It was one big object and it had a little red light at the back. A Mrs. [REDACTED] had also seen it.

4. A patrol was made to [REDACTED] home at Box 11 RR #1 Dugald, Man. She stated that sometime around 11:00 PM she had gone outside for a few seconds and saw a light in the sky. It was a sort of a light yellow in color. She just took a look at it and never paid anymore attention to it except when she heard what had happened to Mrs. [REDACTED]

5. Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are about [REDACTED] yrs. of age and seem to be mentally stable. Neither one of them are known as chronic complainers. Both are considered reliable persons.


6. All persons who had spotted the lights have been interviewed.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of Form A-151-1 from O.C. St. John's Sub/Division, dated 15 SEPT 70.

14 AUG 70

2. At 9:00 p.m., a phone call was received from Mr. [REDACTED] of Little Hearts Ease, Nfld. He advised that he and his family had just seen an object fall out of the sky and it looked to them as if it was a plane or something similar and it was on fire.

3. An immediate patrol was made to the scene by the undersigned and the [REDACTED] family was contacted. They advised me that their attention had first been attracted to the object by the rushing sort of noise it gave off. When they saw it, it was travelling in a North Easterly direction. It passed directly over the settlement of Little Hearts Ease at a height of approximately 1/4 mile and then it abruptly crashed into the mouth of the harbour. Just prior to crashing, it commenced a wobbling sort of motion and pieces seemed to fly off it. They described it as being about eight to ten feet in length, with a tail extending several feet beyond this. It was described as being blood red in colour, with the tail being a lighter shade of red. As it passed over the settlement, it gave out sufficient light to light up the settlement and distinct shadows could be seen.

4. The weather conditions and visibility at the time were very good. The sky was starlit and dark had fallen. Shortly after my arrival at the scene, a patrol was made by boat to the crash site and the area was completely searched. Nothing was found anywhere in the area. Mr. [REDACTED] advised me that he would be fishing in the area the next day and he would bring it to the attention of others fishing in the area and should they find anything, they would notify me immediately. This search was made by them, but nothing was found.

5. The information obtained on the immediate patrol was passed on to Sgt. A.O. MacPHEE via radio and he made a check with the Air Terminal in Gander. After a short time, they were able to advise us that no planes were overdue or missing anywhere in the Province of Newfoundland.

6. Further enquiries in the St. Jones Within area revealed a full confirmation of the sighting. The description given and the time of sighting matched in every detail. The persons making this sighting were the local [REDACTED], and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED].

At 11:15 P.M. this date, a telephone call was received from Mr. [REDACTED], 40 Colindale Ave., Melville Cove, Halifax, Nova Scotia to advise that for the past 30 to 40 minutes he had been watching what appeared to be an orange and green object moving in a North Westerly direction through the sky. [REDACTED] stated that he and [REDACTED], Purcell's Cove, Halifax Co., N.S. had witnessed this together.

2. This date [REDACTED] was contacted at his home and was interviewed. - 40 Colindale Ave., Melville Cove, Halifax, N.S. Latitude: 44 degrees 37 minutes North, Longitude: 63 degrees 37 minutes West.
- Not falling star, no bursts or noise along path the light travelled.
- Appeared as bright as evening star and north star.
- When first seen appeared same colour as star. Turned to bright flickering orange then to bright flickering red and then to light green.
- Size of large star.
- Observed for approximately 40 minutes.
- No noise heard from light.
- Seen travelling in a North Westerly direction at great height and speed and went out of sight over the horizon.
- No form associated with object and no trail. Seemed to slow down at intervals and speed increased as it went out of sight to the North West over the horizon. Not a falling star or comet.

4. [REDACTED] watched this object through binoculars. He stated that the object was bright white for approximately 30



1. With reference to the above, and further to Gander Detachment Message No. GA200 dated 26 JUN 70, the following is submitted in accordance with Operational Manual, CO-Air, Para. 6.
2. (a) 26 JUN 70, 11:10 A.M. Newfoundland Daylight Time.
- (b) Sky partly cloudy (approx. 4/10 to 5/10 cloud), slight haze.
- (c) Cpl. J. G. FOSTER, R. C. M. Police, Gander, Nfld.
- (d) R. C. M. P. Detachment, Gander, and 169, Sullivan Avenue, Gander, Nfld.
- (e) Csts. P.B. ROBBINS, M.R. LESTER and G.W. COOLEN, all of Gander Detachment.
- (f) Single object, circular in shape, colourless, transparent, estimated altitude 25,000 to 30,000 ft., no apparent movement other than wind-drift in North-westerly direction.
- (g) Observed constantly for approx. 10 minutes when first sighted. Object remained in view and observed intermittently until 12:50 p.m., when it was observed for further 10 minutes through binoculars (7 X 50) from second location.
- (h) During observation through binoculars (at 169, Sullivan Ave.) it was noted that while object was roughly circular in shape, the top portion on the side away from the direction from which the wind was blowing, was "belled out", as if blown by the wind. At 1:00 P.M. (NDT) object disappeared into a bank of Cirrus cloud.
3. When object was first sighted, matter was reported to Air Traffic Control, Gander, who advised that they had previously received similar reports, including one from the Gander Meteorological Office. They had already reported the matter to NRC Meteor Centre. The Gander Meteorological Office was contacted and they advised that while the object appeared to be a weather balloon, it was not one of their balloons.
4. The writer's estimate of altitude of object is based on the fact that cirrus cloud is normally found at this altitude. The direction of the wind at that altitude was confirmed by the Gander Met. Office as being North-westerly. The writer is of the opinion that this object was a weather balloon. This is based on experience in previous cases, when similar objects were sighted (and observed by the writer), and it was subsequently confirmed that they were weather balloons.

- At approximately 9:40 AM this date, [redacted] (B. [redacted]) Sign Painter of 604 Strickland St., Whitehorse, Y.T. reported a sighting of an unidentified flying object. [redacted] stated that the sighting took place at approximately 4:10 AM Yukon Standard Time. He did not report this any sooner as he felt that nobody would believe him. Only after talking to a local radio announcer with station CKRW, was he persuaded to report this incident to detachment office.
- Mr. [redacted] reports that he had been to a local bar, had about two or three drinks and returned home at about 2:30 AM, completely sober and wide awake. He had not been able to sleep and decided to work on some of his sign paintings. He was working in a work shop adjacent to his home and near an open door. As he was painting he noticed this object in the sky, took one step outside and observed it for approximately 2 to 3 seconds, than it was out of sight.
- The object he claims to have seen is described as being the color of a red hot electric stove element, noiseless, no vapour trail, saucer shaped bottom with a squarish structure on top, about twice the length of a Boeing 737 and about the same height. Mr. [redacted] estimated the speed of this object to be about three times as fast as that of a Voodoo Jet. The object was observed west of his residence and travelling in a northerly direction. The object was just above the tree tops of the claybank overlooking the city of Whitehorse. It should have been visible from the control tower at the Whitehorse airport, as the airport is on top of this claybank. Estimated altitude of the flying object is 500 feet. No other persons apparently observed the U.F.O. Weather at the time was light overcast.
- The Whitehorse Airport control tower checked and there were no aircraft that landed or took off during the period in question. The meteorological station advised that no weather balloons had been sent up at the time of the reported sighting
- Mr. [redacted] advised that he was with the R.C.A.F. as a Safety Equipment Technician for some ten years. He left the Air Force in 1962. He claims that he is familiar with all types of aircraft and the object he saw was no jet. Claims he has not seen anything like this before. During the course of the interview with him, I found him to be rational and normal. Several members of Whitehorse Detachment know of Mr. [redacted] and advise that he appears to be level headed and has not been known to fabricate tales. I have not been able to find any reason why Mr. [redacted] would fabricate a U.F.O. sighting, if in fact this is the case.

Thank you for the copy of the report from [REDACTED] dated May 21, 1970. We have looked at the two colour photographs enclosed with the report, and our conclusion is that the object referred to is probably the reflection of a fluorescent light in plate glass. Since the pictures were taken in February the temperature would be low, and it is highly probable that the photographer was either on the bridge or an enclosed promenade deck or in the lounge. In any of these cases, he would have been photographing through plate glass.

Whatever the explanation, it is practically certain that the image on the photographs is the result of either a double exposure or a reflection. Any object that prominent and of that apparent size that was actually in the sky would have been seen by the photographer. The report reads that "he saw, nor heard nothing at the time." We have placed this on our records, and will return the photographs as soon as copies have been made. Thank you for your cooperation in sending this to us.



Mr. [REDACTED] states the weather was clear and sunny. There were no clouds in the sky and no boats or anything else that would account for the cloud-like objects in the sky.

2. Mr. [REDACTED] consented to leave the photographs with us, so that they maybe examined if necessary. They are attached. He requests that they be returned when they have served their purpose.



Further to report dated the 21 May 1970 please be advised that no correspondence was received from Doaktown in relation to this file for the simple reason they claim that they did not receive a copy of our report. This is quite possible probably as the copy was mailed to Doaktown in the midst of the mail strike.

