SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

The expression "IWIT" surfaced in Session 01, is the phonetic acronym of a unit described as a "government center, an intelligence community center" located on an old installation.

The expressions "STIL/STIX" surfaced phonetically in Session 01, refer to the identity of the responsible terrorist group and its modus operandi. A "Cpt Needle/Nettle" described as an intelligence officer assigned to Wiesbaden, FRG, should be aware of the meaning of "STIL/STIX."

The target automobile referenced in Session 01 is described as a European-made, light blue, sedan, custom-made in part for use by consular officials. "The windshield was double-coated" for added protection.

A consular official described as field grade officer in the US Navy, an administrative officer whose name starts with "S-Susan" is responsible for approving the work request for vehicular maintenance. The work is done on the "German economy" and the vehicle is then returned to the (US) consulate.

Attempts to obtain the phonetics of the target automobile's registration resulted in the following: "12 J K 8071/ J K 8071/J-8071 K."
