

The unidentified sightings for 1943 consisted of a blue light, four pink wheels, an unknown satellite, a saucer-shaped disk, a series of three strobe-like light crossing the sky, an exploding thing, a balloon and aircraft like sighting, an ear of corn and banana, a report of beautiful valley, one bright stationary light, an unidentified helicopter, a light that disappeared in the sky, one March made, another stroke and one more posting additional data. The Air Force believed that sufficient data was presented in these cases, yet, could find no scientific solution. While these cases are unrelated surely nothing presented would stand as scientific proof/for evidence of a visitation from outer space.

The Air Force does not deny the possibility that some form of life may exist on other planets in the universe; however, there has been no evidence submitted to or discovered by the Air Force that proves or even tends to prove this conclusion.