2. In any event [redacted] was only in the Doaktown area for approx. one week. Since Doaktown did not receive my report no action was taken by them to obtain a statement from [redacted]. By the time they did find out what was requested [redacted] had gone back to Dartmouth Salvage in Dartmouth to work. I again contacted his parents but they have no idea when he will be home again. Apparently [redacted] does not notify his parents when he is coming home and they have no idea when he is coming until his arrival. His mother advised that it may be a month or more before he arrives home but they will call us when he does arrive and we can interview him then. This is not considered an emergency to interview [redacted] as it is known that he did fire this rocket but we would like to obtain a statement to find out from him what exactly happened. Enquiries in the area did reveal that he did fire the rocket. Further report, to be submitted by noted diary date. It is hoped that [redacted] statement will be attached to that report.

1. Further to our radiogram #60 submitted 11 May 70, please be advised that at approx. 2:15 PM 10 May 70 [redacted] of Holmesville, N.B. called and reported what he thought to be a plane crash in the Johnville area. He noticed something falling in the sky which appeared to be on fire and trailed by heavy black smoke.

2. STATEMENT OBTAINED FROM [redacted] (B. [redacted]) - OF HOLMESVILLE, N.B. 12:30 PM 11 May 70

At approx. 1:30 PM 11 May 70, I was in my store at Holmesville, N.B. when I heard some children outside playing say "look at that". So with that I walked over to the window and looked out. I looked out the window in a South-east direction and saw an object that looked like an aircraft. The reason I say it was a plane is because I could see the tail section but that is all I could make out because the rest of it was covered in flames and was trailed by heavy black smoke. The tail section appeared to be grayish in color. This object was descending to the earth very rapidly at approx. 45 degrees in a gliding fashion. All of a sudden the flames died out and this dense smoke appeared to drift off in a southerly direction. This object then seemed to go into a spin and nosed itself to the ground where it disappeared out of sight. From the time I first saw this object until it disappeared out of sight I did not hear any noise whatsoever or any type of explosion. I would say that from the first time I saw this object until it appeared to have crashed to the ground, lasted for a duration of approx. five minutes. Just about the time this object disappeared we could smell smoke that had been emitted from this object. This smoke seemed to give off an odour like a gunpowder smell. The distance from where I was standing to where I feel the object landed would be approx. five or six miles in a Southeast direction, which should put the object in the vicinity of Shepherd's Hill.

3. A patrol and search of the woods in Johnville, N.B. regarding a possible plane crash met with negative results. Also a check was made in the area, with owners of small private aircraft, airports in the Province and a check was also made with the Maine state police in trying to confirm if any small aircraft had been reported missing but these efforts met with negative results as well.

4. In view of investigation and the lack of information as to what this object might be, it was being treated as a U.F.O. However two days later from the time this complaint was brought to the attention of this office I was conducting inquiries in the Holmesville area when I heard a rumor that the son of [redacted], whose home is located in Holmesville, N.B. had set off a rocket in his back yard on Sunday 10 May 70 relative to the time that the complainant called this office advising of a possible plane crash.

5. A patrol was made to the home of [REDACTED], where it was confirmed by him that his son [REDACTED] did in fact set a rocket off in his back yard on Sunday but he said that he had no idea of the repercussions that had resulted from the rocket firing. He said that his [REDACTED] year old son [REDACTED], worked for his son [REDACTED] who owns [REDACTED] which is located in Nova Scotia. Apparently this salvage company bought a ship that had gone ashore at Saint John, N.B. and that [REDACTED] was helping to salvage this ship. In the process of working on this grounded ship some rockets were discovered, which to the best of my knowledge are used as distressed signals, when a ship is in trouble on the high seas. This is apparently what the [REDACTED] boy brought home with him and set off in his yard probably not realizing what consequences would arise. From what the complainant [REDACTED] saw with regards to his statement previously outlined I feel that the description he gave is characteristic of a rocket of this nature.

6. It is hoped that a statement can be obtained from [REDACTED] outlining his activities on the 10 May 70 at Holmesville, N.B. and that he confirm of how he came in possession of a rocket of this nature and what its designed purpose might be, so that matters can be definitely clarified at this point. However [REDACTED] does not come home very often but it is understood that he is presently working on the dismantling of CN Telegraph line in the DoakTown Detachment area.

1. At approximately 10:00 P.M., I was called on the radio by Cst. C.W.R. HAINES and advised to proceed to the Highwood Gulf Service Station, where a person sighted an unidentified flying object. I arrived at the service station at approximately 10:20 P.M. and talked to an Imperial Oil Limited, [REDACTED]. His name was [REDACTED], of 7311 Bowness Road, N.W., Calgary, Alberta. [REDACTED] pointed out a light on the horizon and said to watch it for awhile. I saw what appeared to be a large star, which changed color from white to a yellowy-orange and then to red. It was situated in the west, approximately 25 degrees above the horizon. [REDACTED] stated that he had first observed this light while he was unloading gasoline at the bulk plant in Vulcan, Alberta. It appeared in the southwest and rose in the sky, becoming brighter all the time. While [REDACTED] was travelling from Vulcan to High River, he could see this light at all times. He stated that it would remain stationary for awhile and then it would move at a great rate of speed and then stop again. As he was approaching the Junction of Nos. 2 and 23 Highways, he was flagged down by a man from B.C., who had also seen this light. They tried to look at it through binoculars but were unable to see it, however, they could see other stars. [REDACTED] stated that he had first observed it at approximately 8:30 P.M. I observed the star-like light for approximately ten minutes and then, at approximately 10:30 P.M., it dropped from sight. Upon returning to the Detachment Office, High River, Telex #89 was dispatched.

2. It is felt that [REDACTED] is of sound mind and that he was completely sober at the time I talked to him. I would say that his information in this regard, is completely reliable.

3. This date, Cpl. J.H. WILLIS contacted the Calgary Planetarium, in an effort to ascertain if any sightings had been made by other persons. Officials at the Planetarium, advised that no other reports had come in. Cpl. WILLIS described the sightings as above and the officials stated that from the information we had, it was believed that [REDACTED] and myself had seen the planet Venus. Venus appeared on the horizon at approximately 8:30 P.M. and disappeared at approximately 10:30 P.M. according to Planetarium officials. It is felt by the writer that it was the planet Venus that we had observed.

- At approximately 4:15 A.M. while on routine patrol on Highway #16, approximately 5 miles from the city, an Unidentified Flying Object was sighted by Cpl. A.R. TOMLINS and myself.
- The U.F.O. appeared to be comet like in description, a whitish yellow star like object (very bright), with an arched rooster type tail, also whitish yellow in colour which was extremely long. No noticeable movement could be discerned in the object. The altitude indicated that the object was most probably in outer space. The object was viewed by myself and Cpl. TOMLINS for at least twenty (20) minutes and eventually faded with the coming dawn. It may also be noted that at times during the viewing the object appeared to grow dimmer then brighter.
- Prince Rupert is in the Pacific Standard Time Zone and the condition of the sky in the area of the U.F.O. was clear. Although as stated, no movement of this object was noted, both observers are satisfied that the sighting was that of an object in outer space and not that of a condition brought about by the reflection of light from an unknown source on a low lying cloud.
- Provisions of Operational Manual CO-AIR, Paragraph 6 & 7 complied with.

1. At approximately 9:40 P.M. while on patrol in the Yellowknife area with Cst. A.J. HERBST, I spotted what appeared to be a large reddish orange ball in the sky in the NNE direction. The object first appeared to be travelling horizontally towards us, then seemed to stop and go in the reverse. Cst. HERBST and myself watched this object for approximately 30 seconds until it finally faded away to nothing. The object appeared to be approximately 3000 feet up and travelling quite slowly.
2. Approximately 10 minutes later after seeing the object, we received word by radio that a Mr. [REDACTED] called the office regarding the same sighting. Mr. [REDACTED] description of the object would compare very closely to that described. Statement taken from Mr. [REDACTED], is attached.
3. Telex message as per C Department Policy Instruction 20-AIR was prepared and sent to NRC METEOR CENTRE, CANFORCED, the O.C. Fort Smith Sub/Division and the Commissioner, Ottawa.
4. The following is a description as per the telex message of the object sighted.
 - A) 27 FEB 70 - 9:40 P.M. M.S.T.
 - B) Cloudy o/c 4000 foot ceiling (Obtained from D.O.T)
 - C) RCMP Csts. D.A. BIRKE and A.J. HERBST

 - F) Object appeared to be a large orange/reddish ball first appearing to travel towards observers then seemed to stop and travel away horizontally and disappear leaving only a small bluish light for approximately 5 seconds. Sighted at approximately 3000 feet up.
 - G) 30 seconds.
 - H) D.O.T. Aeradio reported no a/c in area at time.
5. Although there is some discrepancy in the direction of travel, it is felt this could be explained by the fact that Mr. [REDACTED] viewed it from the opposite direction from what the member viewed it. Attached is a map indicating the approximate position of the observers at the time of the sighting.







