

Books listed below deal with facts and theories about our solar system, the sun, planets, comets, meteorites, the universe, stars, constellations and galaxies, telescopes, the composition of the sun as it relates to astronomy, star maps and charts, and the history of astronomy.

THE SUN AND ITS FAMILY, by ALLEN, IRVING. The history of astronomy as it relates to the sun and our solar system.

WEATHER ELEMENTS, by BRADY, published Prentice Hall. Has an excellent chapter on often misinterpreted weather phenomena.

PLANETS, STARS, AND SPACE, by CHAMBERLAIN, JOSEPH W & KICHLER, THOMAS D. An illustrated, non-mathematical explanation of the earth, planets, stars, and the universe. Prepared in cooperation with the National Museum of Natural History.

JULIAN SCIENCE BOOK OF STARS, by JONES, PHILIP. An easy-to-read, exciting story of what scientists now know about the stars, planets, the moon, and the Milky Way.

EXPANDING THE PLANETS, by GILLARD, RAY S. An illustrated description of the planets of our solar system.

COLOSSEUS OF THE UNIVERSE, by STINE, J ALLEN & ANDERSON, NORMAN. Discusses the nature of the universe, astronomy and cosmology, published by Scholastic Press.

THE STORY OF THE STARS, by SALMON, HENRY. An introduction to the universe: our solar system, our galaxy, and other galaxies. Many interesting illustrated analogies help build concepts of size and distance. Includes references to the Van Allen radiation belts and nuclear light observation of 1966.

THE WORLD OF FLYING SAUCERS, by HENRIK & RUD. A scientific examination of the classic UFO reports.

THE MYSTERY OF LIGHT AND COLOR IN THE OPEN AIR, by VERBURGT, Dover Publ. alone. This is an excellent paperback written in clear, readable lay language.

FINDS BOOK OF THE SKIES, by CLARY, L V & S. A completely revised edition of the book which has been the standard work of its kind since its first appearance.

METEORS, by SLINER. Standard text by foremost authority on meteors.

PREPARATION HISTORY OF MOON, 1865-1961, by RALPH, R C, published by Lowell Observatory.

BEYOND THE HORIZON OF ASTRONOMY, by STOKES, J. A first book explaining in simple terms our solar system, the universe and galaxies, and how they are related to space travel.

FIRST MAN TO THE MOON, by VAN SICK, MERRIS.

WALKING IN SPACE, by MOON, V B. A guide to the heavens with excellent star maps.

SHOOTING STARS, by LEM, HERBERT S. Known facts and theories about meteors are explained.
