

The speed of the ship was estimated at 30-40 mph, and its distance from the observer seemed to be seven miles. With the reported speed, distance, and apparent size it would be impossible to note details of an object. Also an object of the size indicated in the report, moving at a speed of 60 mph and at a distance of seven miles would present little, if any, apparent motion toward or away from an observer in a duration of 10 seconds. While there are strong indications of an unclassified report, the case is being reviewed as a possibility since the ship data have been submitted, and no action has been taken.

30... On 7 October 1983 in Irbid, Jordan an observer saw a stationary, light in the SE at 60 degree elevation. An assessment of the object was noted during the 45 minutes that it remained visible. There was a bright sun low in the West, pulling out a sun-dog phenomena. Clouds moved in front of the object without obscuring the light. Not really an object, just a bright light, like sun reflecting from a window glass.

1500. On the night of 23 October 1965 three witnesses saw an object from Coonawa Mountain, Idaho, described as a shiny, metallic, circular from below and like a football from the side. There was one red flashing light coming from the top of the object. The object was seen for about 10 minutes and accompanied movement of the object. It approached from the NE and passed over the observers at about 85 degrees elevation for a 30° altitude. From this point it seemed to gain altitude, flew South for an additional minute, changed direction and flew back North. The object was seen by three witnesses. The observation, the altitude sighting seemed about six minutes. Witnessed by two people and one adult. Description of the sighting conforms with a helicopter observation, however, a check with the US Military units operating near the area where the sightings were made shows no flights consistent with the location and the direction of the object.

... & report from Roger Wise, Seattle in the form of a letter from a 18 year old youth contains of this small diagram and a few short sentences. No investigation was made and no additional information requested, yet this is perhaps the most complete of all the affidavits of 1983. Nonmedical data is exact. The nation and description of the object is clear and accurate. A copy of Walter Baldwin's letter is included as an attachment, not only to illustrate this type of a report that is carried as unidentified, but because it is the only one that is dated. The letter is dated 1983. It is in the Wright-Baldwin UFO Series, Box Maryland Civic Advancement 1977-1983.

15. ... sighting on 10 December 1963 from White Plains, New York carries a tentative unidentified evaluation. Additional information has been requested.

11... Two reports from Washington, D.C. on the evening of 13-14 December 1965 with essentially the same characteristics. Object/objects reflected black smoke or gas and were observed to be at or near the Pentagon and International Airport. They did not appear to be solid, and their size and shape changed continually throughout a ten minute observation.

15... On 16 December 1965 a blinking light was observed from a military A/C flying over the Pacific Ocean. The light was white and travelled from West to East. Altitude unknown. Speed towards observer. Duration 25 seconds.