He looked up through the windshield of the car and saw an object travelling through the sky in a southwesterly direction. The object at first appeared to be white in colour, and gradually turning to a reddish colour. It appeared for about 15-20 seconds, and during this time a greyish-white vapour could be seen trailing the object. The object was about the size of a softball and appeared to burn out before striking the ground.

1. At 8:00PM, 17 JAN 70, ██████████ contacted this office and advised that somewhere between 6:30 and 7:00PM some members of his family had observed the following described object.

A round bright orange object, without a tail larger than a average star, travelling rapidly in a straight line high in the atmosphere. This object was travelling from East to West in the Southern sky. There was no sound and length of sighting was from 2 to 3 minutes.

2. The local airport control tower and meteorological offices were contacted and could supply no information on what the object could have been and had received no reports.

3. Mr. ██████████, local representative of National Research Council Associate Committee was contacted and given the above information. He conducted some immediate enquiries and supplied the following information. There had been no radar contact and no known aircraft in the area, but that he would do some more investigation and would keep us advised.

4. In view of the above Telex R41 was dispatched.

5. No further reports were made to this office.

6. On 26 JAN 70, Mr. ██████████ advised that he had just returned from Ottawa where he attended a committee meeting and that the above report was part of the agenda. Through further investigation they felt that this object could have been one of the following:

- a) A light aircraft known to be in the general area
- b) A lighted weather balloon that had been sent up

However they also felt that no conclusions could be reached on this report and it would be shelved with no further investigation required for the following reasons:



An Unnerving Experience

Another Saucer Sighted This Time Within 60 Feet

By SHARON CURRIE

Fortunately Mrs. Doreen Kendall, a registered nurse at Cowichan District Hospital, is not a nervous person.

Because what she saw at 5 a.m. New Year's Day might have been the most unnerving sight she will ever experience in her entire life.

What Mrs. Kendall saw was a brilliantly lighted, circular object with a glass dome, occupied by two human-like men, which was stationary in

five minutes before it disappeared.

Drummond said he had no idea what the object could have been but he believed it was not an aircraft because there were no colored navigation lights.

"I have never heard of anything that could manoeuvre that slow and that fast without making some sort of noise," he said.

Drummond's mother, Mrs. Beat Drummond, said she also spotted the bright orange and yellow object in the sky about 7 p.m.

the air about 60-feet away from CDH, above the second floor where she was working in the extended care unit.

Mrs. Kendall, a nurse for the past nine years who commutes from Nanaimo, said she was checking on an elderly patient in the extended care unit wing on the second floor and went to draw back the curtains.

"I was so taken with the flying saucer that I didn't call anyone. I felt mumified and fascinated and stood there for about five minutes watching before I called another nurse Mrs. Freda Wilson.

The craft, which was slightly tipped downwards toward her, was about 60 feet off the ground and was about 50 feet in diameter, "or about the width of five hospital windows."

While the ship hovered above her, Mrs. Kendall could see only the upper halves of the figures inside, but when the vehicle tilted she saw their full profile.

"They had nice physiques, more than six-feet tall, and their hands were the same color and shape as ours. Their faces were covered and they wore dark suits, like a pilot's uniform, of soft-looking material.

"Maybe its because I'm so mechanically-minded but I suspect they were having mechanic trouble and had stopped to make repairs."

She said one "man" stood over an instrumental panel,

made of chrome, and the other stood behind him. There were stools for them to sit on.

She described the saucer-shaped craft as silvery, metallic and with a "necklace of lights" around the middle. The vehicle made no sound while it hovered above her or later when it took off towards the south-east.

"I asked myself later did it have mechanical trouble and is that why they had all those lights on?"

While she stood watching, one man turned and looked directly at her and then put his hand on the back of the man sitting down. Mrs. Kendall said the headgear covered his face.

The other man then pulled back "a joy stick" similar to those in a big airplane going from first, into second and then into third gear, and the object tilted sideways giving Mrs. Kendall an even better view of the instrumental panel and interior.

She then noticed that the dome seemed to be lit from below rather than from above.

"When it started to pull away I realized no one would believe me and I ran and called Mrs. Wilson to come and look."

"She asked what on earth was it and I said its a flying saucer. By this time five other nurses ran to the window and watched."

They watched the craft circle about five times and then slowly disappear towards the south-east.

"I was completely oblivious to anything else and felt no fear. In fact I would have loved to have gone for a ride and if the men had spoken to me I would have answered quite naturally."

"The reason I was so terrifically interested was because I always believed there were unidentified flying objects but now I am absolutely convinced."

Mrs. Kendall said the saucer almost touched the patio outside the hospital and added, "if I could have got out on the patio I would have talked to them."

It was pitch black outside when she pulled the curtains.

Later she entered her experience in a hospital working schedule which stated: "At 5 a.m. I saw a flying saucer as low as the third floor of the hospital when I pulled the curtains. There were two men or figures in the dome flying towards Victoria way. The bottom of the saucer was brilliantly lit and also the dome . . . New Year's morning."

Monday, Mrs. Kendall said the experience had left her with a placid feeling but regardless of what people said she would never change her story about what she saw.

SECOND SIGHTING

On New Year's Day, Jim Drummond, 22, and his wife Dianne, 18, reported they studied a bright light in the sky at Mill Bay, through a telescope.

"It was brighter in the middle and I could see four distinct lights of the same color that looked like tips of candles only a bit bigger," he said.

The couple said they observed the object for about

1. The news paper report, copies of which are attached, appeared in the January 7th, 1970 issue of the Cowichan Leader published in Duncan, B. C. It describes quite vividly and possibly a bit dramatically the sighting of a U.F.O. by Mrs. Doreen Eve WENDALL, a Licensed Practical Nurse employed at the Cowichan District Hospital, Gibbins Road, Duncan, B. C. This sighting had not been officially reported to this office, however, vague rumors had been voiced around that people had sighted some sort of U.F.O. since the new year. After reading the article and conducting a few cursory enquiries, it was decided that the sighting had sufficient merit that it warranted reporting. In compliance with instructions, Duncan message #6, dated 3 JAN 70 was sent.

2. The following statements were subsequently taken from actual eye-witnesses to the event:

"Duncan, B.C.,
Jan. 8th, 1970.

STATEMENT OF: [REDACTED] (B: [REDACTED])
Four Ways Trailer Park, Duncan, B.C.

" I am a Registered Nurse and was on graveyard shift - 12 - 3:30 AM on Jan. 1st, 1970. At 5:00 AM I was at the nurses' station on 2nd floor, west, with Mrs. [REDACTED]. We heard Mrs. WENDALL call to us from one of the wards in the Extended Care Unit. She said "come and see." We were talking and I don't remember just what about, but we didn't go right away because we didn't think it was anything urgent. Seconds later, she came out into the hallway and Mrs. WILSON was with her. This time she said "Come and see the flying saucer." We (Mrs. [REDACTED] and I) went to the first windows we could see outside from. As I looked out first, I saw a big bright yellow light moving up and away towards the east. It was a very bright yellow light much larger than stars or aeroplane lights or anything that I've ever seen before. It disappeared quite quickly in a matter of seconds - a minute at the most. It disappeared from our vision because of the trees east of the hospital. It was a clear frosty night out. At this time, I was looking out the windows with Mrs. WENDALL, Mrs. [REDACTED], Mrs. WILSON and I believe Mrs. [REDACTED] was there too.

" There was no sound or vibrations of any sort as the light moved away; there were no flames and the light remained constant. Mrs. WENDALL then described to us that she had seen this flying saucer right outside the windows of the hospital and up a bit about the third floor. She described that she saw two shadows that could have been people in it. She described the actual saucer as mentioned in the news paper report in the

Cowichan Leader. Mrs. WILSON described it as taking off in a circular motion or pattern. Mrs. MENDALL was quite excited about it as she described it to us, but wasn't hysterical or anything like that.

" On Jan 1st, 1970, a few minutes before 5:00 AM I was working at the Cowichan Dist. Hospital on the 2nd floor. I was working with my partner, Mrs. MENDALL, in ward 218 in the Extended Care Unit. It was a 4 bed ward and all beds were occupied. Mrs. MENDALL was looking after a patient next to the windows and I was attending to one on the door side of the ward. I noticed her pulling the drapes on the window and was just standing there looking out not saying anything. Then she suddenly turned around and said "Frieda, Frieda, Frieda, come quick." So I went over to the window and I saw a large saucer shaped object. It was metallic and had either a glass dome or plastic dome and the bottom part was brilliantly lit, and it was moving off tilted slightly and moving in a counter-clockwise series of small circles as it rose. When I first saw it, it was about 100 feet from the window and slightly above eyelevel. I said to Doreen "What on earth is it?" And she said "It must be a space ship or flying saucer." It was going away, so we decided to go and get some of the other nurses so they could see it too from farther down the corridor.

" We went out into the hall and we were kind of excited and we both called to Mrs. [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED] who were both at the nursing station. They didn't come right away and then we said "come and see it, its really something". So they came running and we all looked out the windows of the corridor going at the back of the elevators. At this time the object was much higher and appeared to be just like a bright light and then it went out of sight. It was real pitch black outside, and after it disappeared over the trees, I went to some of the other wards and looked out to see if it had circled around, but I couldn't see it any more. Mrs. MENDALL then wrote about what had happened in a notebook she took out of her purse.

" I was fascinated with the way it went through the air. It didn't make any sound and there were no sparks or anything like that as it rose and went out of sight.

brilliantly lit dome, which must have been made of glass because I could see the interior. There were two figures in the dome and they had on dark sort of flying suits and close fitting helmets. They were faced sideways and were tall. And then I saw this instrument panel and it looked to me like it was chrome, as the lights were shining off it. At this time the saucer was tipped towards me allowing a view inside of it. This instrument panel had large circles and small ones and the one figure was working on the panel. I saw both his hands operating the instruments. His hands appeared to be just like ours. They appeared to have fine physiques. The one closest to me turned slightly and appeared to be looking directly at me. I tried to see his face, but couldn't make out the features as there seemed to be a covering over the face. He then touched the other man in the centre of the back. His movements were smooth and he turned and looked at me too. He also had something over his face. Whatever it was, it was neat and tidy and part of his helmet. I wondered at the time if they were having technical difficulties. Their hands were bare and their heads and faces covered.

" After the second one looked at me, he moved this "joy stick" like a gear shift in a sports car. He moved it forward, downward and then upward and the ship started going in small, counter-clockwise circles. As it circled, it was rising slightly and I thought I'd better call someone else to see this, or no one would believe me. Up to this time, I was fascinated and staring out the window. So I turned and called Mrs. WILSON, who was on the other side of the ward. I said "Frieda look". She came right away and said "my gosh Doreen what's that". I replied that it must be a flying saucer. Then some of the other nurses came to the windows and looked too.

" As soon as the saucer sort of steadied itself, it rose steadily and then levelled slightly and still rising, disappeared behind the trees at the side of the parking lot. This took place in the matter of a few seconds. There was no noise whatsoever, but of course we were inside the hospital. It didn't shoot any flames and had the lights still on in the dome and around the outside as it rose.

" I would say that the ship was about sixty feet away from me when I first looked out of the window and would be at least sixty feet in diameter. The dome alone would be about as big as the room I was in and the lights were brilliantly white. At the beginning, I couldn't tell what colour the outside of the ship, but as it tilted, I could see that it was metallic, but not as highly polished as the metal on the instrument panel. It was about as high as the third floor eaves are off the ground.

" After it disappeared out of sight, I felt ill for a minute and was very quiet. Mrs. WILSON said to one of the other nurses that she'd have to get another partner, hers was no good now. I was deep in thought and then things returned to normal and I wrote down a memo. of what had happened in a note book.

" I have very good eyesight and was sober and am certain that what I saw was not any mirage, reflection or any plastic bag filled with hot air from burning candles. I was most impressed with the sight of the instrument panel in the ship. It was fascinating. I have never seen anything like this before.

" I was working graveyard shift at the Cowichan District Hospital, Duncan, S. C. on Jan 1st, 1970. I am a Registered Nurse and was on 2nd North (Surgical Ward). At approximately 5:00 AM I walked down to the 3rd West Nursing Station. Mrs. [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED] were sitting there and, as I walked up to them, two nurses from the Extended Care unit, Mrs. WILSON and Mrs. LENDALL, came running out of 213 saying "come and see the space ship". We just laughed and joked about it, but they were so insistent, that we finally ran to the hall windows and looked out. I saw this bright round object heading away from the hospital above the trees across the parking lot. It is difficult to say how big it was, but I remember thinking it isn't a plane, or a star, or a helicopter (unless it was all lit up inside) and there was absolutely no noise and it moved very quickly and disappeared from my vision at the window I was at, so I ran to another vantage point farther along the hall, but it had disappeared completely.

" It was very bright yellowish orange and all I could see was light. This was most unusual and I am unable to explain it.

" Right after it happened, Mrs. LENDALL told us it was like a transparent dome or bubble and that she saw two silhouettes in it and that it had two wings on it, which were lit up. I looked at the clock at the time. It was 5:00 AM and still dark out and I went back to my floor and told some of the other nurses about it and got the big "hee haw". Later, about half an hour, I went back and the two nurses (Mrs. LENDALL and Mrs. WILSON) were still looking out a window and were still obviously awe-struck with what they had seen.

" I am a Licenced Practical Nurse and am employed at the Cowichan District Hospital. She is the [REDACTED]. I was checking the patient right by the window and, after finishing her, I drew the drapes and looked out, and there was this brilliantly lit thing looking right at me. The first thing I noticed was this brilliantly string of lights all around it like a necklace. And then after I got my eyes off these lights, I glanced to the left and there was a

" Since that time, someone at the hospital showed me a booklet with drawings of U.F.O.'s. reported to have been sighted by other persons and there was one that looked exactly like the one I saw except that the one I saw had a complete glass dome to it and wasn't closed in like the one in the drawing. It also had the lights around it.

" I am a [REDACTED] on contract. On Jan. 1st, 1970 I was at home. Earlier, I had been at a New Year's Eve party at the Curling Club and left the party around 4:00 AM to go home. I had been home for about three-quarters of an hour when the front doorbell rang. When I answered it, I let [REDACTED] and his wife in. [REDACTED] drew my attention to a light or travelling object that was going across the sky. When I first saw it it would be at an angle of about 35 or 40 degrees up and climbing quite rapidly. It appeared to be coming from the general direction of the Cowichan District Hospital and it appeared to be travelling at a steady rate in an easterly direction. We both stood there on my front lawn and watched it for a while and then went into the house and I tried to get my wife to come and look at it, but she wouldn't. I went out again and watched it again for a couple of minutes and then when it was a little better than half way across my view of the sky it disappeared completely out of sight. When it vanished, I would judge that it was in line with Pine Street.

" In describing it, I can only say, that being a [REDACTED] I have been out at nights quite often and have seen a number of mysterious lights before, but none that had ever held my attention like this one. It was basically a brilliant light with a light orange tone. There appeared to be a number of lights shining downward which eventually made one large single shaft of light. There didn't appear to be any change in the density of the light or in its speed as it moved, but as it continued I got the impression that four, or a number of lights, shone down and formed a main beam. As it went off to my right, it seemed to take shape and I observed a slight silhouette of the object. It was oblong or oval shaped at the top and with the shaft of lights converging below it, it had the general shape of a child's top.

" It was a clear cold night with lots of stars out. I would say it was about a thousand feet up when I first saw it and, as it continued, it appeared to be climbing quite rapidly on a steady arc or course to the point where it disappeared. After it disappeared, I stood watching for about a minute longer, but didn't see anything else. There was absolutely no sound.

" I had drank some at the party, but knew that I was in a fit condition.

ion and had the responsibility of driving our friends home, which were staying at our place over night. The brilliance and character of this light actually had me spellbound as I watched it. It was really something to see. It couldn't have been a balloon or anything like that -- the lights were too bright and they obscured the actual shape of the object because of their brilliance.

" I would estimate that I observed this object for a period of approximately 7 or 8 minutes all together.

3. In assessing the reliability of the above witnesses, I can only say that they appeared to be all sane, responsible persons and are well thought of by their co-workers and friends generally. Mrs. KENDALL's account of what she saw seems to be firmly embedded in her mind, and although there are some very minor differences in the details of what she told me and the report contained in the Cowichan Leader, they do not alter the fact that what she has said is backed up by the accounts of the other women and by Mr. [REDACTED] sighting. His observations were made at approximately the same time and tend to add to the strength of the women's accounts. Mrs. KENDALL was completely reversed in her directions when she had the original interview with Miss [REDACTED], the reporter for the paper. However, when she was properly oriented, with the assistance of plan drawings of the hospital, she agreed that it had left in the same direction as the other women had stated: in a north-easterly direction. Had it left in a southerly direction, it would have crashed into the hospital.

4. It is also noted that in the statements of Mrs. [REDACTED] and Mrs. WILSON that they said Mrs. KENDALL only described the men in the U.F.O. as being "two shadows that could have been people in it" and "two silhouettes in it", respectively. When approached in this regard, Mrs. KENDALL did not remember exactly what she had told them at the time, as she said she was extremely impressed and in a somewhat mild state of shock after the incident. However, I personally saw the account which she wrote down in her note book and it is exactly as quoted in the newspaper article. The other women verify that she wrote it shortly after the occurrence.

5. I talked with the Mrs. [REDACTED], mentioned in two of the statements as having been present, however, she stated that she had not gotten to the window in time to see anything. I checked with [REDACTED] and his wife of Bell-McKinnon Rd., Duncan, B.C. and their descriptions of the object are very similar to that of Mr. [REDACTED].

6. I viewed the scene of the sighting and was unable to observe any physical evidence to substantiate the presence of any U.F.O. outside of the hospital, either on the parking lot below, or on the roof of another two story portion of the hospital, which the object was supposed to have been directly over. However, this was examined a week later and considerable

rain had fallen during that period. There are no guy or high-tension wires or any other obstructions which would have been in the way of an object getting into or out of the location where Mrs. KENDALL reports she saw this U.F.O. The distance that she claims to have seen it first would be from 50 to 60 feet off the ground and about 50 to 60 feet from each wing of the two wings of the hospital. The distance from the edge of the hospital to the tree line varies from about 90 to 150 feet. The tops of the trees would be approximately 120 to 150 feet above the level of the ground or the parking lot beside the hospital.

7. The "Second Sighting", mentioned in the newspaper, has not been investigated, as it is not in this detachment's area, however, I talked with Mr. John MAGOR, publisher of the "Canadian U.F.O. Report", a periodical reporting various sightings and theories of these phenomena, who lives in Duncan, and he said he had talked with James DRUMMOND of Mill Bay, B.C. and felt that the sighting did not amount to much and could be explained as being either a weather balloon, an aircraft from Patricia Airport or one of the many types of plastic bag and lit candle sort of hoaxes that are always prevalent after what appears to have been a legitimate reporting of a U.F.O. by some other person. He stated he had talked with Mrs. KENDALL and Mrs. WILSON the day after the sighting at the hospital and he felt that their experience, and the way in which they related the details of it to him, were most authentic and similar to other reports that he had knowledge of and had studied.

1. [redacted] of Duchess, Alta. contacted this office to advise that he, [redacted] of Twin River, Alta., and [redacted] of Riske Creek, British Columbia, sighted an unidentified flying object between 12:00 Noon and 12:45 P.M., date. [redacted] advised that he had his two companions were out in a pasture feeding some cattle and he noticed an object a distance to the south. He never thought anything about it and never mentioned it to his companions. At approx. 12:40 P.M. they were driving south on the #36 Highway when [redacted] again noticed the object in the same spot. This time all three watched it for approx. five minutes before it disappeared. [redacted] and one of the others observed it through a 6 power scope on a rifle.

2. The sky was clear and the sun was shining brightly. They were looking south into the sun and the object appeared to be to the left and below the sun. It appeared to be circular with a flat top and bottom. The object was longer than it was deep and was silver in colour. There was no movement except for a few fluctuations in light colour, possibly due to the sun reflecting on same. When the object disappeared it proceeded almost straight up at a fast rate of speed and vanished before leaving the field of the scope. The location of the sighting would be approx. 23 miles north of Brooks, Alta. and the object appeared to be just west of the Brooks Townsite. It may be mentioned that no one else reported seeing the object.

3. Brooks Telex No. 1 was dispatched in this regard. [redacted] is a well to do farmer in the area and is not prone to drinking. At the time of the sighting, he had nothing to drink for at least a month prior. This office has had dealings with [redacted] in the past in connection with other matters and he is of reliable character.

4. [redacted] and [redacted] are not of this area and information of their character in not available. They were both staying with [redacted] until 2 JAN 70.

About a quarter after five, I was north of Melita, on Main St. on the 16 Dec 69. I went on west of town about three quarters of a mile. I got out of the car to have a good look at it. I had seen a bright light South West of Melita about fifteen to twenty miles away. It was heading in a westerly direction. Right after I stopped a Pick-up stopped behind me and myself and two men watched it for about two to four minutes. It was no Comet or plane and we could not figure out what it was.

It was quite bright, somewhat larger than a small plane. Lights appeared to be on the side of it in a straight line. You could not tell the exact shape because it was too far away. It was a light bright orange in colour. The lights stayed constant and did not blink. It stayed on the course and did not change at anytime. We could not hear any sound.

The sky was clear, no clouds, red sunset, still with no wind, about 20 degrees above zero at the time.

I do not know who the other men where that stopped and watched it.

3. The above was all the information [REDACTED] could give of the sighting. He stated it did not make any unusual movements at anytime.

4. Enquiries in this area have failed to reveal who the two other persons were who also witnessed this object. [REDACTED] is a long-time resident of the Melita area and could not help in this regard. He is a contractor and considered a reliable person by members of this detachment.

5. There are no commercial airlines operating in the Melita area and there is no indication as to what this object might have been.

1. Miss [redacted], age [redacted], Perth, Ontario, contacted this office and reported that on 12 DEC 69, at approximately 11:55PM (EST) she saw an unidentified flying object.

2. [redacted], reported that the above occurred while she was walking her dog, about three quarters of a mile north of her residence and of the junction of Highways 7 and 15, she described the object as being silver in colour, about 10 ft. in diameter with some sort of light attached to it. Miss [redacted] watched the object for a few seconds, then became frightened and returned to her home; she noted that the object floated or drifted slowly at tree top level. The sky at this time was dark and cloudy.

3. Interviewing Miss [redacted] further, I questioned her as to whether or not the "object" that she saw could have been some sort of weather balloon; she felt that the object could well have been a large balloon.

4. I contacted the Uplands Weather Office and found out that many weather balloons are released in this area. According to the Weather Office the above description of the "Object" seen by Miss [redacted] fitted that of a "Pilot Balloon", which is about 8 ft in diameter, equipped with a small light and various instruments. These instruments measure wind velocity and a transmitter relays the information back to the base at which point they are used to compile weather reports. These balloons are commonly released from a base at Trenton, Ontario, on a regular basis. According to the forecaster winds and weather conditions at the time that the "Object" was sighted would account for its being in the Perth area.

5. The "Object" was obviously a weather balloon, since it was not reported until several days after it was sighted, a telex was not forwarded as per Operational Manual.

6. Although there have been no other reports of this U.F.O. there is no apparent reason to doubt Miss [redacted] reliability.

8 DEC 69

1. Approx. 4:05PM MST this date the above captioned came into this office and reported that he and his wife had seen a U.F.O. roughly 5 mi. E. of Kindersley, Sask. on Hwy. #7. He stated that at first they had thought it was the sun but after observing it for a period of time they were sure it was not. At the time of their seeing the U.F.O. they were on their way home to 1639 28th Ave. SW. Calgary, Alta. from Thompson, Manitoba, where [REDACTED] had supposedly been on business. At this time the sky consisted of a cloudy grey haze. When it was first noticed [REDACTED] described it as a large orange glowing ball on the horizon which flattened out into a rectangular shape and then disappeared into the SW quite rapidly with pulsations of pink remaining. [REDACTED] estimated that it was approx. 1/2 - 1 mi. away, and from where they were it appeared to be 50'-100' above the ground. The entire observation lasted from 2-4 minutes. Telex KIN238 was then sent to departments concerned.

11 DEC 69

2. To date people within a five mile radius of where the U.F.O. was supposedly sighted have been interviewed along with several of the people from Kindersley, Sask. Of the numerous people interviewed only four could say for sure that they had seen this glowing orange ball, which was the sun. They were Cst. C. VAN GELDER and Cst. P.G. HOWES of the Kindersley Det. while the civilians who observed this were one Mrs. [REDACTED] of Box 1376 Kindersley, Sask. and accompanying her a Mrs. [REDACTED] of 215 3rd Ave. W. Kindersley, Sask.

3. The two constables had been in different vehicles at the time they noticed the orange ball, but definitely stated that it was the sun. Upon talking to the two women they stated that upon first noticing the large orange ball they had to look twice, but after observing for a short time they came to the conclusion that it was the sun setting in the SW. Several hours after interviewing the women [REDACTED] called back and stated that her friend and herself had talked it all over and now they were sure that it was not the sun that they had seen as it was in the SW and according to them the sun sets in the NW.

4. In view of the fact that the sun does however set in the SW and not in the NW as the two ladies stated it is felt that the information received from them is not very reliable, thusly it has been concluded that the large orange ball sighted by the two constables was in fact not a U.F.O. but the sun.




5. The reliability of both [REDACTED] and his wife is unknown at this point, however at the time of this report [REDACTED] seemed to be very concerned about matter.



1. Inquiries were made at this point from the news department of a radio station in St. John's, Nfld., concerning the sighting of an unusual object in the Bay Roberts area. While the facts they presented at that time proved to be unfounded it was learned that [redacted], Bay Roberts, Nfld., had reportedly seen an unidentified flying object. [redacted] was contacted and a statement was obtained.

25 NOV 69

2. [redacted] was again contacted and a more complete statement was taken. Harbour Grace message #213, a copy of which is attached, was dispatched in accordance with existing instructions. [redacted] statement is as follows:
25 NOV 69.

Statement of [redacted] (B. [redacted]) Country Rd., Bay Roberts, Nfld.

"I think it was a week Friday past when I was coming into the farm. I was just past the bridge when I saw something in the sky. It was about a 100 ft. from the bottom of it to the ground. The body part was black, circular, like a table top and was about 6 ft. across. It had a white tail which was a bit narrower than the body and this was about 75 feet long. The tail was joined to the body by what appeared to be streamers. The tail was going back and forth like an eel swimming and the whole thing seemed to be floating in the air, but there was no wind. It was dead calm. This was happening around 4:00 p.m.

After I got in as far as Long Pond hill I went back and got [redacted] from Country Road, he used to work at the farm. When we got back to the same place we could see it off in the sky but not as well. We didn't follow because it was getting dark and we thought it might get tangled up in the truck and then anything might happen.

When we came in the second time it was darker and [redacted] of Country Road was with us too.

I definitely hadn't been drinking and felt fine. When it was flying the black round part on top seemed to be keeping it up and the tail by moving about would push it forward.

I definitely feel it was alive and not driven by motors and there wasn't a breath of wind. Before I went back for [redacted] I got out but couldn't hear anything from it. The streamers coming from the head of it attached to the body part which had black round objects on the sides of it. These objects looked like a tire, then the tail was below this.

It was like something alive and not something you could make. I've never seen anything like this before."

3. Attempts to contact [REDACTED] have met with negative results. He is single and working out of the area. His mother is unable to supply an address however he will be home around 19 DEC 69 and she will have him contact this office at that time.

4. Difficulties were also experienced in contacting [REDACTED] however a statement was obtained this date and is as follows:

Statement of [REDACTED] (B. [REDACTED]) Country Road, Nfld. 10 DEC 69

"Around the middle of November I was at home one afternoon when [REDACTED] from the sheep ranch came to my door and asked if I would come in with him to see what was in on the road. I asked what was in there and he said he couldn't describe it as he had never seen anything like it before.

This was late in the afternoon and it was getting dark. We went back in [REDACTED] pick-up. We went back as far as the head of Long Pond but couldn't see anything unusual. The sky was clear but had a couple of dark streaks quite high up. I thought that they were something a jet plane would leave. The streaks were a good distance apart. One was in the west and the other was in the north west. He pointed to something in the far distance but I couldn't make anything out about it. When we were going in we met [REDACTED] and he also went in with us. I am sure that Hervey never saw anything as well. We all came out together."



Further to our message no. 73/491, 6 NOV 73, this is to advise that logical explanations have been discovered for all reported U.F.O. sightings in Westmorland County, N. B.

2. It was learned from airport authorities this point, that aircraft destined for Moncton or departing from same have been instructed to leave all running lights and landing lights illuminated for a predetermined distance. Thus weighing the facts available of the sightings, as well as the fact that aircraft destined for Halifax, N. S., would be using an approach located over the vicinity of sightings noted on message no. 73/491 as A, C, D, and F, it is concluded that the object observed was an aircraft. Optical illusion effects and atmospheric conditions at the time of the sightings would account for the presumption that the objects (aircraft) were close to the observer and also the absence of sound.

3. Thus, reported sighting on the 4/5 NOV 73 have been concluded as having been observations of the evening star Venus, which was learned to be at its brightest illumination, in this region and time of year. It was also learned that the star could be observed for a period of approximately 2½ hours commencing at 6:30 p.m. at its most brilliant. Authorities advised that the star would appear to the human eye to have a flickering effect and gases released from same as well as certain atmospheric conditions present would account for the changes in color. Therefore these facts would account for sightings No. "B" and "E".

4. In view of the above, it is the opinion of the writer that all reported sightings may be said to be as noted, and it is felt that no further action is necessary.





18 SEP 72

1. At approximately 9:30 pm of the above date, the captioned individual telephoned this detachment to report that a shortwhile ago she and her [REDACTED] year old daughter [REDACTED] saw what they thought to be a U.F.O. in the sky. She further advised, it appeared to be a very bright whitish star with pulsating white light with bright red flashing light on top at times. She stated it left in the general direction of Port Elgin, N.B.

2. I left detachment in police transport and upon reaching the intersection of the Moore Road and Highway 16 on the outskirts of the village I could see the object as described by Mrs. [REDACTED]. It was stationary in the sky and stayed so for approximately one hour. I first saw it at 10:10 pm AST. It seemed to be at a high altitude in a somewhat cloudy sky. Cst. Terry STILWELL of the Port Elgin Village Police happened along as I was viewing the object and saw same. It appeared to depart in a westerly direction.

19 SEP 72

3. At approximately 1:15 am of the above date, while on patrol to Cape Tormentine, N.B. I again saw the object, which departed in a north easternly direction towards Prince Edward Island. There would be a distance of approximately 12 miles between the 2 sightings.

4. Radiogram No. 74 was forwarded in this connection.

5. Persons viewing this object are all considered reliable at this point.

3 OCT 72

6. At approximately 9:45 pm of the above date Mrs. [REDACTED] telephoned this detachment to report that she had just seen the object again and it had departed in the direction of Port Elgin, N.B. She said it appeared to be quite high in the sky and the weather was somewhat cloudy.

7. Cst. ANTHONY made an immediate patrol to the area but could not locate it.

8. On the first sighting I caused checks to be made at Summerside C.F.B. and Chatham C.F.B. These were met with negative results.

1. I attended at the [REDACTED] residence at Estlin, Sask., regarding the reported sighting of a UFO and the following information was learned:

- (b) It was a very cloudy night with thick cloud cover

A large orange mist was present for approx. 10 to 15 minutes after the UFO left the area.
- (g) The duration of the observation was approx. four minutes.

2. The Ministry of Transport were contacted however they had no knowledge of anyone flying in the area. Flight plans were checked from Edmonton and Hay River, N.W.T., with negative results. High Level Telex #75 forwarded as per existing instructions.

3. [REDACTED] is known by the writer and felt to be reliable, he does fly his own aircraft and has worked for the Alberta Forestry for the past few years. [REDACTED] had not been drinking on this evening and it is felt it was not just his imagination.

At approximately 9:45 pm I was with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] by the school at Steen River. [REDACTED] had occasion to look up in the sky and told us to come and look. At this time I observed what I thought to be a helicopter on fire. It glowed white and appeared to be some kind of flame. When I first observed it, the object was north of Steen River, approximately over the highway, I would say it was 2 - 5 miles away. Then the glow seemed to change to a light green color, all of the main colors were present but different colors seemed to become more distinct at different times. There was a very distinct gap between the main centre of light and a small green light behind the main body. This light remained the same color and intensity. There appeared to be some sort of frame or shadow of a frame between the main light and small light.

It continued heading North-West and disappeared over the tree line. After it disappeared we observed what appeared to be sparks, although it didn't make any noise from that direction. We hadn't been drinking when this occurred. We observed this object for a good minute.

On the 26th September 72 we were standing outside the school at Steen River, approximately 9:45 pm. I saw a flash like an explosion is what brought my attention to it. I called [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], they were just entering the school. It kept travelling to the north, north-west, it was travelling slowly and appeared like an aircraft on fire. There were pieces flying off it, from the back, it looked like reddish yellow fire rolling around and travelling through the air. It had a green light on the back with the flames ahead of it. I estimated it to be five miles but it could have been farther back than that. It was travelling much too fast for a helicopter but slower than what a meteorite would. It kept on fire until it disappeared in the trees, it was a clear night with overcast to the east, where it was travelling was clear. I saw it for about 30 seconds. We then went to the Forestry tower and looked with binoculars but could not see anything.

On the 27 SEP 72, information was received at "A" Division Desk from Cst. Ralph THORHAUGE, member of our Force that his wife had sighted a U.F.O. in the western area of Ottawa.

2. I interviewed Mrs. THORHAUGE on 28 SEP 72 and the following details were obtained. She was in her residence, 25 Saginaw Crescent, Ottawa and happened to look through the study room window facing the western direction. She sighted a very bright light in an oval shape in the sky. She observed this object for five minutes and then called her neighbour, Mrs. Leigh ANDERSON. Mrs. ANDERSON was accompanied by her husband who also is a member of the Force; both ANDERSONS looked through their residence window and spotted this U.F.O. The same description of the U.F.O. was obtained from the ANDERSONS. The observers were not able to determine an approximate altitude of the U.F.O. but at the time the sky was clear and the approximate time of sighting was between 6:45 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on 27 SEP 72, Eastern Daylight Time.

3. The U.F.O. was sighted in the western direction and from the observers' point of view, the U.F.O. slightly was descending toward the southerly direction. The U.F.O. disappeared from the sight of the observers at approximately 7:00 p.m.

4. All observers who reported sighting this U.F.O. are believed to be reliable sources.

A 68 dark blue Dodge swung south on Hwy. 203 just outside Beausejour town limits at 9:45 p.m. on Thurs., Sept. 7. Occupants of the vehicle were Inspector William McFarland of the R.C.M.P., his wife Thea and their three children Bob (13), Tim (12) and Catherine (7).

The powerful beams of the headlights punched two bright holes in the dark moonless night with heavy cloud cover, as the McFarlands drove down the gravel road on their way to visit Thea's mother, Mrs. A. Reimann, on their journey to Ottawa where Inspector McFarland has been posted.

Within moments of turning down 203, a bright luminous object approached from the east at an altitude of about 30 ft. It zeroed in over the McFarland vehicle and proceeded to follow for 20 - 25 minutes.

Bob, the oldest boy, was the first to spot the strange object. 'Hey, there's something following us,' he cried. Alarmed, the boy's mother turned and looked towards the rear window. 'What do you mean?' she asked. 'There is nobody behind us.'

'No,' cried the boy, 'It's up there, it's up there! Can't you see it?'

He pointed above the roof of the car where a strange light object, alight off to the east, could be seen from any point of the vehicle.

The oblong, bright glowing object appeared to be the size and shape of an oval dining room table. Four to five feet in length and about a foot in depth.

Inspector McFarland speeded the car up and then slowed down to a crawl several times. The object held its position above the roof.

At the corner of 302 and the Springfield Brokenhead boundary road, six miles from the turnoff point on the main highway, he stopped the car and doused the headlights to see if the object could possibly be some unusual reflection from the car headlights. The object did not disappear. Instead it hovered over them.

After waiting a few minutes they proceeded on for the last mile and a half to Mrs Reimann's neat stucco bungalow. The UFO went with them maintaining its position about 30 feet above the ground.

When Inspector McFarland switched off the ignition and turned off the headlights in his mother-in-law's yard, there was the object waiting for them. It had shifted its position from above the car and was now hovering over the house.

The children rushed into the house, breathless and excited. 'Grandma, grandma,' they cried. 'Come see what's out here.' They seized their astounded grandma by her arms and almost dragged

her out into the yard.

Ten feet above her one story home was a UFO.

'It seemed to sway slightly as it rotated in a swinging motion but otherwise it maintained its position over the house.

It was a soft, bright white light, halo in shape but seemingly solid all the way through. There seemed to be no sharp edges or any details visible on it,' they all agreed.

'We all watched it for a good five minutes and then it slowly moved off to the west, rotating as it went, and then we lost it behind the trees,' Inspector McFarland, a veteran R.C.M.P. officer with a disciplined mind, had been very sceptical of UFO reports up to this point and was not about to jump on the believers' bandwagon. Neither was he able to deny the evidence of his own eyes when he had tested the UFO for reflections.

'There just has to be some sort of reasonable explanation,' he said.

Checking with Captain Deault of CFS Beausejour radar site, it was learned by The Beaver that no unusual sightings had occurred on that evening.

'However,' noted Captain Deault, 'commercial level aircraft would have been processed by normal means and would not have been looked for by the Base.'

On checking with residents of

two houses along the 7 1/4 miles stretch the McFarland car travelled, no one else saw either the car or the object. Heavy bush and foliage from yard trees obscure the roadway. There are only six homes along the entire stretch and most are far back from the road.

To the reporter, one item stood out on questioning the family, only Mrs. McFarland had felt any sense of fear. 'What do you suppose it could be mother?' she had asked while they watched the UFO above Mrs Reimann's home. 'Oh its probably just one of those flying saucer things you hear about every so often,' her mother replied.

There have been a number of UFO sightings in eastern Manitoba in the past. In June of 1967, over 20 different valid unidentified flying object sightings occurred during an eight week period.

Mrs Wayne Inkpen of the Tyndall area spotted a similar oval object to the one the McFarlands saw about 11:30 p.m. on May 31, 1967.

Mr John Kryschuk of Brokenhead, on Apr. 3, 1968, was badly shaken for several days after a 40 ft. UFO making a buzzing sound followed him in his farm vehicle a distance of 13 miles into Beausejour along Hwy. 12. That one hovered over his truck some 400 ft. overhead and supplied enough

- At approx. 10:30 P.M. this date Mr. [REDACTED] 4905 Hampton Ave., Montreal, P.Q. and Miss [REDACTED], 128 Queens Road, Sackville, N.B. came to this office and report sighting an object which was displaying a very bright white light with a smaller red light directly behind it travelling in a north easterly direction over Sackville.
- The object appeared to be travelling at an altitude of between 800 and 1000 feet and at a speed of approx. 80 M.P.H. Subjects watched object for approx. 2 or 3 minutes until it slowly descended from sight on the north side of Sackville. They stated they heard no noise from the object.
- The Moncton Airport was contacted and they advised that there was no air traffic in the area at that altitude during the time of the sighting.
- Both subjects appeared to be reliable an investigation failed to show that their report was a hoax. No other persons in the Sackville area reported sighting the object.
- Sackville Detachment Message No. 126 was sent to N.R.C. Meteor Centre info Canforched and the Commissioner, Ottawa.

1. On 18 AUG 72, [REDACTED] came to this office to report that he had spotted an Unidentified Flying Object on their way to Banff, Alberta. The initial information was taken by one of the Stenographers and inadvertently filed for information purposes.
2. On 21 AUG 72, subject was interviewed and the following information recorded and reported via Telex Message WS26. At approximately 4:00 PM, 10 AUG 72, [REDACTED] (BD: [REDACTED]); wife, [REDACTED] (BD: [REDACTED]); and son, [REDACTED] (BD: [REDACTED]), of 9 Queen Crescent, Brandon, Manitoba, (PH-728-1399) while travelling west in their family car from Swift Current, Saskatchewan to Medicine Hat, Alberta, reported seeing a U.F.O. Subjects were travelling on #1 Transcanada Highway approximately 100 miles west of Swift Current, Saskatchewan, at the time. The condition of the sky was clear at this time. The shape of the U.F.O. was circular, the colour was silver, and it was shiny. There was only one U.F.O. at an altitude of 500 feet and the movement was from south to north. The object was observed for approximately 30 seconds. The tail was white with a greenish tinge and very straight out the back proceeding directly with the object. Subject indicated it would be logical that it was an emission from the object. The object was extremely bright and the emission did not fall off, due to the earth's gravitational pull.
3. The subject reporting is a [REDACTED] in Brandon, Manitoba, [REDACTED]. He is active in church work. The day this occurred the temperature was approximately 90 degrees. Subject had driven for approximately 8½ hours. He indicated that he was not tired at the time he saw it and he was of good temperament and relaxed.
4. [REDACTED] indicated that he did see the U.F.O. but was afraid that he had not seen it, merely thought he saw it, because of past correspondence he had read, over the last few months about U.F.O.'s. Upon reaching his destination in Banff, Alberta, he met some people in the camping section from California, U.S.A., and after discussion of the subject, affirmed his belief of seeing the U.F.O. Information received from [REDACTED] is that these people from California, U.S.A., saw the same type of U.F.O. approximately the same date as his sighting. He related that the radio stations in Alberta had been broadcasting the sighting while he was there. He related an experience of a farmer seeing a U.F.O. on approximately same date that cut large Hydro wires. [REDACTED] could not supply names or vehicle licences of the farmer or the people from the U.S.A.

- At 2:45 P.M., [REDACTED] of Calgary, Alta., came to the Brooks Det. office to report that he had sighted an U.F.O. The particulars of the object were obtained from [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED], Brooks, Alta., who was with [REDACTED], also confirmed the sighting. Shortly thereafter, numerous reports were received from residents in Brooks and the surrounding area. The object was described as appearing to be on fire and had various bright colours in it. It was high in the sky and travelled parallel to the ground. A trail of smoke followed the object across the sky. Some observers described it as being round in shape, moving from a south-west direction to a north-east direction.
- At 3:00 P.M. this date a phone call was placed to the Armed Forces Base at Suffield, Alta., enquiring about the sighting. They did not have any knowledge of what the object might be. The Traffic Control Tower at the Calgary International Airport was also contacted. They advised that they had received various reports of sightings in the Calgary area. They could not provide information as to what the object might have been. Brooks message #234 was dispatched.
- Later in the day of 10 AUG 72, the sighting was the subject of news broadcasts. Scientists in the United States believe that a meteorite had entered the earth's atmosphere on a flat path and had caused the unusual sighting. The meteorite is believed to be the remains of a comet. It is the opinion of the writer that the sighting at and near Brooks, Alta., is the same object as the meteorite. None of the persons reporting the sighting deny this possibility. There is no further action anticipated at this point.




1. At approximately 2:30 P.M. on Thursday, I was on routine patrol in the Morrin district, Alberta. At the junction of No. 27 and No. 56 Highways, I had occasion to check two hitch hikers, namely: [REDACTED] (B: [REDACTED]) and his brother, [REDACTED] (B: [REDACTED]), both of Forestburg, Alberta. During this check, one of the subjects called attention to the fact that a U F O was approaching our position from the south, travelling in a northerly direction. Its altitude was estimated at between 4 to 5 thousand feet and travelling at a very high rate of speed. When first observed, the U F O appeared to be climbing and then to level off, spiralling as it travelled. It appeared to be silver in color with flashes of blue and green noted. A smoke trail was noticed behind the U.F.O. when first observed and continued for the full duration of observation estimated at 15 to 20 seconds. It then appeared to disintegrate in level flight as no explosion was noted. Weather conditions at the time were clear and hot.

2. Drumheller Detachment Telex Message No. 139 was dispatched outlining the occurrence as per Op. Man. CO-air.

3. As no further action is deemed necessary, this file will be shown as hereunder noted.

1. Master [REDACTED], of C.F.B. Camp Wainwright, Alta., advised this office at approx. 3:05 PM., that he had just seen an object that he believed to be an U.F.O. He first sighted same 2 3/4 miles north of Huxley, Alta., proceeding from the south in a northerly direction along number 21 highway. [REDACTED] advised that the object he saw was a large ball, silver in the sun's reflection, flying at an altitude he estimated to be approx. 1,000 feet. The object maintained this altitude throughout the duration of the sighting which lasted approx. 90 seconds. As the object neared a position directly overhead of [REDACTED], the vapor trail which was being emitted stopped and the object sped off into the north at an accelerated speed.
2. The above was made subject to Telex THH 45 and forwarded to NRC METEOR CENTER, with information COMMISSIONER.

14 AUGUST 72

3. Enquiries within Detachment area revealed that [REDACTED] (DB: [REDACTED]) and [REDACTED] (DB: [REDACTED]) both of Box 206 Trochu, Alta., sighted the aforementioned object at the same approx. time and location as [REDACTED]. They advised, however, that same was travelling at an extremely high rate of speed and of an altitude similar to that which a jet would be flying. They stated that they could not hear any noise and were of the opinion that same was a meteor.
4. It should be noted that at the same time, an object of similar description was reported by the news media in Calgary, Alta., to have been travelling in the same direction and along a similar path. It was identified as a meteor, and it is felt that this and the object as above, are one in the same.
5. In view of the above this matter will be considered as a meteor sighting and concluded as such, unless other wise instructed.

1. On the above date at approx. 12:15 A.M. a call was received from a subject who identified himself as [REDACTED] who resides at Lot 49 Parish of St. Clements, R.M. of St. Andrews, Man. [REDACTED] advised the member taking the call that they had sighted an unidentified flying object and wished members to attend at his farm. An immediate patrol was made to the [REDACTED] residence.

2. Upon arriving at the [REDACTED] residence the members were greeted by the two c/n subjects. The extent of their story is as follows: At approx. 12:10 A.M. the lads who were sleeping in a bunk house near the main farm building heard a low toned and throbbing noise. The subjects walked from the bunk house towards the house and were looking up in the sky at that point which was quite clear. It was then that they noticed a bright object, that of a star, multi-coloured, crossing the sky in a southerly direction. The object was taking a sharp zig-zagged pattern, very distinct, and then stopped, 4-5 seconds, then took a distinct 90° course proceeding west and out of sight. When asked as to altitude, the boys could not state definitely other than object was like a bright star, multi-coloured, and had no idea how high it was. The subjects were questioned for a lengthy period of time and during this time, it was suggested that it could have been an aircraft, helicopter or a jet aircraft. Both subjects state definitely that it was not either as they have both seen helicopters and jet aircraft within the Selkirk area. Both subjects were quite visibly shaken and at this time there was some doubt in the writer's opinion, as to their reliability. In all, their assessment of the situation appeared rather vague.

3. Numerous enquiries have been made within the district of any other persons sighting a U.F.O. but all met negative results. It might be noted at this time, the [REDACTED] residence is approx. 1½ miles west of the Town of Selkirk in a farming area. Also on the night in question there were some thunderclouds to the south of Selkirk, estimated distance of 15 miles. The sky above the [REDACTED] residence and surrounding area was considered quite clear.

4. Both subjects are known to the members of this detachment and are considered of unreliable character. [REDACTED] has had extensive dealings with our Force and in the writer's opinion, is not considered reliable. [REDACTED] character is certainly not as blemished as [REDACTED] but there is also some degree of hesitancy in believing this person. It is the writer's opinion as well as that of several other members who have been referred to in this matter that [REDACTED] due to his involvement and his character, that there is some doubt as to the validity of his story. It is also known in this area that it is a flight lane of commercial aircraft and in view of this it is believed what they reported as a U.F.O. was in fact a low flying aircraft. Some doubt is cast upon this report as no other individuals had reported a sighting of this nature, as approx. 20,000 people reside within Selkirk and district, therefore the report will be shown as noted hereunder. Extra copies of this report being attached for Headquarters Ottawa.

He stated that this object was rocket-shaped, very bright silvery coloured, with a trail of reddish flame. The object travelled parallel to the horizon at a very high rate of speed, and [REDACTED] made observations of it for 2 or 3 minutes.
- Telex message # SCC323 was forwarded as per Op. Manual "Co-Air" and statement was obtained from [REDACTED]. It might be noted that this object was also observed by Cst. R.W. LOWE, RCMP, Swift Current Rural Detachment, who was on patrol in the Morse district at the time, and by S/Sgt. J.R. NICKEL, RCMP, Swift Current Sub/Division, who was also in the Morse area at the time. Statement has been obtained from Cst. LOWE and it is corroborated by S/Sgt. NICKEL.

2. In view of the contents of the statements, the following Telex was sent to the National Research Council in Ottawa:

- (A) UFO reported 3:00 a.m. Mountain Standard Time 26 MAY 72 near High Level, Alberta.
 - (B) Sky Clear.
 - (C) UFO first observed by [redacted]
 - (D) [redacted] approx. 5 miles North of Paddle Prairie, Alberta at time of first sighting.
 - (E) UFO also observed by [redacted], [redacted], [redacted] and [redacted].
 - (F) UFO travelling approx. 500 ft. from ground, speed varied according to speed of [redacted] vehicle. Main UFO appeared to split into groups of 3 and 6 at random. Main UFO appeared Black with no lights and made no noise. UFO accelerated away from [redacted] vehicle travelling 85 m.p.h.
 - (G) Sighting lasted approx. 1 hour. UFO last seen heading North West toward Footner Lake Airport, 7 miles North of High Level, Alberta.
 - (H) Check with D.O.T. at Footner Lake Airport. No Incoming traffic. One light aircraft left airport 5:30 a.m. 26 MAY 72.
- Afore mentioned people sighting UFO local residents and reliable. Reports to follow.

STATEMENT OF: [REDACTED]
5:00 P.M. 26 MAY 72
High Level, Alberta

"On 26 MAY 72 [REDACTED] and myself were proceeding North on Highway 35 toward High Level from Paddle Prairie. At approx. 2:00 a.m. and 5 miles north of Paddle Prairie, [REDACTED] observed on the right of the Highway, approx. 500 yds. away and approx. 500 ft. high, a black object, round in shape, travelling at approx. 60 m.p.h. which was the same speed as our vehicle was travelling.

After [REDACTED] first observed the object, both [REDACTED] and myself also observed the object. We increased our speed to approx. 85 m.p.h. and the object would move away from us until we ran out of power and then it would seem to come back towards us but never getting behind us. The object seemed to be moving from one side of the road to the other at random.

Approx. 15 miles south of High Level, we used the truck radio to contact Mr. [REDACTED], our boss, to come out and see the object. [REDACTED] lives approx. one block from the High Level Skating Rink towards the North. The object continued to lead us into High Level and then we proceeded to the [REDACTED] residence where both Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] had observed the object.

We had the object in sight all the way to the [REDACTED] residence. We all observed the object at the [REDACTED] residence and then it left quickly heading North West in the direction of Footner Lake Airport.

When I arrived home, I went and got my Binoculars and by the time I got out again, it was gone."

STATEMENT OF: [REDACTED] of High Level, Alberta
Taken: 9:50 P.M. 28 MAY 72 at High Level, Alberta

" We first observed one UFO at about 2:00 a.m. 26 MAY 72. It was approx. 200 to 500 yds. away to the right and about 500 to 1000 feet off of the ground. It would move away from us, but it would keep at approx. the same height all of the time. The object stayed at approx. the same speed as the vehicle that we were in, but the object would always be ahead of us. It disappeared ahead of us a few times but it always seemed to wait on us.

When we hit the pavement 10 miles south of High Level, we increased the speed of our vehicle to 85 m.p.h. and the object accelerated away from us. It continued to move at different speeds, approx. the same speed as our vehicle all the time.

It began to divide into pieces of 2,3,4, or 5 as we approached town. We then proceeded to Mr. [REDACTED] residence. We had already waken the [REDACTED] via the portable radio in the truck. At the [REDACTED] residence, all 5 of us observed the objects, which at this time were 4 or 5 in number.

At the time of the sighting, the sky was fairly clear and it was just getting daylight. At times the objects appeared to resemble clouds.

The objects appeared to be oblong in shape. They moved quickly and had no lights and as far as we could determine, had no noise. At times the object appeared to have a tail first on the right and then on the left.

I had consumed approx. 1 dozen beer from noon 25 MAY 72 until the sighting at 2:00 a.m. 26 MAY 72.

[REDACTED] had explained to [REDACTED], "Now I believe in
UFOs." He then went on to explain to [REDACTED] about their sighting
the objects. [REDACTED] and the other two occupants of the truck
arrived at the [REDACTED] residence at approx. 2:30 a.m.

When the incident occurred, it was almost dawn and fairly
clear out.

We were waiting in the front area of our house when we
observed the objects. We saw the objects first in the West. There
appeared to be three objects when we first saw them. 2 of them
appeared to be close together and one was by itself. They
were approx. 500 to 1000 ft. from the ground.

All three of the objects appeared to be oblong in shape. They
made a grayish-black outline against the sky. They made no noise
and had no lights.

The objects seemed to appear and disappear and move around
alot.

We had been in bed for about three hours and had not been
drinking on that evening.
